Moses Starts Year On High Note

Walnut, California, April 25-26—Edwin Moses won his 60th consecutive final in the intermediate hurdles to highlight the 22nd Mt. San Antonio College Relays, but it took an athlete of Moses' stature to overshadow a "World Record," a trio of women's Collegiate Records and a global best in the heptathlon.

Moses had to fight off a determined Andre Phillips to tally No. 60 at 48.61, as Phillips was pulled to a PR 48.97. Some 10,000 fans on Sunday witnessed the rare sight of Moses being behind heading into the homestretch, such was the fight carried to 1980's Athlete Of The Year by Phillips, the UCLA senior.

The "World Record" was a bit arcane, USC hurdling 4 x 110 highs in 55.25, the fastest effort at the metric distance. Dead last after Jim Tatham's opening leg, the Trojans were right back in it after Philip Johnson's second leg, and Milan Stewart blew into the lead early in his stint.

Tonie Campbell only had to power home smoothly on the anchor to ensure the lowering of all 3 previous versions of the record. (Take your pick: at $4 \times 120y$ there is the hand time of 55.4 and an auto 55.53, and at $4 \times 110m$ with auto timing there was 56.06.)

The collegiate women's throwers were superb, although few fans probably realized it. First, energetic Karin Smith—resplendent in a bright red speed-skating suit—rifled 210-11 for a Collegiate Record and the No. 3 throw of her career.

Then Arizona's Meg Ritchie whirled the discus 221-5 to move to 10th all-time world and down collegiate rival Ria Stalman, who twice upped her PR and finally settled for 204-5, keeping her the No. 2 collegian ever.

It was the finest top-end discus throwing ever produced by U.S. college women. Moreover, it signaled the arrival of Ritchie, a woman discuser born and bred in the West, into territory previously the exclusive domain of Eastern Europeans.

Maybe the finest performance of the entire meet was witnessed only by a handful of people on Thursday and Friday as the new women's heptathlon produced the highest total of its inaugural season.

Jane Frederick, perennial star of U.S. multi-eventers but hampered by injury last year, came up with a 6166 total, 22 points more than Soviet Yekatarina Gordiyenko scored last season.

Jane's mark probably can't be considered for World Record status at year's end when such specification will be made, as the 800 was hand-timed.


Regardless, Frederick showed excellent adaptability to the new event, as 14—June 1981

her 144-0 javelin heave testified. As well, her solid performances in the 5 old pentathlon events totaled 4487 points, a mark reached only by Frederick herself (5 times), and Jodi Anderson (once) among Americans. Frederick, and the heptathlon WR, have great potential for improvement.

The happy Phillips said, "I planned to push hurdles 6-7-8. Is that the way to beat Moses? I don't know if there is a way. You can't dwell on him; just accept the fact he will be out in front."

Moses laughed when he added, "No wonder my rhythm was so off today: I like to get a 2-hour warmup, but today I got less than 1½ hours. I forgot that daylight saving time started today and I forgot to turn my clock ahead."

of 38.78 and a world-leading 1:20.37. UCLA's women hooked up to cover the 4×200 in a Collegiate Record 1:33.40.

But while relays were the name of the meet, the biggest name on everyone's lips was that of Moses. This race was his '81 debut and he later confessed, "I'm behind in my training. I shouldn't even be out here on the training I'm doing." Phillips knew what Moses meant: "We both knew he wouldn't be sharp."

So Phillips took the fight right to the king. Moses clocked an unofficial 22.5 at his stepdown after the 5th barrier, but Phillips made his move and took the lead at hurdle 7.

Moses realized he was in a hole and then ran his fastest between-hurdles segment (3.9 seconds) between barriers 7 and 8. Heading into the stretch, Phillips looked to his right for Moses, who was working hard to cut Phillips' slight margin. Phillips then chopped his step drastically at the ninth barrier, which killed his momentum and sealed his fate.

While Edwin's 48.61 is excellent for so early in the year—and so early in his conditioning—consider that the mark is only =63rd all-time world and only 32nd all-time Moses.
