The 60th Annual California State Meet at Bakersfield Memorial Stadium will go down in history as one of the finest high school meets ever. There were many remarkable performances, but the four new national records set the tone for this the greatest high school meet in America as witnessed by 11,500 spectators.

Banning of Wilmington in the Los Angeles Section with the team of Darryl Davis(49.3), Sam Caeser(48.1), Chris Blavlock(47.4), and Devin Lewis(46.8) set a new national record in the boys mile relay with a sensational 3:11.57 electronic timing, which is rounded up to 3:11.6. The old record of 3:11.8 was set by Spring Branch Memorial, Houston, Texas, on April 1, 1967. It was tied twice by Killian, Miami, Florida on May 10, 1969, and Madison, Houston, Texas on May 1, 1976. The Killian team was anchored by future Olympian Larry Black in 46.2. Rod Bethany of Fontana anchored his team to third place behind Banning with a sizzling split of 45.9. In the qualifying heats, Sacramento ran 3:16.77, but failed to qualify.

Anthony Curran(Crespi, Encino) set a new national pole vault record of 17-5¹/₄. The bar at one end came off the peg it was resting on and came to rest on top of the standard. The commissioner of the C.I.F., Bill Russell, decided to submit it as a national record, as there is no rule in the high school rule book covering this occurrence. The old national record was 16-10 set by Randy Hall (Port Lavaca, Texas) in 1977. Curran's mark is also the best ever by a prep in any competition. Olympian Casey Carrigan(Orting, Washington) vaulted 17-4³/₄

at the Golden West Invitational on June 14, 1969, in Sacramento. Curran opened at 15-2, missed once at 16-3, then made 16-9 and 17-0½ on his first attempt. His record vault came on his third attempt. He failed to improve when the bar was moved to 17-7. The vaulters encountered a problem with water in the pit. They got soaked everytime they landed.

Ann Regan(Camden, San Jose) broke her own national record of 2:08.0 set at last year's meet with an easy 2:07.93. Ann came through the quarter in 62.8. Linda Goen(North, Bakersfield) was not able to provide the competition she did last year, so Ann had this race to herself. Michelle Bush(Rolling Hills) closed quickly to capture second in 2:10.46.

Kris Costello (Lynbrook, Cupertino), who is going to attend the University of Oregon, tied the national record of Laverne Palmer (Dillard, Ft. Lauderdale) in the girls 110 yard low hurdles with 13.83, while defending her title.

Cheri Williams(Livermore), who is also going to Oregon, set a new state record in the girls two mile run with 10:17.71. She has a pending national record of 10:09.8, which she set in qualifving for the State Meet a week earlier. But in contrast to her lonely race at the North Coast Section, she had the company of Susie Meek(Palos Verdes) this night. Meek led the first four laps in 73, 2:30, 3:49, and 5:08. Then during the fifth lap Williams took command with splits of 6:27, 7:49, and 9:09. The old state record was set last year by Roxanne Bier(Independence, San Jose) in 10:37.7. Bier finished third in 10:44, while Meek also broke the old mark with a fine 10:23.54.

Williams came back to set another state record in the girls mile run—4:44.95. It broke the old record of 4:47.8 set by Linda Goen(North, Bakersfield) in the 1977 state meet. Williams'

mile is the second fastest in the United States in 1978. Cheryl Flowers (Valhalla, El Cahon) led the first two laps in 69.3 and 2:24.6. Then Williams took over the third lap in 3:40.1. Susie Meek was again second in 4:49.65.

Fremont(Los Angeles) with the team of Joanna Harper(57.5), Vanessa Frazier (58.5), Brenda Cole(58.6), and Glenda Beshears(56.7) set a new state record in the girls mile relay at 3:51.29. Crawford (San Diego) at 3:51.93, also went under the old standard of 3:52.1 set by Locke (Los Angeles) last year. The fastest split of 55.8 was recorded by Valerie Brisco(Locke) in anchoring her team to a 5th place finish. The pre-meet favorite Berkeley failed to qualify.

Sophomore Sue McNeal(Carlsbad) set a new state record in the girls high jump with 5-10¹/₄. The old record(5-10) was set by Kari Gosswiller(Upland) in 1976. McNeal's jump was equal to the 4th best jump of all time.

Arlise Emerson(Westminister) set a new state record of 54.3 in the girls 440 yard dash. Emerson also broke the old record in the heats. Valerie Brisco, the favorite from Locke, went out too fast and faded in the stretch.

Jordan of Los Angeles was the upset winner in the girls 440 relay. Crawford (San Diego) dropped the baton at the second exchange, which was the same location that pre-meet favorite Berkeley dropped theirs in the trials.

El Cerrito upset Gardena in the boys 440 yard relay despite starting in lane 9. It was a pleasant surprise as El Cerrito didn't have a sprint superstar, but good coaching and a positive attitude pulled it off.

Dave Mack (Locke, L.A.) a last minute substitution in the 880 led from start to finish. His first quarter was 53.8. The pre-meet favorite, Mike White (Richmond) started too slowly and only finished fourth, after being third last

year. Big surprise was fast improving sophomore Pete Quinones(Tulare Union) who pulled in second.

Kelia Bolton(Andrew Hill, San Jose) dominated the girls sprints and led her team to the girls championship. She is going to Cal Berkeley, and is interested in studying law. Freida Cobbs(Berkeley) didn't qualify for the finals of the 100 because five of the top nine girls were placed in the third heat. The electronic times were not converted to hand times when the heat assignments were made.

Dokie Williams (El Camino, Oceanside) led his team to the boys title with his victories in the triple jump (50-4¹/₄) and long jump (25-1¹/₄).

Giant Dave Porath(Atwater), who is going to Cal Berkeley, doubled in the discus(199-5) and shot put(65-1034) as expected. His Brian Oldfield spin technique in the shot put has proven very effective.

Junior Mike Sanford of Pasadena doubled in the 100 and 220 despite experiencing some leg difficulties in the stretch of the 220.

Milan Stewart(West Covina) upset Philip Johnson(Gardena) in the 120 highs, as Philip hit the first hurdle.

Junior Jeff Nelson(Burbank) outkicked veteran internationalist Rod Berry (Redwood, Larkspur), who wore his USA sweats to the meet. Carmelo Rios (Lennox) led the first lap in 67.4. Nelson took over the second lap in 2:15.4. Junior Tom Downs(Skyline, Oakland) led the third lap in 3:23.9. Nelson hit the mile in 4:32.7 and the 1½ in 5:41.4. Then Berry challenged at 1½ miles in 6:49.3 and 1¾ in 7:56.3, with Nelson on his shoulder. It was reminiscent of the super battle between Eric Hulst and Ralph Serna in San Diego during the 1975 meet.

Junior Bill Green(Cubberley, Palo Also) ran away from a fine 440 field in 46.77. He looks like a great prospect.

However, he did have difficulty in the 220 finishing ninth with insufficient rest(less than 20 minutes). The meet officials should allow more time between the 440 and 220.

Gary Lee(Poly, Long Beach) came from nowhere to surprise the 330 low hurdle field in 36.58. Willie Curran (Crespi, Encino) failed to qualify for the final.

Paul Medvin(University, Los Angeles) ran a fine 4:08.91 to win the mile. Most of the runners showed the strain of running so fast the night before in the fastest qualifying ever. Burt Shirley (Notre Dame) was the fastest non-qualifier in state meet history at 4:11.26.



To the casual track and field observer, Bill Green and Anthony Curran have little or nothing in com-

In fact, prior to today, Green had never heard of Curran.

Green is a junior and attends Cubberley High. Curran is a senior and attends Crespi High in Encino. Green is a sprinter and Curran is a pole vaulter. But

here any disimilarity ends.
Both athletes, who have never formally met, will be in Bakersfield this weekend for the 60th annual California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) state meet. And both are national leaders in their respec-

tive events heading into today's trials.

Curran tops the nation in the pole vault with ark of 17-44—the national record—and is the overwhelming favorite for the gold medal in Saturday's finals.

Green, currently the hottest track talent in the Central Coast Section, is the country's No. 1 prep quartermiler with his sizzling 47.0.

Both will carry that extra pressure with them into the meet. Or will they?

"I don't think there's any extra pressure," says the unflappable Green, who likes the idea of being the

nation's fastest prep quartermiler Green has perhaps the best chance of any Midpeninsula athlete of winning a gold medal. Rod Bethany of Fontana High, who finished third in last year's state meet with a 47.9, appears to be Green's stiffest competition with a 1978 best of 47.31.

After that, the challenge could be from Region II competitors Art Nicholson of Menlo-Atherton (47.9) and Tony Thompson of Woodside (48.0) or Mike

White of Richmond (48.1). At stake, At stake, along with the gold medal, is the record of 46.6 held by James Sanford of USC Larence Jones—a current member of the San Fran-

cisco 49ers.

While Green stands a good chance at a gold in the 440 and a decent chance at a medal in the 220 where he brings a best of 21.4, he's not the only CCS athlete

with that opportunity

Carlos Carrasco of Mt. Pleasant is the state leader in the two mile with a best of 9:02.6 and could win since defending champion Frank Assumma of Eisenhower High in Rialto qualified only in the mile. Assumma's brother, Chuck, will miss the competition altogether with a stress fracture.

Kobert Smith of Awalt has dropped seven seconds in the mile this year, from a 4:19.9 early in the year to his current best of 4:12.0, but is still three seconds behind Dave Bahara of Hart High in Newhall who is

the state leader and co-national leader at 4:09.4. CCS pole vault entrants Bert Tardieu of Del Mar (16-134), Ross McAlexander of Monta Vista (15-61/2) and Mitch Preciado of Homestead (15-6) stand chances for medals, as long as they don't mind silver or bronze while Steve Struble of Sunnyvale is miles away from a gold but could still pick up a second or third in the discus if he can duplicate his best of 185-1

Dave Porath of Atwater appears a likely winner in both the discus and shot put with state bests of 206-6

and 64-10, respectively Steve Bruce of Menlo-Atherton is among the state leaders in the long jump with a 23-8½ best, but Gary Butler of Fremont High of Los Angeles has gone 25-4 1

Steve Guthrie of Cupertino and Malcolm Dixon of Sequoia have the unenviable task of challenging defending state champion Phil Johnson of Gardena in the 120-yard high hurdles. Johnson won last year with a 13.66 time and has the hand-held equivalent of

a 13.4 this season. Other Region II competitors in today's trials, which begin at 4 p.m., are Fred Grolle of Los Altos in the long and triple jumps, Al Zoppi of Wilcox in the triple jump, Bob Love of Carlmont in the two mile, Matt Bailey of Buchser in the 880, Mesha Spivey of Woodside in the high jump, Stan Beal of San Carlos in the 100 and 220, Frank Oravillo of Sequoia in the 100 and Dave Avila of Cupertino in the mile.

Cubberley also has entered its 440 relay team, as does Carlmont, while San Carlos sends its 3:20.8 mile



Vike girl ties national record in low hurdles

DEFENDING champion Kris Costello of Lynbrook set a state record and tied the national standard while winning the 110 low hurdles at the 60th annual CIF State Track and Field Championships Saturday in Bakersfield.

Costello's performance highlighted De Anza League efforts, which saw nine of 14 area athletes qualify during Friday's preliminaries for the next day's finals.

The senior Viking, third at CCS while favoring torn cartilage in one knee, blazed an electronically timed 13.83 in a race that produced the three top clockings in the nation for 1978. The mark was rounded off to equal the national record of 13.8.

"I WAS REALLY nervous at the start of the race," said Costello, who has accepted a full-ride scholarship to the University of Oregon in Eugene and plans to major in

pre-med.
"Kim (Costello of El Camino, South San Francisco) had a faster time going into it, and I was never really sure whether my knee would hold up or start ripping. Plus the fact that I put pressure on myself.

since I was the defending champion. Lynbrook also entered freshmen CCS queens Tracy Weber in the mile and Kristy Campbell in the long jump. Neither made the finals as Weber ran 5:03.3 for eighth in her heat while Campbell leaped 17-21/2 for 19th overall.

CUPERTINO TOOK down its largest group of individuals ever and had Steve Guthrie place fifth in the 120 high hurdles

and first-ever female Pioneer qualifier
Karen Woodbeck take sixth in the discus.
Guthrie, the DAL, Region II and CCS gold medalist, brought the crowd to its feet with his second-place finish in Friday's heats. Hitting all 10 hurdles and knocking down eight, he slammed into the last barrier badly, forcing him to remain on two feet by pushing off the all-weather

Tartan surface with one hand. Staggering toward the tape, he threw himself across the finish line sideways,

landing in a heap just over the stripe. "I caught my trail leg on the last one and just tried to stay up," explained Guthrie, who stopped the watches at 14.46. "I didn't even know how far away the finish was. I just tried to stay up."

The Pioneer senior came back the next day to place fifth in 14.64, becoming one of a small handful of CCS hurdlers ever to make the state finals.

make the state finals. WOODBECK, ONLY a junior, has been surprising coaches and competitors alike ever since the league meet, where she broke her foot after a winning toss. Since then, she has limped through the region and section meets on crutches, throwing

with her foot heavily taped. She was also on crutches during the state meet where she qualified eighth in Friday's prelims at 123-2, then came back

the next day to place sixth with a 122-9 "The pain is not really a factor," said the 5-10 blonde, who gutted out the post-season meets this year after a disappointing sophomore campaign in which she placed sixth in the CCS after entering with

the second-ranked throw, thus missing the state meet. 'It only hurts just when I release it. The doctors say it'll take about six weeks to Cupertino girls' coach Chuck Bean added, "Karen's key was her consistency, even if it was on a bad foot. She kept getting out to the same distance when everyone around her was choking because of the pressure.

PIONEER SENIOR Steve Finley, CCS runner-up in the long jump, placed 19th overall with a leap of 22-234 in the prelims. Junior miler Dave Avila, also a second-placer in the section, did not run due to

personal problems.

Probably the toughest event DAL representatives entered was the pole

The names and heights were awesome; Steve Tully from Millikan, brother of UCLA's world recordholder Mike, and phenomena Anthony Curran of Crespi-Encino, who set the national high school record of 17-41/4 this year.

COMPETING IN this, one of the finest high school vault fields ever assembled, were Homestead's Mitch Preciado and Monta Mista's Ross McAlexander.

Both had trouble with a fluctuating wind in the stadium, to the extent that Preciado barely made his opening height of 13-9 with a third attempt clearance. The duo qualified with efforts of 14-3, however,

to advance it into the 12-man finals.
On Saturday the wind conditions were the same, constantly alternating between a headwind and tailwind. McAlexander had a moderate clearance at 14-8, then popped a screamer over 15-2 with a 15-inch clearance, and it appeared that a 16-footer

might be on the way. The gusting wind, though, had other ideas, forcing him to pull short on his first trial at 15-6, then run under the bar on his second attempt. On his final try, McAlexander planted and was in the air, but the pair of aborted attempts had taken their toll and dulled his technique enough to miss. He placed seventh behind Tully.

PRECIADO, in the meantime, was "giving me ulcers," according to Mustang mentor Rick Milam. Of the 15 possible attempts the Homestead senior had at five

different heights, he used 12, clearing three heights on his third and final trial. The result of this hair-tearing effort cul-

minated when Preciado writhed over 15-6 for a lifetime best by half a foot and fifth place.
"The biggest problem was the wind," he remarked. "It was circular. On every other vault it'd be a headwind, and every other vault would be a tailwind. That killed

a lot of attempts. "At the beginning of this year I wanted to place in the top 10 in the state. I didn't have the trouble I had with my back this

season like I did last year, and that made a big difference."

The pair then sat back and watched Curran set another national record at 17-5¹/₄, adding the senior class mark to his other class records of 14-8³/₄ as a freshman, 15-9¹/₄ as a soph and 16-4¹/₄ as a junior. The record may be disallowed for the UCLA-bound Curran, however, as the bar flipped up off one peg and onto the top

of the standard. THE DAL ALSO sent Steve Struble of Sunnyvale in the discus. The senior qualified fourth in the prelims at 175-11, but threw three straight fouls in the finals to finish unplaced. His Friday mark would have tied him for second place overall.

Pole Vault Record Takes a Funny Bounce for Curran

BAKERSFIELD—Anthony Curran, Crespi High's record-setting pole vaulter, had missed twice at 17 feet 5¼ inches in Saturday night's 60th annual CIF state track and field championships at Bakersfield College's Memorial Stadium.

As he prepared for his third attempt, an errantly thrown discussailed into the vault pit. He backed off, regained his composure, then started down the ramp.

Curran apparently cleared the bar, but it quivered, bounced off the pins and came to rest atop the standard, two inches higher.

A national high school record? Maybe.

Curran, who holds the National Federation mark of 17-4¼ and the CIF record of 17-1, may have erased Casey Carrigan's 1969 all-time prep best of 17-4¾, but it will be more than a week before an official ruling is announced

Meanwhile, Dokie Williams led El Camino High of Oceanside to the boys' title with 16 points by winning the long jump and triple jump and finishing fourth in the 100.

Andrew Hill of San Jose won the girls' title.

It was a perfect night for running, with little wind and mild temperature. The crowd was estimated at 10,000.

But the most dramatic moment of the meet was when Curran vaulted 17-51/4 and the bar bounced up.

"I've been in track and field for 28 years, and I've never seen the bar sit like that before," said Bill Russell, executive secretary of the CIF.

Russell said a 14-member board will rule on Curran's vault at the national high school committee meeting June

12-13 in Elgin, Ill.
"I'm not optimistic," Russell said. "The National Federation Track and Field Record Book says, 'It shall count as an unsuccessful trial when the crossbar is displaced by the body or the pole,' but it doesn't say displaced from what."
Curran, who broke his brother Tim's 1973 state record of

16-23/4, is optimistic.

"I'm pretty sure they're going to count it," he said. "If God wants me to have it as a record, then I will. If not, then that's the way it was meant to be.

Curran, who will attend UCLA this fall, said after missing once at 16-3, "I'm not too excited about this meet. I don't feel that well."

He then cleared 16-3 on his second try, 16-9, 17-01/4 and apparently 17-51/4 before three unsuccessful vaults at 17-7.





BAKERSFIELD--While tional records tumbled in glamour events-the pole vault and mile relay-Woodside High's Tony Thompson and Lynbrook's Kris Costello also enjoyed genuine distinction in the 60th annual state track and field finals.

On the surface, Thompson's fifth in the 440 in 48.08 behind winner Bill Green of Cubberley seems only like an excellent Northern Califor nia effort in a traditionally Southern California-dominated event.

But by placing in the state meet Saturday night at Bakersfield College, Tony T became the first ath-lete in the 13-season history of the Central Coast Section to enjoy both a 1,000-yard football rushing season and a place in the 440.

Costello was the only girl from Region II who placed, though 10 others from the CCS also scored in an excellent distaff showing capped by a team title for Andrew Hill of San Jose. El Camino-Oceanside won the boys title.

Costello's 110 low hurdles effort was super—a remarkably smooth, dominant 13.83. That bettered her own 1977 state meet record of 13.97. And, rounded down as her electrical time will be, it also will tie the national record of 13.8 hand-timed by La Verne Palmer of Dillard, Fla., in 1977.

The pole vault, of course, was this year's spotlight event, and Anthony Curran of Crespi-Encino didn't disappoint the crowd of 11,500.

Curran, earlier breaking with ease the state meet record of 16-234 by his brother, Tim, in 1973, cleared a national record 17-51/4 on his final try. But the record involved a bizarre twist.

As Curran brushed the bar, it actually was somehow lifted from the peg onto the top of the standard, where it stayed. A million-toone shot, perhaps, but CIF Commissioner Bill Russell ruled that it would be submitted as a record, since the rule book doesn't cover such a strange situation.

The other national boys record was a 3:11.60 mile relay by Banning of Los Angeles, topping the 3:11.8 by Killian of Miami, Fla., in 1969.

Aside from Green, top Region II placer was Sequoia senior Malcolm Dixon, whose fourth-place, 14.41 120 high hurdles race was the Cherokees' first state meet medal in 22 years. Jim Matejka last earned a medal in the 1956 meet with a tie for third in the pole

On the whole, the CCS boys suffered one of their poorer showings in the state meet.

Along with the first by Green, fourth by Dixon and fifth by Thompson, Cupertino's Steve Guthrie took fifth in the hurdles in 14.64 and Homestead's Mitch Preciado pole vaulted a life best 15-6 for another fifth. Region II scored 11 of the 16 points by CCS athletes.

The other CCS places were fourths by Gilroy's Ken Holladay in the two-mile (relegating Carlmont's Bob Love to sixth) and North Salinas' Tom Peterson in the discus, plus a fifth in the high jump by Mt. Pleasant's Joel Wyrick.

Cubberley's Green is something else

BAKERSFIELD — It's no exaggeration. Bill Green could well be the finest 440-yard dash prospect in United States track

and field history.

Consider that one year ago, the Cubberley High junior had yet to run his first open quarter.

Consider that Saturday night, when he won the first state track title by a Palo Alto city athlete in 22 years, he also became the fastest junior, at 46.77, in California annals.

Consider that of the nine 440 finalists Saturday at Bakersfield College, Green was the only one who attempted to qualify in Friday's trials in both the 440 and 220 - and succeeded.

Consider that the fastest Olympian Lee Evans ever ran in high school was 46.9 - as a senior in 1965, the year he set the Central Coast Section record which stood until Green's great run Saturday.

Consider that another Olympian, Tommie Smith, won the California state 440 in 1963 - in

Consider that Green already ranks No. 7 on the all-time California listing. That he isn't far off the state meet record of 46.6 by Larance Jones of Lemoore in 1969 and James Sanford of Pasadena last year. And that he may better the all-time California best of 46.1 by Ulis Williams of Compton in 1961 and the national mark of 45.8 by Ronnie Ray of Newport News, Va., in 1972. And consider that his title time probably will finish as the national best.

Truly, the mind boggles at what Bill Green, a relative novice on the track, may accomplish when he becomes more accomplished.

"I'm kind of overwhelmed by it all," said the soft-spoken Green, first state champ from Cubberley and first Cougar state meet placer since Don Castle took second in the 1961 shot put.

"I never dreamed of all this," added the modest Green. He did acknowledge, however, that he began thinking state title "when I did so well in the Regions (Region II finals).

"I'll be back next year, trying just as hard. Now, I just have to go back to Cubberley and be Bill Green again."

He also plans to continue running in AAU competition for the Herbert Hoover Memorial Boys Club of Menlo Park.

Green, the first state champ from Palo Alto since Paly High's Ron Larrieu won the mile in 1956, was in command all the

"Wow, is he strong!" praised Woodside's Tony Thompson, whose fifth place gave the CCS two places for the first time since Los Altos' Rick Brown (last previous quarter champ from the CCS) and Jim Andrew were first and fourth in 1970.

"The race went just the way I thought it out," said Green. "I wanted to sprint out, glide and kick it in. Everything went fine. My hip didn't bother me. It seems to be getting better

Green, bothered to varying degrees the past four weeks with a nerve irritation in his hip, handed his main rival, Fon-tana's Rod Bethany, his first loss this season.

Green's effort topped the state record by a junior of 46.8 by Ray Johnson of Blair-Pasadena in 1971. Since Green's romp was electrical, the added conversion factor of 0.14 puts Bill well ahead of Johnson's hand-timed mark.

Green credited his Cougar coaches, Jim Yelton and Jack Young, with "giving me good workouts," and his father, also Bill Green, with "providing me with my real inspiration. My dad (a former collegiate 440 standout) taught me about the strategy I've used."

Green is only the sixth state champ from Palo Alto. The first four were three-time high jump winner Les Steers (1935-37) and high hurdler Omar Cowles

"I'm committed to track it's one of the main parts of my life," said Green, who turned 17

Green came back only 10 minutes after his 440 victory and tried the 220 also.

Green finished ninth in 22.24. He developed a painful leg cramp, which cost him his appearance on the victory stand.
