# 1979 California high

It all began on a hot and dusty day in the middle of a once forgotten stadium in the middle of a once forgotten city called Sacramento. They had come from all over the state to find out for sure; to find out who was really the best. Could Mike Sanford from Pasadena do what no other had ever done and be the first person to win both sprints two years running. Was the Howard machine from San Gorgonio as well oiled as rumor had it. Could the human eye see

Cubberley's Bill Green when he got to moving. Could Berkeley's women overcome their perennial State Meet jinx. Could those men from Richmond get their heads together and show the world that they weren't to be messed with. Was that bundle of energy and exuberance from Westchester as much a joy to watch as she was fast. All of these questions were floating about but the one question that was being spoken by those in the know from all over the state concerned the once fast track in Hughes Stadium.

When they held track meets at Hughes Stadium on a regular basis (they say Fred Flintstone was pretty quick), there were some pretty quick times run on the dirt track. But the peoples of Sacramento had forgotten about Hughes Stadium and because of disuse it became



SACRAMENTO—Pasadena's boys and Westchester's girls won team titles and Glendale high jumper Lee Balkin set a meet record of 7-3¼ at the State high school track and field finals Saturday night at Hughes Stadium.

Both team races would have been photo-finish close had not the Palo Alto Cubberly boys and the Berkeley and San Gorgonio girls tossed away precious points. But disqualifications and dropped batons settled the issue before a crowd of 16,500.

Pasadena wound up with 16 points. Westchester won the girls' championship with 24 to 19 for runnerup San Gorgonio, with pre-meet favorite Berkeley dropping to third place with 13 points.

Pasadena seemed to be going for a tie at best when Cubberly's Bill Green outpowered Michael Sanford in the 100-yard dash, 9.59 to 9.66. It was only a slight upset, but seemed enough to deny Pasadena's Bulldogs the title, just as it denied Sanford his double-double, the 100 and 220 titles they ware in a row. two years in a row.

But Sanford had already anchored Pasadena to first in the 440-relay (41.45) and he came back to win the 220 in 21.00. And then Green killed Cubberly's hopes by being disqualified in his specialty, the 440.

Green ran a blazing 46.27 to win the quarter-mile and seemingly set Cubberly up for a tie for the boy's title when he led his team to a second-place in the mile relay. But the officials detected that Green's time was helped by cutting corners on his lane and the meet-ending mile relay became unimportant.

In the girls' competition, Gwen Loud's one-woman show made West-chester too much for San Gorgonio's four Howard sisters and Berkeley's entire team. Loud, headed for UCLA, won three individual titles, all state records, and anchored the Comets' winning 440-yard relay.

At the first pass, Sherri Howard and sister Denean dropped the baton and San Gorgonio's Spartans could not catch up. At the second pass, Berkeley ran out of its exchange zone without ever completing the pass and was disqualified for the fourth time in six State meet 440 relays.

Westchester, meanwhile, breezed away from the depleted pack, winning in 47.20 and getting six big points for

Loud then won the 100 (10.62), 220 (23.53) and long jump (20-4½). In the 220, Berkeley further destructed when Sharon Ware, expected to finish second behind Loud, false started.

It was in the 100 that Loud may have wrapped up the title. She caught Sherri Howard, who needed the win to bring San Gorgonio back into it, at 50 yards and pulled

Howard came back to make her own mark, setting a national interscholastic record in the 440. Despite the dirt track, she won in 53.65, lowering the 54.2 by Merry Johnson of Canyon (Tex.) High in 1977. Howard also anchored San Gorgonio to yet another national record in the mile relay (3:44.1 to the sisters' old 3:44.9), but it earned only six points, not enough to catch Westchester.

The only other national federation mark—a record that must be set in a prep meet-came from Leslie Deniz of Gridley, who threw the discus 167-1, bettering a two-year old mark of 161-11 by Helene Connell of Memorial in Jackson, N.J.

In other girls' highlights, Ann Reagan of Camden won her third-straight girls' 880 title in 2:10.3 and Susie Ray of

Villa Park set a State shot put record of 49-612, bettering the 49-1 by Kathy Devine of Mission Bay in 1975.

In other boys' competition, David Mack of Locke won his second straight 880 by tracking down friend and arch-rival Jeff West of Crenshaw on the final straightway. And for once, they were enough apart to have different times. Mack 1:50.2 and West 1:50.5.

Mack also anchored Locke's winning mile relay, but the Saints failed in their attempt at a national record.

Balkin broke the record of 7-2 by Dennis Smith of Santa Monica in 1977. Balkin's first attempt at 7-4 just missed as his heel clipped the bar. The other two tries were not close. His winning mark is second all-time among preps to Gail Olsen of Sycamore (Ill.) Olson jumped 7-41/4.

Among the favorites not seen in their events were Vickie Cook of Chaminade, who scratched from the twomile to concentrate on the mile: Tonya Alston of Chico. who injured a hamstring in the hurdles after already having won the high jump; and Greg Ellis of Menlo-Atherton, who was co-favorite in the pole vault but injured an ankle in warm-ups.

# Pasadena Moving Closer to Boys' State Track Title

SACRAMENTO—Pasadena moved a little closer to the boys' title, and the girls' race tightened into what could be a cliffhanger after preliminary rounds in the State high school

track meet Friday.

Most of the qualifying went as expected before 8,200 in steamy Hughes Stadium at Sacramento City College.
But boys' challenger Locke sacrificed points to put Pasadena in the driver's seat, and girls' favorite Berkeley lost enough points to give Westchester and San Gorgonio a real shot at the championehin.

Locke scratched powerhouse David Mack from the 440 to save him for a try at the national record in the mile relay. The half-mile specialist had only been figured for a fourth place on The Times' dope sheet, but those sacrificed two points, gave breathing room to Pasadena. Pasadena appeared in good shape to deliver on all its expected points. Super-sprinter Michael Sanford led the qualifying in the 100 (9.81), 220 (21.47) and anchored Pasadena's 440yard relay to the fastest qualifying time of 41.89.

Meanwhile, Mack came through in his specialty, winning his 880 heat in 1:54.6. And as in the Arcadia Invitational and the City finals, Crenshaw's Jeff West got exactly the same time. The uncanny thing this time, though, was that West was in a different heat.

But the Locke strategy may have backfired a bit, sin-e their mile relay team did not come close to the national record of 3:11.6 set by Banning last year.

# Mosebar, Ellard Join Arnold In Prep Track Finals

SACRAMENTO — Don Mosebar of Mt. Whitney and Henry Ellard of Hoover displayed their talents in a couple of quick bursts while Yolanda Arnold of Chowchilla let it all hang out.

Mosebar and Ellard used as little effort as possible to qualify for to-day's final round in the 61st annual California State High School Track and Field Championships.

Ellard took only two jumps and came away as the man to beat in the triple jump, qualifying with a 50-10 effort.

Mosebar made only one attempt in the shot put — a 63-1¾ effort that makes him a marked man although John Brenner of Fullerton qualified first with a 63-2 best.

Arnold, however, had the biggest day of any valley athlete, qualifying in three events while winning a pair of heats.

The Chowchilla senior clipped a fast field in her 110-yard low hurdle heat with a 14.15 clocking, the best of the day. Then she shocked favorite Sharon Ware of Berkeley in the 220 heat, winning with a 24.94 clocking.

In the 100 heats, Arnold finished behind four-time valley champion Constance Ward of South, Ward timing 11.17 and Arnold just a hair back at 11.18.

That Arnold, or any of the other runners in this excellent field could even come close to respectable times was a credit only to the athletes. No credit can go to the disgraceful Hughes Stadium dirt track that was nothing more than a dust bowl by the end of the evening.

The State's best ever mile relay field — including valley all-time leader Edison High — staggered in the soft dirt and the times were unimpressive.

Edison, which can run 3:21.93 backwards — well almost — could manage only that in taking second in its heat. The same Tiger quartet timed a 3:14.6 in last week's valley championships.

The only meet record of the day came, obviously, in the field events when Gridley's Leslie Deniz tossed the discus 159-3 to lad the girls' qualifiers and that mark could fall again today since Deniz has a national-record 175-10 earlier this season.

Mosebar was impressive but he said he wanted to save something for today's finals after falling off in last year's second-day of the state meet when he finished fourth in the shot.

"I really felt good today (Friday) but I wanted to save it for the finals." the USC-bound Visalian who is undefeated this year in the shot said. "Yes, I still would like to get the valley record (65-2½). Mosebar was the only valley athlete to qualify in the discus, reaching 168-10 in the first of two throws. Ellard took only two jumps and then retired to let the triple jump field try to catch him.

Edison's 440 relay team also qualified for today's finals, winning its heat despite a shaky last handoff in 42.19, the third-best time of the day.

Edison's George Timmons finished third in his 440 heat to advance to the quarterfinals with a 49.46 time but was later disqualfied — although officials refused to report what caused the disqualification.

Clovis' Janet Yarbrough made he girls low hurdle finals, timing 14.65 for a second in her heat but here 16-6½ was not good enough to make the long jump finals. Coalinga's Paula Stevens did advance with an 18-10¾ effort, her best mark of the season.

North's Linda Goen will make another double appearance in the state meet, timing 5:05.82 in the mile and 2:16.90 in the 880 — both times just running to qualify and not running for time.

Merced's Shelly Nieto was second in her mile heat in 5:03.60.

Delano's Rita Banks moved on in the shot put with a valley-leading 43-0 effort.

The valley made one of its strongest showings in the long jump with Lemoore's George Gaffney getting the best mark of the day, 24-21/4, and Foothill's Larry Clemons next at 24-11/2.

Ozell Thompson of Edison made the 220 finals with a second-place 21.97 time and Tulare's Pete Quinonez, who was second in the state last yar as a sophomore, moved into the finals with a 1:55.43 clocking.

Ken Bass of Madera, one of the favorites in the high jump, cleared 6-8 to make the finals and Brian Folmar of Sanger and Tim Sipes of Bakersfield cleared 14-0 to make the pole vault finals.

# Gummy track slows runners at State meet

SACRAMENTO — The state high school track and field finals will be held here tonight at Hughes Stadium, and one thing is abundantly clear — meet records figure to be about as plentiful as open gas stations at midnight.

Although the stadium's clay track used to be considered one of the fastest around, it was anything but last night. Qualifying times in almost all events were considerably slower than clockings previously posted by the athletes.

"It's too gummy," said Wilson High's Brennan Redd, who won his heat in the 120 high hurdles (14.45) to become the only San Francisco athlete to advance to the finals.

"You go in it and your feet don't come out that quick," be continued. "They sort of stic."

Most of the athletes complained that the track was too soft on top, and underneath it was very hard. Some compared it to running on the beach. After a few races, it began to look like an off track at Golden Gate Fields.

This, of course, may be no fault of the meet officials. Late last night workmen were watering and grading the track in preparation for tonight's action. How much good that will do remains to be seen.

A brief look at some of the qualifying times give a good indication of the situation. Pasadena's Michael Sanford, who is trying to become the first athlete in California history to

double in the sprints two years in a row, won his heat in the 100-yard dash in 9.81. He won his sectional meet in 9.44.

In the 440, Cubberly's Bill Green captured his heat in 48.52, which was almost two seconds slower than his Central Coast Section winning time. Of course, he coasted a bit at the end last night, but he wasn't exactly pressed in the sectional meet, either.

The team title is stil very much up for grabs between Cubberly and Pasadena. Although Cubberly's 440 relay team failed to qualify, coach Ken-Preminger didn't think that was necessarily a fatal blow.

"We could still have a chance if the mile relay team does well," he said. "I think we're going to do better in the mile relay than people think. But you'd have to still consider Pasadena the favorite."

Pasadena is favored in the 440 relay, but the Cougars could offset a victory there by winning the mile relay. Sanford figures to win the 220, and Green should take the 440. It could come down to the head-to-head matchup in the 100 between Green and Sanford.

Last night Green demonstrated why Cubberly could surprise some people in the mile relay. Although the Palo Alto school is not among the state leaders in the event, the Cougars won their heat when Green made up about 15 yards on the anchor leg and coasted to victory a good five to seven yards in the lead.

Among Bay Area athletes who qualified in two events last night was

Carl Montgomery of South San Francisco High, who placed third in his heat in both the 100 and 220. His 100 time was 10.07, and he ran the 220 in 22.13.

Others who did well included Jim Scannella of San Ramon, who finished first in the 120 high hurdles in 14.12 and was the leader in the 330 lows at 36.75. Pittsburg's Ray Threatt also made the finals in two events, as he finished second in the 100 in 9.86 and won his 220 heat in 21.71.

It was a long day for most Academic Athletic Association athletes, however. Raul Rodriquez of Lowell missed qualifying in the 880 when he finished fourth, and Balboa's 440 relay team dropped the baton on the anchor leg after having taken a slight lead on the turn.
