COPENHAGEN GAMES

Copenhagen, Denmark, August 13. - For Stones a 7-3 pop in his second attempt was enough to win the high jump competition. After Jesper Tarring had knocked down the bar twice on this height, he choosed to take the last attempt at 7-4 $\frac{1}{4}$ knowing that this was his only chance for winning. But he missed and was runner-up to Stones.

Tom B. Hansen made a very disappointing come-back - after his injury - on the loometers by only running 2:24.1.

Mac Wilkins reached his winning-length 216-10 in the first throw, but wasn't satisfied: - I wasn't in the mood after four competitions in four days, he said apologetically.

Also the fight in the 100 meter-race between the two olympic finalists Klaus-Dieter Kurrat (10.47) and Guy Abrahams (10.55) was interesting.

AARHUS GAMES

Aarhus, Denmark, August 15. - Filbert Bayi refused to run at his best distance 1500 meters and converted to the 5000 meters, which he won in 13:51.8 ahead of fellow-Tanzanian Ibrahim Jima (13:52.1).

- I wouldn't disappoint the spectators, and when I have had malaria I think it was right running the longer distance, Bayi told. The high jump competition was interrupted in half an hour, while Dwight Stones had stiffness of the neck. A Doctor helped him with a massage treatment. But it wasn't enough. Rolf Beilschmidt, Rory Kontinek and Stones made all 7-2 $\frac{1}{4}$ in their first attempts, and the two first mentioned also did 7-3 $\frac{1}{2}$ that way, while Stones didn't clear that height in his first attempt. Then he gambled by waiting until 7-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ with the two last attempts, but both he and the two other jumpers failed. So then Beilschmidt was the winner.
