Seaside Wins Varsity, Soquel F-S In MBL Track F

SALINAS— Three Central Coast Section marks were bettered, two league records tumbled as Seaside picked up its fourth Monterey Bay League cinder crown in a row Saturday in near-perfect weather on Hartnell's all-weather oval.

The depth-laden Spartans, qualifying 16 individuals plus two relay teams for this week's Region IV finals, racked up 66 1/2 points while cross-town rival Monterey finished second totaling 60.

Soquel was a distant third with 31 ahead of Alisal 30, Watsonville 21, San Lorenzo Valley 15, Salinas 11, North Salinas 8, Aptos 5, Harbor 4 1/2 while Santa

Cruz notched last place scoring four points.

The ideal weather seemed to have a real effect on at least three MBL track and field competitors Saturday when Soquel's senior half-miler Mark Wagner and a pair of Monterey flashes in Kirk Collins and Nate Johnson established new CCS marks.

Wagner ran a perfect race by touring the first 440 in 56.2 and his efforts didn't stop there. The final lap was equally impressive with a winning time of 1:54.9 easily breaking the existing CCS best to date of 1:55.1. Wagner's time also broke the MBL mark of 1:57.1 set 11 years ago.

It took a tremendous kick on

the final stretch for Collins to nose out Seaside's Perry Cockerham in the 440 battle. Collins, with a CCS best, was clocked in 49.6 while meet officials got Cockerham at 49.7. In the same race, Aptos' Mike Morgan was third at 50.9.

There was close to two feet separating first and second in the triple jump when Johnson, only a junior, got finished. His winning leap of 48-2 not only bettered the CCS mark, the previous best of 47-9— but also broke the MBL record as well. The old distance was 46-10 1/4 set in 1973.

Saturday's MBL finals provided many Santa Cruz

County athletes with the opportunity to shatter school records.

For Soquel individually, Marty Capron was second in the 120 yard high hurdles in 15.0 and teammate Jim Fox garnered second in the 180 lows in 20.2. The Knight 440 relay team of Mark Myers, Fox, Gary Link and Scott Meyer raced to a new mark of 44.5 in finishing third behind Monterey and Seaside.

San Lorenzo Valley gained its first ever MBL champion when Bill Gervasi cleared 13-0 in the pole vault to win the event. Teammate Joe Krasky was second in the shot put (50-3 and fourth in the discus (147-7 3/4) and both will continue to this

weekend's Region IV meet.

The Valley's mile relay foursome broke the Cougar mark with a 3:30.5 time, good for fourth.

In that blazing 880 race, Aptos' Eric Stakkestad broke the Mariner school record with a 1:54.9 effort for fourth.

Harbor and Santa Cruz each had one qualifier as Buc high jumper Barry Leaman tied for third at 6-0. Distance ace Allen Sandretti of Santa Cruz was second in the two mile in 9:46.7.

The foursome of Phil Kitchen, Tim Hoffman, Dave Clemens and Mike Hamm led Soquel to the frosh-soph team championship. The Knights, in winning

their first MBL title, won six of the 10 running events in scoring 68 points.

Seaside was second at 46 followed by North Salinas 36, Aptos 25, Salinas 21 while Alisal and Monterey salvaged 20 points.

A stalwart performance came from Clemens with victories in the mile (4:38.5) and two mile (10:01.7) plus a better-than-average leg on the victorious mile relay team (39.4). Kitchen nabbed the 70 highs (9.1) and 180 lows (21.5) and proceeded to finish fourth in the high jump (5-8).

A Soquel school mark was erased when Hoffman ran a

2:01.9 880.

Aptos' Mark Lamberson broke the 100 (10.4) and 220 (23.4) frosh-soph marks with second place finishes and The Valley's Bob King made 5-11 in gaining second in the high jump.

One other Aptos frosh-soph standard fell when Mark Quinn was third in the two mile (10:15.7).
