After numerous injuries Debbie is on the rebound and in top condition as exemplified by her victorious 1500 meter time of 4:17.2, a big ten seconds ahead of second placer, Michelle Bush.

Pandemonium paramounted for the world record runs of New Zealander John Walker (1500 meter 3:37.4) and the Philadelphia Pioneers' Herman Frazier (500 meter 1:01.2). Unfortunately, neither records are likely to be accepted because the unique Ron Davis 200 meter track has no curb.



A further sour note occured when seven Japanese entrants, here to compete in the Sunkist meet, were banned from the meet late that evening when the International Amateur Athletic Federation suspended Japan from international competition for appearing in the Asian Games. The Japanese athletes were dressed and ready to compete when the IAAF ruling was received.






