

Jakle, Finley star in Hill track meet

SAN JOSE — Dave Jakle of Los Altos won the 180-yard low hurdles in a Central Coast Section seasonal best 19.3 Saturday in the 13th annual Hill-Kiwanis Invitational track meet at San Jose City College.

Cupertino's Don Finley got off a 46-11½ triple jump to equal the section best of '74.

Finley also placed in both hurdles, clocking 14.9 for fourth in the highs and 19.7 for third in the lows.

Gunn's John Littleboy cleared 6-4 in the high jump and Mildbrandt won the high hurdles in 14.4.

Mount Pleasant captured team honors and Rusty Nahirny of Washington and Gary Bersano of Los Gatos were the individual stars. Nahirny negotiated a neat distance double, winning the mile in 4:16.5 and the two mile in 9:07.8, a meet record. Besano won the discus with a 169-8 hurl and the shot put with a 58-5 effort.

Besano thwarted Midpeninsulans in both events: Scott Wells of Palo Alto was second in the discus at 167-7 and Rick Rossi of Los Altos was second in the shot put at 56-7.

Silver Creek finished second while St. Francis edged Cupertino for third place in team scoring.

A 'Pleasant Track Upset

Mount Pleasant nudged Dave Jakle of Los Altos Millard Hampton and his Silver Creek mates for team honors and Washington's Rusty Nahirny and Los Gatos' Gary Bersano took individual laurels Saturday at the 13th annual Hill-Kiwanis Invitational Track & Field meet at San Jose City College.

Mount Pleasant won only one event, the 440 relay in 43.4, but had a pair of seconds from Glenn Cannon in the sprints behind Hampton's 9.5 and 21.3, and another from Ed Martinez in the 440 along with three fourth places and two fifth place spots.

Nahirny was voted the "Outstanding Track Athlete" off a scintillating distance double of 9:07.8 and 4:16.5 while setting his own pace in both races. Bersano was the "Outstanding Field Athlete" with his weight double of 58-5 and 169-8.

Nahirny's 9:07.8 is a new meet record, wiping out the 9:09 set by Bob Grubbs, also of Washington, two years ago. It was one of two new meet marks Hampton's 9.8 bettering the 9.9 he ran last year while equalling the previous best set by Brad Lyman of Los Altos in 1968.

He tied another meet standard when he won the 180 low hurdles in a swift 19.3 which is also a Central Coast Section season best. His 19.3 tied the mark set by Mike Toler of Buchser in 1966.

Don Finley of Cupertino proved one of the more versatile and successful athletes as he won the triple jump with a good leap of 46-11½ to equal the CCS best of Lynbrook's Bill Napier. He was third in the low hurdles in 19.7, and fourth in the highs in 14.9.

One of the surprise winners was Rocky Dumais of Ayer, a sophomore who took the pole vault at 13-6. He was one of five to clear the height and attempt 14-0 which he cleared on a fourth attempt after the event had officially ended.

Silver Creek's hopes for the team title were jolted before the meet started when coach Bobby Poynter decided to scratch David Wesley from the 440 relay because of a slight strain in his leg. It was not Wesley's speed that was missed so much, but the smoothness of his baton handling was and that cost the Raiders the relay to Mount Pleasant.
