on his 1977 State Meet finishes of fifth and third.

"In the 880 I was trying to make myself go out faster, but I have a tendency to stay with everybody," he explained. "I'm really looking forward to next week.

"There's no competition so I have to run for time," he added. "I've got so much background in distance work and after the races I'm not tired. If I get somebody out there to push me in the 880, the national record is gone."

El Cerrito's Dale Scott holds the prep national record, running 1:48.5 in 1972. White's best is 1:51,8 at the

State Meet finals a year ago.

Barrett, a junior, copped both hurdle events (14.3, 37.3) and was one of the moaning Gauchos after their mile relay effort fell short. Barrett ran a 48.5 leg on the mile relay.

The Gauchos were very unfortunate. When E.C. mile relay anchor Bryant Pete took the baton from Jerry Shepherd, his right heel was stepped on by Mike White.

Pete's shoe flew into the air and he had to run the final lap with a bare foot. He did an admirable job, clocking 49.9, but suffered on the curves when he had little traction.

"On the last curve, I tried to hang with (Berkeley's Fred) DeWitt," noted Pete, one of three juniors on the E.C. mile relay quartet which ran the second fastest time in school history.

'I felt every time I came down with my foot, I lost a 10th of a second," Pete continued. "It would have been

much better if I had that shoe."

Richard suffered, if possible, even a worse fate. He finished second in the 440, running 48.3, but then came the

discouraging news.

"I was in lane eight and I tried to run on the inside of the lane to make sure the race was as short as possible," said the disconsolate Richard. "They didn't even tell me I was disqualified until I was ready to go on the victory stand.

"At first I didn't feel like running anymore," Richard admitted. "I felt like tearing up my suit. I wanted to go to the State Meet in the open events."

Richard and teammates Terry Lewis, Paul Stewart and Ken Russell will be in Bakersfield after capturing the mile relay in 3:16.5, one of the best times in Northern California history.

Bachand, meanwhile, ran strategically and won the

mile in 4:11.0.

His previous best was 4:17.0, and he had been running in the 4:30 range while trying to recover. His 60.4 last lap indicates Bachand is in excellent shape.

BHS girls gain momentum, seem likely favorites at State Meet

Berkeley's girls served notice they will be tough to beat, Richmond's Mike White indicated he is better than his times have showed, El Cerrito's Don Barrett demonstrated he could be a star of the future and Albany's Greg Bachand emerged from obscurity.

Among a host of superb track and field athletes at Cal's Edwards Stadium Saturday, the above stood out. But there was also some despondent news for local athletes, the majority of whom sparkled on a splendid

afternoon.

The competition was so fierce that El Cerrito's boys, running 3:19.0 in the mile relay, failed to advance because of an unfortunate mishap at the final exchange.

And Kennedy's Jamie Richard, seemingly assured of a berth in the 440, found out he had been

disqualified after running out of his lane.

Enough of the bad news. For Willie White and his Berkeley girls, the news was very, very good. The Jackets won five events in the non-scoring meet and Sharon Ware's second place in the sprints lent depth to the team which probably will be the favorite when the State Meet begins at Bakersfield College Friday evening.

Probably the most encouraging aspect of Berkeley's effort was not Freida Cobbs' expected double win in the sprints (10.6w; 23.7), nor the relay victories (47.3 and a state-best 3:52.8). Rather, it was the efforts of quarter-

miler Kim White.

The daughter of the Berkeley coach, Kim drew the disadvantage of lane eight in the 440 final, meaning her competitors could watch her progress while she ran the first part of the race alone.

White did not seem to be hindered, however, zipping to a 55.6 for a win. Her strong third legs on the relays set

up the flying Cobbs for relatively easy anchors.

Another White, Richmond's Mike, says he is running for time and not necessarily for the competition. He won the 440 in 48:1 and the 880 in 1:54.2. He hopes to improve
