ERV HUNT
HEAD COACH
UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

Hunt is entering his seventh season as the California track coach. He is only the sixth man to hold the position in the school's 76 years of track and field history.

At the time of his appointment by former track coach and currently athletic director Dave Maggard, Hunt was the youngest coach ever named to a head position at the University of California.

Hunt has accomplished many things during his six years, including a 32-21 dual meet record. Since 1973, school records have been tied or established in eleven events, four in 1978.

Born and raised in Fresno, Calif., Hunt enjoyed both an outstanding prep and collegiate career in his hometown. He was a three sport athlete at Edison H.S., where he was a stand-out defensive back in football, played guard in basketball, and ran the hurdles in track.



His 14.0 time in the 120 high hurdles was the fastest JC time in the United States in 1969, when he finished second in the State JC meet. He also ran a 37.7 in the 330 intermediate

hurdles that same year, and "toyed" with several field events, most notably his 49'8" triple jump.

He transferred to Fresno State on a football-track scholarship following his two years at Fresno CC, playing defensive back under Darryl Rogers, now at Michigan State. He won Little All-American honors as the Bulldogs won two conference titles.

At the conclusion of his college football he was chosen in the sixth round by the Green Bay Packers. He suffered a back injury in his second season as a pro which forced an early retirement.

Following his pro stint, Hunt returned to Fresno and taught elementary school for a brief time before teaching at Clovis H.S.

In 1972, Cal's head track coach Dave Maggard hired Hunt to handle the runners.

Hunt's accomplishments went beyond the playing field. In 1968 he was chosen by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes as the "Scholar-Athlete of the Year."

Erv and his lovely wife Jackie make their home in Richmond with their two children, Jamie, 7 and Ericka, 2.

JOHN WEDEL

ASSISTANT TRACK COACH
UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA



Now in his fourth season at Cal, John Wedel handles the field event and decathlon areas for the Bears. Since his arrival in the fall of 1975, the highlights in the field have included school records in the long jump, triple jump, pole vault and decathlon, as well as a 200-foot discus throw and 7-1 high jump. Ed Miller set the decathlon record while winning the 1976 NCAA title.

Wedel, a native Californian, came to Berkeley from Texas-El Paso, where he spent three seasons with Ted Banks. There the Miners won two consecutive NCAA outdoor titles, and one indoors, where the field events earned them 30 of the 38 championship points.

Born and raised in southern California, Wedel attended Lynwood HS (graduating in 1965), and moved on to Compton JC, where he developed into a 6'8" high jumper. As a junior, he transferred to Arizona, clearing 7'0" to become only the second man over that height there.

His coaching career opened at Long Beach State under Jack Rose, and it was there that he met Banks, who was named coach at UTEP in 1973.

BRIAN MAXWELL

ASSISTANT TRACK COACH
DISTANCE RUNNERS



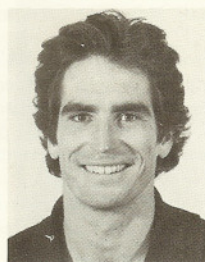
Maxwell returns for his fourth season helping Hunt with the Cal distance runners. He also coached the cross-country team this past fall. In 1975, Maxwell was one of Cal's top two and three milers. He narrowly missed earning a berth on Canada's 1976 Olympic team as a marathoner.

Born in London, England, he attended Victoria Park High School in Toronto, Canada. As a Canadian prep, Maxwell was the Canadian junior 5000 meters champion and later ran the fourth fastest Canadian national 10,000 meters time (28:58.4). While at Cal, he established the fifth fastest two and three mile times as well as the school's fourth fastest 3000 meters time.

Maxwell remains active in the marathon, ranking among the world's elite in that event.

BRAD DUFFEY

ASSISTANT TRACK COACH
UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA



California record holder Brad Duffey joins the staff for 1979, assisting Erv Hunt and Brian Maxwell in coaching the track athletes. A four-year letterman ('73-'77 with a year off in '75), Duffey has the fastest two-mile, three-mile, and 5000-meter times ever at Cal, and also ranks among the top 10 mile-1500 runners.

The 24-year old came to Berkeley from Lowell HS in San Francisco, with family tradition at Cal (five family members are grads), and received a degree in political science in 1977 (B+ average). He went on to earn his teaching credential in 1978, also at Cal.

As a senior, he was also honored as the 1977 recipient of the Brutus Hamilton Award for the track scholar-athlete of year.

DAVE MAGGARD

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS
UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA



While excellence, diversity, creativity and size are the hallmarks of the University of California, the same can be said of its popular athletic director, Dave Maggard.

Now in his seventh year as Cal's director of men's intercollegiate athletics, Maggard has a background in sports only a very select few enjoy. However, the level of excellence at which he has performed is unsurpassed.

As an athlete, he reached the pinnacle of amateur athletics as a member of the 1968 U.S. Olympic team as a 67 foot shot putter. During his college days he set the Cal school record in the shot put while winning three letters in that sport and one in football.

While a rookie head coach for the 1970 Cal track team, Maggard led the Golden Bears to that sport's pinnacle, the NCAA championship, developing such standouts as former world record holder Eddie Hart and NFL standout Isaac Curtis.

In 1971, he was selected to the prestigious post of Head Coach of the United States National Track and Field Team. A year later, at the young age of 32, Maggard was named the University's Athletic Director, one of the most commanding positions at any level of athletic administration. The job he has done since 1972 is nothing short of outstanding, bringing the University back to athletic prominence and respect.

The task was not an easy one by any means. His first effort was giving birth to the Bear Backers, which has since become the

fund-raising life blood of the Department. This donor group has grown from an infancy of virtually nothing to its present stature of \$700,000 annual giving, which includes a full grant-in-aid program, endowments, and capital improvements.

Maggard has also taken steps to improve several of the University's athletic facilities, which includes a new \$250,000 track surface, a new \$135,000 tennis complex, a new \$35,000 bulkhead for the aquatics complex, and this fall Memorial Stadium will receive a new \$200,000 natural turf.

He was recently appointed the chairman for the NCAA's prestigious International Relations Committee, which worked toward rejoining the United States Olympic Committee. He also serves on the NCAA's Committee for the United States Track & Field Federation, and is a member of a committee which sanctions all-star high school games.

A native of Turlock, California, Maggard enrolled at Cal on a football scholarship. He lettered one year in football and three in track before graduation in 1962 with his BA in Physical Science.

He began teaching and coaching on the high school level in 1963 at Sunset H.S. in Hayward, Calif., while training toward his goal of winning a spot on the 1968 Olympic squad.

He later assumed a coaching and teaching position with Los Altos H.S. near San Jose, but was summoned back to his alma mater for the 1969 season to serve as Sam Bell's assistant with the track team. A year later, he was the head track coach.

Despite the long hours and the seven day working weeks, one of his greatest enjoyments comes with the time he can spend with his family. He and his lovely wife, Carolyn, have three children, David, Dana, and Darrin. The Maggards make their home in Lafayette.

STAFF PERSONNEL

California athletic department staff actively involved with track and field include medical, equipment, and facilities personnel. The daily well-being of the participants is attended to by head trainer Bob Orr, who is assisted by Dave Stenger, Paul Mohler, and Dan LaConte.

The Bears' team physician is Dr. Jerome Patmont, a Cal graduate who handles all of the men's intercollegiate sports at Berkeley.

Equipment is under the supervision of Dick Hale.

Maintenance of the track facility is overseen by Hal Barker, who also directs the Bears' operations in Memorial Stadium, Evans Diamond, and areas of Harmon Gymnasium. He is assisted primarily by Pete Molendyk and Jack Baldrige at the track, as well as by Al Linder and Howard Comrie.

PRESS SERVICES

Requests for credentials for California track and field events should be made in writing and one week in advance to John McCasey, director of public relations, men's intercollegiate athletics, 61 Harmon Gym.

Edwards Stadium has a press box, located on the west side, with access by stairs only. Complete event summaries will be provided at the conclusion of the meet. If telephones are required at the press box, orders must be placed directly with Pacific Telephone. Otherwise, a telecopier and several phones located in the Sports Information Office in Harmon Gym may be made available upon prior arrangement.

1979 CALIFORNIA TRACK OUTLOOK

Head coach Erv Hunt appears to have the makings of a solid squad, welcoming back nineteen lettermen, among them four school record holders and another seven who rank on Cal's top ten performers list in their best events.

Add to those a couple of JC transfers and eight freshmen who could make significant contributions this season, and the Bears should have a representative squad in 1979.

ERV HUNT ON 1979: "It's a little difficult before the season to predict how things will go this season. However, it does appear that we have some depth on the track, particularly in the middle distance and hurdles, and that will give people on the team an opportunity to run different events from week to week.

"In the field, we have some excellent individuals in spots, but we're not very deep. The people we do have are capable of being right up there with the best."

EVENT BY EVENT (depth chart on page 20)

100-200: Mike Farmer, who tied the school 100 meters mark last year, leads a group that includes two JC transfers, Alonzo Mathis (10.3, 21.0) and Eugene Rachal (10.4, 21.0), and two returnees whose activity may be limited. Holden Smith (10.5, 21.3), a regular last season in both races, is turning to the decathlon this year, and may on occasion be working on other events. Floyd Eddings (10.3) ran only the 100 last year, and is coming off a knee injury incurred during football season which may delay his conditioning.

400: The Bears can use a number of individuals here, largely ones who can also run other events. Thus, depending on the meet, Hunt could look to 800 men Ron Brown and Mike White; sprinters Farmer, Eddings, or Rachal; hurdlers Larry Cowling, Lloyd Guss, or Mike Crittenden; or decathlete Smith.

800: Could be an interesting event, with returnees Andy Clifford (1:48.0), Brown (1:50.4), and Robin Clarke (1:51.3), all of whom improved their personal bests in 1978. And the Bears have added freshman Mike White, another in the line of Bay Area 800 prospects that has included former Cal men Rick Brown and James Robinson. Coming in with a best of 1:50.4, White has excellent speed and runs aggressively. On occasion, Guss (1:54.1) could also run here.

1500: School record holder Clifford clearly is the leader here for Cal, with depth provided by a young group of newcomers and experienced distance men. Among the former are freshmen Mike O'Reilly (3:51.5) and Gregory Bachand (4:11.0 mile) and JC transfer Michael Brown (3:51.1), while seniors Damon Wood (3:49.8) and Gary Blume (3:51.0) can drop down.

Distance: Cal has several of its top distance men ever, with the third and fourth best 5000 men on the all-time school list in Hal Schulz (14:12.8) and Blume (14:13.6). In the steeple, it's Blume (2th, 8:56.8), Wood (3rd, 8:58.9), and Schulz (5th, 9:01.3).

Hurdles: This is the area where Hunt has more depth, possibly, than any event ever has had at Cal. In the intermediates, Walter Pratt (50.4) and Ray Smith (51.1) rank second and third all-time at Cal, and Lloyd Guss (51.8) and Mark Uribe (52.7) also make

the top 11. Then there are newcomers Scott Monroy (52.6), freshman Larry Cowling (53.7), and redshirt freshman Peter Grimes (54.1), who could also make their way onto the lists.

In the highs, Monroy (13.7) and Mike Crittenden (13.9), who missed last season with a bad back, lead returnees Smith and Pratt as well as Cowling, who already has done 14.4 over the college hurdles.

Relays: Smith, Eddings, and Farmer all were regulars on last season's sprint relay, and will add Rachal and Mathis to their number. On the 1600 relay, candidates abound, led by Ron Brown (46.3), who had a fine relay season in 1978, Farmer (46.2r), Guss (46.9r), and Eddings (46.8r) among the returnees. Then Hunt can also turn to White (46.7r), Cowling (47.0r), and Rachal (47.6r) among this year's additions.

High Jump: This event is very inexperienced, with freshman Reuben Edwards having the best mark (6-11). Sophs Dave Steen (6-9) and Peter Imperial (6-8½) and Holden Smith are the other possibles in dual meet competition.

Pole Vault: Senior Kevin Stevenson (16-0) returns, but has no proven companions, with JC transfer Brad Smith, redshirt Tom Philbert, and freshman Paul Roache.

Long Jump: Floyd Eddings broke the school record (which had stood since 1937) as a freshman last year in his first season with regular training in the jump. He's coming back off a knee injury incurred during football season, however, which could delay his conditioning. Other possible entries here include Michael Marlow, Holden Smith, Mike Dobbins, Joe Tleimat, and Steen.

Triple Jump: Only two men figure here, but are solid. Marlow joined the team during the spring quarter and proceeded to rewrite the Cal triple jump list. Breaking the school record three times, he has the five longest performances outdoors, and added the school indoor mark in January 1979, a lifetime longest 54-6¼. Mike Dobbins, also a senior, improved to 50-2½ in 1978.

Shot Put: The Bears have an entirely new crew here in 1979, with freshman Dave Porath and Bruce Parker and JC transfer Mike Self. Porath and Parker were both well over 60 feet with the high school shot, Porath winning the California state meet, while Self has a best of 53-5.

Discus: The same new faces here as in the shot, with Porath and Parker shifting to the heavier implement for the first time. Porath holds the national HS discus mark, having extended it twice last season, and is the California prep champion. Self has thrown over 155. Letterman Anthony Hill will probably sit out 1979.

Javelin: Doug Cooper is in his third year, and if elbow problems that plagued him in 1978 do not return, will eye his personal best of 218-7 as a freshman. Behind him are Paul Pande and three decathletes, Steen, Smith, and Jeff Harmon.

Decathlon: Steen has the best previous performance, over 6900 as a prep, but only made 6856 last year. Smith has speed and good strength in his first year with the decathlon, while Harmon, a 1978 redshirt, adds some depth.

Other Events: Cal could make a run at the school record in the two-mile relay (run only in relay meets), with Clifford, White, Brown, Clarke, O'Reilly, and Guss available. Also a challenge within reach is the distance medley.

PROFILES

GARY BLUME SENIOR DISTANCE 8:56.8 SC, 14:13.6



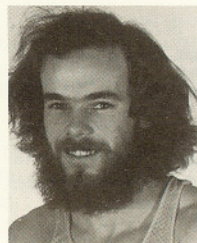
Returns for his final season after sitting out in 1978. A fine cross-country and road runner, ranks as one of the better distance men in Cal history, fourth on the 5000 meters list and second in the steeplechase and 10,000 meters. Placed fifth in the 1977 Pac-8 steeple after taking it up in the second half of that season. Holds the school indoor two-mile mark, 8:40.9 in San Diego in 1977. Has a best of 3:51.0 in the 1500. Attended Marina HS in San Diego.

RON BROWN SENIOR 800-400 1:50.4, 47.6



Concentrated on the 800 meters last year, and improved upon his previous career best 1:51.3 with a win in the Stanford dual (1:50.9) and then 1:50.4 for fifth at the Pac-8 meet. Although he ran just one open 400 (for 1st against Fresno State), he developed into a fine relay runner, turning in six legs under 47.0 (best of 46.3) with 47.8 his slowest of the year. Transferred to Cal in 1977 from Diablo Valley College, where he was sixth in the 400 at the state JC meet. Prepped at Kennedy HS in Richmond. Sociology major.

ROBIN CLARKE JUNIOR 800 1:51.3



Improved his career best almost two seconds last year, down from 1:53.2. Placed second in FSU and ASU-WSU duals, third vs. UCLA, and third in life best against Stanford. Came to Cal last season from College of Marin, where he ran track and cross-country. Graduated from San Marin HS, where he was team MVP as a 440 runner. Mechanical engineering major.

ANDY CLIFFORD SENIOR 1500-800 1:48.0, 3:40.4



Established a new Cal record in the 1500 with his run in the heats at the 1978 AAU meet in Los Angeles, one second faster than Don Bowden's mark (converted from 3:58.7 mile). Counting only actual 1500 meter races, Clifford has the five fastest times in Cal history, four of them last year plus his 3:42.3 in 1977. He also lowered his mile PR to 4:03.3 in winning the West Coast Relays (ranking third on Cal's mile list), and during a summer trip to Europe, improved his two-lap best to 1:48.0. Ten of his twelve 1500s were under 3:50, and five at 3:45.2 or better, earning six dual meet wins to go with three in the 800 (two of those as doubles"), won 1977 Pac-8 1500. Came to Cal from Sunny Hills HS, where he was the 1974 state meet mile runnerup and earned bests of 4:06.7 and 1:53.6 as a prep. Physical education major, plans on ministry.

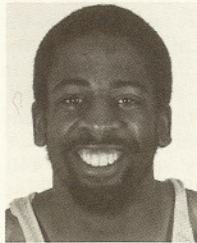

DOUG COOPER JUNIOR JAVELIN 218'7"



Placed sixth in 1977 Pac-8 javelin, throwing career best, but was hampered last season by tendinitis in the elbow. Season best was 200'3", but he contributed to Cal's scoring in five of seven dual meets. Threw 199'10" as a prep at Jesuit HS in Portland, Oregon, lettering three years in track and football. Fine arts/humanities major.

MIKE CRITTENDEN SENIOR 400-HURDLES 13.9, 47.5



Ranks in a tie for third on Cal's high hurdles list with time in 1977 SJS dual. Sat out 1978 with back problems which might limit him to the 400. Ran relays and hurdled (sixth '76 state JC meet) at Contra Costa College, where he was two-time league champ and also lettered in football. Attended Kennedy HS (Richmond), where he played football and hurdled.

MIKE DOBBINS**SENIOR TRIPLE JUMP 50'2½"**

Passed the 50 foot mark in last year's Stanford dual, earning second, and jumped over 49 feet in four other outings, including 49-9 to win the ASU dual. Capped a consistent 1977 season with a fifth place finish at the Pac-8 meet. Won the 1975 state HS meet at Merced HS, where he also competed in the long jump and made All-NorCal in football. Architecture major.

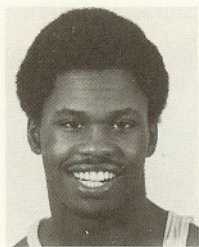
FLOYD EDDINGS SOPHOMORE LONG JUMP-SPRINTS 25'6½"

Erased the oldest record in Cal's book with his fifth-place jump at the West Coast Relays, his fourth outing of the year in that event. Went on to place sixth at the Pac-8 meet, and also ran 47.2 leading off for the 1600 meter relay. Best 100 meters was 10.6, at the Stanford Relays. Has been the top deep threat of the football team the past two seasons—17 catches for 321 yards (18.9 per catch) and three TDs in 1977, and 13 for 232 (17.8) and 4 TDs in

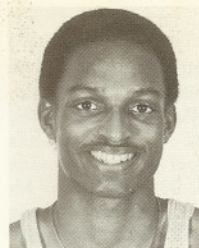
1978 before being injured for the season against Arizona State. Won Alabama state prep decathlon as a soph. Came to Cal from Ganesha HS in Pomona.

FELIX ELIEFF**SOPHOMORE DISTANCE 14:55.8**

Hopes to return to form he showed in 1977 when he placed third in state HS meet two-mile. Career bests are 8:55.7 two mile, 4:16 mile. Came to Cal from Highland HS in Bakersfield. Art history major.

MIKE FARMER**SENIOR SPRINTS 10.33e, 20.7**

Tied the school 100 meters record with a second place finish at the West Coast Relays. His time, fastest ever in the "electronic" era at Cal, converts to the equal of Leamon King's 10.1 time in 1956. His best day in 1978 came at Westwood, when he won the 100 (10.40) and 200 (20.9 wind-aided) against UCLA. Also ran a 46.8 relay split on the 440-yard track at Stanford. Was a member of the 1974 state champion team at Wilson HS (S.F.). Social welfare major.

PETER GRIMES**FRESHMAN HURDLES 54.1**

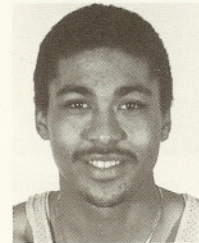
In his second year at Cal, has freshman eligibility after redshirting in 1978. Ran 54.1 in first and only appearance, at the intra-squad, but could challenge for a spot in Cal's deepest event. Attended Lowell HS, where he lettered in cross-country and track, running the hurdles and 400.

LLOYD GUSS**SOPHOMORE 400H, 400 51.8, 47.7**

Strategy dictated his running the 400 in dual meets last season, with a best of 47.9 against Stanford, but he went on to run a lifetime best 51.8 in Canada over the summer. Had opened the dual meet season with a 52.5 hurdles race at the intra-squad meet. Anchored Cal's Pac-8 1600 relay team in 47.1. Attended West Vancouver HS in British Columbia.

PETER IMPERIAL**SOPHOMORE HIGH JUMP 6'8¾"**

Season best in 1978 was 6'6", in the Stanford dual, where he won a jumpoff for second place. Attended St. Ignatius HS in San Francisco.

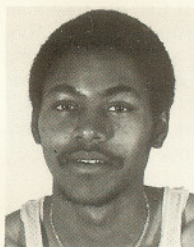
MICHAEL MARLOW SENIOR TRIPLE JUMP 54'3¾", 54'6¼"

Rewrote Cal's triple jump list in 1978 after joining the team in spring quarter. Best effort came in the trials of the NCAA meet, and he missed third place in the finals by less than five inches. In all, he had nine individual jumps farther than Cal's previous school record. Jumped to life best indoors in 1979 at the Sunkist meet in Los Angeles. Last year, also long jumped twice, including second on final attempt against Stanford (24'1¼"). Came to Cal from Cosumnes River College, where he had bests of 52'10" and 24'10" and set the national JC triple jump record in 1976. Began track at Burbank HS in Sacramento.

WALTER PRATT SENIOR HURDLES 50.52e, 14.12ew



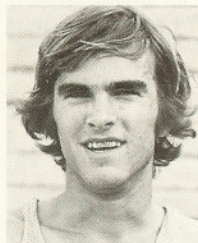
Became Cal's second fastest intermediate hurdler ever last season, with consistent performances that helped drop his personal best over a second. Placed second in the Pac-8 intermediates, and sixth in the highs. Was one of Cal's most valuable dual meet scorers, winning six duals (the slowest, 51.5, equalling his previous career best) and scoring in the highs in seven. Came to Cal from Bakersfield College, where he had one of the

nation's best JC times in 1977. Attended Foothill HS in Bakersfield, winning the Valley high hurdles championship.

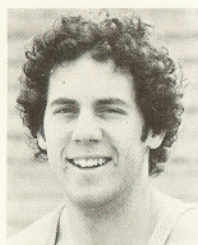

Ranks third on Cal's 5000 meters list, fifth in steeplechase. 5000 best came at Stanford Relays, and is Cal's second fastest actual 5000 race. In 5000, won five of seven duals in 1978. Steeple career best came at 1977 Pac-8 meet, where he finished seventh. Finished third in 1976 AAU Jr cross-country, ran at world championships in Germany March 1977. Attended Redwood HS in Marin, running 13:52 for three miles.

HOLDEN SMITH JUNIOR DECATHLON 10.5, 21.3



Sprint regular the past two seasons switches to decathlon, where size (6'2", 190) and strength should be assets. Chief learning process will occur in "technique" events (discus, javelin, pole vault, hurdles). Led off sprint relay in every meet for Cal in 1978, and led off 1977 sprint relay at NCAAAs (5th), earning All-America status. A very gifted natural athlete, was Cal's most explosive wide receiver in 1978, leading the team in catches (26), yards

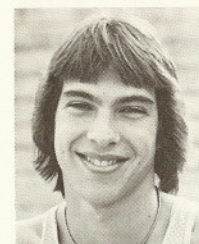
(641), average (24.7), and touchdowns (5) after sitting out 1977 season. Has also been drafted as an outfielder for pro baseball despite not having played since high school. Attended Los Gatos HS.

RAPHAEL SMITH SENIOR HURDLES 14.1, 51.1



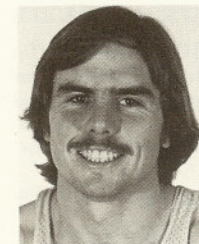

Won three duals in the highs, and combined with Pratt for 1-2 finishes against UCLA and Stanford. At Skyline JC, placed in both hurdles at 1977 state JC meet, 3rd in highs and 6th in intermediates, also running mile relay.

DAVE STEEN SOPHOMORE DECATHLON 6917 POINTS



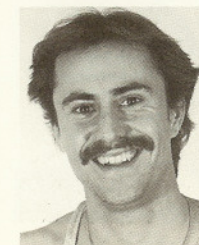
Could see dual meet action in best events, long jump (24'2" life best) and high jump (6'9"). Last season, scored 6856 at Cal all-comers decathlon, just 44 points shy of the Pac-8 meet qualifying mark. Won 1977 Canada Summer Games decathlon, and helped Burnaby Central HS to the British Columbia provincial championship with wins in the high, long, and triple jumps, and pole vault.

Improved his career best by a tenth in the FSU dual last year, taking third place. Was Cal's top 400 hurdler as a soph, and holds the fresh IH record. As a prep at Roseville HS, ran three hurdle events, 100 and 400, and participated in both jumps. Won high and low hurdles for four years in Sierra Foothill League. Social welfare major.

DAMON WOOD SENIOR 3000 SC, 1500 8:58.9, 3:49.8



Was forced to sit out in 1978 because of shin splints. Had a fine competitive season in the steeple in 1977, running that race in five meets and winning them all, with PR coming against USC. 1500 best came in 1976, ran that only once in 1977, instead doubling back three times in the 5000. Should be a solid contributor again in any of the three events. Won the Golden Gate Conference two mile at College of San Mateo after attending Woodside HS. Civil Engineering major.

GREGORY BACHAND FRESHMAN DISTANCE 4:11.0y

State meet entrant for Albany HS ran life best in trials at Bakersfield. Has also run 9:32 for two miles.

LARRY COWLING FRESHMAN HURDLES 13.9hs, 53.7

Rangy hurdler comes to Cal from Sacramento HS, where he posted 13.9 for the high school highs and 36.6 for the 330 intermediates, in which he was the 1978 state meet runnerup. Also ran 53.7 for 400 intermediates at Golden West meet, and has run 47.0 for a 400 relay leg. Won team MVP honors and four letters under Tommy Allen.

ALONZO MATHIS JUNIOR SPRINTS 10.3, 21.0

Junior college transfer from Los Medanos JC, attended Griffin HS in Georgia, where he won the state meet 100. Lettered four years in track and three in football, winning "best back" and "Christian athlete of the year" awards.

DAVID PORATH FRESHMAN WEIGHTS 65'10 1/4"hs, 209'6"hs

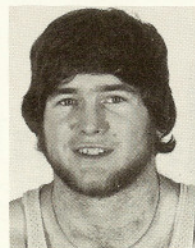

EUGENE RACHAL JUNIOR SPRINTS 10.4, 21.0

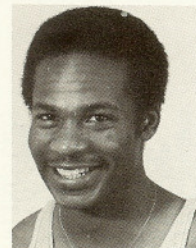

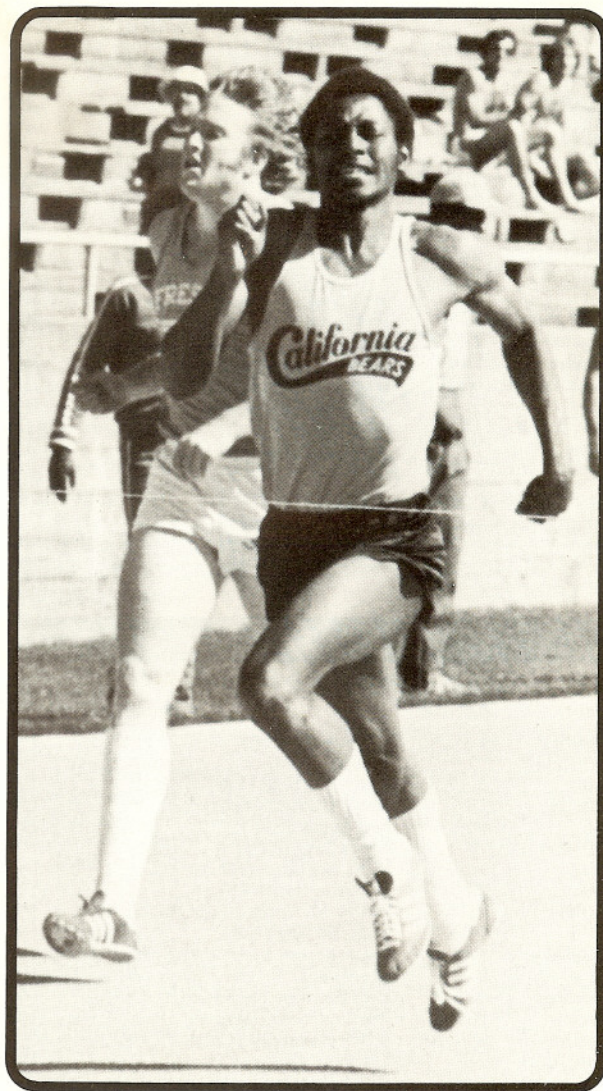

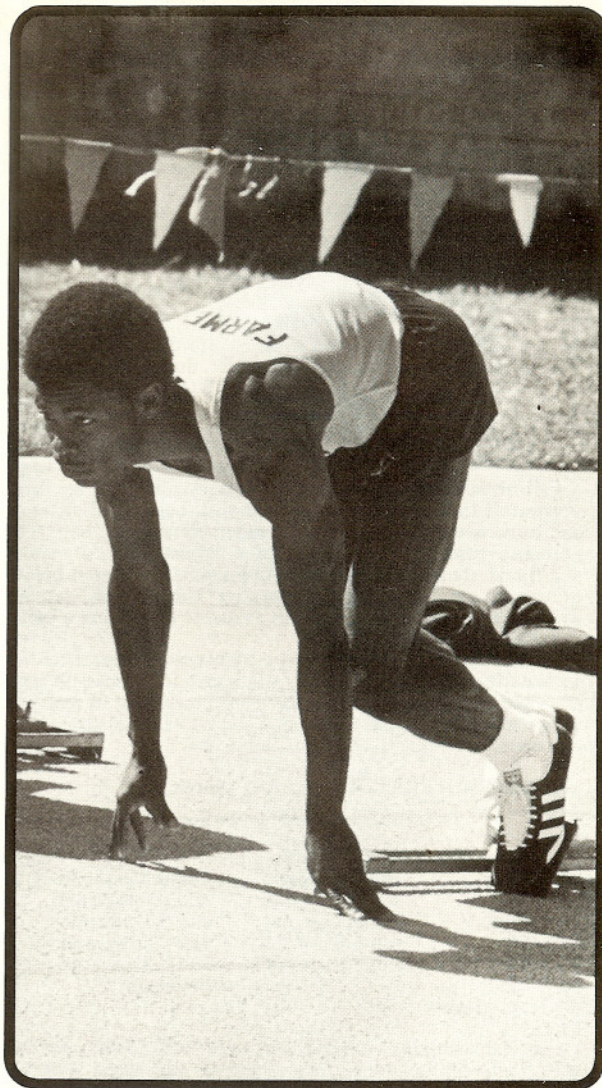

2. AUTOMATIC-HAND CONVERSION (Suffix e)

In races up to 400 meters, automatic times will generally be slower than hand times. The standard conversions are: 100m, 110m, 220m: 0.24 seconds; 400m, 0.14 seconds. Thus, to figure a hand-timed equivalent from automatic, subtract the appropriate figure.

NOTE: For international and national records, only times recorded with fully automatic timing will be accepted in events up to 400 meters. Above that distance, records will be recorded in 1/10 second, with auto-timed marks being rounded to the next higher 1/10.

EDWARDS STADIUM

Long considered the finest track facility in the world, Edwards Stadium (seating 22,000) received a face lift in 1977 with the installation of a Tartan surface not only on the oval but on all the infield runways as well.

The track oval was also changed to a metric distance, changing from 440 yards to the more contemporary 400 meters.

Edwards was originally finished in 1932 and at the time it was the only, "pure track" stadium in the world. The stadium has been the site of seven NCAA Championship meets, one National AAU Championship, and All-American Invitational in 1966, the 1971 and 1978 US vs. USSR meet, and six Kennedy Games.

The stadium is named after Col. George C. Edwards, as is the field adjoining it to the east.

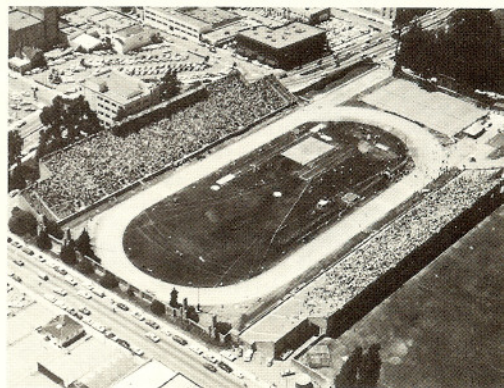
In 1957 the oval itself was dedicated in the name of Walter Christie, California's first track coach, 1900-32, and in the early 60's "friends of California track," raised funds to build the Walter Christie bench which stands just outside the running track on the west side of the field.

With funds that remained after the bench was built, the electric clock that stands atop the scoreboard to the north was purchased.

Prior to 1977, the track was last redone in 1965 with Fresno clay and cinders. The site of 11 world records, 16 American records, and at least 18 collegiate records, Edwards Stadium, with the addition of its synthetic surface, became once again one of the finest track facilities in the world.

CALIFORNIA

The University of California at Berkeley has grown over more than a century to become a city of intellect across the bay from San Francisco. Nearly 30,000 students are pursuing academic goals here in almost a hundred fields of study. Berkeley is known now for having one of the top-rated graduate programs in the country.

A recent American Council of Education Survey found Berkeley to be one of the best educational institutions in the land, ranking 26 of Berkeley's 35 graduate schools among the top three in the nation. Perhaps nowhere else in the country can an entering group of freshmen find ten Nobel Prize winners in the lecture hall and faculty rooms as easy to approach as fellow classmates.

Over the past seven years, under the direction of Athletic Director Dave Maggard, Cal has enjoyed a major upswing in virtually all of its athletic teams.

Water Polo has established itself as the finest program in the nation winning four of the past six NCAA Championships. Swimming placed third at the NCAAs in 1978, the highest finish by a Pac-8 team. Tennis finished sixth at the NCAA Championships with a very young squad. Crew met with a disappointing mishap at the '78 IRA finals but still enjoys a reputation as one of the top college crews in the country, and gymnastics continues to rank as one of the top ten squads in the country.

A total of eight Cal athletes participated at the 1976 Olympics in Montreal. The most significant performance came from USA double silver medalist Peter Rocca in the 100 and 200 meter backstroke events.

The University of California's athletic department fields nearly 25 varsity, junior varsity, and freshmen teams in 16 sports to place it as one of the largest and most comprehensive athletic programs in the nation.

Excellence, diversity, creativity and size are the hallmarks of the University of California at Berkeley.
