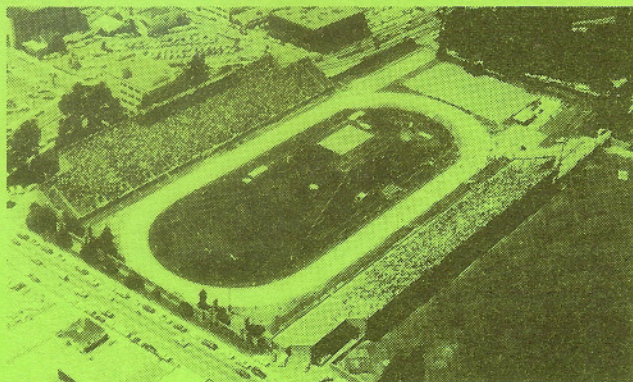

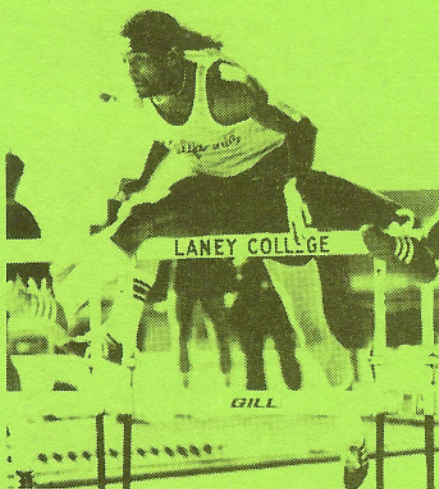

A renovated Edwards Stadium, with a brand new \$250,000 All-Weather Track will be unveiled for the first time as Cal hosts the traditional Double-Dual meet on April 16. Local track fans will be treated to some of the finest track and field competition in the country this year as traditional national pow-

ers USC and UCLA come to Berkeley, along with Stanford to open up the new-look Edwards Stadium. Ticket prices for this track spectacular are \$3.50 for adults, \$2.50 for high school students and \$1.50 for children. For more information please call 642-5150.

CAL vs. UCLA

Cal's Golden Bears hope to upset a very strong UCLA team which again figures to be in the Top Five at the NCAA's in 1977. The Bruins, who have finished first or second in the NCAA in five of the last six years, are led by Olympic medal sprinter Millard Hampton, 18-foot pole vaulter Mike Tully and 25 foot long jumper Willie Banks. Cal, meanwhile, looks to have its best team in a number of years. Sprinters Wesley Walker, Keith Taylor, Holden Smith and Paul Wallace give the Bears excellent depth; Brad Duffey, Gary Blume, and Hal Shulz are very strong in the distance events and school record holders Carl Florant in the High Hurdles and Larry Hintz in the pole vault are also big factors for the Bears in 1977.

Defending NCAA Champion USC Trojans invade Edwards Stadium to meet Stanford. The Trojans are again rated one of the favorites for their 27th national championship. They are led by premier sprinters Clancy Edwards, Joel Andrews, Rich Graybehl; Mike Johnson and Tom Andrews in the hurdles, Rayfield Beaton in the 800 meters and Ralph Fruguglietti in the discus and shot put. Stanford has two world class athletes in Terry Albritton in the shot put and James Lofton who has jumped over 26 feet this year. Other Stanford standouts include Alan Sheats in the 400 and Roy Kissin in the 5000.

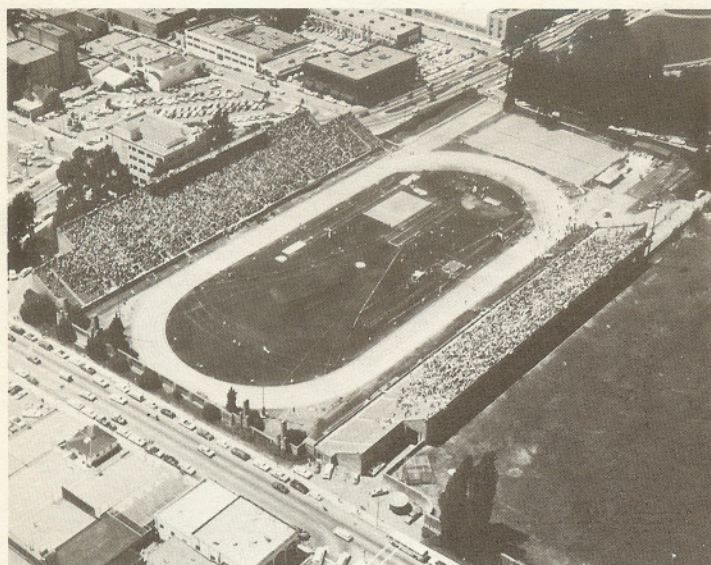

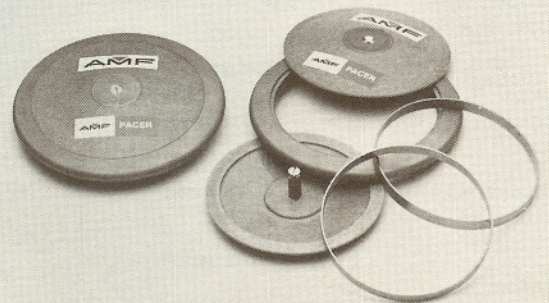

Track Spectacular In Edwards Today

A finer collegiate track and field meet could not be designed than today's annual Double Dual which pits California against UCLA and Stanford against USC to inaugurate the new Tartan Surface which now graces Edwards Stadium.

The quality of the performers assembled here is stunning among the collegiate ranks. There are no less than five 26 foot long jumpers, a former world record holder in the shot-put, an 18 foot pole vaulter and four hurdlers with times 13.6 or under.

The long jump will probably have the finest collection of performers at one time short of the NCAA championships. Both Willie Banks and Jerry Herndon of UCLA will challenge Cal's Ralph Dangerfield who is threatening the school record and the 25 foot barrier. Stanford's James Lofton, who has already cleared 26'2½" this season, will be battling USC's Larry Doubley and Gerald Hardeman.

Stanford and USC will pose a battle in the shot-put that should see the winner throwing over 60 feet. Stanford's Terry Albritton will face Ralph Fruguglietti and John McKenzie, of USC. Albritton, the former world record holder has a 1977 best of 64'4" while Fruguglietti has come very close to the 60 foot barrier with a seasonal best of 59'8". McKenzie, a freshman, has thrown 60'¼" in 1977.

Cal school record holder Carl Florant will be in tough company with the likes of U.S. Olympian James Owens and Greg Foster of UCLA. All three are potential sub 13.6 hurdlers. Owens has broken 14.0 seconds in 36 of his last 40 races while the freshman Foster has improved from an opening 14.3 to a best of 13.68.

The Trojans will send a pair of 13.6 hurdlers, Tom Andrews and Mike Johnson, at Stanford.

A host of brilliant sprinters will be entered from the 100 to the 400 meters. The matchups should be very interesting and the competition should be very keen regardless of what strategy the coaches choose. The field is led by Olympian Millard Hampton of UCLA. The 1976 AAU champion has a lifetime best of 20.29 in the 200 meters and a lifetime best of 46.5 in the 400 meters. However, teammate Bennie Myles has an impressive 45.8 quartermile time thus making the Bruins tough in the 200 and 400 meters.

The Trojans are awesome in the 100 and 200 with the likes of Clancy Edwards having run a 10.27 and 20.63 in those events already this season. Teammate Joel Andrews has beaten Edwards with his lifetime best of 10.3 in the 100 meters while Mike Simmons' 20.7 and Colin Bradford's 20.8, complete an excellent sprinting line-up for the Trojans.

Both Cal and Stanford will provide fine challenges. The Bears are just now coming around with Wesley Walker and Paul Wallace starting to reach full stride. The Bears have been relying heavily on freshman sprinters Holden Smith and Keith Taylor and they have performed admirably. Erv Hunt will likely enter the freshman in the 100 and 200 meters while employing Walker and Wallace where they will garner the most points.

The Stanford sprinters, unlike Cal, have come on strong early and have shown no signs of letting up. They are

anchored by the versatile James Lofton, and Alan Sheats, who both have run the 400 meters in 46.6 already this season. Sprinters Gordon Banks and Marvin Holmes have run 10.4 in the 100 meters. Banks has a seasonal best of 21.1 in the 200 meters while Holmes has a 21.7.

One thing is for sure, all of today's relays should be outstanding. Especially crucial in the Cal-UCLA dual meet is the placing in the relay competition.

The meet certainly has some great competition and some great performers. UCLA's Mike Tulley has an impressive streak of 20 consecutive dual meet victories in the pole vault, and is a threat to break the 18 foot barrier any time he competes. Cal's John Lane has cleared the 6-10 mark in the high jump three weeks consecutively and appears on the verge of clearing the 7-0 barrier for the first time as a collegian.

Cal is easily the class of this meet in the distance events with people like school record holders Brad Duffey and Gary Blume in the two-mile. Freshman Hal Schulz gives them a strong man to provide a threat to sweeping the long distances.

Damon Wood is emerging into a fine steeplechaser and Schulz has provided help in that event. Duffey and Wood have doubling in the 1500 meters along with their specialties. The two have provided coach Hunt with fine depth behind Soph Andy Clifford who ran a 3:48.1 two weeks ago against USC's David Omwansa, and set a personal best last week against Arizona State with a 3:45.4.

While USC probably will not be severely tested by Stanford, several exceptional athletes on both teams will be on display and fans will be treated to a number of fine races. The Cal-UCLA match-up should be much closer as the Bears hope to pull an upset over the Bruins for the first time since 1968.

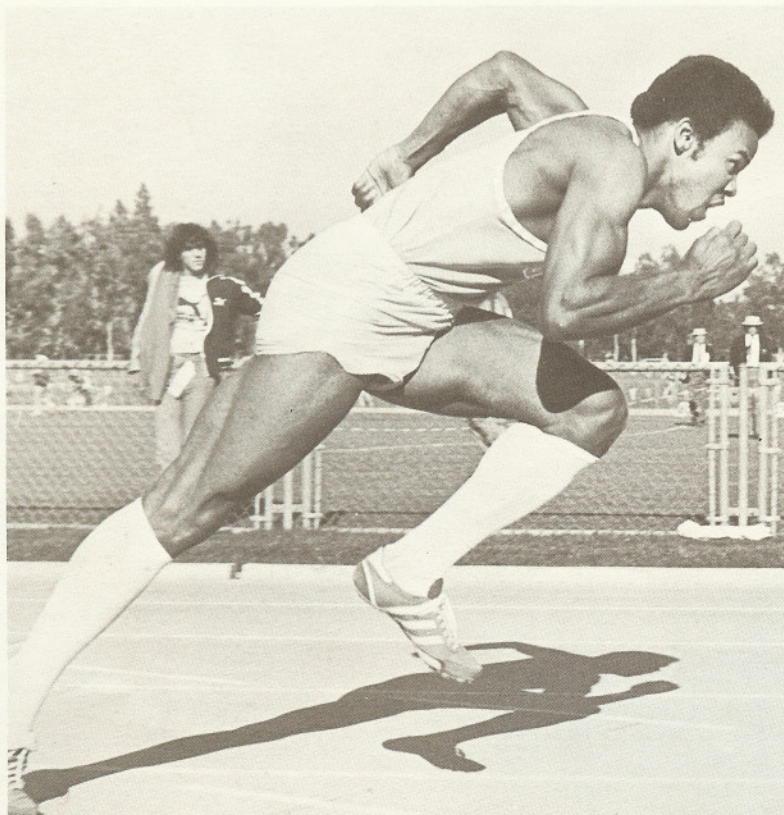

Bruins In 1977

The Bruins of UCLA, who have finished first or second in five of the last six years at the NCAA Championships again look to be a potential threat for a national crown in 1977.

After a sensational recruiting year, UCLA Head Coach Jim Bush feels his young squad will be strong contenders at the Pac-8 and NCAA Finals.

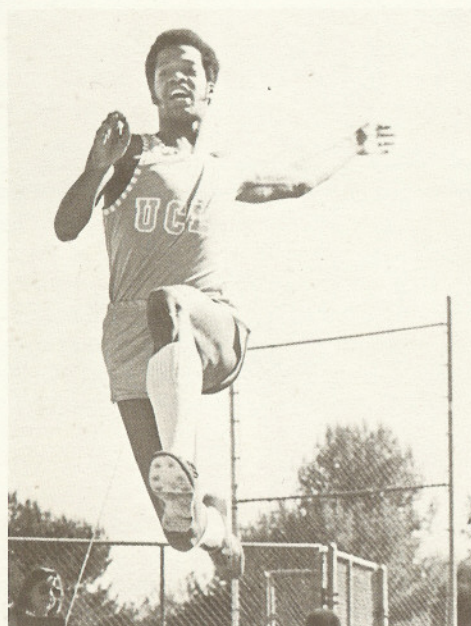
"We have the leadership that we didn't have last year, and if our youngsters come along, we can challenge the other top teams in the United States for the NCAA Championship," said Bush.

Among the Bruins to keep your eye on today are world class pole vaulter Mike Tully, who has already gone 18-2½ — the best in the world outdoors in 1977, Millard Hampton UCLA's Olympic Silver Medalist in the 200 meters and Willie Banks, who is having a great year in the long jump and triple jump.

Others to watch include James Owens (13.4 lifetime) and freshman Greg Foster who will challenge Cal's Carl Florant in the high hurdles. Bush describes the pair as "the best 1-2 punch in the nation."

Another strong event for the Bruins is the 800 meter run where Grant Niederhaus, Brian Theriot and Conrad Suhr have dominated that race in 1977. Perhaps the two key events in the match-up against Cal will be high jump, where Bruins Jay Meisler and Charles Boyd will battle Cal frosh John Lane and the relays, where the Bruins are hoping for a sweep.

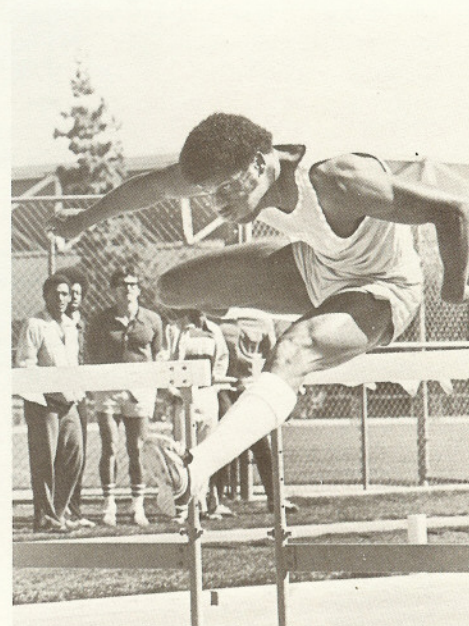
UCLA is headed for their annual showdown against crosstown rival USC, April 30 in what figures to be a very close meet in Los Angeles.

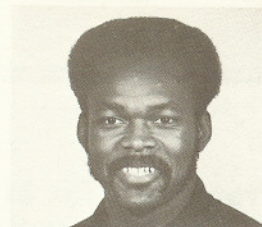

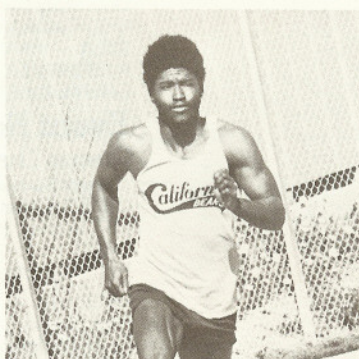
Bears In 1977

Despite a rather inauspicious beginning, the 1977 edition of California track has given indications that it is the best Bear team in a number of years. Although they have won only one dual-meet to date, several outstanding performances by individuals have caused Coach Erv Hunt to feel confident about the Pac-8 and NCAA Championships.

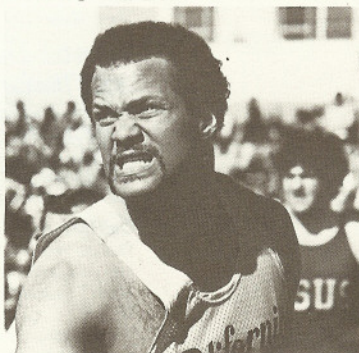
This year's squad figures to be deeper than most Cal teams in recent memory. The depth begins with the sprints where veterans Wesley Walker and Paul Wallace blend with freshmen Keith Taylor and Holden Smith to give the team good balance and talent. In the longer distances, Cal relies on Andy Clifford in the 1500 and a trio of standouts at 5000—Brad Duffey, Gary Blume and Hal Schulz.

Should the Bears hope to upset the highly-touted Bruins of UCLA, they must do exceptionally well in the field events. Coach Erv Hunt and Assistant John Wedel have said that their team must rack up early points in not only the distance runs, but also do well in the shot put and discus as well as preventing a Bruin sweep in the long jump, triple jump and high jump.

Also among the keys for California is how the two school record holders perform. Carl Florant will have his hands full in the high hurdles with James Owens and Greg Foster, and Larry Hintz hopes to return to his 1976 form which saw him go over 17 feet as he battles Bruin Mike Tully.

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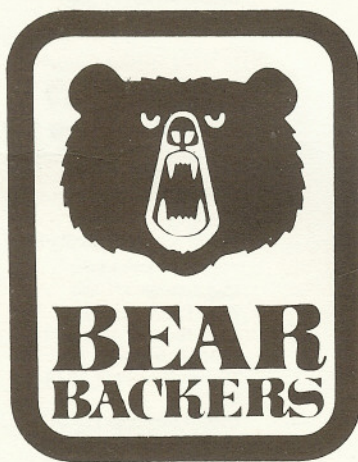

Although they are plagued by a lack of depth which has been a problem for the Cardinals in recent history, they boast several outstanding athletes including two world-class performers in shot putter Terry Albritton and long jumper James Lofton.

Albritton is a former world record-holder and current American and NCAA standard bearer in the shot put at 71-8½. He established a new NCAA indoor mark of 70-6½ in January.

Stanford has a couple of quality sprinters in Gordon Banks (10.4, 21.1) and Marvin Holmes (10.48, 21.7) and the 400 meters is a good race for the Cardinals with Alan Sheats and James Lofton.

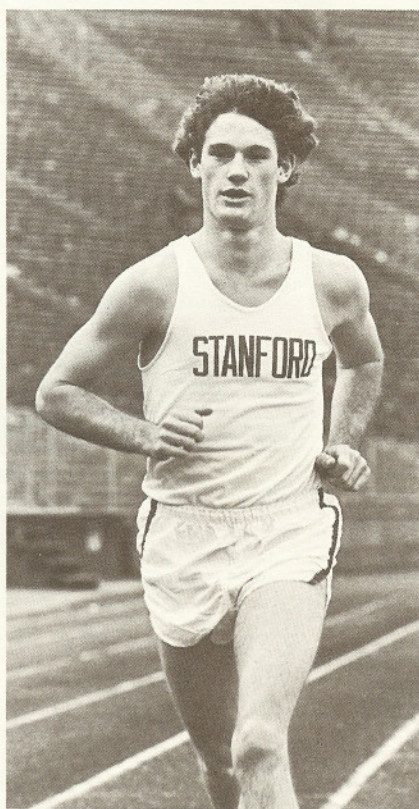
Stanford stands 2-2 on the 1977 season and are hoping for their best Pac-8 finish in a number of years.

USC In 1977

Their 1977 Trojan press guide begins the season outlook with the question "How can you top perfection?" While it may seem extravagant praise, there does seem to be much evidence to support such lofty exaltations. USC has captured 28 National track titles in its history and 1977 looks like another great year for the Trojans.

"The key to our team in the championship meets will be our returning NCAA scorers," says USC Head Coach Vern Wolfe. "They will have to perform consistently because we are so thin. We'll also need team leadership from them like we had from last year's seniors."

Among the returning scorers from the '76 NCAA meet are Ralph Fruguglietti in the discus, Tom Andrews in the 400 meter hurdles, Tom DiStanislao in the pole vault and Rayfield Beaton in the 800 meter run.

The Trojans are 4-0 on the 1977 season in their attempt to repeat last year's undefeated dual-meet season. They have beaten Arizona (110-43), Arizona State (79-62) and BYU (88-55) before taking care of California on April 2 (95-58).

Those to watch for this afternoon include Clancy Edwards, the Trojans' top threat in the springs and a definite NCAA contender. A transfer from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, Edwards won both sprints at the 1975 NCAA Division II Championships. He is aided by experienced sprinters Joel Andrews and Mike Simmons.

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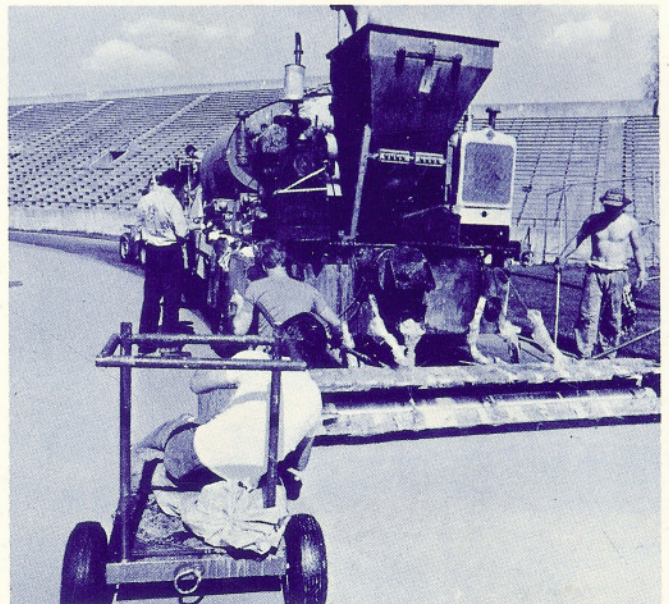
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
