The site was set. U.Cal of Davis's dirt track. A tired and beleaguered track... one that should be retired. The day was going to be a warm one..possibly HOT... A bothersome north-east wind promised to bring discomfort and frustration to the early morning contestants in the 10,000 meters and the discus... aside from that..the FOURTH ANNUAL GOLDEN STATE CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS were ready to get under way and Cal State HAYWARD was getting ready to make their bid for a FOURTH CONSECUTIVE GOLDEN STATE CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE.
