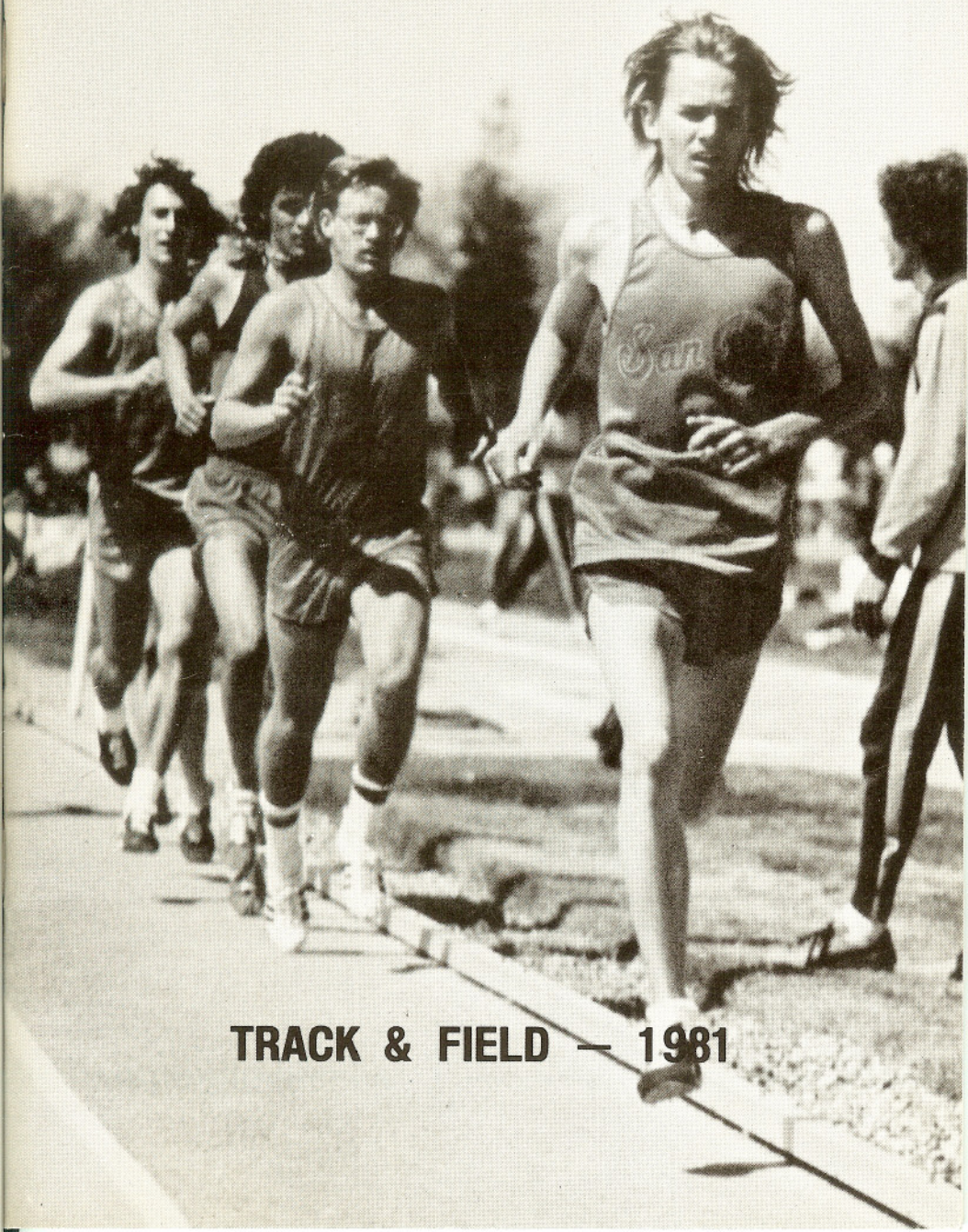

DR. GAIL FULLERTON

President



Gail Fullerton, Ph.D., was appointed President of San Jose State University in September, 1978. Dr. Fullerton was Executive Vice President of San Jose State prior to that date.

A sociologist, Dr. Fullerton has been a member of the Department of Sociology at San Jose State University since 1963, and served briefly as chair of that department before her appointment as Dean of Graduate Studies and Research in 1972. She presently holds the rank of Professor of Sociology. Her publications include two books, one of these a text published in 1972, with a second edition published in 1977.

She is currently a member of the Executive Committee of the Western College Association, a national panelist for the American Council on Education, a member of the International Sociological Association, the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Board of the San Jose Chamber of Commerce, a member of the Board of the San Jose Symphony, a member of the Board of Directors of the Greater San Jose YWCA, and a member of the Board of Directors of the Santa Clara County Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Inc.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska, Dr. Fullerton holds the Ph.D. in sociology from the University of Oregon.

DAVE ADAMS

Athletic Director



Appointed in December 1979, Dave Adams began his first full academic year as the San Jose State men's athletic director. A former assistant athletic director for men's athletics at the University of Pittsburgh for two years prior to his appointment, he joined the Spartans' athletic staff in February, 1980.

Adams got his start in coaching as the head wrestling and assistant football coach at Bolling Springs (PA) High School in 1958. He returned to Penn State in 1959 as an assistant wrestling coach.

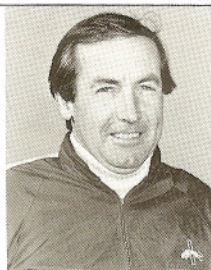
After serving five years at Penn State, he moved to Navy as an assistant baseball and head wrestling coach. In three seasons at the Naval Academy, his Plebe wrestling teams compiled a 21-1 record, including two undefeated seasons.

In 1967, Adams began a 12-year stint as the head wrestling coach at the University of Pittsburgh. Producing five Eastern Wrestling League and Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association champions, Adams' squads compiled a 90-69-2 record. His 1978 team established a school record for season victories with 13 wins.

Named the 1967 "Rookie Coach-of-the-Year" by the Amateur Wrestling News, Adams served on the executive committee of the NCAA Wrestling Coaches Association and is a past president of the Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Coaches Association. Instrumental in the formation of the Eastern Wrestling League, the top Eastern collegiate wrestling league, Adams is currently secretary-editor of the NCAA Wrestling Rules Committee.

ERNIE BULLARD

Head Coach



Ernie Bullard begins his eleventh season at the helm of one of America's top collegiate track and field powers, San Jose State University.

A former head coach at Orange Coast Community College, Bullard came to San Jose State in 1968 from Mesa Community College in Mesa, AZ. His last Mesa JC team won the National Junior College Association (NJCAA) crown. In addition, he also coached several NJCAA individual champions, American JC record holders, and Olympic competitors.

Since coming to San Jose State, Bullard has guided his charges to eight NCAA championship meets, including a fourth place finish in 1975. His teams have won five Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) titles and placed second four other times.

A dual meet power during his tenure, the Spartans have been consistently ranked in the top ten by *TRACK AND FIELD NEWS*. Three of his teams have compiled perfect dual meet record seasons as part of his 70-14 overall dual meet slate.

One of the top pole vault coaches in the world, Bullard graduated from the University of Southern California in 1959. An outstanding collegiate pole vaulter, he once placed fourth in the NCAA championships.

The 1975 U.S. Junior Olympic team coach earned his master's degree from Arizona State University in 1961. Internationally respected, he was also selected to the Olympic development staff in 1978.

MARSHALL CLARK

Distance Coach



Marshall Clark is completing his first year at San Jose State as the head cross country and distance coach for the Spartans' track and field program.

One of the finest distance coaches in the nation, Clark joins the Spartan coaching staff after a two year stint at the University of Montana. He served as the cross country coach for one season, the head track coach for two campaigns, and the school's assistant athletic director.

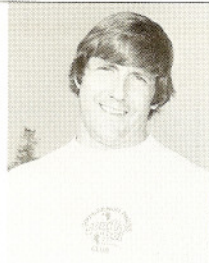
The 47-year-old Clark established his Bay Area roots in 1968 when he was named coach of the Stanford University cross country team. During his ten year tenure, he led the Cardinals to a second place finish at the 1968 NCAA cross country championships. Among the many Stanford athletes he coached were Olympians Don Kardong and Duncan Macdonald.

Selected to coach the 1972 United States AAU track team in Moscow, Russia, Clark was a successful high school coach at Los Altos and Seaside High Schools. In ten years, he won six conference championships and one southern section California Interscholastic Federation title.

A 1957 graduate of the University of Southern California, he was a three year letterman in track and cross country for the Trojans.

JOHN POWELL

Weight Coach



One of the top discus throwers in the world over the past ten years, John Powell returns to coach the weight men for the third year.

The former world record holder in the discus at 226-8 set in Long Beach, CA on May 4, 1975, John is a two-time Olympian. He finished fourth at Munich in 1972, and picked up a bronze medal in 1976 at Montreal.

A 1969 graduate of San Jose State with a degree in political science and a minor in psychology, John finished fourth in the 1969 NCAA Championships. He was the AAU Champion in 1974 and 1975.

The native San Franciscan has co-authored two books on the discus: "The Linear Approach to the Discus" and "Discus: Wilkins vs. Powell, A Comparative Study," with SJSU Head Coach Ernie Bullard. Single, the 32-year-old Powell lives in Cupertino, CA.

BOB POYNTER

Sprint Coach



A fine addition to the Spartan coaching staff, Bob is a former San Jose State track great. He was the NCAA runner-up in the 100 and 220 yard dashes in 1959. He ranks second on the Spartan all-time list in the 200 meters, and ran on the 1959 400 meter relay team which is also second all-time.

Bob attended Pasadena High School where he was state champion in the 220 in both his junior and senior years.

He earned his Bachelor's degree in Physical Education from San Jose State in 1965. From 1969 through 1974 he coached at Silver Creek High School in San Jose where he first coached Millard Hampton. While they were both at San Jose City College, Millard made the 1976 United States Olympic team, winning a gold medal (400 meter relay) and silver medal (200 meters). Bob coached many fine athletes at SJCC, including Cecil Overstreet and Don Livers who were state champions in the 100 and 200 meters respectively. Other Poynter products are Willie Jackson (1979 State JC 100 and 200 meter champion), Tim Foster (1980 PCAA 200 meter champion), and new Spartan recruits Dwayne Green and Dwayne Taylor.

Earning his master's degree in Physical Education from Cal Poly—San Luis Obispo, Bob works full-time as a counselor at Silver Creek High School. Married for 20 years to wife Gloria, the Poynters live in San Jose with their two children, Effrem, 14, and Adrienne, 6.

1981 SEASON OUTLOOK

Although San Jose State does not have the balance to be an outstanding dual meet team, the Spartan coaching staff feels it has the potential to be an excellent big meet team.

The Spartans will excel in the sprints and relays, and the horizontal jumps. The coaches feel that the rest of the events have a sparkling of individual performers.

Head coach Ernie Bullard returns for his eleventh season at SJSU, hoping to win his second straight and fifth career PCAA Championship.

San Jose State will host two meets this season. The first will be Saturday, March 21 against Nevada-Reno, Nevada-Las Vegas, and the West Valley Track Club. The second meet will be the Saturday, May 2, San Jose National Invitational.

SPRINTS

COACHES' RATING—EXCELLENT

With the addition of former SJS sprint great Bobby Poynter to the coaching staff, the Spartans have attracted some of the top athletes in the state. Joining returning PCAA Champions Ken Thomas (100 meters) and Tim Foster (200 meters) are junior college transfers Virgil Torrence (Long Beach City College), versatile Cleve Prince (Foothill College), and Dwayne Green and Dwayne Taylor (San Jose City College). A strong addition to the 400 meters will be Swiss Olympian Urs Kamber, and prepster Harry Campbell (Mt. Pleasant). Another spring prospect is Iceland's Sigi Sigurdsson.

PETER ANGELIDAKIS
Shot Put—Hammer
6-2 235 Senior
San Jose, CA



Peter is returning for his second season of track at SJSU and will add depth to the Spartan discus corps. His best hurl last year was 162-3. A former guard on the Spartan football team, Peter was an All-PCAA first team selection as well as the team's Rookie-of-the-Year in 1977. He was a two-sport star at San Jose's Del Mar High School in track and football. He was coached in track by former SJSU pole vault great Bob Slover.

ESSODINA ATCHADE
Long Jump
6-2 175 Junior
Lome, Togo



The school freshman record holder in the long jump at 26-1½, Essodina was on his way to a sterling sophomore campaign until he was sidelined with a knee injury. His best jump last season was 25-5½. His 1979 leap was good for second at the PCAA Championships and the same slot on the Spartans' all-time list. He needs to improve only an inch to tie the all-time mark set in 1969. Essodina made his country's Olympic team at the age of 17 but never competed due to the African nation's boycott at Montreal. He was discovered by former Spartan track star Errol Williams who was working in Togo (Southwest Africa).

This freshman from San Ramon High School in Danville, CA, will run the 5000 and 10,000 for San Jose State. While at San Ramon, Bret lettered in track and cross country under coach Bob Vincent, earning all-Northern California cross country first team honors.

PAUL BISHOP
Shot Put—Discus
6-4 250 Senior
South Gate, CA



Last year's PCAA Champion in the discus with a toss of 180-11, Paul had a best of 190-2 which is the third best throw in Spartan history and qualified him for the NCAA's. A versatile athlete, he also had bests of 51-10¾ in the shot put, and 138-11 in the hammer. Paul transferred from West Los Angeles Junior College where he was a two-sport star, winning two letters each in football and track. He was also conference champion in the discus and placed fourth in the state junior college championships. A graduate of South Gate High School, Paul played football and threw the shot, winning his league's shot put title his senior year.

FELIX BOHNI
Pole Vault
6-3 195 Sophomore
Zurich, Switzerland



The San Jose State record holder for the pole vault at 18-2½, Felix returns as only a sophomore. The 1980 PCAA Champion was one of the top ranked vaulters in the world last year before injuring his ankle. Felix is the holder of every national age group record in the pole vault for his native country of Switzerland from the ages of 12 through 21. He competed in the 1980 Olympics for the Swiss.

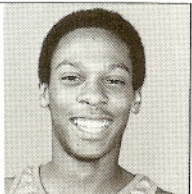

A transfer from San Jose City College, Bo finished third in the 800 meters at the State JC Championships last year. One of the top half-milers in his native country of Norway, Bo ran against world record holder Sebastian Coe when he set the world record. His best time is 1:49.21, and he has also run a 46.6 mile relay split. He has also run 51.21 in the 400 intermediate hurdles.

A freshman from Mt. Pleasant High School under coach Jim DeDiego, Harry will lend depth to an already strong sprint team. He will probably be used mostly in the 400 meters where he has a best time of 47.6. He has also run 21.5 in the half-lap.

Bob returns for his third season with the Spartans as the team's top hammer thrower. He threw 145-6 last year, the tenth best effort in Spartan history. Not limiting himself to the iron ball and chain, he also threw 155-2 in the discus. Bob attended Sacramento High School where he lettered in football and track under coach Tom Allen.

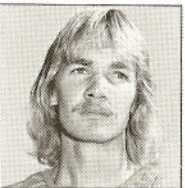


The defending PCAA 200 meter champion, Tim had a fine first season at SJSU after transferring from San Jose City College. He will be rejoined by his former coach at SJCC, Bob Poynter. Tim ran his lifetime best of 21.16 to take the furlong title. He also ran 10.66 to take fourth in the 100 meters. Tim ran the leadoff leg on the Spartans' 400 meter relay team that took the PCAA title in 39.92. While at SJCC, he ran leadoff on the 400 meter relay team that finished second in the state. Tim took a third in the 100 meters. He lettered in basketball, football and track at John F. Kennedy High School in Barstow. In his junior year, he helped his team to the state track title and was on the victorious 440 relay team.

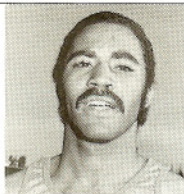

He will run the short and medium sprints at Sparta, with bests of 10.3 and 21.1.

The top cross country runner and captain on Marshall Clark's team this fall, Dan finished 2nd at the PCAA championships and qualified for the NCAA's. In his freshman year, he just missed finishing for the NCAA's by one place. Dan took second at the PCAA track championship in the 5000 meters last season. His best time was 14:32.6. His lifetime best of 14:26.2 is 10th on the all-time list. He also ran the shorter distances, 3:50.1 in the 1500 meters and 9:38.3 in the steeplechase. A product of Dublin High School in Dublin, CA, Dan was All-NorCal in cross country under coach Tom Cathcart, lettering all four years in both track and cross country.

After redshirting in 1979, Mike came to the Spartans as a freshman and led the team in the 110 high hurdles, eventually running 14.3. His hard work led him to a second place finish in the PCAA Championships at 14.52. At Salesian High School in Richmond, he lettered in basketball and track, while earning all-league honors on the cinder by winning the high hurdles. His team won the conference title. Mike is part of a very athletic family with one sister running track at California, one sister running track at Cal State-Northridge, and a brother playing basketball at the University of Arizona.

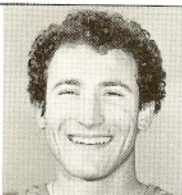

An honor roll student at Washington High School in Fremont, CA, he lettered in three sports under coach Bob Springer. Tom posted all-league honors in all four years in cross country and track, as well as winning the NCS mile title in 1977.

He was all-league in the 800 and was a member of the league championship mile relay team.

At Ravenswood, he was listed in Who's Who among American high school students and was in the Society of Outstanding High School Students. He has bests of 10.5 in the century, 21.0 in the half-lap, and 46.5 in the quarter mile.

San Jose State has had three individual Olympic Gold Medalists. Willie Steele won the long jump in 1948 with a leap of 25 feet, 8 inches. In 1968, Lee Evans won the 400 meters with a time of 43.86. Also that year, Tommie Smith won the 200 meters with a 19.83 clocking.

Evans and Ronnie Ray Smith have won gold medals as members of the 1968 U.S. 1600 and 400 meter relay teams, respectively.
