SEVENTH ANNUAL PCAA TRACK & FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS TO BE HELD AT LONG BEACH

Since the inaugural PCAA Track & Field Championships were held in 1970 only two schools (San Jose State and Long Beach State) have won the coveted title. In fact, only in 1974 did another team even squeeze into the number two position, when Fresno State edged out Long Beach by three points.

1976 should show little deviation from the past scripts. Most dopesters show this meet coming down to the wire between the Spartans of San Jose and the 49ers of Long Beach. Both schools deserve ranking in the top ten in the nation. In a dual meet at the Long Beach track on April 10th, San Jose narrowly nipped the 49ers by a score of 75 to 70. Long Beach State mentor Ron Allice claims "This isn't just another track meet - this is war!"

The four schools represented in this championship event have a proud history in Track & Field, having produced such Olympic stars and World Record holders as Dutch Warmerdam, FS (now head coach at Fresno); Tommie Smith (SJ), Lee Evans (SJ), Ronnie Ray Smith (SJ), Steve Williams (SD), Dan Ripley (SJ), John Carlos (SJ), Steve Smith (LB), Bob Soth (LB), John Rambo (LB), and George Frenn (LB) - to mention only a few.

This year's meet will highlight many Olympic hopefuls including pole vaulter Don Baird (already named to the Australian team) and the world record holder in the high jump, Dwight Stones.

The competition will undoubtedly produce many new meet records. This is guaranteed by running metric distances for the first time in the history of the conference.
