Six Central Coast Section athletes have finished 19th or better in the national rankings - and two of them climaxed the 1976 track and field season with all-time area bests in their pet events.

Peter Moreno (Lick) and Andre Phillips (Silver creek) became No. 1 on the all-time section list in the triple jump and 330-yard low hurdles, respectively

Moreno spanned 50-03/4 in the triple jump, the first area athlete in history to get off a legal 50-foot jump. And Phillips scampered over the 330 yard low barriers in a swift 36.4, just before incurring a painful hamstring injury.

Moreno also had a windy 50-11/4 which was good for third place in the state meet at Berkeley. His marks rate fourth on Track & Field News magazine's na

tional list.

Phillips, who finished fourth in the state meet despite the injury, had the third best mark in the country in the low hurdles.

Glenn Cannon tied Millard Hampton's all-time section 100-yard dash best of 9.5 and his 21.1 in the 220 is second to Hampton's 20.9. Hampton, the Silver Creek grad, will be shooting for an Olympic gold medal in Montreal.

Cannon's furlong clocking tied him for fifth nation-

ally and his 9.5 equals the 14th best.

Keith Taylor (Piedmont Hills) shares the 16th best mark in the country with his 47.8 in the 440 and he anchored a 41.7 sprint relay team to a share of 17th.

dles at the San Jose Relays, shares the 19th best mark.

All of the nationally ranked athletes lead their respective events on the 1976 Central Coast Section list and also are members of the fourth annual Mercury & News All-CCS track and field team.

tello (Lynbrook).

Miss Belk, who won the state 440 title with a blazing 55.2, just completed her freshman year. Miss Costello was second in the state 80-yard low hurdles and won three events in the section finals.

Virtually all of the area selectees who compete or the track, also have competed with the San Jose Cindergals two of whose products are on the Olympic team: Cindy Poor and Francie Larrieu Lutz.
