5122 Girls qualify for CCS

The field is set in the girls' division for Friday night's Central Coast Section track and field championships at San Jose City College.

But as far as Kris Costello of Lynbrook High is concerned, it's not quite set.

Costello, the top long jumper in the CCS, will not be competing in her specialty Friday. A pulled ligament which finally surfaced in Saturday's trials decided that.

"I don't know how I did it," said Costello, applying a melting bag of ice to her leg. "I first felt it Thursday. I must have done it long jumping. It wasn't too bad then, but, oh, does it hurt now."

Costello carried a season best of 18-8 into the trials, almost a foot better than Saturday's top qualifier. She did jump,

but her injury limited her distance to just 16-10 $\frac{3}{4}$.

Costello's only consolation is that she still qualified No. 1 for the 110 low hurdles.

Elsewhere in Saturday's trials, meet records were set in the 440 relay by Andrew Hill, in the 100, 880, two-mile, and mile relay.

Defending state champion Ann Regan of Camden battled the effects of a sudden three-day case of the measles and still qualified in both the 440 and 880.

Locally, Tammy Weber of Lynbrook was the only winner as she qualified first in the mile with a 5:09.89 clocking. De Anza Athletic League schools pace area qualifiers with 15 spots while Santa Clara Valley and South Peninsula Athletic League teams had 13 and 12 spots.
