

EDWARDS STADIUM

Finished in 1932, and at the time the only purely "Track" Stadium in the World, Edwards Stadium has been the site of seven National Collegiate Championship Meets, one National AAU Championship Meet, All-American Invitational in 1966, and the 1932 IC4A Meet, the only time this meet had been held away from the East.

This Stadium is named after Col. George C. Edwards, as is the field adjoining it to the East.

In 1957 the oval itself was dedicated in the name of Walter Christie, California's first track coach, 1900-32, and in the early sixties "the friends of California track," raised funds to build the Walter Christie bench which stands just outside the running track on the West side of the infield.

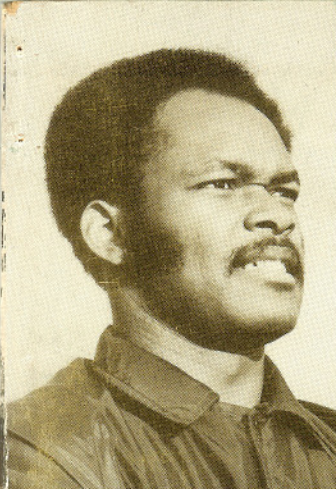
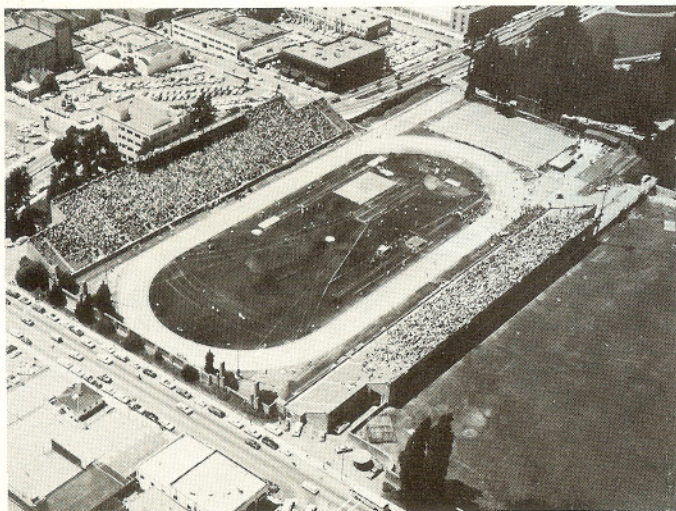
With funds that remained after the bench was built the electric clock that stands atop the scoreboard to the North was purchased.

The track in the 22,000 seat Stadium was completely redone in 1965 and is a composite of Fresno clay and cinders and is reddish in color.

Ten world records, 16 American records and at least 18 collegiate records have been set in this Stadium.

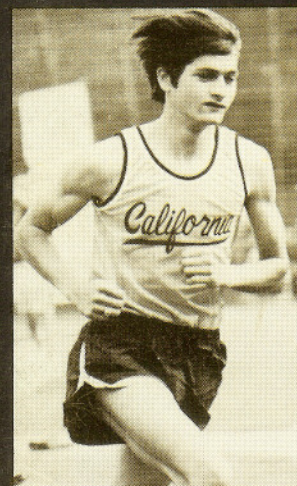

HEAD COACH ERV HUNT

Erv Hunt is California's new head track and field coach. At 25 he is the youngest full-time head coach in California history.

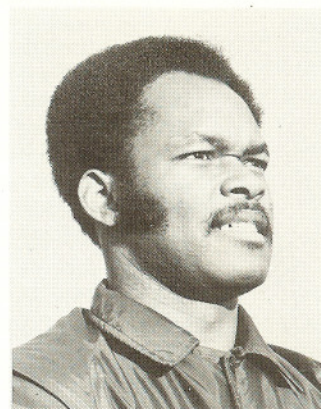
Hunt assisted Dave Maggard last year and impressed the man who is also Cal's Athletic Director with his teaching ability, enthusiasm and stability, despite his youthful age.

A "Little" All-American football player and all-around track star at Fresno State College, Hunt coached at the junior and senior high school levels in Fresno and at Clovis HS before joining Maggard last spring.

He also played one season of professional football with the Green Bay Packers, having that career curtailed due to a back injury.

Born July 1, 1947 in Fresno, Hunt is a graduate of Edison HS and Fresno City College. He was the nation's leading junior college hurdler, and was a state high school championship meet performer. His honors at FSC are numerous, and they include the Fellowship of Christian Athlete's "Scholar-Athlete of the year" award.

He and his wife Jacquelyne have a two year old son Jamie.



ASSISTANT COACH BILL FROST

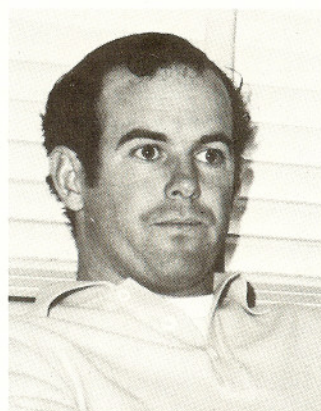
Bill Frost is California's assistant track and field coach and head cross country coach.

The 28-year old Frost came to California last summer from Cupertino High School where he had coached for two years, 1970 and 1971. His last Cupertino team, led by Craig Conway, won the Central Coast Section championship.

In 1968 and 1969 he was an assistant coach for Dave Maggard at Los Altos HS.

Frost is a Los Altos HS graduate himself, and he received his BS degree in Physical Education from UCLA, and his MA in Education from Stanford.

Frost was born on October 12, 1944 in Los Angeles. He is married to the former Toni Frees.

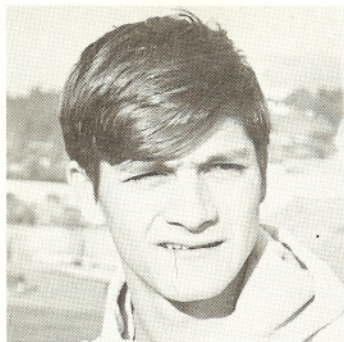

GORDON HERRICK (Rick) **BROWN**, 440, 880, mile, junior ... The University of California 800 meter record holder at 1:45.4; two time Pacific-8 halfmile champion; NCAA 880 runner-up as a freshman in his only appearance in that meet; the American record holder at 600 meters in 1:16.2 ... defeated only once in a dual meet halfmile, and that as a freshman by teammate John Drew. He has scored 101½ dual meet points in two years.

As a senior at Los Altos High School, in 1970, he won an unprecedented double, the 440 and the 880, and added frosting by anchoring the winning mile relay team.

He has four of the ten fastest 800/880 clockings in Cal history (Don Bowden has three and Jerry Siebert has three). He is the freshman class record holder at 1:48.9 and the sophomore class record holder at 1:47.7 for 880 yards.

No U.S. sophomore has ever run faster than has Rick, and, in fact, only seven Americans have ever run faster.

Brown was born 2/9/52 in Miami, Florida. He is a Physical Education major who plans on a coaching career.
