Jordan sees rosy future for Stanford Relays

Stanford track and field coach Pavton Jordan sees a silver lining for the Stanford Relays, revived Saturday as rain clouds shadowed Stanford Stadi-3/24/75 um.

Jordan says he is already making preliminary plans to stage next year's meet and anticipates an upgrading of the event to where it may eventually rank among the state's better college relays.

"This is a hot spot for a fine relay meet," says Jordan. "We have the stadium, enthusiastic fans and normally good weather to make it one of the best. But it will take some time to develop it."

Jordan said he has had inquiries from such schools as Oregon State and Washington State to compete next year and has given some thought to "beefing up the mile run with a class field."

The relays, previously held from 1960 to 1966, drew 5,000 dampened spectators who sat through occasional rain showers to see six college teams and nine high schools compete in the all-day program.
