

COACHING STAFF



DICK HILL Aztec Head Coach

In his sixth year as head track coach for San Diego State University, Dick Hill has brought to the Aztecs his background of professional success, including coaching athletes to 30 world records and three individual Olympic gold medals.

Hill came to San Diego State in 1973 from Southern University, where he had coached from 1965 to 1969 and in 1971 and 1972. A 1960 alumnus of the school, with a B.S. in physical education, his teams there won five NAIA national titles in three years, and Hill was named National Track Coach of the Year.

Southern won NAIA championships outdoors in 1966, 1967, and 1968, as well as the 1966 and 1967 indoor titles. After a year's leave of absence in 1970 to complete his Ed.D. (doctoral) degree at the State University of New York (Buffalo), Hill returned to Southern, and in 1972, a five-man team placed fifth at the NAIA Nationals.

Hill began his collegiate coaching career at Florida A&M University, where he was head track coach and head basketball coach from 1962 to 1964.

A fine athlete himself, Hill played basketball and competed in track while a student at Southern. After graduation, he entered the University of Buffalo, where he completed his Ed.M. (master's) degree in 1961. While at Buffalo, Hill won the New York State AAU decathlon title with 7250 points in 1962, after finishing second in 1961. He also played on the Western New York AAU champion basketball team both years, and was a member of the New York State National AAU team each season.

Hill's coaching success has been remarkable, to say the least. In addition to the five national titles at Southern, his teams have won seven conference

championships (five at Southern, two at Florida A&M). Since coming to San Diego, Hill has been building the team. In his first three seasons at SDSU, Hill's teams were 5-13 in dual meet competition. The past two years the Aztecs are 16-2 in dual meets, including 9-1 in 1976 and 7-1 last year.

Perhaps even more phenomenal has been his success with individual athletes. At Florida A&M, Hill coached Bob Hayes to world records at 100yards and 100-meters, as well as to the 1964 Olympic gold medal. At Southern University, Hill coached high hurdlers Willie Davenport, the 1968 Olympic champion, and Rod Milburn, who won the 1972 Olympic gold medal. Both athletes tied and broke numerous indoor and outdoor world records in the hurdles. Also at Southern, members of Hill's teams broke the world records in the 440-yard, 880-yard, and mile relays. For two years at San Diego State, Hill coached Steve Wiliams, who tied both the 100-yard and 100-meter world records.

Two years ago, Hill's top pupil was Quentin Wheeler. Wheeler won the PCAA Championship in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles and then went on to set a new NCAA Meet record of 48.55 in winning the national title. Wheeler later finished fourth in the Olympics.

BOB WHEELER Assistant Track Coach



Bob Wheeler, one of the finest milers in United States collegiate history, begins his third year as assistant track and field coach at San Diego State.

Wheeler will be working primarily with the distance runners this season, many of whom were on his Aztec cross country team.

Bob was named District-8 co-Coach of the Year in 1976 for piloting his young Aztec cross country team to the PCAA Title and an eighth place finish in the NCAA Championships in Denton, Texas.

This is Wheeler's first coaching assignment after receiving a bachelors degree in management science and economics at Duke University in 1974.

Bob has had some outstanding personal performances as a distance man with 1972 being a banner year. In that season Wheeler ran 11 consecutive miles or 1500 meter races in times equivalent to a sub-four minute mile and was selected as a member of the United States Olympic team in the 1500 meters.

Wheeler, 23, was a two-time outdoor track and field All-America at Duke as well as All-America indoors in 1971. Bob won the NCAA indoor title in the 1000 in 1971. He was runner-up in the NCAA outdoor mile that season.

Wheeler twice won the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletics in America (IC4A) cross country championship and won Atlantic Coast Conference titles in cross country, indoor and outdoor track nine times.

In high school, Wheeler was All-America in the 880 and mile and is the present record holder in the high school indoor 600-yard run.

He also holds the record for the NCAA indoor 1000-yard run and was a member of the AAU national team in 1971 and 1972.

New jumper who comes to the Aztecs from Los Angeles Harbor College ... was 4th in the Southern Cal Relays with a high jump of 6-6 and 5th in the triple jump ... won the Southern California Conference triple jump title with a best mark of 46-4 ... prepped at San Pedro High School where he lettered two years ... born June 2, 1956 in Los Angeles, but calls San Pedro home now ... single ... Political Science/Pre-Law major.



NED ARMOUR — Long Jump — 6-1 — 175 — Junior



Best long jump prospect at San Diego State since Arnie Robinson ... comes to the Aztecs from San Diego Mesa College where he had a best of 25-9¾ in the long jump ... also competed in the 440, 110HH and triple jump at Mesa and was the South Coast Conference Athlete of the Year in 1977 ... prepped at Morse High School in San Diego where he was the CIF long jump champion ... lettered in football in both high school

and JC \ldots born March 6, 1957 in Indianapolis, Indiana, but lives now in San Diego \ldots single.

JOHN BARR — Javelin — 6-31/2 — 205 — Sophomore

Was with the Aztecs last year, but didn't letter ... prepped at Patrick Henry High School where he lettered two years as a shot putter and quarter-miler ... born February 20, 1958 in Rockledge, Florida, but lives now in San Diego ... single ... Physics major.

JOE BRISKI — Hammer — 6-2 — 225 — Senior



Two year letterman who won the PCAA Championships last year with a heave of 184-0 in the hammer... that mark is also a lifetime best and an SDSU school record... placed 3rd in the PCAA Meet as a sophomore ... came to San Diego State after a year at Eastern Michigan University where he competed in track ... prepped at Riverside High School in Dearborn Heights, Michigan where he lettered in track and football ... born

October 2, 1955 in Detroit, but calls Dearborn Heights home now ... single.

Local sprinter who comes to the Aztecs from Crawford High School in San Diego ... lettered three years as a sprinter for the Colts ... also lettered two years in basketball ... born February 22, 1959 in San Diego and still lives here ... single ... Psychology major.



GARY COSTELLO — Discus — 6-3 — 210 — Senior



Returning letterman who threw the discus 158-8 last season for a lifetime best ... came to the Aztecs from Citrus College where he finished 8th in the State in the discus as a freshman and 6th in Southern California as a sophomore ... also lettered two years in football as a tight end ... prepped at Arroyo High School in El Monte where he lettered in January 27, 1955 in Long Island, New York,

but calls Temple City home now ... single ... P.E. major.

STEVE CROW — Discus — 6-2 — 170 — Freshman

Outstanding freshman weight prospect from Monache High School in Porterville ... threw the discus 185-2 last season as a prep to rank No. 1 in the San Joaquin Valley and in the top 10 nationally ... lettered three years in track and three in football as a defensive back ... born August 23, 1959 in Porterville and still calls it home ... single.



BRIAN DONOHUE — Middle Distances — 5-10 — 145 — Senior



Had an outstanding year for the Aztecs last season, finishing 3rd in the PCAA Championships in the 800 with a time of 1:48.6... finished behind Mark Schilling of San Jose State and Mark Enyeart of Utah State ... ran internationally last summer and racked up a lifetime best 1:47.8, finishing 3rd in the USA-USSR Meet in Sochi in the Soviet Union ... holds the San Diego State school record at 800 meters with the 1:47.5 with 47.6 ward rale up an

... has run 4:10.4 in the mile and 47.6 on a 440 yard relay leg ... usually runs a leg of the Aztec mile relay... came to the Aztecs from Pierce College in Woodland Hills where he was Metropolitan Conference, Southern California and State Champion in the 880 and ran the fastest junior college time in the nation with a 1:49.2 ... prepped at Taft High School in Woodland Hills where he was ranked 12th in the nation as a senior in the 880 ... born January 25, 1956 in Los Angeles, but calls Woodland Hills home now ... single ... Political Science major.

DON FOSS — Decathlon — 6-1 — 175 — Senior

Placed 5th last year in the PCAA Championships in the decathlon with 6519 points which was a career high ... best event is the pole vault where he has cleared 15-0 and will compete in dual meets as a pole vaulter . . . came to the Aztecs from Cerritos College where he finished 3rd in Southern California and 10th in the State in the decathlon as a sophomore ... prepped at St. Paul High School in Santa Fe Springs and



lettered in track and football ... born March 30, 1956 in Whittier, but lives now in La Mirada ... single ... Business Management major.

STEVE HEYWOOD - Sprinter - 5-10 - 140 - Sophomore



Local sprinter who competed just one year in high school ... has run 10.1 in the 100yard dash, 22.9 in the 220 and 51.0 in the 440 while at La Jolla High School in San Diego ... born June 25, 1958 in Dayton. Ohio, but lives now in La Jolla ... single.

TONY HICKS — Hurdles — 6-0 — 170 — Junior

Top junior college recruit . . . has run 13.9 in the 100-meter hurdles, 51.7 in the 400meter intermediate hurdles and 10.5 in the 100-meters . . . went to junior college at both Skyline College in San Bruno and Central Arizona in Coolidge and earned JC All-America honors at both schools ... prepped at Serramonte High School in Daly City where he gained prep All-America honors as a hurdler ... also lettered in football and cross



country ... born October 15, 1957 in San Francisco, but lives now in Daly City ... single ... Public Relations major.

MIKE HIGGINS — Hurdles — 6-0 — 155 — Freshman



Won the Western League 330-yard intermediate hurdles last year while at Mission Bay High School ... lettered two years in track, basketball and football at Mission Bay ... born April 7, 1959 in San Diego and still lives here ... single ... Business major.

KEN HOWER — Middle Distances — 6-2 — 170 — Senior

Reshirted at San Diego State last season after lettering at Colorado State in track as a halfmiler and in cross country ... has a lifetime best 1:52.0 in the 880 in college and has run a 4:18 mile and 9:20 two-mile in high school ... prepped at Mission Viejo High School where he ran the two-mile and was league champion and 2nd in the CIF in the 880 . . . also played football . . . born July 20, 1955 in Washington, D.C., but lives now in Mission Viejo ... single ... Business Management major.



BRIAN HUNSAKER — Distances — 5-9 — 140 — Sophomore

Figures to be one of the finest distance runners to compete for the Aztecs ... redshirted last season after spending his freshman season at UC Irvine where he lettered in track and cross country . . . won the PCAA Cross Country Championship for the Aztecs this year with a six-mile time of 30:33 . . . also placed 8th in the District 8 Cross Country Championships and 30th in the NCAA Finals ... the 30th finish at the



NCAA Meet earned him United States Citizen All-America honors . . . has best track times of 4:11.2 in the mile and 13:53 in the 3-mile ... prepped at Corona del Mar High School where he was one of the top prep distance men in the country ... single ... Business/Recreation major.

JOHN KENWORTHY — Pole Vault — 5-9 — 145 — Freshman



Freshman pole vaulter who comes to the Aztecs from Crespi High School in Encino . . . lettered two years and has a lifetime best mark of 13-6 ... born February 25, 1959 in Los Angeles, but lives in Encino now single.

MARTY KRULEE — Sprinter — 5-7 — 150 — Senior

One of last season's surprise performers . ran a 10.5 in the 100-meters for the Aztecs and a 21.5 in the 200-meters . . . also ran the lead leg on the Aztec 400 Relay team that recorded a 40.6 last season . . . came to the Aztecs from West Valley College where he lettered two seasons ... prepped at Branham High School in San Jose where he lettered twice ... born November 4, 1956 in Framingham, Mass., but calls San Jose home now ... single.



LONNY LOW — High Jump — 6-21/2 — 165 — Freshman



One of the top high school prospects recruited by the Aztecs \ldots has a lifetime best of 6-10½ in the high jump, 22-11 in the long jump and 14.4 in the high school hurdles ... prepped at Tamalpais High School in Mill Valley where he lettered four years on the varsity ... also lettered in football as a wide receiver ... born May 29, 1959 in Brynmawr, Pa., but lives now in Sausalito ... single ... Telecommunications major.

VERNOY MAYWEATHER — Sprinter — 5-11 — 150 — Junior

Outstanding junior college prospect who comes to the Aztecs from College of Alameda ... won the JC State Title in the 400-meters in 1976 . . . has a lifetime best of 46.8 in the 400 ... also has bests of 10.5 in the 100meters and 21.3 in the 200 ... prepped at Fremont High School in Oakland where he lettered two years ... born April 25, 1957 in Oakland and still calls it home ... single.



HIRAM MUNA — Javelin — 6-0 — 180 — Junior



JC transfer who comes to the Aztecs from San Diego Mesa College ... has a lifetime best mark of 208-3 in the javelin ... was 3rd in the South Coast Conference Championships last year ... prepped at Claire-mont High School in San Diego where he lettered in track and football ... born December 18, 1955 in San Diego and still lives here ... single ... P.E. major.

HARLOW NAASZ — Sprinter — 5-8 — 130 — Freshman

Good freshman sprint prospect who comes to the Aztecs from Chula Vista High School ... was 3rd in both the 100 and 220 yard dashes in the CIF Meet ... has lifetime bests of 9.7 in the 100-yards, 10.6 in the 100-meters, 21.7 in the 220 and 49.8 on a 400 relay split ... lettered three years at Chula Vista ... born October 28, 1959 in Honolulu, Hawaii, but lives now in Chula Vista ... single ... Psychology major.



HILDRIA NEWELL — Sprinter — 6-2 — 180 — Sophomore



Did a fine job for the Aztecs last season as a freshman, posting marks of 10.7 in the 100-meters (10.4 wind-aided) and 21.2 in the 200 ... also ran the second leg of the Aztec 400 relay team that posted a 40.6 ... came to San Diego State from Chula Vista High School where he ran 9.5 in the 100, 21.5 in the 220, high jumped 6-2 and 22-0 in the long jump ... lettered three years in track and also played football at Chula Vista

... born March 8, 1957 in Riverhead, New York and still calls it home single.

PAT OLIVERIO — Pole Vault — 5-11 — 155 — Junior

JC transfer who comes to SDSU from Grossmont College . . . has a lifetime best in the pole vault of 14-0 ... competed in the Southern California Championships both vears at Grossmont ... prepped at Mt. Miguel High School in Spring Valley where he lettered in track, football and wrestling born March 25, 1957 in San Diego, but lives now in La Mesa ... single ... P.E. major.



JAMES PERRY - Sprinter - 5-11 - 145 - Senior

One of the major contributors on last year's Aztec team ... placed 2nd in the PCAA 200-meters with a lifetime best 21.3 also has lifetime high marks of 10.6W in the 100-meters, 48.0 in the 400 and 24-0 in the long jump ... anchored the Aztec 400 Relay team that ran 40.6 last year . . . came to San Diego State from East Los Angeles College where he won the Metropolitan Conference 200 and 400 titles as a soph as well



as the State JC 200 title . . . also ran on East L.A.'s State Championship 400 and mile relay teams as a soph . . . as a freshman at ELA won the conference 220 title and was 3rd in the State and 2nd in the long jump ... prepped at Fremont High School in Los Angeles where he was one of the City's top performers ... also lettered in football and basketball ... born September 13. 1956 in Dallas, Texas, but lives now in Los Angeles ... single Recreation major.

DAVID RUSSELL — Sprinter — 5-8 — 143 — Freshman

One of the hottest prospects in the nation last year ... won both the 100 and 220 at the California State High School Championships with clockings of 9.61 in the 100 and 20.97 in the 220 ... also was a double winner in the San Diego CIF Championships ... was one of the top preps in the country with his 100 and 220 times ... also has best mark of 49.2 in the 440 ... ran for Patrick Henry High School in San Diego and lettered on the varsity three seasons ... born November 10, 1958 in San

Diego and still lives here ... single.



RHAN SHEFFIELD — Hurdles — 5-7 — 150 — Senior



Developed into one of the finest intermediate hurdlers in the country last year ... won the PCAA Championships in the 400meter hurdles and placed 8th in the NCAA Finals to earn All-America honors ... was the fifth Aztec in a row to win the PCAA hurdles title ... has a lifetime best of 50.6 in the 400IH ... also ran a leg on the Aztec mile relay team last season ... came to SDSU from East Los Angeles College where

DAN STEWART — Quarter Mile — 5-11 — 155 — Freshman



Top freshman prospect from San Diego High School ... placed 6th in the California State Championships with a top 440-yard dash time of 48.5 ... placed 2nd in the CIF Meet in the 440 and ran a leg on the mile relay team that was 2nd in the CIF ... also played football at San Diego High and lettered as a defensive back ... born July 17, 1958 in San Diego and still calls it home ... single.

BILL ST. JOHN — Distances — 5-10 — 135 — Sophomore

Won the PCAA 3,00 meter steeplechase Title last year as a freshman ... broke the old conference record by almost 10 seconds in winning the meet ... has a best time of 8:52.9 in the steeplechase which is an Aztec record ... ran in the NCAA Finals last season ... placed 8th in the PCAA and 22nd in the District 8 cross country championships this year and was 5th in the PCAA, 16th in the District 8 and 81st in the NCAA last season

... prepped at Mater Dei High School in Santa Ana where he was All-CIF and All-America in both track and cross country ... has best times of 8:54.8 in the two-mile, 4:20.5 in the mile and 1:58.0 in the 880... born November 8, 1957 in Morristown, New Jersey, but calls Orange home now ... single ... Business major.

BOBBY THOMAS — Distances — 6-0 — 150 — Junior



Redshirted last year for the Aztecs after lettering in track and cross country at UCLA... ran for the Aztec cross country team this year, but was hampered by injuries... was 8th in the 1976 National AAU Cross Country Championships in Philadelphia with a six-mile time of 30:40 ... was the United States and World Junior Cross Country Champion in 1974 while competing at Glendale College ... has a

best of 14:08 in the 5000-meters ... prepped at Glendale High School ... single ... Business/Real Estate major.

GLEN VIEIRA — Pole Vault — 5-8 — 135 — Freshman

Won the San Diego CIF pole vault title last season while at Madison High School with a vault of 14-0... has a lifetime best, however, of 15-0... lettered four years in track at Madison and three years in football as a free safety... born September 26, 1959 in Victorville, but lives now in San Diego ... single... Business major.





Junior college transfer from Grossmont College where he turned in a best of 55.8 in the 440 intermediate hurdles ... lettered two years in track at Grossmont and also lettered in soccer ... prepped at Mt. Miguel High School in Spring Valley where he was a hurdler and an all-league soccer player ... also was on the San Diego Youth Track Team that toured Japan three years ago ... born June 29, 1956 in Kingsville, Texas, but lives



now in San Diego ... single ... Élementary Education major.

SCOTT YOUNG - Decathlon - 6-31/2 - 185 - Senior



Perhaps the best pure athlete to wear an Aztec uniform ... placed 6th in the NCAA decathlon Finals last year and won the PCAA Championships with a school record 7215 points ... won the decathlon high jump competition at the NCAA Finals with a personal best of $6-9^{1/2}$... also has top marks of 14.1 in the high hurdles, 53.8 in the intermediate hurdles and 22.5 in the long jump ... will high jump and run the hurdles

for the Aztecs in dual meets ... came to SDSU from Southwestern College where he placed 5th in the State JC decathlon ... won the Mission Conference high hurdle and high jump championships and placed 3rd in the State Meet in the high hurdles ... prepped at Bonita Vista High School in Chula Vista where he was the Metro League Athlete of the Year as a senior ... won the CIF high jump as a senior and placed 9th in the State Meet ... also played football in high school ... born July 5, 1956 in Chula Vista, but calls Bonita home now ... single ... P.E. major.
