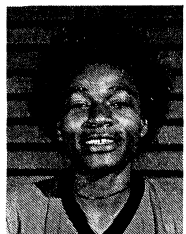

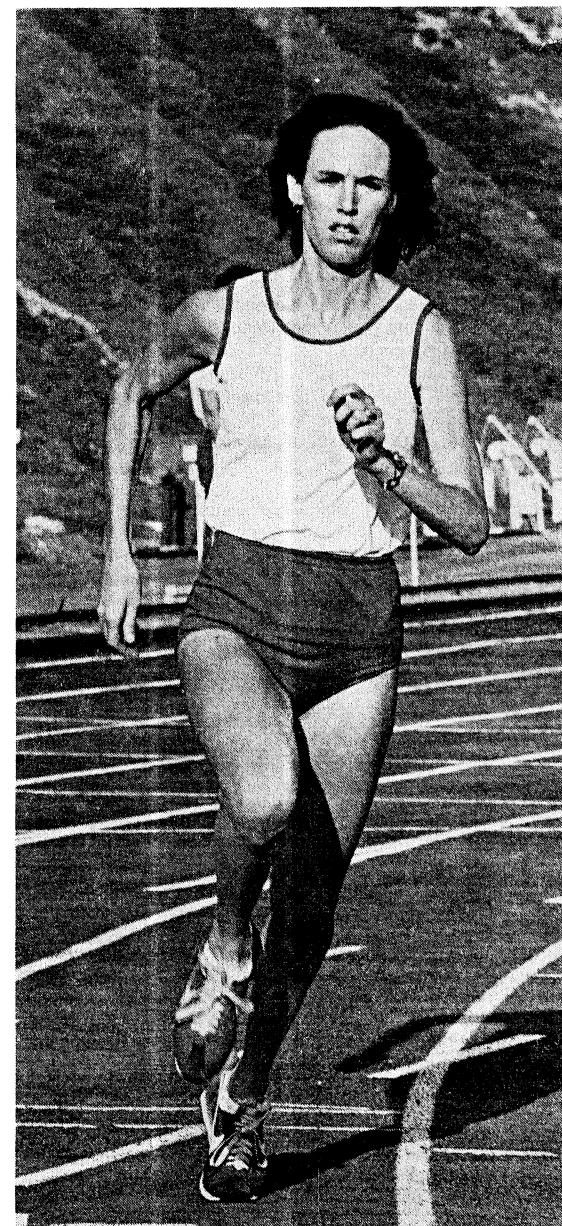

SAN DIEGO STATE 1978 WOMEN'S TRACK and FIELD

THE COACH



Mary Alice Hill serves not only as coach of the San Diego State women's track and field and cross country teams, but is the associate athletic director in charge of Women's Athletics for the Aztecs.

Hill came to San Diego State in 1976 from Colorado State, where she was director of women's athletics and an assistant professor

in physical education for three years. While with the Fort Collins school, Hill coached the women's track and field team, and her 1974-75 outdoor team finished fourth in the AIAW National Championships.

While at Texas Woman's University from 1969-71, Hill served as assistant coach in track and field and volleyball. For five summers (1966-70) she was an assistant with the Texas Track Club. During her coaching career, she has handled five Olympic athletes, including Patrice Shmock from the current Aztec roster.

As a participant, Hill was a five-time member of the U.S. track and field team to the South American Games (1966-70), where in 1970, she placed first in the discus and javelin events. She competed four years in the U.S. Track and Field Federation Nationals, with her best showing in 1969 when she took a first in the discus and a second in the javelin.

Hill received her B.S. in Education from Missouri State Teachers College and her M.A. in Physical Education from Texas Woman's University.

THE ATHLETES

By competing in the Western Collegiate Athletic Association along with such powerhouses as UCLA and USC, the Aztecs should get a good idea of the level of competition at the AIAW National Championships, which will be held this season in Knoxville, Tenn., in late May. After qualifying four athletes for the 1977 Nationals, coach Hill feels as many as 12 may qualify this season.

Leading a strong contingent in the field events is Donna Dietrich, one of the nation's top woman javelin throwers as well as a fine discus hurler. Linn Dunton, who holds 10 New Mexico state records for women in the shot, discus, and javelin, will add strength in the throwing events.

Lynn Page, a 1977 qualifier to the AIAW Nationals in the long jump and an Aztec women's basketball squad member as well, paces the team in the jumping events.

In the running events, the Aztecs are strong in both the 100 and 400 meter hurdles, with 1976 Olympic team member Patrice Shmock (who also has competed on two World University and two Pan American Games teams) expected to excel at 100 meters, and twin sisters Sandy and Susie Niehues running the 400 meter distance, along with Cathy Clarke, who is an excellent high jumper as well.

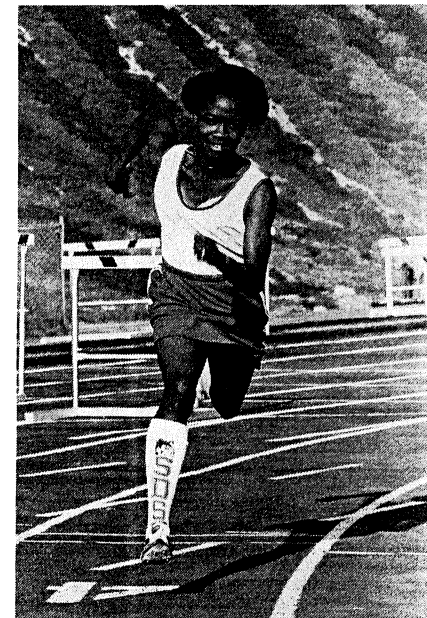
Janice Pope and Anovia Taylor give the Aztecs speed in the sprints and, teamed with Shmock, form the backbone of what should be strong 400 meter and 880 medley relay squads. In the middle distance events, Jeannie Abare, state high school 880 champion while at Crawford in 1971, should provide points in races from a half mile to two miles, with Diane Riley and Marie Hoffman carrying the load in the longer distances.
