DR. GAIL FULLERTON

President



Gail Fullerton, Ph.D., was appointed President of San Jose State University in September, 1978. Dr. Fullerton was Executive Vice President of San Jose State prior to that date.

A sociologist, Dr. Fullerton has been a member of the Department of Sociology at San Jose State Univeristy since 1963, and served briefly as chair of that department before her appointment as Dean of Graduate Studies and Research in 1972. She presently holds the rank of Professor of Sociology. Her publications include two books, one of these a text published in 1972, with a second edition published in 1977.

She is currently a member of the Executive Committee of the Western College Association, a national panelist for the American Council on Education, a member of the International Sociological Association, the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Board of the San Jose Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Board of the San Jose Symphony, a member of the Board of Directors of the Greater San Jose YWCA, and a member of the Board of Directors of the Santa Clara County Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Inc.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska, Dr. Fullerton holds the Ph.D. in sociology from the University of Oregon.



Appointed in December 1979, Dave Adams began his first full academic year as the San Jose State men's athletic director. A former assistant athletic director for men's athletics at the University of Pittsburgh for two years prior to his appointment, he joined the Spartans' athletic staff in February, 1980.

Adams got his start in coaching as the head wrestling and assistant football coach at Bolling Springs (PA) High School in 1958. He returned to Penn State in 1959 as an assistant wrestling coach.

After serving five years at Penn State, he moved to Navy as an assistant baseball and head wrestling coach. In three seasons at the Naval Academy, his Plebe wrestling teams compiled a 21-1 record, including two undefeated seasons.

In 1967, Adams began a 12-year stint as the head wrestling coach at the University of Pittsburgh. Producing five Eastern Wrestling League and Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association champions, Adams' squads compiled a 90-69-2 record. His 1978 team established a school record for season victories with 13 wins.

Named the 1967 "Rookie Coach-of-the-Year" by the Amateur Wrestling News, Adams served on the executive committee of the NCAA Wrestling Coaches Association and is a past president of the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Coaches Association. Instrumental in the formation of the Eastern Wrestling League, the top Eastern collegiate wrestling league, Adams is currently secretary-editor of the NCAA Wrestling Rules Committee.

ERNIE BULLARD

Head Coach



Ernie Bullard begins his eleventh season at the helm of one of America's top collegiate track and field powers, San Jose State University.

A former head coach at Orange Coast Community College, Bullard came to San Jose State in 1968 from Mesa Community College in Mesa, AZ. His last Mesa JC team won the National Junior College Association (NJCAA) crown. In addition, he also coached several NJCAA individual champions, American JC record holders, and Olympic competitors.

Since coming to San Jose State, Bullard has guided his charges to eight NCAA championship meets, including a fourth place finish in 1975. His teams have won five Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) titles and placed second four other times.

A dual meet power during his tenure, the Spartans have been consistently ranked in the top ten by *TRACK AND FIELD NEWS*. Three of his teams have compiled perfect dual meet record seasons as part of his 70-14 overall dual meet slate.

One of the top pole vault coaches in the world, Bullard graduated from the University of Southern California in 1959. An outstanding collegiate pole vaulter, he once placed fourth in the NCAA championships.

The 1975 U.S. Junior Olympic team coach earned his master's degree from Arizona State University in 1961. Internationally respected, he was also selected to the Olympic development staff in 1978.

MARSHALL CLARK

Distance Coach



Marshall Clark is completing his first year at San Jose State as the head cross country and distance coach for the Spartans' track and field program.

One of the finest distance coaches in the nation, Clark joins the Spartan coaching staff after a two year stint at the University of Montana. He served as the cross country coach for one season, the head track coach for two campaigns, and the school's assistant athletic director.

The 47-year-old Clark established his Bay Area roots in 1968 when he was named coach of the Stanford Univeristy cross country team. During his ten year tenure, he led the Cardinals to a second place finish at the 1968 NCAA cross country championships. Among the many Stanford athletes he coached were Olympians Don Kardong and Duncan Macdonald.

Selected to coach the 1972 United States AAU track team in Moscow, Russia, Clark was a successful high school coach at Los Altos and Seaside High Schools. In ten years, he won six conference championships and one southern section California Interscholastic Federation title.

A 1957 graduate of the University of Southern California, he was a three year letterman in track and cross country for the Trojans.

JOHN POWELL

Weight Coach



One of the top discus throwers in the world over the past ten years, John Powell returns to coach the weight men for the third year.

The former world record holder in the discus at 226-8 set in Long Beach, CA on May 4, 1975, John is a two-time Olympian. He finished fourth at Munich in 1972, and picked up a bronze medal in 1976 at Montreal.

A 1969 graduate of San Jose State with a degree in political science and a minor in psychology, John finished fourth in the 1969 NCAA Championships. He was the AAU Champion in 1974 and 1975.

The native San Franciscan has co-authored two books on the discus: "The Linear Approach to the Discus" and "Discus: Wilkins vs. Powell, A Comparative Study," with SJSU Head Coach Ernie Bullard. Single, the 32-year-old Powell lives in Cupertino, CA.

BOB POYNTER

Sprint Coach



A fine addition to the Spartan coaching staff, Bob is a former San Jose State track great. He was the NCAA runner-up in the 100 and 220 yard dashes in 1959. He ranks second on the Spartan all-time list in the 200 meters, and ran on the 1959 400 meter relay team which is also second all-time.

Bob attended Pasadena High School where he was state champion in the 220 in both his junior and senior years.

He earned his Bachelor's degree in Physical Education from San Jose State in 1965. From 1969 through 1974 he coached at Silver Creek High School in San Jose where he first coached Millard Hampton. While they were both at San Jose City College, Millard made the 1976 United States Olympic team, winning a gold medal (400 meter relay) and silver medal (200 meters). Bob coached many fine athletes at SJCC, including Cecil Overstreet and Don Livers who were state champions in the 100 and 200 meters respectively. Other Poynter products are Willie Jackson (1979 State JC 100 and 200 meter champion), Tim Foster (1980 PCAA 200 meter champion), and new Spartan recruits Dwayne Green and Dwayne Taylor.

Earning his master's degree in Physical Education from Cal Poly—San Louis Obispo, Bob works full-time as a counselor at Silver Creek High School. Married for 20 years to wife Gloria, the Poynters live in San Jose wth their two children, Effrem, 14, and Adrienne, 6. Although San Jose State does not have the balance to be an outstanding dual meet team, the Spartan coaching staff feels it has the potential to be an excellent big meet team.

The Spartans will excel in the sprints and relays, and the horizontal jumps. The coaches feel that the rest of the events have a sparkling of individual performers.

Head coach Ernie Bullard returns for his eleventh season at SJSU, hoping to win his second straight and fifth career PCAA Championship.

San Jose State will host two meets this season. The first will be Saturday, March 21 against Nevada-Reno, Nevada-Las Vegas, and the West Valley Track Club. The second meet will be the Saturday, May 2, San Jose National Invitational.

SPRINTS

COACHES' RATING-EXCELLENT

With the addition of former SJS sprint great Bobby Poynter to the coaching staff, the Spartans have attracted some of the top athletes in the state. Joining returning PCAA Champions Ken Thomas (100 meters) and Tim Foster (200 meters) are junior college transfers Virgil Torrence (Long Beach City College), versatile Cleve Prince (Foothill College), and Dwayne Green and Dwayne Taylor (San Jose City College). A strong addition to the 400 meters will be Swiss Olympian Urs Kamber, and prepster Harry Campbell (Mt. Pleasant). Another spring prospect is Iceland's Siggi Sigurdsson.

PETER ANGELIDAKIS Shot Put—Hammer 6-2 235 Senior San Jose, CA



Peter is returning for his second season of track at SJSU and will add depth to the Spartan discus corps. His best hurl last year was 162-3. A former guard on the Spartan football team, Peter was an All-PCAA first team selection as well as the team's Rookie-of-the-Year in 1977. He was a two-sport star at San Jose's Del Mar High School in track and football. He was coached in track by former SJSU pole vault great Bob Slover.

ESSODINA ATCHADE Long Jump 6-2 175 Junior Lome, Togo



The school freshman record holder in the long jump at 26-1½, Essodina was on his way to a sterling sophomore campaign until he was sidelined with a knee injury. His best jump last season was 25-5½. His 1979 leap was good for second at the PCAA Championships and the same slot on the Spartans' all-time list. He needs to improve only an inch to tie the all-time mark set in 1969. Essodina made his country's Olympic team at the age of 17 but never competed due to the African nation's boycott at Montreal. He was discovered by former Spartan track star Errol Williams who was working in Togo (Southwest Africa).

BRET BAFFERT 5,000—10,000 5-10 140 Freshman Alamo, CA



This freshman from San Ramon High School in Danville, CA, will run the 5000 and 10,000 for San Jose State. While at San Ramon, Bret lettered in track and cross country under coach Bob Vincent, earning all-Northern California cross country first team honors.

PAUL BISHOP Shot Put—Discus 6-4 250 Senior South Gate, CA



Last year's PCAA Champion in the discus with a toss of 180-11, Paul had a best of 190-2 which is the third best throw in Spartan history and qualified him for the NCAA's. A versatile athlete, he also had bests of 51-10¾ in the shot put, and 138-11 in the hammer. Paul transferred from West Los Angeles Junior College where he was a two-sport star, winning two letters each in football and track. He was also conference champion in the discus and placed fourth in the state junior college championships. A graduate of South Gate High School, Paul played football and threw the shot, winning his league's shot put title his senior year.

FELIX BOHNI Pole Vault 6-3 195 Sophomore Zurich, Switzerland



The San Jose State record holder for the pole vault at 18-2½, Felix returns as only a sophomore. The 1980 PCAA Champion was one of the top ranked vaulters in the world last year before injuring his ankle. Felix is the holder of every national age group record in the pole vault for his native country of Switzerland from the ages of 12 through 21. He competed in the 1980 Olympics for the Swiss.

BURNESS BRAYBOY 400—800 5-11 170 Freshman Compton, CA



A freshman sprinter from Centennial High School in Compton, CA, Burness will run primarily the longer sprints for San Jose State. He was all-league at Centennial High School while running for coach Charles Leather. His best times are 22.0 in the 220 and 48.0 in the quarter mile.

BO BREIGAN 400 IH—800 6-4 170 Sophomore Fredrikstad, Norway

A transfer from San Jose City College, Bo finished third in the 800 meters at the State JC Championships last year. One of the top half-milers in his native country of Norway, Bo ran against world record holder Sebastian Coe when he set the world record. His best time is 1:49.21, and he has also run a 46.6 mile relay split. He has also run 51.21 in the 400 intermediate hurdles.

HARRY CAMPBELL 100—200—400 5-10 155 Freshman San Jose, CA



A freshman from Mt. Pleasant High School under coach Jim DeDiego, Harry will lend depth to an already strong sprint team. He will probably be used mostly in the 400 meters where he has a best time of 47.6. He has also run 21.5 in the half-lap.

BOB COOK Discus—Hammer 6-5 235 Junior Sacramento, CA



Bob returns for his third season with the Spartans as the team's top hammer thrower. He threw 145-6 last year, the tenth best effort in Spartan history. Not limiting himself to the iron ball and chain, he also threw 155-2 in the discus. Bob attended Sacramento High School where he lettered in football and track under coach Tom Allen.

TIM FOSTER 100—200—400 6-0 160 Senior Barstow, CA



The defending PCAA 200 meter champion, Tim had a fine first season at SJSU after transferring from San Jose City College. He will be rejoined by his former coach at SJCC, Bob Poynter. Tim ran his lifetime best of 21.16 to take the furlong title. He also ran 10.66 to take fourth in the 100 meters. Tim ran the leadoff leg on the Spartans' 400 meter relay team that took the PCAA title in 39.92. While at SJCC, he ran leadoff on the 400 meter relay team that finished second in the state. Tim took a third in the 100 meters. He lettered in basketball, football and track at John F. Kennedy High School in Barstow. In his junior year, he helped his team to the state track title and was on the victorious 440 relay team.

DWAYNE GREEN 100—200 5-9 150 Junior San Jose, CA


A three-sport star at Samuel Ayer High School in Milpitas, CA, Dwayne was voted the Outstanding Academic Athlete. Dwayne also played football and wrestled at Ayer. He was all-league in all three sports. Another product of Bob Poynter at San Jose City College, he ran the leadoff leg on the Jaguars' national record setting 800 meter relay team. He will run the short and medium sprints at Sparta, with bests of 10.3 and 21.1.

DAN HARVEY 5000—10,000 5-10 120 Senior San Ramon, CA



The top cross country runner and captain on Marshall Clark's team this fall, Dan finished 2nd at the PCAA championships and qualified for the NCAA's. In his freshman year, he just missed finishing for the NCAA's by one place. Dan took second at the PCAA track championship in the 5000 meters last season. His best time was 14:32.6. His lifetime best of 14:26.2 is 10th on the all-time list. He also ran the shorter distances, 3:50.1 in the 1500 meters and 9:38.3 in the steeplechase. A product of Dublin High School in Dublin, CA, Dan was All-NorCal in cross country under coach Tom Cathcart, lettering all four years in both track and cross country.

MIKE HAWTHORNE 110 HH—400 IH 6-1 185 Sophomore Richmond, CA



After redshirting in 1979, Mike came to the Spartans as a freshman and led the team in the 110 high hurdles, eventually running 14.3. His hard work led him to a second place finish in the PCAA Championships at 14.52. At Salesian High School in Richmond, he lettered in basketball and track, while earning all-league honors on the cinder by winning the high hurdles. His team won the conference title. Mike is part of a very athletic family with one sister running track at California, one sister running track at Cal State-Northridge, and a brother playing basketball at the University of Arizona.

TERRY HUDDLESTON 1500—5000 5-10 145 Freshman San Clemente, CA

A freshman from San Clemente, Terry had best times of 4:20 in the mile and 9:25 in the 2-mile. He will run the 5,000 at Sparta this season. Terry is a USAF veteran.

TOM HUSSEY 1500 6-3 160 Junior Fremont, CA

Tom returns for his junior year with the Spartans, hoping to improve on his 5th place finish in the 1500 meters at the PCAA Championships last season. He ran a 3:51.6 in that race, but had a season best of 3:50.4, 14th on the all-time Spartan list. He also ran 1:54.9 in the 800. An honor roll student at Washington High School in Fremont, CA, he lettered in three sports under coach Bob Springer. Tom posted all-league honors in all four years in cross country and track, as well as winning the NCS mile title in 1977.

TERRY JOHNSON 800—1500 5-11 165 Senior Fremont, CA



Terry returns for his second season with the Spartans as the number two 800 meter runner. He ran 1:52.0 last season. Terry is a transfer from Chabot College where he lettered twice in cross country and track under coach John Mardem. He was voted all-league both years in the 800. Terry did his high school running for Mission San Jose in Fremont, CA, where he lettered in cross country and track. He was all-league in the 800 and was a member of the league championship mile relay team.

The Swiss 400 meter record holder at 45.79, Urs competed in the 1980 Olympics for his native country, running on the 1600 meter relay team. He won the Swiss championship for the past two years, and was part of his country's record setting 400 and 1600 meter relay teams. Urs will add the much needed punch the Spartans have lacked in the 400 meters.

CLEVELAND PRINCE 100—200—400 5-10 165 Junior East Palo Alto, CA

URS KAMBER 200—400 6-0 175 Senior Rubigen, Switzerland



A prize recruit from Hank Ketels' Foothill College program in Los Altos, CA, Cleve was the Golden Gate Conference Champion at 200 and 400 meters last season. He repeated those finishes in the JC NorCal Championship. Cleve is a graduate of Ravenswood High School in East Palo Alto, CA, where he competed in football, wrestling, cross country and track. At Ravenswood, he was listed in Who's Who among American high school students and was in the Society of Outstanding High School Students. He has bests of 10.5 in the century, 21.0 in the half-lap, and 46.5 in the quarter mile.

CRAIG ROBERTS Triple Jump 6-0 175 Junior Cerritos, CA



One of six returning individual PCAA Champions from San Jose State, Craig's winning leap of 51-5 ranks as the fifth best hop, step and jump in Spartan history. He finished third at the PCAA's in 1979. Craig attended Cerritos High School in Southern California where he played football and ran track, the latter under coach Sam Martinez. An honor student while at CHS, he was all-league for three years and his team's MVP for two. He capped his high school career by taking second at the California State meet.

STAN ROSS 800—1500 5-10 145 Senior Belmont, CA



The top middle distance runner for the Spartans last year, Stan finished third in the PCAA Championships in the 1500 meters at 3:50.6. His best time of the season, 3:44.7, was good enough to qualify him for the NCAA's. He also ran a team best 1:51.9 in the 800. His time in the 1500 ranks as the third best in Spartan history. Stan started his Spartan career in 1978 with a bang, finishing third in the PCAA's in the metric mile while setting a school freshman record in that event. Stan attended Serra High School in San Mateo, CA where he lettered in cross country and track all four seasons. He was tabbed all-league (four years) and All-NorCal (two years) under coach Rich Tambrini. In 1977, Stan had the third fastest clocking in the mile in the nation among high schoolers (4:08.0).

JOE SALAZAR Steeplechase—5000 5-7 135 Senior San Jose, CA



The top steeplechaser on the Spartan squad last season, Joe had a best of 9:18.8. He also had the best 10,000 meter time at 31:45.5, and ran a 15:12.8 5000 meters. Joe was a transfer out of San Jose City College where he lettered twice in both track and cross country under coach Steve Haas. He prepped at James Lick High School where he was his league's cross country champion and the school's MVP in both track and cross country his senior year.

RANDY SCOTT Long, Triple, High Jump 5-11 150 Sophomore Los Angeles, CA



A three-event star at Manual Arts High School in Los Angeles under coach Reggie Morris, Randy should provide depth to the vertical and horizontal jumps. At East Los Angeles College in Monterey Park, CA, he was the 1980 league champion in the triple jump. He has also skied 6-8 in the high jump and 23-11 in the long jump.

JEFF SHAVER 5000—10,000 5-9 140 Junior Santa Monica, CA



Jeff is a transfer from Santa Monica College in Santa Monica, CA, where he was a two-year letterman in both track and cross country under former Spartan sprint star, Tommie Smith. He was all-conference in track and cross country both years. He finished 6th in the AAU Junior Nationals in 1979 at 10,000 meters. Jeff earned all-league honors in track and cross country at Palisades High School in Pacific Palisades, CA, under coach Algis Karalius.

SIGURDUR SIGURDSSON 100—200 5-10 150 Freshman Reykjavik, Iceland

One of three imports from Iceland, Sigurdur is the Icelandic sprint champion at 100 and 200 meters as well as the long jump. His bests are 10.4 in the 100, 21.3 in the 200, and 22-7 in the long jump. He is a graduate of Menntaskolinn High School in Vid Hamrahlid, Iceland. One of two freshman sprinters, Siggy could be the first imported national sprint champion at San Jose State.

WILLIAM SKINNER 5000 6-1 150 Freshman Macon, GA

A freshman out of Central High School in Macon, GA, Billy will run the 3,000 and 5,000 meters this season.

ROBERT SUELFLOHN Shot Put—Discus 6-4 225 Junior Menlo Park, CA



As a sophomore last season, Robert became the 10th best shot putter in school history with a heave of 56-034. He put the 16-pound ball 55-51/2 at the PCAA Championships, good for second place. Bob prepped at Woodside High School in Woodside, CA, where he was a three-sport star, (football, wrestling and track) earning 10 letters. An all-league selection in football and track, he finished second in the CCS in the shot and 10th in the state meet. Bob spent one season at San Mateo JC before coming to Sparta.

DWAYNE TAYLOR 100—200—400 5-10 165 Junior San Jose, CA



Another former pupil of sprint coach Bob Poynter when the two were at San Jose City College, Dwayne should be in competition for a spot on the 400 and 1600 meter relay teams. He is a graduate of Overfelt High School in San Jose, CA, where he was league, region and CCS sprint champion. He has bests of 10.3 in the 100 meters, 21.1 in the 200 meters and 47.4 in the quarter mile.

KEN THOMAS 100—200 5-10 210 Junior Hanford, CA



In only two seasons at San Jose State. Ken has made quite a mark on Spartan athletics. In his freshman season, he set rookie records for the 100 meters (10.2) (10th all-time) and 200 meters (20.7), finished as runner-up in the PCAA Championships in the 100 and 200 and defeated such world class sprinters as James Sanford, Houston McTear, Clancy Edwards and Eddie Hart enroute to winning the 100 meter crowns at the West Coast Relays and San Jose Invitational. Last season. he moved up a notch in the PCAA Championships, taking first while setting a new meet record. 10.36. He also ran second leg on the Spartan's championship 400 meter relay team. His 1980 best time of 10.35 in the century gualified him for the NCAA semi-finals. Ken also plays safety on the Spartan football team. In his freshman season, he broke school records for most TD's returned via interceptions in a season, most vards returned with interceptions in a season as well as the longest interception return for a TD (89 yards vs. Utah State). He earned first team all-PCAA honors at defensive back, the only freshman selected on the first team, and was honored as the SJSU Rookie-of-the-Year. In all, he picked off five passes. returning three for scores. Ken attended Hanford High School where he finished 2nd in the state meet at 100 yards. He lettered in football, basketball and track while at Hanford. Ken comes from a very athletic family. His brother Jewerl played for the Spartan football team and now plays for the Los Angeles Rams of the NFL. Another brother, Billy, wrestled for T.J. Kerr's wrestling team.

THORSTEIN THORSSON Decathlon 6-0 193 Freshman Iceland

One of only two decathletes on this year's squad, Thorstein is only a freshman. His older brother Thorvalour, also competing for the Spartans, is the 1977 Icelandic 110 meter hurdle champion. Will also throw the javelin.

THORVALOUR THORSSON 400 6-2 185 Freshman Iceland



Thorvalour comes to San Jose State to compete in two events the Spartans have been lacking in—the 400 meters and the 110 meter hurdles. He was the Icelandic champion in the 110 meter hurdles in 1977, and has been on the national team since that year. He will also run the 400 meters where he has run 49.0.

VIRGIL TORRENCE 100—200 6-1 165 Junior Gardena, CA



A versatile athlete who is expected to add depth to the sprint corps, Virgil is a transfer from Long Beach City College, running under coach Ron Allice. He was all-league at Long Beach and at Gardena High School in Gardena, CA, where he ran track and played football. He was chosen all-league and all-city in both the century and the furlong. His best times are 10.2 in the 100, 21.3 in the 200, and has also run 48.2 in the 440.

JOEL WYRICK High Jump—Triple Jump 6-1 160 Junior San Jose, CA



Joel had an impressive first season for San Jose State last year. After transferring from San Jose City College where he finished 7th in both the high and triple jump at the State JC Championships, Joel finished third in the PCAA Championships in the triple jump at 49-714. His best of 51-21/2 at the San Jose Invitational places him 4th in school history. Joel can also jump high, with a lifetime best of 7-1. Joel Lawrence attended Mt. Pleasant High School in San Jose where he lettered four years in track for coach Rich Kennedy.

TONY ZAWINUL Long Jump—110 HH 6-0 172 Junior Pasadena, CA

The 1980 State junior college long jump champion, Tony comes to San Jose State after two years at Pasadena City College, where he lettered twice under coach Skip Robinson. He has a lifetime best of 25-2 in the long jump. A graduate of Blair High School in Pasadena, Tony earned two letters in basketball and three in track. His presence will give the Spartans a pair of 25-foot jumpers.

San Jose State has had three individual Olympic Gold Medalists. Willie Steele won the long jump in 1948 with a leap of 25 feet, 8 inches. In 1968, Lee Evans won the 400 meters with a time of 43.86. Also that year, Tommie Smith won the 200 meters with a 19.83 clocking.

Evans and Ronnie Ray Smith have won gold medals as members of the 1968 U.S. 1600 and 400 meter relay teams, respectively.

If you don't have Gillcable, your viewing choices are few. A handful of channels showing the same types of programs; movies that are annoyingly edited and interrupted by commercials; poor reception of some stations.
