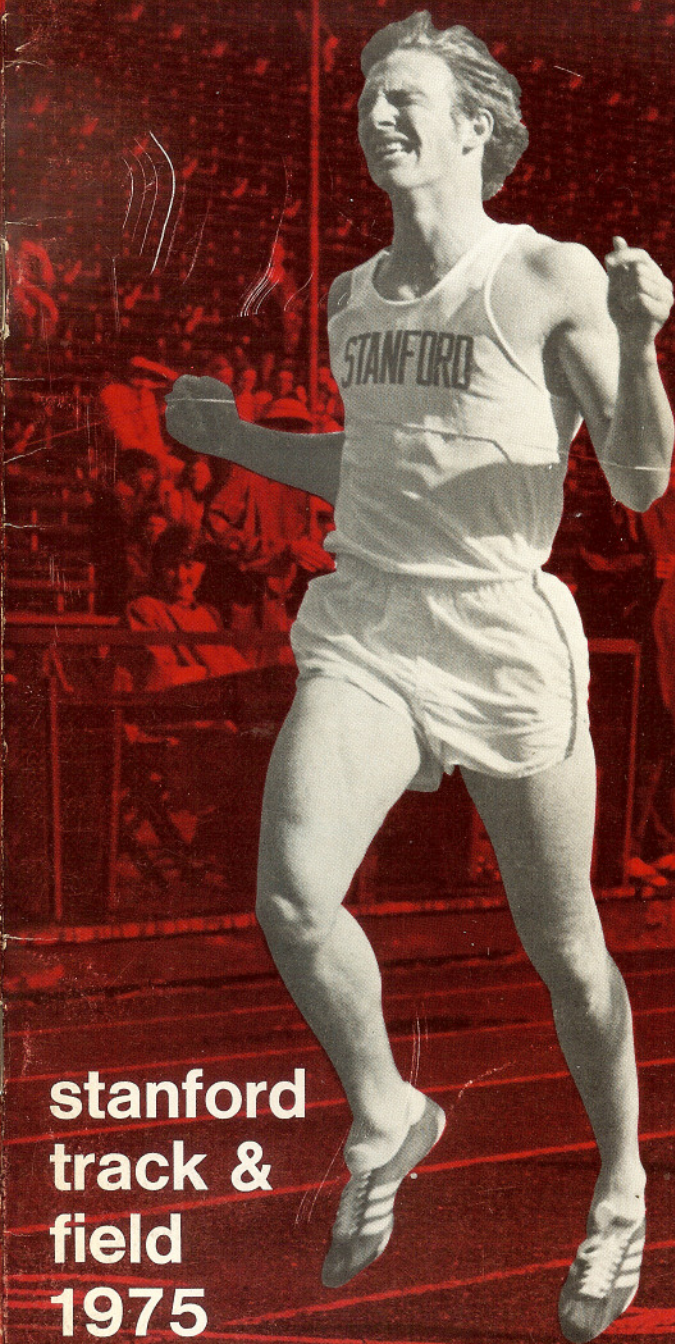

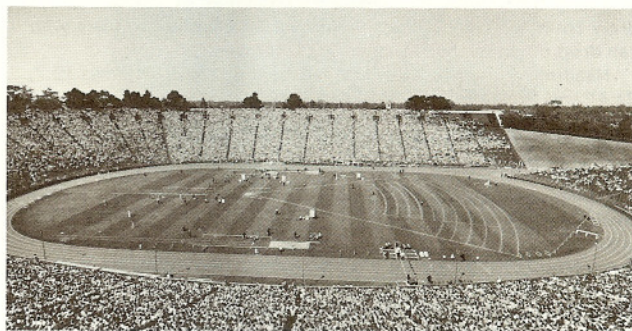

1975 STANFORD OUTLOOK

"I think this is going to be an exciting team," says Coach Payton Jordan in assessing his 1975 Stanford track and field squad.

With few key losses from last year's team and a number of promising newcomers on hand, Jordan is understandably optimistic about Stanford's chances this spring.

"We'll have better frontline strength and more depth than we've had in some time," says the Cardinal coach, now in his 19th year at Stanford.

"For the first time in 10 years, we won't have to overwork people and ask them to go in too many events. We'll have flexibility that's been absent here for awhile."

Gone from the '74 team are talented Kenny Kring, fourth in the Pacific-8 decathlon last year; Steve Hopkins, sixth in the Pac-8 javelin throw; top discus man Jim Royer, and versatile quarter-miler John Kessel.

But the other leading point-winners from last year's team return. That fact, plus the arrival of freshman long jumper James Lofton, pole vaulter Bob Flint, and other top recruits, has spurred Jordan's optimism this spring.

Lofton won the California state long jump championship last year with a leap of 24-4/4, then went on to capture the Golden West Invitational with a wind-aided 24-9/2 effort. "James definitely has NCAA championship potential," Jordan says.

Flint vaulted 16-6/4 to win the State JC pole vault championship last spring. The transfer from Fresno City College "will be a great one," says Jordan.

The 1975 Cards also appear to be very strong in the hurdles, the relays, and the distances.

"We have excellent explosiveness and depth in the hurdles," Jordan says. "Matt Hogsett is certainly one of the best intermediate hurdlers in the nation, and Dave Bagshaw and John Foster give us an outstanding one-two punch in the 120 highs."

Hogsett, a junior from Newport Beach, captured the Pac-8 440 intermediate hurdle championship last year with a 51.3 clocking. Bagshaw went 14.0 in the highs as a sophomore in '73, while Foster finished third in the California JC finals with a 14.1 effort last year. Bagshaw has also gone 52.2 in the intermediates.

Pointing to a fine crop of sprinters and quarter-milers, Jordan says, "We're going to have very strong relay teams this year."

"This is the best depth and potential we've had in the sprints in a long time," he says. "We have a large pool of fine runners to draw from, partly because of an overlay of quarter-milers who can drop down to the 100 and 220."

Heading the sprint crew are footballers Marvin Holmes (9.7, 21.4) and Forrie Martin (9.9), veteran Otto Rossner (9.8, 22.1), soph Scott Wingo (9.8, 21.9) and freshman Alan Sheats (9.8, 22.2).

Wingo and Sheats also figure most prominently in the Cardinals' 440 and mile relay plans. Wingo, the probable anchorman on the mile relay quartet, has a 47.2 relay leg to his credit. Sheats ran a leg on the state championship mile relay team from Pasadena's Muir High School. His personal best is 47.6.

In the distances, the Cards will have three proven veterans in Tony Sandoval, Mark McConnell, and Jack Bellah, plus highly promising sophomore Steve Crowley.

Sandoval, with an impressive list of marks in the 1, 2, 3, and 6-mile, "is one of the best distance runners we've had here," Jordan says. McConnell, soon to be a four-year letterman in both track and cross country, has the team's best time in the 2-mile, an 8:55.9 effort.

Bellah, labelled a "big event performer" by Jordan, placed fifth in the Pac-8 6-mile last year at 29:10.6. Crowley, who scored impressive wins in the mile against UCLA and Cal, should improve on his best time of 4:10.5 this year.

In the half-mile, Stanford has three solid performers in seniors Ben Scheible and Jim Bordon, and freshman Mark Hadley, who went 1:52.6 in high school last year.

Freshman Stacy Geiken, a California state meet finalist in the 2-mile in 1973 and 1974, will run the steeplechase this spring along with Bellah and junior Doug McLean.

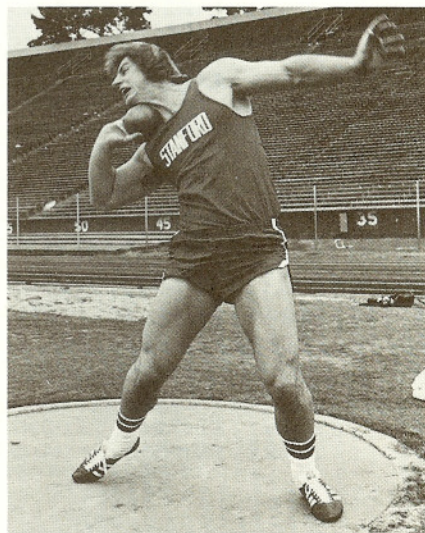
In the triple jump, Jordan has team captain Mike Hall, who leaped 49-11/4 a year ago. Hall also has the team's top mark in the high jump, 6-4. Freshman Randy Tucker, hurdler Bagshaw and long jumper Lofton could go in the high jump as well.

Though Stanford will be green in the shot, discus and javelin, Jordan feels "the development potential is outstanding." Top candidates include four footballers—soph Rich Merlo, freshman Mark Hill, soph John Olenchalk, and junior Mike Langford, hero of the 1974 Big Game.

"Hill and Merlo have excellent potential in the discus, and Olenchalk is improving all the time in the shot," Jordan says. "Merlo and Olenchalk have the capability to go in both events effectively."

In the javelin, Jordan has "three men capable of exploding into the long distances," namely Langford, junior John Macrorie, and freshman Monte Makous.

Top candidates to replace Kring in the decathlon are freshmen Carl Johnk and Carl Ellis.

1975 STANFORD PROFILES

DAVE BAGSHAW Senior Hurdles

"When healthy, he's one of the best hurdlers in the Pacific-8," says Coach Payton Jordan...Had bests of 14.3 and 52.2 last year...Was hampered by leg injuries in 1974 after clocking 14.0 as a sophomore...Placed 6th in the conference 120 highs in his freshman year...Made great progress in the 440 intermediates last spring..."Potentially, he's a great intermediate hurdler," Jordan says...A soaring enthusiast...His father, Malcolm, is chairman of Stanford Medical School's Department of Radiology.

JACK BELLAH Junior Distances

"Jack is a big event performer," says Coach Jordan...Placed 5th in the Pac-8 6-mile last year with a 29:10.6 effort...Has a best of 8:56.2 in the 2-mile...Finished 11th in the 1974 Pac-8 cross country championships, setting a Stanford record of 28:56 (6 miles) in the process...A former CCS cross country champ from San Jose's Leigh High School...Grandson of Stanford Olympian Sam Bellah, who took 6th in the pole vault in 1908 and 7th in 1912.

JIM BORDONI Senior 880

Missed most of the 1974 season because of overseas study...Has a best of 1:55.7..."Jim's made as much improvement from his freshman to senior years as anyone we've had at Stanford," says Coach Jordan...Ran impressively in winning a 660 team trial in 1:20.9 in pre-season workouts...An outstanding student with interests in biology and art history.

STEVE CROWLEY Soph Mile

A very promising miler with a great deal of natural ability...Scored impressive victories in the mile against UCLA and Cal last year as a freshman...Had a best of 4:10.5..."Steve has tremendous potential," says Coach Jordan. "He should be a top miler before long"...Finished second in the state finals as a senior at nearby Gunn High School.

BOB FLINT Junior Pole Vault

Vaulted 16-6½ to win the California JC pole vault championship last spring and establish a new state record...Comes to Stanford from Fresno City College..."He's the kind of athlete who will step right in and compete with the best in the Pac-8," says Coach Jordan. "He has great potential. Everything's in front of him"...An intense competitor who works very hard on form and technique...A definite threat to break Jim Eshelman's Stanford record of 16-11¼ and crack the 17-foot barrier this spring.

JOHN FOSTER Junior Hurdles

An impressive transfer from Foothill College in Los Altos...Placed third in the California JC meet with a 14.1 effort in the 120 highs..."An outstanding high hurdler and good intermediate hurdler," says Coach Jordan. "He's proven himself in pressure meets. We expect him to be in the thick of Pac-8 competition"...Attended nearby Los Altos High School...Also plans to act in stage productions at Stanford.

STACY GEIKEN Freshman Distances

A promising newcomer from Palo Alto's Cubberley High...Competed in the state meet twice in the 2-mile...Has a best of 9:11.0...Has looked good in the steeplechase in pre-season practice..."He could be one of the best steeplechasers we've had here," says Jordan...Hobby is backpacking.

MARK HADLEY **Freshman** **880**

"A big, strong runner with great potential," says Coach Jordan...Was a California state meet finalist in the half-mile last year...Has the best time of Stanford's half-milers, a 1:52.6 clocking...Could also be used in the mile relay this year...Pre-med major.

MIKE HALL **Senior** **TJ, HJ**

Stanford's 1975 team captain..."One of the leading returning triple jumpers in the Pac-8," Coach Jordan says...Has a life best of 49-11 $\frac{1}{4}$ to rank fifth on the all-time list at Stanford...Called one of the hardest workers on the team by his coaches...Also has the team's top mark in the high jump, 6-4...Could be a consistent point winner in that event, as well.

MARK HILL **Freshman** **Discus**

An impressive newcomer from Santa Clara's Wilcox High School...Labelled "a tremendous raw talent," by Coach Jordan...Best mark was 160-0 in high school...Was a prep football All-America...Played center for Stanford's JV football team last fall..."In early practice, he looks to have as much ability as any freshman discus thrower I've seen here," Jordan says.

MATT HOGSETT **Junior** **440 IH**

The defending Pacific-8 champion in the 440 intermediate hurdles...Was the top Stanford athlete in the national track and field rankings a year ago..."He has all the tools to become one of the best in the world, in my opinion," Coach Jordan says...Has a best of 51.3...A definite threat to break Randy White's Stanford record of 50.7...Will also be one of the Cards' key mile relay men this year...Has run a 47.4 mile relay leadoff leg...With two years remaining, a strong challenger for national honors in the 440 hurdles.

MARVIN HOLMES **Soph** **Sprints**

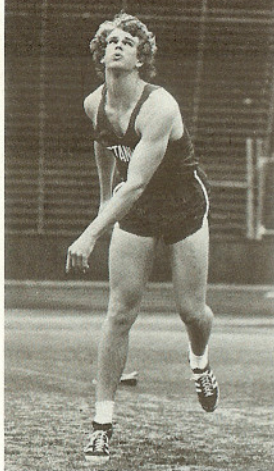
Stanford's leading sprinter going into the 1974 season...Has bests of 9.7 in the 100 and 21.4 in the 220...Called a rugged, hard-working performer by his coaches...Played halfback for Stanford's varsity football team last fall...Won the 220 in a non-scoring meet at El Paso last year and scored in most meets for Stanford...Will probably be the leadoff man on the Cards' 440 relay team.

MIKE LANGFORD **Junior** **Javelin**

"He's going to be a very good javelin thrower," Coach Jordan says...Competed in the shot, discus, and javelin at Atwater High School...Transferred to Stanford from Merced JC...Has a best of 189-11 in the javelin...Appears to have excellent potential...Best known as the hero of the 1974 Big Game, kicking a 50-yard game-winning field goal in the last second.

JAMES LOFTON **Freshman** **LJ, 440**

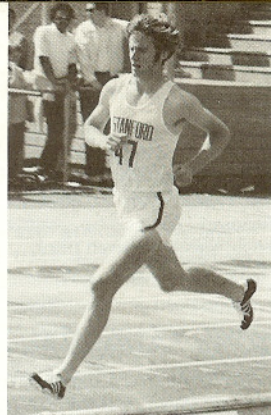
Won the state and Golden West Invitational long jump championship last year while competing for Los Angeles' Washington High...Leaped 24-4 $\frac{1}{4}$ to win the state meet...Took the Golden West with a wind-aided 24-9 $\frac{1}{4}$...Also has high-jumped 6-4, triple-jumped 48-1 and run a 47.8 mile relay leg...A tremendously talented and versatile athlete who is also considered an outstanding football prospect as a wide receiver...Likely to be used in both relays and in the 440 this spring..."He's fast enough and strong enough to run in both relays," Coach Jordan says. "He's an odds-on choice to win the NCAA long jump championship while at Stanford. He'll have to contend with people like Randy Williams of USC and Jerry Herndon of UCLA, who also won the California prep championship. But he's equal to the challenge."

JOHN MACRORIE Junior Javelin

An impressive transfer from Fullerton JC...Had bests of 205-7 in the javelin and 23-1½ in the long jump last year, despite being handicapped by a knee injury...Will concentrate primarily on the javelin at Stanford...A left-handed thrower, the first at Stanford since school record-holder Tim Colby...Wants to be a lawyer...Also interested in photography.

MONTE MAKOUS Freshman Javelin

"We're extremely high on him as a top javelin prospect," Coach Jordan says...Threw 198-6 in high school and 191 at an all-comers meet this year...Also threw the shot and discus in high school...Works very hard on perfecting technique...Plans to major in chemistry, but also interested in music.

FORRIE MARTIN Senior Sprints

Could be one of the big surprises of the 1975 track season...A star line-backer on Stanford's football team the past two years...Has returned to track after concentrating solely on football in 1974...Competed in four meets as a sophomore before moving over to spring football...Clocked 9.9 in his best effort in the 100...Has lost 30 pounds since the end of the 1974 football season, dropping from 220 to 190..."He has good natural quickness off the blocks, and he's a super competitor," Coach Jordan says. "He could be a top sprinter"...May anchor the 440 relay for Stanford this year...A brilliant student who will attend medical school next fall.

REGGIE MASON Soph 440 IH

"If you're building a team on desire, he'd be at the head of the list," Coaches Jordan and Clark say...Has the potential to be a fine hurdler...Already one of the team leaders as a sophomore...Will also be used in the mile relay this year...Wants to earn degrees in medicine and marine biology.

MARK McCONNELL Senior Distances

A top distance runner with excellent times in the 1, 2, and 3-mile...Has the team's best time in the 2-mile, an 8:55.9 effort...Will be the first four-year letterman in both track and cross country in Stanford history...Captained the 1974 Card cross country team...Placed 7th in the Pac-8 3-mile last spring...Has never missed a meet while competing for Stanford..."One of the most respected members of the team," Coach Jordan says.

RICH MERLO Junior Discus

Is competing in track for Stanford for the first time this spring...A fine linebacker for the Cards' football team...An extremely strong athlete...Threw the discus 166-0 in high school..."He has a lot of promise," Jordan says. "I really feel that with Rich and Mark Hill, we'll have a surprisingly good one-two punch in the discus."

JOHN OLENCHALK Soph Shot Put

A rapidly-improving weight man with excellent potential...Called "the leader of the movement of football players into track," by Coach Jordan...Had a best of 48-9½ as a freshman, but was consistently at 52 feet in pre-season practice..."He's made greater strides in one year than anyone in our weight program in a long time," Jordan says. "I anticipate he'll be in the high 50's this year without question."

JEFF PARIETTI Soph Distances

A promising distance runner with range from the 880 to the 2-mile...Will probably concentrate most on the mile this year...Has a life best of 4:13.0...Placed in the state mile as a prepster in Washington...A graduate of Seattle Prep, the same school that produced Stanford 2-mile record-holder Don Kardong...Wants to go into sportswriting...His father, Walt, is a sportswriter for the *Seattle Times*.

OTTO ROSSNER Senior Sprints

Expected to be a key man for the 1975 Cards in the sprints and mile relay...Hampered by a painful hamstring pull last year...Has life bests of 9.8 and 22.0..."He's fully recovered this year, and we expect him to have an excellent season," Jordan says...A licensed pilot who wants to become an astronaut or an engineering research pilot.

TONY SANDOVAL Junior Distances

"One of the best distance runners we've ever had here," Coach Jordan says...Has the team's best times in the mile (4:09.3), 3-mile (13:45.5) and 6-mile (28:58.6)...Has undergone several operations during the past six months to remove a series of hard callouses on his foot...Healthy now, but has lost much training time...Finished 7th in the NCAA 6-mile last year...Placed 6th in the Pac-8 6-mile in 1973...Broke the course record in winning the Stanford cross country Invitational last fall...Also won the Pac-8 Southern Division race.

BEN SCHEIBLE Senior 880

Showed much improvement last year after missing the 1973 campaign because of overseas study...Scored for Stanford in numerous meets..."A stylish runner and very intense competitor," says Coach Jordan. "Ben, Mark Hadley and Jim Bordoni give us a fine group of half-milers"...Has a best of 1:54.0.

ALAN SHEATS Freshman 440

An outstanding prospect from Pasadena's Muir High School, the 1974 California champs...Ran a leg on the state championship mile relay team...Their 3:13.8 clocking was best in the U.S. last year...Has bests of 47.6 in the 440, 22.2 in the 220 and 9.8 in the 100..."He's going to be a great quarter-miler, and he has the leg speed to be a top 220 man," Coach Jordan says. "He's a courageous athlete and an exciting runner to watch"...Should contribute in both relays this year...Wants to be a dentist...Also interested in photography.

SCOTT WINGO Soph 440

"Probably the most versatile long sprinter we have," says Coach Jordan. "He's one of the quickest quarter-milers I've seen in terms of generating speed"...Had bests of 48.5 and 47.2 in the mile relay last year...Also has gone 9.8 in the 100 and 21.9 in the 220...Expected to anchor the mile relay this year...Could also run in the 440 relay and drop down to the 220...Attended Mt. Whitney High School in Visalia, where he was coached by Hank Roldan, a former javelin star at Stanford.

Payton Jordan moves into his 19th year at Stanford as one of the world's most highly respected track and field coaches. Jordan is a recognized leader in developing track and field champions, as exemplified by his accomplishments as head coach of the 1968 U.S. Olympic team. That team won more medals and broke more records than any other team in history.

In addition to being a successful coach, Jordan is himself an excellent athlete. He has recently returned to competition in the over-50 age bracket and holds five world sprint records in that division.

Jordan came to Stanford in 1957 after 10 triumphant years of coaching at Occidental College. During that period (1946-56), he produced 10 league championships, two NAIA titles, and a 4th place finish in the NCAA finals.

In 18 years on the Farm, Jordan has built a strong track and field program. The highlight of team competition was a 2nd place finish in the 1963 NCAA Championships. Payton has also produced a number of world class athletes, including high jumper Peter Boyce, discus thrower Dave Weill, sprinter Larry Questad, and miler Ernie Cunliffe, all recent Olympians.

Before becoming head coach at Occidental, Jordan competed for the University of Southern California, where he starred in three sports. Prior to enrolling at USC, Jordan had clocked 9.6 in the 100 and 21.1 in the 220 at Santa Monica Junior College. During the next three years for the Trojans, he captained the track squad, played rugby, and was a halfback on the 1938 football team which went on to defeat Duke in the 1939 Rose Bowl.

After graduating from USC, Jordan ran the 100 in 9.5 to set a world record for grass tracks, and later ran an unofficial 9.3 on a dirt track. In the service, he was an All-America halfback for the Iowa Naval Air Station.

Jordan has extensive experience in international competition as a coach and organizer. In addition to his head coaching duties in the 1968 Olympics, he worked as first assistant track coach for U.S. Olympians in 1964, and served for 12 years (1961-73) as a member of the U.S. Olympic Committee. He has also worked with the Yugoslavian and Greek national teams, and assisted the U.S. teams in the 1965 Maccabiah Games, the 1965 Deaf Games, and the 1970 World Games.

Jordan organized and promoted the U.S. vs. U.S.S.R. competition at Stanford Stadium in 1962. The two-day event attracted more than 150,000 spectators.

Vice-president of the International Track Coaches Association since 1966, he is also past President of the National Collegiate Track Coaches Association and a former member of both the NCAA Rules and AAU Track and Field committees. He was one of the founders of the Southern California Striders.

Jordan is author of several articles and two books on track and field, including "Champions in the Making," which he co-authored with assistant coach Bud Spencer. In 1967, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics elected Jordan to its Hall of Fame, and in 1972 he was named to the United Savings-Helms Hall of Fame in Los Angeles.

Returning to competition in 1972, Jordan holds world records for the over-50 division in the 60-yard dash (6.9), 100-yard dash (10.6), 100-meter dash (11.6), 220-yard dash (24.6), and 200-meter dash (24.2).

Payton lives in Los Altos with his wife, Marge. The Jordans have two daughters and three grandchildren. Payton was born in Whittier, California, on March 19, 1917.

**Assistant Track and Field Coach
Head Cross Country Coach**

An excellent complement to the work of Payton Jordan in building a strong track and field program has been the enthusiastic and dedicated help of assistant coach Marshall Clark, now in his seventh year at Stanford. He is also the head cross country coach for the Cards.

Coming to the Farm in 1968, Clark met with instant success, guiding his cross country team through an undefeated season and a 2nd place finish in the NCAA Championships behind Villanova. Leading the Cards that year were All-Americans Brook Thomas and Greg Brock. Under Clark's guidance, Brock repeated as an All-America in 1969 and Don Kardong followed in 1970. In 1974, Stanford finished 4th in the Pac-8 and harrier Tony Sandoval won the Pac-8 Southern Division title.

Like Jordan, Marshall is a graduate of the University of Southern California where he earned a B.S. degree in 1957 and a Master's in 1958. At USC, he was a member of the 1955 NCAA Championship track team and a letterman in track and cross country from 1955-57. Clark also competed for the Southern California Striders for three years in the 440 and 880. For the past two years, he has been active in Masters' (over-40) track competition.

In 1958, Clark began his coaching career as head of the cross country team at Los Altos H.S. in La Puente. After nine years at Los Altos, he moved to Monterey's Seaside H.S. for a year. During his 10 years of high school coaching, Clark's cross country teams won six league titles and a CIF Southern Section championship. His track teams chalked up three league titles.

In February, 1972, Marshall was chosen to lead a team of U.S. athletes to Moscow for three days of international competition.

Clark, 41, and his wife, Beverly, have three children.

BUD SPENCER

Assistant Track and Field Coach

Bud Spencer, one of the greatest runners ever to attend Stanford, works with the Card sprinters, hurdlers, and quarter-milers. En route to the 1928 Olympics, Bud shattered a 12-year-old world record for 400 meters and then went on to win the NCAA 440-Yard Championship. His swift leg on the 1600-meter relay team helped bring the U.S. a Gold Medal. He later anchored a record-breaking mile relay quartet in the U.S. vs. British Empire Games. Spencer is co-author of "Champions in the Making" with head coach Payton Jordan.

KENNY KRING and JIM ROYER

**Graduate Assistants
GEORGE BERRY, Manager**

Giving further strength to the Cardinal track staff this year will be the addition of two former Stanford track and field stars, Kenny Kring and Jim Royer, as graduate assistants. Kring, Stanford's all-time leader in the pentathlon, will be tutoring in the jumps, while Royer, Stanford's number one man in the discus last year, will be offering guidance in the weight events.

It's no coincidence that these two 1974 graduates were co-captains for the Cards last year. Head coach Payton Jordan stressed, "I'll count on these two fine young men for the same kind of leadership as coaches that they displayed as performers."

Both Kring and Royer plan careers in coaching, and Jordan feels they will make a major contribution to the Stanford program this year.

Another valuable member of the Card staff is manager George Berry, a junior from West Boylston, Mass. "George does a heck of a job and helps us out a great deal," Jordan says.

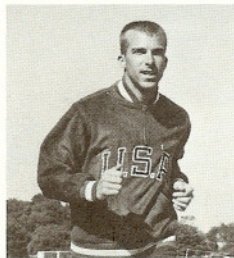
