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Cindi Durchslag eyes state track meet berth

San Carlos High's track and field weightperson Cindi Durchslag is sitting in the garden spot approaching next Friday's Central Coast Section finals.

Durchslag tops the CCS in both the discus throw and the shot put.

But in every garden, there's a weed. Durchslag's no exception.

"There's a lot of pressure that goes along with being the top marks in the CCS," said Durchslag after wiping up victories in the discus and shot put in Saturday's Region II finals at College of San Mateo. "If I didn't have the top marks, I might be doing better now."

Not that Durchslag is disgracing herself. She threw 130-6 and putted 42.3 for easy regional victories. But Durchslag feels she's been slumping lately.

"I've been doing pretty well in the shot put, but my discus throws haven't been that good," she said. "I got up high, and then started dropping off. My throws today weren't that bad, so maybe I'm starting a slow

upward swing again." Durchslag has CCS bests of 42-4½ and 146-2. Those marks rank her near the top in the state. A strong showing in the CCS finals will give her a trip to Cerritos College June 4-5 for the state finals.

But even with a Durchslag, and a Rhonda Robinson, who won the 100 and 200 races, San Carlos could not overhaul powerful Carmont for the team title. Carmont outscored San Carlos 70-56.

Carmont doesn't have any one outstanding individual, but the Scots are loaded with depth. The only event Carmont won was the mile relay, and the Scots won it with authority, lowering their CCS best time to 3:55.7.

Carmont, which also holds the CCS best clocking in the 440 relay, seemed a dead cert for the another victory in that event. But nerves got the best of their leadoff runner, causing her to false start. Carmont was disqualified and will only make the CCS finals if another team were to scratch.

Other local girl winners were Sequoia's Linda Lut-

trell in the 110 low hurdles and freshman Wendy Brown with a 17-1 long jump.

Menlo-Atherton's Reggie DuPee was the local stand-out in the varsity action.

DuPee captured the 110 high hurdles in 14.8, and the high jump with a leap of 6-6. He was also a game second in the low hurdles race, losing a close 37.7 decision to Woodside's Tim Reddick.

In the high's, DuPee reversed a South Peninsula Athletic League finals defeat to Sequoia's Greg Tucker. Tucker was second in the regionals at 15.1.

"I don't think my winning was an upset," said DuPee. "When he beat me in the SPAL finals, I was hitting every hurdle, and then, my shoe flew off and hit me in the head. I was ahead when it happened. Before today's race, someone said I'd have to beat Tucker. I said, 'no, he'd have to beat me.'"

Tucker did get a slow start when he slipped out of the blocks.

DuPee was the only high jumper to clear 6-6, and is presently tied for the CCS lead with a leap of 6-8.

"I jump better under pressure," said DuPee. "Nobody else was staying with me, so I kind of lost my concentration. But I have had a problem lately with going over the bar sideways. Hopefully that's corrected. On my 6-6 jump, everything seemed like it was done properly."

Sequoia discus thrower Dave Elkins was somewhat of a surprise winner with a toss of 167-6½.

"I've been practicing up here (CSM) for about two weeks," said Elkins. "My practice throws were all right around 160. I stayed loose, and really felt comfortable in the ring today. It shocked me when I won the event. It was totally unexpected. I was just hoping to place for the finals."

Other top varsity performances came from Woodside's Steve Luke with a 50.4 quarter-mile victory, hurdler Tim Reddick of Woodside with a quick 37.7 triumph, M-A jumpers Shawn Smith (21-8 long jump) and Ben Sterling (46-6¾ triple jump), and Carmont's winning relay team with a 42.8 clocking.

M-A's super frosh-soph

squad ran away with the team title.
