

Sequoia surprises Gunn track team

Gunn High, expected to contend strongly again for the South Peninsula Athletic League track title it won last season, suffered a shocking 71-64 loss to supposed non-contender Sequoia Friday in a league opener.

In other openers, powerful Woodside breezed past Cubberley 95-39 and San Carlos nipped Menlo-Atherton 71½-64½ in a struggle of title-hopefuls. The Palo Alto-Ravenswood meet was rescheduled for Tuesday.

Gunn captured only seven firsts against the Cherokees' nine on the muddy Sequoia oval for the difference.

Muddy conditions helped keep marks down in all three meets. The day's best efforts were 13-foot pole vaults by San Carlos' Ray Nolan and Sequoia's Tom Dixon.

M-A's title bid, which may have hinged on Friday's loss, was set back when the Bears fell to San Carlos in five of six field events.

It was a "field day" for the winners — especially Sequoia High — and mudville for the losers in the abbreviated and delayed opening round of the South Peninsula Athletic League track and field season yesterday.

Sequoia received heavy point-scoring performances in the field events as it edged defending SPAL champion Gunn 71-64 in the biggest shock on the opening agenda.

In other meets, San Carlos was very disappointing on the track, but strong in the field as it tripped Menlo-Atherton 71½-64½ and Woodside blitzed Cubberley 95-39 despite the absence of two of its strongest members.

Multi-purpose runner and jumper Myrt Easley and weightman Dave Brunsting spent last night playing basketball at Stanford in the Central Coast Section basketball

tournament for the Wildcats.

"If you beat the defending champions it always feels good," said Sequoia mentor Joe Greggans. "It's been four years since we beat Gunn."

Although the Tribe scored a majority of their points in the field, it was the final running event of the day — the mile relay — which clinched the victory for Sequoia. The Tribe won that event in 3:44.3 to assure the team win after leading 66-64 going to the five-point event.

Big Ron Chamness set the stage for a wild discuss season as he tossed the platter 161-11 despite a limited training schedule because of playing basketball.

Chamness' teammates Ed VanBrenk, Thomas Dixon, Jim Data and Ed Oravillo also played a big part in unseating the defending champs and breaking an eight-meet skein of the Titans. VanBrenk won the triple jump (43-5¼), Dixon

the pole vault (13-0) and 440 (53.7), Data won the shot put (50-10) and Oravillo won both sprints.

San Carlos coach Jim Luttrell wasn't overly impressed with his running forces, but he got a top-notch early-season performance from a couple of his field performers.

Ray Nolan became the second pole vaulter of the day to clear 13 feet as he mastered that exact height in setting a Don school record while Greg Malveaux triple jumped 44-2 and Mitch Kingsery and Mark Rockwood claimed doubles for the winners.

Woodside coach Claude Turner was pleased with the showing of several of his athletes, namely Mark Llewellyn, Robert Sweet, Bob Young and Phil Robinson. Robinson had the third outstanding triple jump leap of the day as he stretched to 42-4½.

Parkinson's strange case

Possibly the SPAL's best sprinter fights for his athletic life in court this Monday over an academic eligibility issue.

Yet Ben Parkinson of Menlo-Atherton High is a fine, college-bound student regarded as "mentally gifted" who will graduate this June having fulfilled all requirements.

If this case seems weird, it is.

Parkinson has been running this season under a court injunction. And running rather successfully, at that — his 10.1 for the 100 is the league's top clocking and his 23.3 in the 220 is tied for second best.

The injunction was obtained by Parkinson's father, Ben, a San Francisco attorney, when young Ben was declared ineligible for track because he had not passed 20 units the previous semester, as required by the California Interscholastic Federation code.

The problem was not that Parkinson failed a subject, but that following the football season (he was honorable mention all-league at flanker), he dropped a chemistry course.

Parkinson has accumulated enough credits toward graduation, anyway, as so many students seem able to do these days. And he claimed he received a bum steer from someone who reportedly told him he could audit the course for credit, which was false.

Parkinson was surprised and dismayed when declared ineligible to compete in spring sports. So was his track coach, Plato Yanicks. And so was Ben's father, who was in a position to take action, but not before his appeals to the SPAL, Central Coast Section and CIF were all turned down.

CIF rule 205 — which Parkinson's case falls under — was originally intended to eliminate the so-called "tramp athlete," the boy who was only in school to compete in athletics rather than graduate with a degree.

But the rule doesn't take into account bright, ambitious students able to pile up enough credits to graduate so that a full load is unnecessary during part of a senior year.

most schools we ever heard of.

But as long as such a system prevails, it would be wrong to discriminate against athletes in good academic standing otherwise who are due to graduate with the rest of their class.

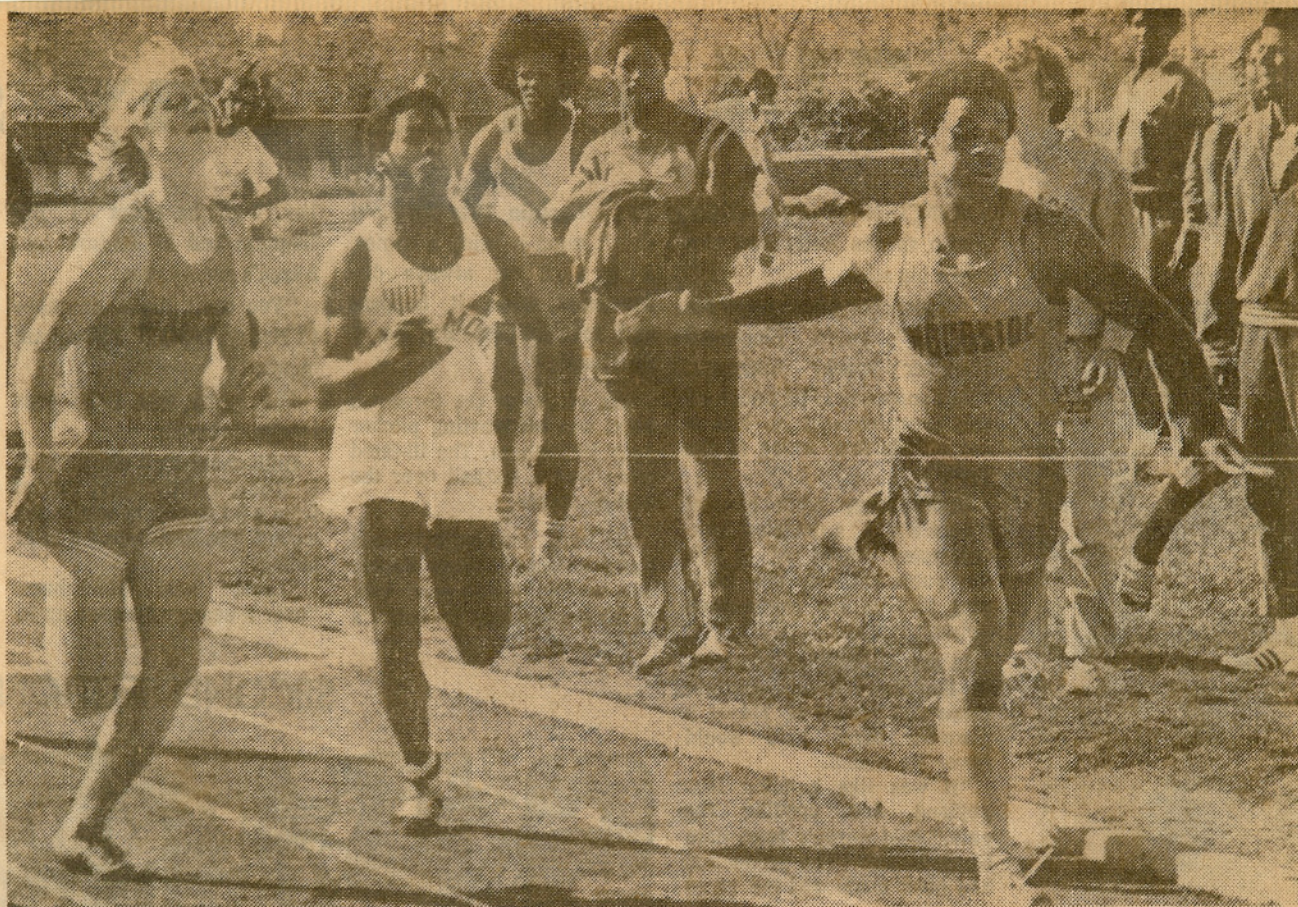

"I know of no purpose to be served under the academic requirements of the Sequoia Union High School District by the applications of rule 205, to render plaintiff Ben Parkinson or others in like situation ineligible for participation of interscholastic sports," was the concluding statement in the declarations of Yanicks, M-A football coach Ben Parks and M-A Principal Douglas D. Murray.

We have to agree. Here's a case where a legitimate student — a good one, yet — may be denied his right to participate due to some bad advice and a technicality.

Jim Hubenette, M-A long jumper, and Bill Benedaret, Palo Alto baseball star, are currently performing with the aid of the injunction also because of similar problems. Hubenette reportedly was told he could repeat a course for a better grade and it would count. But the 20-unit rule states the work must be new.

Frankly, we have to wonder about a system of graduation requirements which allows a student to take less than a full load during any of his or her eight semesters in high school. It didn't used to be that way in

'Sweet' day for cats

It was a beautiful day for SPAL track and field yesterday, but for Woodside High coach Claude Turner it was a 'Sweet' afternoon.

Turner's classy junior sprinter, Robert Sweet, won the 100, 220 and anchored the Wildcats' 440-relay team to a key win as unbeaten Woodside downed previously unbeaten Carlmont 82-54 on the Scots track yesterday.

In other meets, Menlo-Atherton had its best showing of the season as it clobbered Ravenswood 120-14, Sequoia edged Cubberley 76-58 and San Carlos romped over Gunn 82-54 despite a loss by Mitch Kingery in the two-mile.

M-A, San Carlos, Sequoia and Woodside of the SPAL and St. Francis of the WCAL are just a few of the many schools entered in the Andrew Hill Relays at San Jose City College tomorrow. Action begins with trials at 9 a.m.

"Other sprinters have gotten recognition this season," said Turner. "But Sweet has shown that he's the best in the league. He's just a great competitor."

Sweet wasn't the only Wildcat who crossed the finish line first. The Cats went at the Scots' power, winning the mile, two-mile and pole vault

— for many seasons Carlmont's strongest events — in garnering 12 of 16 first places.

One first place that got away from Woodside — and that was by inches — was in the 880. Carlmont's Brian Hurdal ran a life best 1:58.8 to edge Damon Wood. Wood came back to win the mile in

Sweet started his heroics in the day's first event as he nosed out Carlmont's anchorman to give the Wildcats five big points in the relay.

Myrt Easley then followed with a winning 15.6 in the high hurdles and the Cats were off to a rapid start. Easley also won the 180 low hurdles, triple jump and sprinted to a 50.8 440 split in a losing mile-relay effort.

Gunn's John Littleboy registered the best high jump mark of the SPAL season with a 6-6 leap, but the surprise of the meet was Jerry Emery's upset of Kingery in the two mile. Emery ran away with the event, winning in 9:29.6 to

Kingery's 9:45.0.

"I hope he just had a bad day," said Don coach Jim Luttrell. "This is the first bad race I've ever seen him run, although 9:45 really isn't that bad." Pete Butler ran a 10.2, 22.8 Don sprint double.

M-A coach Plato Yanicks was amazed at the showing he received from junior Barry O'Neill, who finished second in his initial running of the 100-yard dash. Dennis McGowan set one of four M-A meet records as he added a school record-high jump of 6-3, while soph George Smith blazed the high hurdles in 15.2.

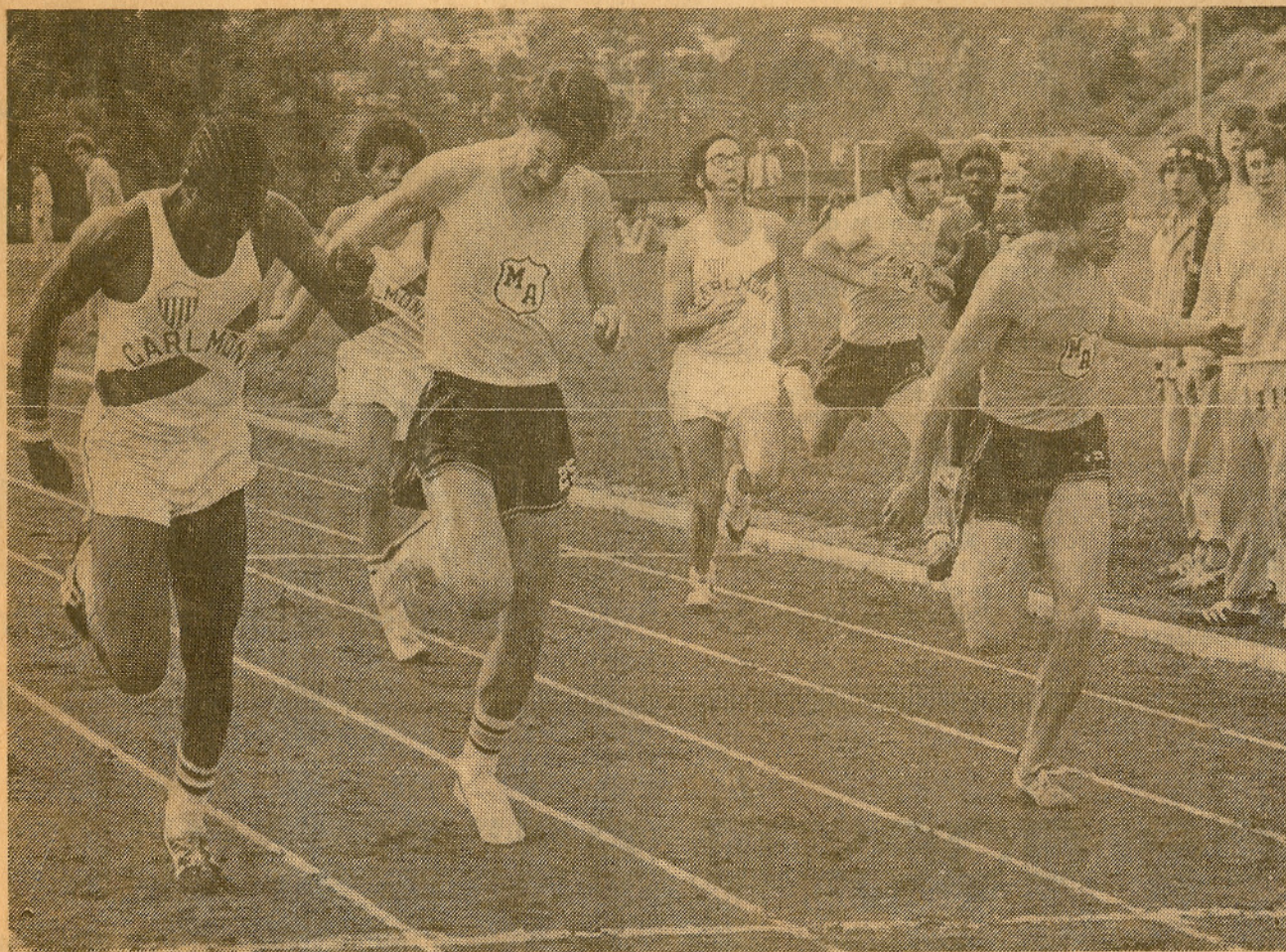

No upset thanks to Nance upsets

Although it came about in a way he did not anticipate, that didn't make Carlmont coach Loren Lansberry any less pleased with his Scots' 77-59 victory over visiting Menlo-Atherton in yesterday's only SPAL track meet.

In fact, the Old Fox is probably happier now than if the meet had unfolded exactly as he had hoped it because he may have found a potential star in sophomore Brent Nance.

Which is something the injury-depleted Scots won't mind having around next Thursday, when Carlmont, now 3-0 after dropping M-A to 2-2, takes on unbeaten Woodside (2-0) on its oval for the probable SPAL dual meet crown.

"I figured we'd win the 440 relay, but when M-A won it I thought we might be in trouble," Lansberry offered. "But Nance brought us back. He gave us an emotional lift."

How Nance did this was by tying M-A sprinting ace Ben Parkinson in the 100 and then upsetting Parkinson in the 220 on the heavy, wet track which slowed times. Parkinson wound up third behind teammate Don Mackenzie.

Also pacing the win were Mike Weber's discus heave of 155-2 1/2, the best in Carlmont history since the Jim Penrose days of 1968; Larry Wright's 6-3 high jump (he's done 6-5') and a lifetime best triple jump of 43-11 1/4 by Aaron Brisbane, who subbed for injured Scott Hazelton. Brisbane also won the long jump.

Carlmont's mile relay team of Vince Kitchens, Wyatt Bishop, Mike Tolibas and Brian Hurdal ripped off a 3:33.9, best for an SPAL club

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this season.

David Hull's third place in the two mile preceding his triumph in the mile, Mark Gerkenmeyer's 21.1 in the 180 low hurdles and Walter Bogue's 13-0 pole vault were M-A's top efforts.

The Woodside at Palo Alto (rescheduled for Tuesday), Sequoia at Ravenswood (held today weather permitting) and Gunn at Cubberley (postponed indefinitely) meets were not held due to rain.

Carlmont's junior varsity (3-0) dealt M-A (3-1) its first loss 81-55 while M-A's freshman team (3-1) handed Carlmont (2-1) its first setback by the same count.

Tomorrow, the 12th annual, varsity-only Carlmont Relays have been moved to the College of San Mateo track due to the weather. Action in the classic, cosponsored by the Carlmont and Belmont Rotary Clubs, begins at 9 a.m. with field events. Running events start at 10.
