# Knights Second In Region IV Track Duel

Soquel High took second to Seaside in the Region IV boys' track and field finals Saturday at Hartnell College.

Robert East won the 440 in school record time of 49.0 and also placed second in the 220 in 22.2, which tied a school record. Jim Verdusco nabbed the 330 low hurdles with a school record time of 38.2 and came in third in the 120 highs in 15.3.

Santa Cruz' John Rembao nabbed the two-mile (9:39.0) and Harbor's Sam Taran heaved the frosh-soph shot 52-8 for a first. Soquel's Lorin Wilson was third at 47-0 and second in the discus at 140-10.

Aptos' Tim Gruber finished second in the mile in 4:20.5, just ahead of the Knights' Rick Ifland, who crossed in 4:23.7. Ifland placed second in the 880 with a personal best of 1:57.1.

Soquel's 440 relay team (Bob Bauld, Kurt Kruger, Verdusco and East) came in second with a school record clocking of

4:35.0. The Knights' mile relay quartet just missed a school record by 0:00.2, checking in second in 3:25.8.

Santa Cruz' Andre Wilkes took third in the 100 with a time of 10.2.

Soquel's Bob Bauld placed second in the pole vault at 13-0, and the Knights' Robert Mander recorded a personal best in the frosh-soph 880 with a 2:03.9 time.

The top three finishers in each event advance to Friday's CCS finals at San Jose City College.

Aptos' Charlene Lundy captured the long jump with an effort of 17-9 to highlight local action in the CCS girls' qualifying meet at San Jose City College.

In addition to Lundy, Soquel's Sue Tompkins, Laurie Spence, Renee Mulvaney, Kris Allayne and Kelly Osterkamp, Harbor's Lezli Peterson and San Lorenzo Valley's Joni

Martin all qualified for Friday's CCS Finals.

Tompkins took third in her heat of the 110 low hurdles with a school record time of 15.21, and also ran the first leg of the Knights' runner-up mile relay team (4:05.85, Mulvaney, Allayne and Osterkamp were also on the school record setting quartet. Spence placed fourth in her heat of the 880 with a time of 2:23.6.

Peterson sprinted across the line first in 57.67 in her heat of the 440, while Martin cleared the bar at 5-3 in the high jump for a fourth to round out the Santa Cruz County Athletic League qualifiers.

Peterson was third in her heat of the 220 at 25.84, but dropped to 27.18 in the semifinals for a sixth and didn't qualify. Rebecca Rosser and Christa Cavanah both went 5-1 in the high jump and Harbor's mile relay team took seventh in 4:19.90, but didn't qualify.

Aptos' Sally Weaver placed seventh in the mile in 5:26.55 and teammate Katy Brown — after nabbing the SCCAL title last week with a 35-8 heave in the shot put — slipped to 32-10½ Saturday. Neither qualified for

Friday's CCS finals at San Jose City College.

Soquel's Gretchen Guelich was sixth in school record time in her two-mile heat (11:57.15). Soquel's 440 relay team (Osterkamp, Tompkins, Mindy

Gulbert, and Allayne) was fifth at 50.90, Allayne was fourth in her 440 heat (59.85) and Osterkamp fifth (1:00.48), but Pianavilla tossed the discus failed to meet qualification 109-7 and Harbor's Bobbie Parsons heaved it 107-8 in non-qualifying marks.
