1980 SEASON OUTLOOK

In this day and age there are few things that you can count on, but almost one certain fact is that San Jose State University will field one of the nation's top track and field teams.

Head Coach Ernie Bullard enters his 10th season at SJSU with a team that could, no make that should, return to the top of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) and could pull some surprises at the NCAA Championships, June 5-7, at the University of Texas at Austin.

The Spartans return 10 lettermen from a team that finished 10th in the nation in 1979 with a perfect 6-0 dual meet record, the second undefeated campaign in the last three years.

SPRINTS/HURDLES

This should be a key area for SJSU in 1980. Coach Livers has assembled the best group of sprinters since the "Speed City" era of the late 1960's. The one major weakness will be the quarter-mile, where junior college transfers James Davis and Tim Foster, along with returner Phil Williams will have to do the job.

Freshman Ken Thomas returns, the school freshman 100 and 200 meter record holder, and footballer Eric Hurt, who finished fifth in last year's PCAA Championships, and anchored the 4×100 meter relay team that finished second. Added to that duo are transfers Willie Jackson, JC State 100 and 200 meter champion, Ernest Lewis, 1978 JC 200 meter champ and Foster, third in the '79 JC 100 meter dash.

JUMPS

Some of the teams top athletes are found in this area, an area where SJSU should be strong, especcially in the vertical jumps. The Spartans posess four seven footers in the high jump; letterman Thurlis Gibbs and Sly Pritchett and transfers Willie Briscoe and Joel Wyrick. Two seventeen foot pole vaulters in Kim Black, second in last year's PCAA Championships and Switzerland's top jumper Felix Bohni. Freshman record holder in the long jump Essodina Atchade returns and will be backuped by transfer Harry Walker and triple jumper Craig Roberts. Roberts will head the hop, skip and jump with high jumper Wyrick as his backup.

WEIGHTS

Another area where the Spartans should do well is the weights. This area highlights some potential NCAA points. Curt Ransford, sixth in the 1979 NCAA's in the javelin returns as does shot putter Bob Feuerbach, who placed fourth in the '78 NCAA's. Kevin Brady, third in the '79 PCAA's will backup Feuerbach, with 1979 State High School shot runner-up Jim Spillers and transfer Rob Suelflohn the top newcomers. Redshirts Paul Bishop, Feuerbach and Brady will handle the discus event. Basketball standout Mikki Jackson will backup Ransford in the javelin. The hammer features people of limited experience, but show potential for improvement. Bob Cook and Feuerbach are the only experienced throwers. Brady and Pete Angelidakis may try the event.

An offense guard on the Spartan grid squad, Peter was an All-PCAA first team selection as well as the team's Rookie-of-the-Year in 1977 . . . Had to redshirt last seeason due to an injury suffered in the off-season . . . He was a two-sport star at San Jose's Del Mar High School in track and football . . . ESSODINA ATCHADE—The school freshman record holder, Essodina had an outstanding first year at Sparta in 1979... The returning letterman caped the '79 season by finishing second in the PCAA Championships with a leap of 26-1½, the 29th longest jump in the world last year ... He ranks second on the all-time school long jump list and has three of the top 20 longest jumps in the school's history ... He made his country's Olympic team at the age of 17 but never competed due to the African nation's boycott at Montreal ... He was discovered

by former Spartan track star Errol Williams who was working in Togo (Southwest Africa) . . . An industrial technology major, he plans an engineering career after graduation . . . Hobbies include reading, swimming, and traveling . . . Born 2-11-58 in Pagouda, Togo.



JEROME BEARDEN—A returning letterman, Jerome Augustine is back for his second season of track following a successful grid campaign on the Spartan's PCAA Co-championship team in the fall . . . A competitive vaulter, he had eight meets in 1979 in which he jumped 17-0 feet or better ... He was the 1978 California State Junior College pole vault Champion and Northern California Junior College (Champion under the guidance of Coach Bob Rush while at

College of San Mateo . . . A fine arts major with a minor in HP & RE, he is an honor student and has made the Dean's List since high school . . . Prepped at Carlmont High School, he was league, district, and regional champion as well as the school record-holder . . . Hobbies include playing the banjo, painting and sculpturing . . . Plans a career as a commercial artist or teacher after graduation . . . Born 9-6-57 in San Mateo.



GORDON BLISS—A walk-on to the program last year, Gordon Lee returns for his final season in 1980... The biggest of the spikesters (6-5, 250) he redshirted in the 1978 season after transfering from Drake University . . . in cross country, indoor and outdoor track ... He was the Northeastern Conference shot put champion in high school and finished sixth in the state meet ... TERENCE BOYNTON—A returning competitor from last season, Terence J. will again be one of the Spartan mainstays in the steeplechase . . . A member of SJSU's cross country team the last three seasons, he prepped at Cupertino High School under former standout SJSU race-walker Tom Dooley . . . While at Cupertino he was his league's cross country champion in 1976 as well as earning all-league honors his final three years . . .

Totaled three letters in each track and cross country... A chemistry major with a minor in mathematics, he hopes for a teaching or industrial chemist career after graduating from San Jose State ... Enjoy's skiing as a hobby ... Born 3-25-59 in Norwich, CN.



BOB COOK—The number two hammer thrower on the team in 1979, Robert Allen returns as the 11th performer all-time in the iron ball and chain in the school's history . . . A redshirt in 1978, he finished with a best mark of 143-5 in the hammer, and figures to improve upon that this year, his second year with the event . . . Attended Sacramento High School where he lettered in football and track under the guidance of Coach Tom Allen . . . A HP & He was also an honor roll student while at SHS . . . A HP & RE major with a minor in business at SJSU, he plans a coach-

ing career after graduation . . . Hobbies include listening to music and playing all sports . . . Born 4-30-59 in Walnut Creek, CA.



JAMES DAVIS—One of the many junior college recruits on this year's team, James enters San Jose State with some impressive credentials . . . Attended Hartnell College where he earned an A.A. degree in recreation . . . Prepped at Harry Ellis High School in Richmond where he teammed with former Spartan great Dedy Cooper to lead them to the California State High School Championships . . . Earned 10 letters in three sports (basketball, football and track) . . . As a junior he was all-league in basketball, a member of the football team that

won the league title and the North Coast Division 220 yard dash champion . . . His senior year he repeated as the league 220 champion and added the 440 yard title, earning him the Most Outstanding Performer laurel, while leading his team to the conference crown . . . A recreation-corrections major with a minor in psychology, he hopes to work as a probation officer after graduating from SJSU . . . Lists basketball and poetry as hobbies . . . Goes by the nickname of "Tiny" . . . Born 11-7-58 in San Francisco, CA.



BOB FEUERBACH—The number two shot putter in the history of SJSU track & field, Robert Lynn returns for his final season . . . Slowed in 1979 due to a nagging injury after having outstanding freshman and sophomore seasons . . . After reshirting in 1976, his first year, he places second in the conference in the shot and seventh at the NCAA Championships, the only freshman in the top 10 . . . Also threw the discus 172-3, the number 17 performance in the school's anuals . . . As a sophomore, he won the PCAA title, placed fourth at the

NCAA's and seventh at the AAU's, throwing a lifetime best of $64-0\frac{1}{4}$. . . He ended as the number eight thrower in the US by season's end . . . Last year he repeated as the conference shot king and placed fourth in the discus . . . In high school he was the Iowa State Champion in the shot put 1973-75 . . . He played four sports earning an amazing 14 letters . . . Was twice voted all-conference in football at fullback . . . From a very athletic family, his brother Al is a former world and American record holder and a two-time Olympian in the shot . . . Al and Bob together hold the world record for the farthest distance thrown with a shot put by two brothers (Al 71-7, Bob 64-0¹/₄) . . . A business marketing major at SJSU, he has not been defeated in the shot in a dual meet for almost two years . . . The only athlete in the school's history to rank in the top 20 in three field events (2nd shot, 16th discus, 9th hammer) . . . Married (Sandy), he was born 6-20-57 in Preston, IA.


TIM FOSTER—One third of the San Jose City College speedsters recruited by SJSU, Tim has all the tools to be an outstanding sprinter . . . Transfer from SJCC where he was coached by another former Spartan sprinter Bob Poynter . . . At City he ran leadoff on the 4×100 meter relay team that finished second, and finished third in the 100 meters . . . Attended John F. Kennedy in Barstow . . . Lettered in three sports (basketball, football, and track) . . . In his junior year he helped lead his team to the state title and was on the victorius 4×110 yard relay team . . . He is a business administration major with plans of starting his own business after graduating . . . Born 5-5-58 in Santa Ana, CA.

THURLIS GIBBS JR.—Moved into the number two spot in SJSU history with his 7-2¹/₄ leap versus Arizona, the 25th performance in 1979 by an American and the 18th by collegian . . Although injured most of the year, he still jumped 7-0 or better, 10 times . . . Transfered from San Jose City College where he was coached by Steve Haas . . . Set the national record for the junior college division at the 1978 West Coast Relays, jumping 7-3¹/₄, the record stood for one week before falling . . . In his one season at SJCC, he finished second in the JC State Championships and second in the NorCal JC Championships . . . Attended Andrew Hill High School and he won three league high jump titles and two CCS championships for Coach Bruce Shimizu . . . He also won four letters each in track and basketball . . . An electronics major, he plans to be a home electrician after graduation . . . Married (Tina), he enjoys making stereo speakers and playing the bass guitar in his spare time . . . Born 7-21-58 in Brooklyn, N.Y.



TIM GRUBER—This one will be a good one before he is through with his running career at SJSU . . . Timothy William along with teammate Dan Harvey will be the backbone of the Spartan's long distance fortunes . . . Besides running the 5000 and 10,000 he may try the steeplechase some this year . . . Attended Aptos High School where he lettered in three sports (cross country, basketball and track) earning 9 letters . . . An honor roll student at Washington High School in Fremong, CA, he lettered in three sports under Coach Bob Springer . . . He posted all-league honors in all four years in school in cross country

WILLIE JACKSON—One of the sprint standouts from San Jose City College, he bring's to Sparta some outstanding credentials . . . Coached at SJCC by former SJSU dash man Bob Poynter . . . Last season he captured the NorCal JC 100 and 200 meter dash crowns and repeated the feat at the JC State Championships . . . He later finished eighth in the AAU's in the 200 meters, running 20.72, the 40th fastest time in the world, and the 21st fastest by an American in 1979 . . . following graduation . . . Born 12-12-58 in Oakland, CA.







HEAD COACH ERNIE BULLARD



Entering his 10th season at the helm of one of America's top collegiate track and field powers, Ernie Bullard looks forward with great anticipation to his 1980 campaign with the latest crop of San Jose State Spartans.

The head coach came to San Jose State in 1968 from Mesa Community College in Mesa, Arizona, where his '68 squad won the National Junior College Association (NJCAA) crown. While at Mesa, Bullard coached several NJCAA individual champions, American JC record holders and a few Olympians.

Prior to his successful stint in Arizona, Bullard served as head coach at Orange Coast Community College in California.

Since coming to Sparta, Bullard has guided his charges to NCAA finishes of 14th in 1971, 35th in 1973, 4th in 1975, 9th in 1976, 12th in 1977, 17th in 1978 and 40th last year. His teams have won four Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) titles and placed second four times in the past nine seasons. SJSU was league champion in 1973, 1974, 1975 and in 1977.

San Jose has been rated by TRACK & FIELD NEWS as Nos. 6, 13, 7, 7, 5, 7 and 10 from 1973 through 1979 in the nation among dual-meet powers.

SJSU has earned an overall mark of 60-14 in dual meets since 1971 including a perfect 9-0 mark in 1973, 10-0 in 1977 and 6-0 last year.

Recognized as one of the top pole vault coaches in the world, Bullard graduated from the University of Southern California in 1959. He placed fourth in the NCAA meet in that event as a collegian.

He earned his Masters of Science from Arizona State University in 1961. Among his other honors, Bullard was coach of the US Junior Olympic team in 1975, has guided teams on several international tours, has written four books on field event techniques and was selected to the Olympic development coaching staff in 1978.

DR. GAIL FULLERTON-PRESIDENT

A person who has endeared herself towards making San Jose State University strong both athletically as well as academically, Dr. Gail Fullerton has accomplished plenty since taking over as President in September 1978.

Having succeeded John Bunzel as President, Dr. Fullerton has spearheaded the groundbreaking and construction of a new library, the hiring of football coach Jack Elway, Basketball coach Bill Berry and Athletic Director Dave Adams. She was

also instrumental in getting the long-awaited Spartan Stadium expansion campaign underway last December.

A faculty member at SJSU since 1963, Dr. Fullerton has moved up through the ranks in the University to her position that she holds today. She was Chairperson of the Sociology department and has also served as Dean of Graduate Studies & Research.

Dr. Fullerton, a full Professor of Sociology, was Executive Vice-President at SJSU during Bunzel's reign and is on the boards of several executive committees outside the San Jose State spectrum.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska, where she received her B.S. in Sociology. She received her Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Maine. Dr. Fullerton and her husband Stanley live in Santa Cruz, CA. They have two children, both who live out of state.



DAVE ADAMS—ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Dave Adams has paid his dues.

After 21 years of coaching, and two years as the University of Pittsburgh Assistant Athletic Director for Men's Sports, Adams was named Athletic Director at San Jose State University this past December.

A tireless worker, Adam brings a hard-nosed, belly-to-belly style to his new job at San Jose—a style that first surfaced as a highly successful collegiate wrestler at Penn State and has perpetuated itself over the years.

Adams first appeared on the athletic scene as a scholastic wrestler at Bellefonte (PA) High School,

where he was a two-time State Champion, co-captain of his team, and compiled a 67-4 record. Following his graduation, he matriculated at Penn State, where he was a three-year starter. A two-time All-America, he ws the NCAA runner-up at 147 pounds as a junior and won the Eastern Wrestling Championship at 147 as a senior.

In the classroom, Adams earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1957 and went on to his Masters of Education the following year.

He then began his coaching career, as head wrestling coach and assistant football coach, at Bolling Springs (PA) High School in 1958. The following year he returned to his alma mater as an assistant wrestling coach. He remained at Penn State until 1964, when he moved to Navy as the Plebe wrestling coach under the legendary Ed Perry. During his three years at Navy, Adams' Navy Plebes compiled a 21-1 record—including two undefeated seasons.

In 1967, Adams took over the Pitt wrestling program, a program that had slipped from its glory days of the late fifties, and returned it to its rightful place as one of the most respected wrestling programs in the East.

In his 12 years at the helm, Adams compiled a 87-64-1 record for a .601 career winning percentage. Under his tutelage, five Eastern Wrestling League and five Easter Intercollegiate Wrestling Association champions developed. The 13 wins in 1977-78 were the most ever in a single season in Pitt history.

Adams was named Rookie Coach-of-the-Year by the Amateur Wrestling News in 1967 and was a member of the U.S. Wrestling Federation. Presently, he is Secretary and Editor of the Wrestling Rules Committee. He was also very instrumental in the formation of the Eastern Wrestling League, by far the top wrestling league in the East.

Adams, 44, and his wife Barbara have three children—Melinda (Mrs. James Irwin), 25; Lisa (Mrs. Wayne Richlina), 24, and David Jr. 15.



JON CROSBY—ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

When Bob Murphy stepped down from his Athletic Directorship last year, it was only natural that Jon Crosby be the man to replace him. Working on an interim basis until Dave Adams was hired, "Cros" kept things running in the department until Adams' arrival in February.

A former baseball player at Stanford, where he earned his B.S. in Economics in 1975, Crosby also holds a Master's in Sports Administration from Ohio University. He has worked

in many areas in athletic administration including publicity, budget, scheduling and development.

It was under Crosby's direction that the go-ahead for the move to Civic Auditorium for the basketball team was achieved. Crosby also was involved in the Spartan Stadium expansion program.

Crosby, who's been at San Jose State since 1977, is a native of Bakersfield, CA and attended Bakersfield High School. He has also dabbled in coaching, as he was Junior Varsity baseball coach at Stanford during his senior year at The Farm.

The 26 year-old Crosby and his wife Cathy, live in Willow Glen, CA.



FRANK FANTOZZI-BUSINESS MANAGER

A Bay Area native who's been involved with athletics all his life, Frank Fantozzi has been handling the books for the men's and women's athletic department's since 1977.

"The Fonz" is responsible for handling travel, budget allocations, athletic financial aid and anything that has to do with spending within the department. He also is involved with game management for football during that season.

A 1970 graduate of SJSU, Fantozzi holds his degree in Business Administration. Fantozzi previously worked as Assistant Controller for Owens Illinois Inc. He held that job prior to coming to SJSU.

A graduate of Bellarmine Prep, the 33 year-old Fantozzi, his wife Joanne and daughters Christina, 7, and Catherine, 4, live in San Jose.



STEVE CARP—SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR


SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY

Situated in the heart of San Jose's thriving downtown commercial district, **San Jose State University** continues to provide the same full-spectrum in quality education as it has for more than 123 years to Northern California and Bay Area residents.

With a current enrollment of 26,500, representing students from every state in the U.S. and more than 40 foreign countries, San Jose State is one of the largest of 19 campuses in **The California State University and Colleges** system. The 134-acre campus is composed of eight distinct schools and 70 different departments, staffed by an outstanding faculty of 1,900, 75 percent of whom hold doctoral degrees.

San Jose State, an integral part of the fastest-growing metropolitan area in the United States, has kept pace with San Jose's phenomenal expansion. Among the University's nationally ranked schools, programs, and departments are business, Engineering, Health Sciences, Industrial Technology, Art, Music, Journalism, and Nuclear Science. The Graduate Meteorology Facility and Occupational Therapy programs are unique in the California State University system.

Equally impressive are San Jose State's outstanding athletic programs, many of which have gained national attention. Under the leadership of **Men's Athletic Director Dave Adams** and **Women's Athletic Director Joyce Malone**, the University currently fields 24 teams in 16 sports.



San Jose State, now covering 20 city blocks, plus a south campus, aeronautics facility and Moss Landing Marine Laboratories, began in 1857 as Minn's Evening Normal School in San Francisco. SJSU is the oldest public-supported institution of higher learning in California.

In 1862, the University was renamed California State Normal School. Because of San Francisco's rough-and-tumble environment, the school was moved south to San Jose in 1871 and became San Jose State Normal School.

The first campus buildings at San Jose were destroyed by fire in **1880**. Subsequent buildings were ruined in the **1906** earthquake. The cornerstone of the fourth building, today's famed ivy-covered Tower Hall, was laid in Washington Square on **June 23**, **1909**.

In 1921, the normal schools of California became teachers colleges. In 1923, the school awarded its first B.A. degree in teaching. Today, SJSU still trains more teachers than any other California institution.

In 1935, the institution became San Jose State College. In 1971, the school was granted university status. SJSU today offers undergraduate degrees in 154 disciplines and master's degrees in 95 fields. It also offers accredited professional programs in 20 fields, more than any other campus in the CSUC. system.

1980 SPARTAN SPIKESTERS

The men and women behind the scenes who really make the San Jose State track and field program go are a group of devoted track fans called the Spartan Spikesters.

Comprised of SJSU alumni, local businessmen and others who love the sport, the Spikesters run virtually every facet of home meets.

Their knowledge and love of track and field events have been instrumental in making San Jose State University world renowned in the sport.

FINAL 1979 DUAL MEET RANKINGS

San Jose State for the fifth straight year placed among the top-10 as the Spartans finished tenth, their worst finish since their 13th place finish in 1974. The scoring system invented by **Track & Field News** correspondent John Wenos is derived from the following factors: 1) winning percentage, 2) margin of victory, 3) schedule difficulty, 4) team depth, 5) a hypothetical rating of all teams against one another. 
