# CCS Ranks Decimated

SAN DIEGO—A handful of standouts were today trying to hide the disappointments which befell Central Coast Section athletes Friday in the trials of the 57th annual Boys and second annual Girls California Interscholastic Federation Track & Field Championships at Balboa Stadium.

The finals were scheduled this afternoon with the CCS having filled only 15 out of 45 possible berths in the boys finals and only seven out of 24 in the girls division. Trials were not held in the boys 2-

mile and girls mile run, shot put and discus.

Conrad Suhr of Leigh won his heat of the 880 in 1:53.4 and Don Finley of Cupertino took his 330 low hurdles race in 37.2 as all three CCS hopefuls in the latter event advanced to the finals.

Ron Kennedy of Serramonte was the only other CCS athlete to win his heat when he skipped over the 120 yard high hurdles in 13.9.

Glenn Cannon of Mount Pleasant, a junior making his second appearance in this

meet, finished third in his heats of the 100 and 220 in 9.7 and 21.3 and also anchored the Cardinals mile relay team into the finals with a 3:21.8, also good for third place.

Keith Taylor, regarded as a threat for the 220 title in pre-meet blurbs, ran out of the money in the 100 despite a 9.7 clocking and did qualify for the finals in the 220 with his second place. He was caught in 21.3.

San Jose area athletes qualifying in the field were

Steve Oravetz (Campbell) and Marion Medeiros (Cupertino) in the pole vault, and Gary Bersano (Los Gatos) and Craig Watkins (Mitty) in the discus. The CCS failed to qualify anyone in the 100, mile, 440 relay, long jump and shot put.

Most surprising aspect was the failure of Woodside's 440 relay team which went into the event with the second best clocking in the state at 41.6. The Wildcats clocked

42.3 in Friday's trials, Mount Pleasant was sixth in its heat and Serramonte fifth in its race.

Taking Friday's individual honors was San Jose State-bound Dedy Cooper (Ells of Richmond) who equalled a pending national record of 13.2 in the high hurdles, won his heat of the 330 lows in 36.2, and anchored his relay teams to wins in their heats in 41.1 for the 440 and 3:16.5 in the mile. He ran an anchor 46.1 in the latter.

Elijah Jefferson of San Diego Crawford, bidding for a third straight state title in the 100, won his heat with a 9.4 which was matched in the next race by Joel Andrews (West Bakersfield).

Among the qualifiers in the girls events were Kathy Schentrup (Willow Glen) who was third in 11.1 in her heat of the 80 yard hurdles, Mary Ellis (Yerba Buena) third in 25.0 in the 220, and the Milpi-

tas 880 medley relay team, third in 1:51.4.

Also qualifying were Pam Blackburn (Cubberley), defending high jump champion who made it in the long jump but not in the high jump, Lezli Peterson (Harbor) in the 440, and Denise Cornell (King City) in the high jump. Harbor's medley relay team also qualified for today's finals.

Five meet records fell and one was tied during the trials of the girls events while in the boys, Cooper set the lone mark in the high hurdles, established another in the lows which is a new event, and Jefferson and Andrews tied the 100-yard dash mark which Jefferson shared with two other sprinters.



# Cooper Ends Newport's Hopes

*June 6 1975 state trials*

SAN DIEGO—Dedy Cooper is rolling and Newport Harbor High's hopes for the team title have evaporated in his wake.

Cooper of Harry Ells High in Richmond dominated the qualifying session Friday at the 57th Championships at Balboa Stadium, Annual California State Track

ium. Responding to a challenge by Saddleback's John Peterson, Cooper tied the pending national record in the high hurdles with a 13.2 clocking. He also led the 330 low hurdle qualifiers with a 36.2, anchored the Ells' 440 relay to a 44.1, and ran a 46.1 anchor on the mile relay team which was timed in 3:16.5.

Both relay times are the fastest in the state this year. The 440 relay is especially significant since pre-meet favorite Crawford (San Diego) was disqualified for passing out of zone.

Saddleback's Peterson gave Cooper all he could handle in the high hurdles. Peterson was out of the blocks first and held a slight lead through the first half of the race. The two were close as they were over the eighth hurdle, but Cooper pulled away to win by two yards. Peterson was clocked in a lifetime best 13.5.

Cypress' Tom Turner qualified for today's finals, which start at noon with the field events and the first race at 1:30. Turner was third behind Peterson with a 14.0 clocking.

Mission Viejo's Wilbur Gregory finished second in his high hurdle heat with a 14.1 tie.

Loara's Ralph Serna, who will attempt the difficult mile-two-mile double today, was surprised in his mile heat by Hollywood's Ajim Baksh, but was a "safe" third to qualify in 4:13.3. Baksh, jumped the field with less than 500 yards left and opened up a 20 yard lead to win in a lifetime best 4:11.2.

Huntington Beach's Robert Angel waited too long before beginning his patented sprint to the tape. Angel managed fifth in the second heat at 4:17.8, but the ninth qualifying spot went to De Anza's Bob McMeans who ran 4:16.2 for fifth in the first heat.

Despite Cooper's spectacular effort, Newport Harbor should

still make a strong showing in today's finals.

As expected shot putter David Kurrasch led the qualifying with a toss of 66-9. Southern Section rivals Brad Slinkard (63-0½) of St. Paul and David Laut (62-8¾) of Santa Clara were second and third.

Newport Harbor's Brian Theriot had no trouble in his heat as he coasted to a 47.7 in the 440. He will not be able to coast today however as he meets Sacramento's Johnny Ware who was impressive in winning his heat in 47.5.

Theriot came back later with a 47.9 anchor leg on the Tar mile relay team which won its heat in a season best 3:16.8, which was the second fastest time of the day behind Ells' 3:16.5.

Times in the sprints and hurdles bordered on the sensational, the result of Balboa Stadium's super-swift all-weather track and some erratic timing by the officials.

Crawford's Elijah Jefferson, who is bidding for his third straight State Meet 100 yard dash title, equalled the State Meet record of 9.4 in the first heat. Joel Andrews of West (Bakersfield) did the same in the second heat.

All three winners in the 220 heat clocked 21.1, including Compton's Lew Mc Glothin, whose previous best was 21.8.

State CIF Championships: (June 6-7, San Diego) - Dedy Cooper paced Ells of Richmond to the championship and pig-tailed Kathy Costello of Pleasant Hill captured two firsts to highlight the California State CIF Championships. Three year State Meet veteran Cooper accounted for virtually all of Ells' points in his superlative effort. He was second in a highly controversial high hurdle race which saw certainly one and probably two men jump the gun without being recalled. Robert Gaines (Kennedy, Richmond) finally got his day against Cooper and won in a fine 13.3, with Cooper and Peterson (Saddleback) taking the next two spots in the same time. Cooper set the State record and equalled the national record in Friday's trials with a 13.2. He then came back to win the 330 lows with an easy 36.5 after running a meet record 36.2 in the trials. He started out the day by anchoring Ells' 440 relay team to victory after getting the baton in fourth or fifth place. Finally, he blitzed to a low-46 effort in pulling home Ells' mile relay to victory in a 3:15.7. Credit should certainly be given to the other members of the relay teams (Ed Miller, Anthony Williams, Renondo Gentry, and James Davis) who turned in fine performances that very probably would have placed them in each event even without Dedy.

Costello was the highlight of the girls competition with her awesome victories in the 880 (2:09.2) and mile (4:53.5), both of which were national high school records. She was virtually uncontested in either race, even though Lassen's Pam Allen was second in the mile at 5:00.5, which also bettered the old national record. The mile was a clean sweep for NorCal, with Tamalpais' Maggie Keyes third (5:02.9), Sue Munday (Lincoln of San Jose) fourth (5:03.8), and Sara Sweeney (Marin Catholic) fifth in the same time.

NorCal had several other fine champions, accounting for one of our best years in the CIF Meet. Johnny Ware of Sacramento started off slowly but came on strong to win going away in the 440 with a 47.2, easily defeating the more publicized Brian Theriot of Newport Harbor. Mike Alberg of Lodi was an upset winner in the discus with a single toss one inch beyond second place. His 171-11 was the shortest winning toss in the 17-year history of the event! All-NorCal footballer Mike Dobbins of Merced won the triple jump in 49-3, upsetting favorite Dan Jackson (Oakland) 49-2, and basketball star Myrt Easley (Woodside) 49-2. Conrad Suhr (Leigh, San Jose) took the lead in the 880 at the end of the final turn to out-duel Dan Aldridge of Petaluma for victory in 1:51.0, and John Johnson of Skyline (Oakland) drew much applause from the more than 15,000 fans with his 58.2 anchor lap to win the mile in 4:09.5.

The girls found the going a bit tougher, as Yvonne Boone of Fremont (Oakland) was the only other champion besides Costello. Yvonne, who had set a national record of 10.2 in the OAL Championships, ran 10.1 in both the trials and finals over the 80 yard lows to obliterate the field. Los Angeles area girls seemed to dominate everything else, although there were some outstanding efforts in a 'losing' cause. In the 440, frosh Lesli Peterson (Harbor, Santa Cruz) finished second in 55.9, and Lilly Partina (Yuba City) third in 56.0, both times being under the national high school record, which was set by the winner, Jodi Anderson (Washington, LA). Pam Allen of Lassen, the national girls' X-C champion, was second in the mile and fourth in the 880. Merced's Tuti Lee was a solid second in the hurdles. Defending high jump champ Pam Blackburn (Cubberley, Palo Alto) failed to clear the qualifying height (5-2) but did manage a third in the long jump. Terry Prince (Anderson) was second in the unofficial girls discus.

There were many fine performances among the boys, which were not necessarily winning efforts. Dwayne Pulliam (Skyline-Oakland) jumped consistently well and earned third in the long jump, while Brad Vassar (Sonora) upped his PR considerably while getting third in the shot (64-11 1/2), fourth best in NorCal annals. The high jump was won by All-American basketball star Johnny Washington (Fremont, LA) at 7-0, but the next three spots went to NorCal leapers. Coart Owens (Castlemont), John Lane (American, Fremont), and Kirk Collins (Monterey) all cleared 6-10. The very fast 2-mile saw Roy Kissin (San Ramon) finish third in 8:56.2, with Mitch Kingery (San Carlos) next at 8:57.3 after staying with Hulst and Serna until about a 660 to go. Only three others have run faster than Kissin in NorCal history. /Chris Kinder/

# Prep Hurdle Star Ties U.S. Record

## Cooper Posts :13.2; :09.4 For Jefferson

Elijah Jefferson set the groundwork for his unprecedented third straight 100-yard dash title but was upstaged in yesterday's California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) state track and field championship prelims at Balboa Stadium.

The Crawford High senior equalled his state meet 100 record, running :09.4 before 7,000 onlookers.

Under normal conditions, that would assure the Colt speedster not only the favorite role in today's finals, starting at noon, but would easily be the most impressive performance.

Not so yesterday.

Dedy Cooper of Ells High in Richmond scorched a :13.2 in the 120-yard high hurdles to tie the pending national record.

Earlier this year Mike Roberson of Winter Park, Florida, also clocked a :13.2, three tenths of a second faster than the recognized mark.

Cooper used the high hurdles as a springboard to an outstanding one-day performance which included an easy :36.2 in the 330 low hurdles, a leg on the Ells 440 relay team which clocked a :41.1; and finished with a :46.1 440 leg on the mile relay team which ran the top time in the state this year, 3:16.5.

disqualified.

It didn't seem to have an adverse effect on Jefferson.

Getting perhaps his best start of the year in the 100, Jefferson bolted to a quick three-yard lead which he held to the tape, tying the meet record run by Mel Gary the last time the meet was held here in 1967 and run by Jefferson last year.

His celebration was short lived.

In the second heat, West Bakersfield's Joel Andrews matched Jefferson's time, looking equally impressive. Andrews expressed amazement and happiness over his best time in the event.

With Cooper making such a strong showing, Ells easily became the heavy favorite to win the state title in today's finals.

Crawford, which figured to have an outside chance before the prelims, had their hopes quickly dashed when the Colt 440 relay team, struggling to stay in the running after a bad baton pass, went out of the allotted exchange area and was

Jefferson also qualified for the 220 finals, but in far less impressive fashion. Getting out fast again, Jefferson seemed to relax coming off the turn and was passed by Norris Jones of Barstow Kennedy.

Jones ran :21.1 while Jefferson was second in :21.3.

The meet featured few upsets in the boys division, meaning runners like Petaluma's Dan Aldridge, Loara's Ralph Serna and Henry's Thom Hunt and field event specialists like Newport Harbor's Dave Kurrasch and Villa Park's Keith Schimmel will vie today.

Aldridge was solid in winning a fast 880 heat at 1:51.8. While not seeming to push, he had plenty of competition.

Los Angeles Birmingham's Tom Hacche clocked a 1:52.1, just two-tenths ahead of a surprising Paul Becklund of Patrick Henry.

Becklund's time of 1:52.3 is third on the all-time San Diego County list, bettered only by Madison's Bob Hose in (1964 (1:49.2) and Hilltop's Terry Rodgers in 1966 (1:50.4).

## Hulst Breaks 2-Mile Record

SAN DIEGO—A record-breaking performance by Eric Hulst of Laguna Beach in the two-mile highlighted Saturday's 57th annual California State track and field championships.

But Hulst's brilliant 8:44.9 effort was not the only story in the meet witnessed by an estimated crowd of 17,000 on a pleasant afternoon at Balboa Stadium.

There were surprises as Dedy Cooper of Harry Ellis (Richmond)—which won the team title—did not win the 120-yard high hurdles after equaling the national record in Friday's prelims and Crawford's Elijah Jefferson failed to make it three straight victories in the 100.

There were outstanding performances by L.A. City athletes, including a sweep of the sprints—San Fernando's Kevin Williams won the 100 in a meet-record equalling 9.4 and Hamilton's Billy Mullins took the 220 in 21.2—and a victory in the high jump at 7-0 by Fremont's Johnny Washington.

And there was domination in the girls' competition by LA City perfor-

ers including six victories and an easy team title to Washington capped by a national-record performance of 1:44.5 in the 880 medley relay.

The girls, with Kathy Costello of Pleasant Hill setting records in both the 880 and mile, broke four national marks and equalled two others.

Hulst, 5-10, 180-pound junior, was exceptionally consistent in his state record two mile as he went past the mile in 4:21 and did not run any lap slower than 68 seconds.

The race was a direct contrast to last year's when Hulst chased De La Salle's Rich Kimball most of the way and wound up second in 8:50.6 as Kimball set a state record of 8:46.5.

Hulst moved out in front at the start as Loara's Ralph Serna and San Carlos' Mitch Kingery stayed right behind. By the seventh lap, it was Hulst and Serna all alone and, although Serna tried two or three times to move ahead, Hulst was in control and increased his margin to four yards at the finish. Serna also wound up breaking the record with a clocking of 8:45.9.

Hulst's time is the fourth fastest ever for a prep, bettered only by Craig Virgin of Lebanon, Ill. (8:41.0 and 8:42.6) and the late Steve Prefontaine of Coos Bay, Ore. (8:41.6). Hulst's time also set a national record for a junior, eclipsing the record of 8:48.8 set by Santa Monica's Curtis Beck in 1972.

Both the 120 high hurdles, won by Robert Gaines of Kennedy of Richmond, and the 100 had their share of controversy as it appeared that both Gaines and Williams got off to rolling starts.

Gaines' start may have been legal but Cooper obviously thought there would be a recall because he was left in the blocks. When he did get going, Gaines and Saddleback's John Peterson had at least a five-yard edge.

Cooper made it close at the finish and all three were timed in a splendid 13.3.

Williams, just as he did in the City meet, was away quickly and Jefferson, who won at Woodland in 1973 and Bakersfield last year, couldn't catch him.

"I figured that if I got off quick, I could win, said Williams, a junior who was also All-City as a halfback on the Tigers' City championship team last year. "I was nervous yesterday and didn't start well but I almost caught him (Jefferson), so I knew I had a chance."

In the 220, Mullins, also a junior, made a big move in the last 50 yards to overtake Joel Andrews of West of Bakersfield and give the City its first 220 champion since Willie Deckard in 1968.

In addition to Hulst, the Southern Section had two other winners in pole vaulter Keith Schimmel of Villa Park, who cleared 15-6 to edge his teammate, Tim Vahlstrom, on number of misses and shot putter Dave Kurrasch of Newport Harbor, did 65-9½ to nudge Dave Laut of Santa Clara, who threw 65-9 on his final attempt.

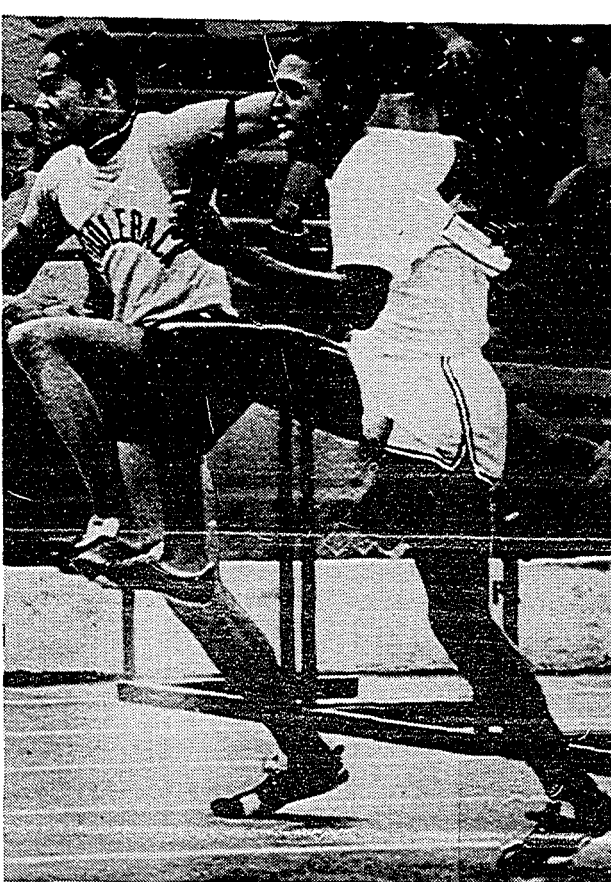
Although Cooper faltered in the high hurdles, if you can call a 13.3 faltering, he came back to win the 330 low hurdles (36.5) W and run a 46.3 anchor leg that helped Ells take the mile relay in 3:15.7.

Ells thus dethroned Muir as team champion with 22 points followed by Newport Harbor with 14 and Pasadena with 11.

Washington's team victory in the girls competition was keyed, as usual, by another spectacular performance by Jodi Anderson who (a) ran third in the 80 low hurdles as Fremont of Oakland's Yvon Boone equalled her own national and State mark of 10.1; (b)—won the 440 in a state and national record 55.3 and (c)—retained her title in the long jump at 19-6½; (d)—ran a 58.6 anchor leg on the record-setting 880 medley relay.

## State Meet Notes

The two-mile obviously had an important impact on the mile as Serna had nothing left and wound up last. Tom Hunt of Patrick Henry, another of the favorites, finished fifth after running 9:30.2 in the two-mile, and Hollywood's Ajim Baksh, who dropped out of the eight-lapper after five laps, wound up sixth in 4:17.3 after running 4:11 in the prelims. . . Pasadena's

Ricky Jackson finished fourth in the 220 but then was "disqualified." Jackson was replacing Sacramento's John Ware, who had scratched, but no substitution is allowed in that situation. . . Ware earlier had won the 440, overtaking Newport Harbor's Brian Theriot with 80 yards to go. . . Cooper also overtook Theriot in the mile relay, coming from fourth place to prance past the Newport Harbor runner in the stretch. . . In addition to Anderson's two wins, the other City girls' titlists were Manual Arts' Sandra Howard in the 100 (10.7), Bell's Pam Waters in the 220 (24.4) and Los Angeles' sophomore Kim Maddox, who equalled the State record at 5-8 after having a previous best of 5-4.

Surprises popped up in the 880, mile, triple jump and discus. The mile went to Skyline of Oakland's John Johnson in 4:09.5 as he surged past Gahr's Jim Arriola around the final curve: the 880 was won by Leigh's Conrad Suhr, who charged past the favored Dan Aldridge of Petaluma and clocked 1:51.0; the triple jump went to Mike Dobbins of Merced at 49-3 as the favored Dan Jackson of Oakland was second at 49-2 and the discus was won at 171-11 by Lodi's Mike Alberg with Fresno's Pat Howell, who had a best of 184-5 and is bound for USC to play football, finishing second at 171-10.

# High School Track for Women: 'Rather Muddled Thing'

Women's high school track is a rather muddled sort of thing in the US right now. The National Federation Rules and Records Book lists state-meet results from 41 states, Washington, D.C., and four provinces, yet omits probably the best program in the nation (along with Texas), Iowa.

New York has a growing program but no state meet (until this year) so is not listed. The others not listed are Alaska, Delaware, Florida, Missouri, Ohio, South Carolina and West Virginia, so it is hard to say anything about their programs (or lack thereof).

It is often difficult to compare state programs and results since there is a plethora of rules, few of which conform to the sport as it is contested in the rest of the world. As an example, there are no fewer than eight different hurdle races run by various states, *not* including the standard internationally-contested 100- and 400-meter races. Some states follow the NAGWS (National Assoc. for Girls & Women in Sport) rules, while others follow the National Federation book. The

NAGWS book conforms more closely to internationally-contested events, while the Federation rules seem to be closer to the manner in which the sport is usually conducted, but with several screwball events (hurdle races, pentathlon selection, 8lb shot, etc.).

One of the biggest retardants to the women's program's development is the proscription against "outside" (non-high school) competition by the high school associations in most states. Although the same proscription exists for the men's programs, the effect is somewhat more devastating on the women's side.

Many of the US's top women tracksters are of high-school age. This is due primarily to a reluctance on the part of most to continue to participate once past high school, the area in which they would reach their peak. (This situation is just now starting to change as colleges encourage participation and social acceptance of the woman athlete grows.)

At any rate, the combination of the availability of a well-developed AAU club program for the high-school age woman and the lack of experienced coaching on a

widespread level in high schools, leads many of our better athletes to forsake the prep program when faced with the either-or decision insisted upon by the state associations.

This is unfortunate in that it not only denies our prep programs of many excellent athletes, but that it also denies the less experienced athletes the association with those who are well-experienced and the excellence of competition which is required to develop themselves to the ultimate of their own potential. It thus also becomes a vicious circle as the top athletes disappear.

## AIAW, NCAA at Loggerheads

Could intercollegiate athletics be heading for a war of the sexes? Possibly, depending on which side you're on.

In one corner is the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women, the AIAW, the major women's intercollegiate sports association in the US. In the other is the National Collegiate Athletic Association, the well-known NCAA, the controlling body of men's intercollegiate athletics in the country.

According to Leotus Morrison, AIAW president, the NCAA is trying a quiet power play to seize control over women's athletics in the nation's colleges.

The NCAA says it feels it has to conduct its own women's program because the eligibility standards of the AIAW are so different from those of the NCAA. Besides, two championships would give institutions a choice.

The groundwork for a potential conflict was laid in February when the Department of Health, Education and Welfare forwarded to the White House a final version of regulations implementing the sex discrimination prohibition of Title IX of 1972's Education Amendments Act.

The statute prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in the conduct of educational programs receiving Federal financial assistance.

In 1973, the AIAW (which sponsors its own national track championships) initiated meetings with the NCAA to explore ways they might cooperate in

establishing and expanding cooperative programs. At their last meeting in October of 1974, it was agreed that a joint committee study the differences between the two groups regarding ethics and eligibility.

AIAW president Morrison says of the NCAA moves, "It is understandable that the announcement of a program of women's intercollegiate championships by the NCAA was deemed a betrayal of the AIAW's good faith in working with the NCAA." The NCAA hastily backtracked when its membership rejected the proposed women's title events.

A special committee recommended that either the two groups continue separately or that they join together with equal voice. The NCAA Council rejected the recommendation and, Morrison says, "is instead proposing a plan to its members which would give the NCAA an upper hand in conducting programs for both men and women. It appears the NCAA prefers usurping us to cooperating with us."

An NCAA spokesman says, "Legal counsel advises us that each school, with the implementation of Title IX, will have to apply virtually similar eligibility standards for men and women students. Since AIAW standards are so different from the NCAA's, the Council felt the NCAA should provide competition for women, conducted under the same eligibility standards as existing championships as an alternative for those wishing to take advantage of it."

## Women's AAU Standards

These are the qualifying standards for the AAU Junior and Senior women's Championships, both to be held in White Plains, N.Y., June 24-28.

The Senior meet (June 27-28) is open to all athletes 14 or older who meet qualifying standard between Jan. 1-June 8, 1975. The Junior meet (June 24-25) has the same stipulations, but is only open to athletes 14-18. The first two finishers in each event in the junior meet will automatically qualify for the same event in the senior meet.

Entries for both meets must be received by June 10th and entries will only be accepted on the official entry form.

# Regents Make State

**SAN DIEGO** — The "Tony Hicks Show" premiered on San Diego television Friday, but the Serramonte High hurdler had to wait hours to learn if he had won an Emmy at the State prep track and field meet.

The movie was entitled "The Man Who Didn't Exist."

Hicks ran third in the 330 low hurdles — good enough to qualify for today's finals — but judges apparently had their eyes closed.

Hicks' name wasn't on the finish list. His name wasn't announced over the speaker system. Both Hicks and Regent Coach Mike Rueda were puzzled.

Hours after the race was run, officials

viewed a videotape of the finish and declared that Hicks had indeed run, and had indeed finished third.

Serramonte was the lone County school to perform well in the meet. The Regent mile relay team, Ron Kennedy in the 120 high hurdles and Hicks in the 330 lows made today's finals.

Also in the finals were Myrt Easley of Woodside, who qualified second in the triple jump with a leap of 48-11, and Mitch Kingery of San Carlos in the two mile (no qualifying was required for that event).

Meantime, you'd have expected Kennedy to start trembling when he saw rival Dedy Cooper of Harry Ells High in Richmond zip to a national record 13.2 in a high hurdles qualifying heat.

Nope. Not a quiver. All it did was make Kennedy more confident — at least on the surface — as he prepared for this afternoon's finals.

"I think I can run 13.2 too," explained Kennedy, whose 13.9 clocking won the third heat and was fourth best overall. "I'll just go out there and beat them all. It's better competition and I know I can run harder."

Kennedy has lost only two high hurdles events this year — both to Cooper — despite a troublesome right knee, which bothered him slightly Friday.

Cooper may prove to be Hicks' nemesis as well. Cooper was the top qualifier in the 330 lows at 36.2 (Hicks had run 37.6). Cooper also anchored the fastest 440 and mile relay teams in qualifying.

Hicks, also entered in the 120 highs, almost fell twice in his qualifying heat and finished fourth (the top three qualify) in 14.2.

Serramonte's mile relay team gained the finals thanks to three sensational legs by Hicks, Alvin Diles and Kennedy.

Dan Martinelli, subbing for brother Jim — out with a virus — in the leadoff spot, was sixth after the initial quarter mile. But Hicks took the Regents to fourth, and Diles closed ground on third. Kennedy battled to make third in the heat.

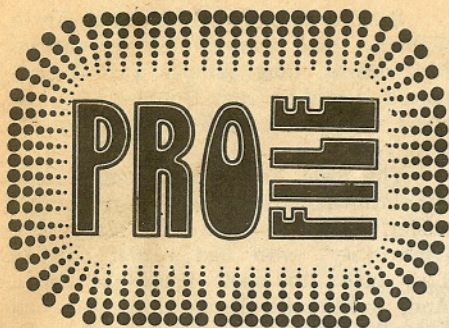

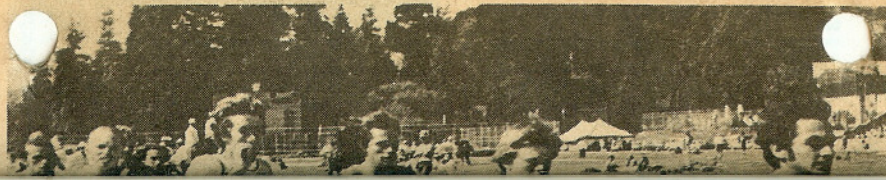

Bob has been a promising runner since arriving at DeAnza High as a 9th grader in February 1973. He obviously loves to run. He loves the entire track atmosphere, he is also very intelligent and playful, and he has a non-stop sense of humor.

He was little as a 9th grader, about 5-4 and 110 pounds, so his early running successes—confined to dual meets—seemed heightened. "Look at that little kid run. Watch little McMeans," became familiar phrases around DeAnza.

It was as a junior that Bob started to fulfill his promise. Larger, 5-8 and 125 pounds, he seemed to have more confidence. A letter that preceded his arrival to school that year said, "I know you're the coach, and that's the way it should be; but I've been writing Jeff Galloway (one of America's better runners and a former Olympian) and I have some ideas about training. Remember that my goal is to run the mile at the State Meet."

That junior year he doubled two wins in league: the mile in 4:24 and the two-mile in 9:54. The next week, driving from last on the last lap (and driving me crazy), he took the Division mile in 4:23. At the Section meet he eased up in the last 110 and finished third in 4:20.

Bob had qualified for State. His ambition had materialized.

That next Friday at Balboa Stadium in San Diego Bob found himself in the first of two heats. His time in the Section ranked him 23rd. out of 27. He ran 4:16.8, 5th in his heat, but as it turned out, the fastest qualifying 5th which put him into the final with eight other milers. He had beaten 4:08 and 4:11 milers in the heat. He was one of two juniors in the final. Saturday he ran 8th in 4:18.1. It was the first time he had run hard competitively two days in a row. Bob said, "We'll have to remember that next year. I would like to run the West Coast Relays Friday night and come back to the Castro Valley Invitational on Saturday so I'll be ready for State."

This past track season may have been somewhat frustrating for Bob. It really shouldn't have been as it was capped by his second State Meet mile final and an improvement from 8th to 5th. But he really didn't run the time he was capable of and he had a couple of bad races this year.

Bob is a run from behind type and the State Meet final was a slow, tactical race on a slow track on a very windy day. His workouts indicated he was at least 6 seconds faster than last year when he ran 4:16. His best this year, winning the Meet of Champions mile the week previous to State, was 4:15. At the State Meet trials, when he finished 3rd in his heat in 4:16, he could have easily gone 4:12. I actually thought 4:08 to 4:10 was well within his scope.

But he is not about to stop running: University of Washington, Oregon State, San Mateo College or Contra Costa College will probably have him next

year. 4:05 should be an optimal goal for next season. The 5,000 in 1980 is a real possibility.

As for Bob's training? Bob says it best. "I have maintained a constant improvement in my times every year since I began competing. I attribute this to consistency. I'm not into high mileage yet. I'll work up to it eventually. Last season as a junior I averaged 30-35 miles a week from September to June. This season my average weekly mileage was around 40-50 miles. The longest week being 52 miles and the shortest 30 miles.

"I also maintain that the consistency of my program is responsible for my being injury-free. believe a program of this type is necessary if continual progress

over a number of years is to be expected. Next year's mileage will probably be around 50-60 but I don't worry about these details. I just do what feels right although we do have a basic plan.

We begin the year with larger intervals, say 4 or 5 interval miles in 5:00 with a mile jog. As the year progresses the distances of the intervals shrinks, and are run at faster speeds.

"I very much enjoy competition. I have a Ron Clarke compulsion to compete to test myself. I enjoy racing so much that I usually run two or three races in our dual meets and I compete in road races and all comers meets in the off season."



# Menlo teen killed in auto accident

Joanne McFate, 16, a Menlo-Atherton High School student and champion swimmer, was killed early today in an auto accident on Interstate 5 near Coalinga, according to the California Highway Patrol (CHP).

Officers said Miss McFate, who lived at 1725 Oakdell Drive, Menlo Park, died when the auto in which she was riding collided with a truck and double trailer rig.

The driver of the auto, Robert Benton, 17, of 29 Lorelei Lane, Menlo Park, suffered cuts and bruises in the crash. He was treated and released from Coalinga District Hospital.

The truck driver, James Murphy, 50, of Livermore, was not injured.

The cause of the accident is still under investigation.

Officer Robert Rigby reported:

The collision occurred at 12:02 a.m. today in the southbound lanes of Interstate 5 near the Kamm Avenue overcrossing.

Both vehicles were southbound, and Benton's auto crashed into the rear of the truck at a speed of 70 miles per hour. Miss McFate was dead in the wreckage, and Benton had to be rescued with cutting tools.

Miss McFate was born in Redwood City, and lived for the first

part of her life in Atherton. She had lived at the Oakdell Drive address for the past 13 years.

She had attended Harker School, Oak Knoll School and Hillview School prior to Menlo-Atherton High School.

She belonged to the Sharon Heights Swim Club, and was very active in girls' athletics in high school. Last year she placed seventh in the half mile run in a state high school track meet in San Diego for high school girls.

She was also a member of a high school girls' 400 meter swimming relay team which held a national record. Miss McFate swam the butterfly stroke.

Her father, Dr. Norman McFate, is a dentist and a medical school affiliate at Stanford University.

Other survivors include her mother, Jean McFate, and a sister, Patricia Jean McFate, both of the family home; and a grandmother, Mrs. Eva Shrader of Newport Beach.

Dr. McFate said his daughter had been en route with Benton, who is her boyfriend, to visit Benton's sister and brother-in-law in Hanford, when the accident occurred.

Funeral arrangements are pending at the Palo Alto Funeral Home, 744 San Antonio Road, Palo Alto.
