Some top NorCal talent went to the Arcadia Invitational in SoCal on April 28: <u>Dave Porath</u> continued his fine efforts with a 204-11 fling (4th all-time). <u>Mike 0'Reilly</u> of San Rafael clicked off a very quick 1500m to win in 3:51.5 (about equivalent to a 4:10 mile). <u>Skyline</u> produced a 10:16.2 distance medley effort behind Lakewood's 10:15.7. Porath also annexed the shot with a 63-7¼ effort. Berkeley's Freida Cobbs moved up to the one-lapper and produced a fine 55.80m behind Valerie Brisco (Locke, LA), who took the national lead with a great 53.70. Like other big track meets held on dirt running surfaces, the West Coast Relays are experiencing difficulties in attracting both big name athletes and the large crowds that come with them. This meet, however, is hardly on its death bed. In spite of competition from the Pepsi-UCLA meet on the same weekend, the two day affair drew a crowd of about 7,000 on Friday and almost 12,000 on Saturday. The spectators were not disappointed by the performances of the competitors. Tom Woods led a host of high jumpers with a national best for the outdoor season of 7-5½. The weight men broke meet records in three of the four throwing events, and Eddie Hart made a triumphant return to the sprint scene.

the sprint scene. Fresno City College was rushed to complete the new high jump approach at Ratcliffe Stadium the week before the Relays, but the jumpers proved that the new surface was worth the effort. On Friday Joel Wyrick of Mt. Pleasant High School nipped Bob Churchill of Livermore on fewer misses at 6-8. Later that evening Dave Haber of Hayward State cleared 7-3 to set a college division meet record and win the college athlete of the meet award. On Saturday Thurlis Gibbs of San Jose City College leaped 7-3¼ to break Kyle Arney's national junior college record. Incredibly, Gibbs was followed by six other JC jumpers who cleared 7-0. Haber returned Saturday for the Open competition and improved to 7-3¾ for second place before missing three times at 7-5½. Woods cleared the height after the stadium lights failed for a period of 12 minutes. Said Woods, "I've learned to handle such interruptions. I just kicked back and waited." The mark was Woods best jump in three years.

Two Canadians led the weight men in a run on West Coast Relays records. Phil Olsen, competing for the University of Tennessee threw 280-8 in the javelin to better Bill Skinners 1971 mark and Scott Nielson, now throwing for the University of Washington threw 235-4 in the hammer to better George Frenn's old record of 226-4. In addition to the Canadian contribution, Ken Stadel set a meet record 216-9 in the discus and Al Feuerbach put the shot a solid 69-1½.

San Diego State dominated the open distance races as Bill St. John won the steeple in 8:52.2 and Brian Hunsaker pulled away from Fresno Pacific Track Club's Gary Romesser in the last lap of the 5,000 meter. Cal Berkeley's Andy Clifford used his usual strong finish to win the mile in 4:03.28. Bill Hurst of Modesto ran a very strong 8:51 to win the JC two mile in the heat of the day. Ruth Caldwell of Athletes in Action held on to win with 2:03.9 in the women's 800 meter after a fast 59 second first lap. Cheri Williams of Livermore ran a state best 4:53.3 mile in the high school girls mile in Friday's very windy conditions.

In the 800 meter relay USC ran an excellent 1:21.63 but was disqualified for passing out of the zone. Unbelievably down on their luck USC was later disqualified for a false start in the 400 meter relay, leaving the race open for a win by Cal Poly of San Luis Obispo.

Eddie Hart ran a strong 100 meters to announce his return to competition after a long lay off. Hart's 10.21 electronic time was good enough to win over Joel Andrews of USC and Carl Farmer of Cal, and also gave him second spot on this year's U.S. list behind Joel Andrews 10.18. Hart, who coaches at Alameda JC and has never given up running totally but has not trained seriously for several year, demonstrated what he and others have discovered — at age 29 the problem for a runner is one of priorities rather than ability.


