

Seaside Wins Region IV Meet

PACIFIC GROVE — Seaside High School increased its corps of talented hurdlers and sprinters here Saturday morning and rode their strength to a varsity team championship in track and field's Central Coast Section Regional IV meet.

Eight meet records were either broken or equaled by the best thirclads from the Monterey Bay League, Mission Trail League and Coast Athletic Association.

Salinas Valley tracksters getting into the act as new or equaling record-setters were North Salinas' fresh-cup sprinter Glenn Mahoney who breezed to a 22.4 clocking in the 220 to tie the old standard, Gonzales High's Ruben Mendosa in the two-mile run, and King-City's Scott Jeroch in the pole vault.

Mendosa answered the "who's he?" question of sideline observers by front-running

the eightlap run in the good-time of 9:24.4 and his effort crossed the mark of Salinas High's Harmon Gurnea, 9:27.4, established in the 1978 meet.

Other Valley thirclads winning first place ribbons included varsity performer J. Brewster Thompson of North High and Fresh-cup athlete Mack Domingo of Alisal and Norcal's Susan Mallo.

Off Form, But Wins

Thompson, although far off his form, still had enough spring to win the high jump with a leap of 6-7. The Vixen jumping-jack has been over 4-4 on two occasions this season.

Domingo streaked home a winner in the yearling class 440, clocking 1:1.4. Mallo defeated arch-rival Johnny Beacom of Watsonville in winning the 70 yard high hurdles in 2.4.

Varsity second-place affairs Saturday were turned in by Jeff Cook (Salinas—32.9—32.8), and the Salinas High 440 relay team

with a clocking of 1:1.1. Cornerback Bob Washington of Salinas High was second in 28.2 in the 100 yard low hurdles.

Second-place performances were also logged by Norcal's Mahoney (100), Palma's Robert Bond (long jump), Alisal's Carlos Jacobs (discus), North High's Mallo (100 low hurdles), and relay teams from Alisal (400) and North Salinas (440).

Saturday's top three finishers resume training this week with sights set on next weekend's Central Coast Section championship meet, next Saturday on the San Jose City College oval.

In direct contrast to Seaside's run-a-way team victory in the varsity meet, Watsonville just barely managed to edge Coach Mary Beguhl and Blair Miller's Norstrom for the fresh-cup meet championship, the Norcal's edged 23-21 in final point scoring.
