



FIFTY YEARS OF GOLDEN MOMENTS IN TRACK 1931 - 1981

Recreation Park, Visalia; Saturday, May 23, 1931

The date for the 17th State Meet was moved 2 weeks closer to summer and the site was Visalia, about halfway between Bakersfield and Fresno. At least three records were expected to be broken, the 440, 880 relay, and broad jump. John McCarthy (Fairfax, LA) had run under 49 flat twice this season and had a great shot at the 49.6 State Meet mark. The LA Poly relay team had bettered the National Interscholastic record three different times, winning the Southern meet in 1:28.2, and looked like a cinch. In the broad jump either Floyd Wilson of Riverdale or Melo Almada of Los Angeles High should do the job. Wilson's best effort this season was 23-101/2, a new National prep mark, while Almada was improving steadily, leaping more than 23 feet in his last three meets.

There were still other great athletes back from last year's meet. Ashley Burch (Jordan, LA) returned to try to keep his 220 crown. Carl Satterfield (Manual Arts), last year's 440 king, was back but would switch to the 880. Phil Morentin from host Visalia would try to keep his mile title on his home track. In the field events Don Carter (Franklin, LA) returned to try to repeat in the shot and George Theodoratus (Sacramento) would attempt to make his presence felt after placing 3rd in both the shot and discus last

The same 14 scoring events contested since 1926 were again on the schedule, but the scoring system was changed to 5-4-3-2-1 for the first time. This took a lot of the sting out of first place points and in retrospect was probably a step backward. Three 2nd places now would easily beat two 1st places, where in the old system the reverse was true. This scoring system would last until 1966. The meet was to start at 1:30 with trial heats in sprints, hurdles, and relay. Visalia had worked hard in preparing for the meet and the track appeared to be in great shape. The 440 would be run around one curve.

STATE MEET RECORDS

Two new State Meet records were set and one was tied, the new half mile record being the only surprise. John McCarthy (Fairfax, LA) demolished the old 440 record, running a great 48.7. He won by only a foot, however, over LA Poly's Jimmy LuValle. LA Poly, everyone's choice to win the relay in a new record, was forced to use a substitute runner and ended 2nd to Huntington Park's record-equalling 1:29.6. Carl Satterfield (Manual Arts), last year's 440 champ, moved up to the 880 and, surprising many, brought the State Meet record down to 1:57.6.

HIGHLIGHTS

The top scorer of the Meet turned out to be George Theodoratus, Sacramento's 240-pound weight tosser, with 9 points. He won the discus at 132-11/2 and placed 2nd in the shot put to Don Carter (Franklin, LA) who won his 2nd crown, this time at 52-10. Little Foy Draper of Huntington Park took the 100 in 9.9 over the favorite, Al Fitch of Pasadena, and Ashley Burch of Jordan, LA repeated in the 220 with a 21.5, only 1/10 over the State record. Phil Morentin (Visalia) won his 2nd mile title at 4:32.8. Blankenship's 1915 record of 4:30.0 still remained untouched after all these years.

Floyd Wilson of Riverdale won the broad jump at 23-5 5/8, missing the State Meet record by about 3 inches. Almada of LA was second. About 4000 fans turned out to watch the meet.


TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP (Meet scored 5-4-3-2-1)

The team title was back on a positive note after last year's tie, LA Poly winning with 191/2 points. Their points came from many sources, including Stankovich's tie for first in the pole vault (12-81/4) and the 2nd in the 880 relay. Sacramento, behind Theodoratus's 9 points, finished 2nd at 13. Huntington Park had 11, followed by Manual Arts of LA and Fairfax of LA at 9 and Los Angeles with 8.

Huntington Park - 11. 5-1st in 880 relay; 5-Draper, 1st in 100; 1-Heigold, 5th in HJ.







STEVE SCOTT — AMERICA'S BEST (UNKNOWN) MILER

If Steve Scott, America's best miler, was a European Citizen he almost certainly would be rich and famous. Steve Scott (3:51.1 best time) is considered by many track experts to be the third best miler in the world (behind world-famous Sebastin Coe and Steve Ovette), but only a handful of Americans would recognize the 25-year-old former C.I.F. Southern Section star.

Steve Scott graduated from Upland High School in 1974 with a 3.0 grade point average. A star in high school, he placed 3rd in the Southern Section's 3A Cross Country Meet his senior year, won the section's 3A ½ mile, and placed second in the State's ½ mile (1:54) championship. His best time in the mile was only 4:21 and, consequently, he wasn't heavily recruited by the Country's top track programs. Scott wasn't entirely overlooked as UC Irvine, then a NCAA Division II school, gave the future star a half scholarship.

"Irvine is your basic adacemic school. Scholarships were at a nill — I received a half scholarship which was worth about a third by the time I graduated because of inflation," said Scott.

It was at UC Irvine that Scott came into his own as a student/athlete. He graduated from the academically-oriented school in four years with a degree in secondary education. Scott stayed at Irvine long enough to be named All-American (numerous times) in both track and cross country as he won the NCAA Division II mile with times of 4:08.8, 3:57.0, and 3:55.0 his

freshman, sophomore and junior years respectively, before winning the Division I mile his senior year with a time of 3:52.9.

"Running in college is a mind-expanding experience. I was used to running 50 miles a week at the most in high school — suddenly I was running 100 miles (a week) over hills."

During Scott's four years at Irvine, he experienced things that the typical student and even the typical athlete doesn't usually experience. After his sophomore year, Scott went to the Olympic Trials (he was the 18th of 18 people invited) and finished 7th (top three qualified for the Olympics). Four years later he again was invited to the trials, but this time he left #1 in the 1500 (metric mile) and qualified for the Olympic Games. Scott, along with the rest of the United States' Olympic Team never attended the Olympic Games because of the country's boycott.

"It's not like I was all alone (in not attending the Olympic Games). There were hundreds of others that also didn't go. The Olympics are very important — I wanted to compete — but . . . "

What motivates a runner like Steve Scott who is one of the best in the world yet goes unnoticed in his own country?

"I've been in athletics since I was nine years old. I've been involved with the world of athletics all my life. I've learned about

life through sports — you learn about right and wrong, and about friendships and relationships with people. You can't learn how to relate with people through a text book — you have to live it. It (athletics) has enabled me to grow. All the people that have been around me have cared about me as a human being, not as a runner."

It was at UC Irvine that Scott came into his own as a student/athlete. He graduated from the academically-oriented school in four years with a degree in secondary education. Scott stayed at Irvine long enough to be named All-American (numerous times) in both track and cross country as he won the NCAA Division II mile with times of 4:08.8, 3:57.0, and 3:55.0 his freshman, sophomore and junior years respectively, before winning the Division I mile his senior year with a time of 3:52.9.

Steve Scott regularly runs before large 100,000 + crowds when he competes in Europe, but is used to the much smaller crowds in the United States. Scott works to support his track and his family, yet doesn't directly get paid for competing. The world's third best miler will never be signed to million + contracts which has become commonplace for his counterparts in the world of baseball, basketball, football and even hockey, tennis and golf, because there isn't currently such a thing as profes-

sional track. Scott and his family will never become rich. "If we were a professional sport then — but that's not important to me."

... he wasn't heavily recruited by the Country's top track programs. Scott wasn't entirely overlooked as UC Irvine, then a NCAA Division II school, gave the future star a half scholarship.

Besides being on his own financially in comparison to professional team sports, Scott also is on his own when he competes. If he wins, it's because he won and if he loses he can't blame anyone besides himself. "There's more pressure in individual sports. It takes a lot more to succeed. If you make a mistake—it's all over—you have no backup. When you are running a race—it's you vs you."

The world's third best miler will never be signed to million + contracts which has become commonplace for counterparts in the world of baseball, basketball, football and even hockey, tennis and golf, because there isn't currently such a thing as professional track.

Scott has some important advice for today's student/athletes. "Have patience. I didn't come into my own (world class) until my junior year in college. If you keep training hard and remain dedicated you'll improve. As long as your time improves and you feel as if you are improving, that's the most important thing. You have to want to be good."

Steve Scott plans on continuing to run and wants to compete in the 1984 Olympics after not being able to go last summer. He and his wife Kim are expecting their first child this summer and are living in Arizona (Scott's former UC Irvine Coach Len Miller still coaches Scott and is Head Coach at Arizona State). Then Scott hopes to run in the Olympics instead of watching them on television.

"Have patience. I didn't come into my own (world class) until my junior year in college. If you keep training hard and remain dedicated you'll improve. As long as your time improves and you feel as if you are improving, that's the most important thing. You have to want to be good."

"I'm in track and field because I enjoy the competition, meeting people, and traveling." Steve Scott won't have too far to travel for the 1984 games, they'll be in his backyard. And winning? Well, that's in his nature too.

THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA'S TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS: A Look at Some of the Nation's Finest.

The MAN from Sacramento is here.

The Yellowjackets, led by Ken Robinson and Sharon Ware, have flown in from Berkeley with hopes of winning two team championships.

The lady's from University and Alemany are in attendance and will battle for a third time this season in a race that could well produce a national record.

It's the California Interscholastic Federation State Track and Field Championships, long regarded as the best high school meet in the nation, this weekend at Cerritos College. Qualifying for all events but the 3,200 will be run Friday with an all-finals program scheduled for Saturday.

Last Friday night at Modesto College in the Sac-Joaquin Section final Kevin Willhite raced to a 21.01 nation-leading 200 meters despite being totally unpressed. He also won the 100 in 10.46. The multitalented junior from Cordova High School (a suburb of Sacramento) is 6-0, weighs 190 pounds and last fall gained over 1,800 as a running back. The marks didn't come as a complete surprise since earlier in the season he had wind-aided hand times of 10.2 and 20.4. If Willhite is to become a state champion he will have to defeat Berkeley's Robinson who won the 200 last year and was second in the 100. Earlier this season Robinson ran 10.39 to beat Willhite, but since that time Robinson has been running with a slight injury. Robinson has not run a serious 200 this year, but has a 400 time of 46.8.

If Berkeley's men and women are to win team champions they will need outstanding efforts both from Robinson and Ware. In addition to Robinson, who also runs on the state-leading 400 relay (41.1) and will run on the 1,600 relay (3:11.7), the Yellowjacket men have potential point winners in Pete Richardson and Johnny Langerston in the 800, Walter Murray in the 300 low hurdles and both relays.

In last year's meet Ware won the 100 in 11.42, a state and National Federation record, and finished second in the 200 to Olympian Sherri Howard of Kennedy High School in Granada Hills. This weekend the Berkeley senior is matched against Sherri's sister Denean, another Olympian, who has run 11.77 and 23.40. Ware has run 10.59 and 24.04 this season but has an all-time best of 11.34 and 23.62. Berkeley lost to Kennedy by six points last year but if the Yellowjackets

can hold on to the baton in the 400 and 1,600 relays they stand a good chance of reversing that decision.

Polly Plumer of University High in Irvine and Vickie Cook of Alemany High in the San Fernando Valley are two of the best distance runners in the nation. In last year's state meet Plummer just edged Cook in the 1,600 with a stunning sprint over the final 100 meters. (Continued on page 13)


Plummer was timed in 4:46.71 and Cook clocked 4:47.31 for the two best times in the nation. The two have met twice this season with Cook winning over 1,500 at San Jose (both were timed in 4:25.9) and Plumer prevailing over 1,600 in Southern Section final (4:45.06 to 4:45.21). Earlier this year Cook, competing unattached, ran 4:40.2 for 1,600. The pending national record is 4:41.08 set earlier this year by sophomore Kim Gallagher of Upper Dublin in Fort Washington, Pa.

Several other national records could be seriously challenged. In two of the last three state meets the national record has been broken in the four-lap relay. In 1978, at Bakersfield, Los Angeles Banning broke the mile relay record with a 3:11.52 and last year at Berkeley, Centennial shattered that mark with a 3:10.37 for 1,600 with the Yellowjackets just .05 behind running an all-junior team. Berkeley's team is no long intact but the current foresome is potentially even faster. In the North Coast Section finals Berkeley ran 3:11.7 and that was without Robinson. Add to a Robinson-anchored quintet, teams from Long Beach Poly (3:12.55), Muir (3:12.61), Centennial (3:12.72), Compton (3:12.96), Pasadena (3:13.12), Crenshaw (3:15.75), Oakland (3:15.9), Locke (3:15.92) and Cordova (3:16.7) and you have the best high school four lap relay race ever assembled.

Two other national interscholastic records that could also be broken are in the men's and women's 800. In the past, in quality women's 800 races, the first lap has been run in 61 or 62 seconds. Last week at Berkeley junior Jessica Spies of Livermore went by 400 meters in 59.3 and 600 meters in 1:31.5 and won unpressed in 2:09.0. Based on the Southern Section final last Thursday Spies will have plenty of company in the state final. Donna Curtis of Culver City had the same time as Spies at 400 and 600 meters and was closely followed by Rennie Durand of Laguna Beach. Curtis just managed to hold off Durrand, 2:06.01 to 2:06.42. The National Federation record is 2:04.5 set by Joetta Clark of Columbia High in Maplewood, N.J. last year. Mary Decker of Orange has the best time ever by a prep (2:02.3).

The men's National Interscholastic Federation 800 record is one of the oldest on the books, a 1:48.8 for 880 yards set by Richard Joyce of Sierra High in Whittier at the California State meet in Bakersfield in 1965. Joyce was unpressed in that race after a 49.2 first lap. Two weeks ago Eddie Davis of Compton won the Southern Section 4-A race in 1:49.43 for the best time in the nation. This weekend Davis is matched against Berkeley's Richardson who was second in last year's

state meet in 1:50.19 losing by .04 to the closing burst of speed from Tulare's Pete Quinonez. A slightly faster opening lap (52 seconds) could result in not only a new Federation record but also challenge the all-time prep best of 1:47.9 set by El Cerritos' Dale Scott in open competition in 1972.

COACHES HONORED



BOB FRALEY CENTRAL SECTION Lemoore High School

After 18 years of coaching at the high school level, one of the C.I.F. Central Section's most successful coaches, Bob Fraley has moved on to the college level at his alma mater, Fresno State this year. In 15 previous years at Lemoore High School, Fraley's track teams have lost a total of two dual meets. He has coached teams that have won 12 league championships and one of his teams won the West Coast Relays. In addition to his service and dedication as a coach, Fraley has served high school track and field as Central Section Track Advisory Committee Chairman for many years. Although high school athletics will not have Bob Fraley as one of their coaches anymore, he surely won't be apart from the sport he so loves.



BEVERLY MARTIN CENTRAL SECTION South High School

Beverly Martin, a native of the Bakersfield area has stayed in her backyard to become one of the finest girls' track coaches in the Central Section, and in the State of California. Martin has been the head girls' track coach ever since the sport officially was recognized by the Kern High School District in 1974. Her teams have compiled an impressive 26-7 record in dual meets, and Martin has coached 17 state qualifiers during that time. A graduate of the University of Oregon (History/Philosophy) she is presently working on her Masters during the summer at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo (Guidance and Counseling).



JERRA ROWLAND CENTRAL COAST SECTION

Lynbrook High School

Having coached track at Lynbrook High School for 10 years, Jerra Rowland has sent at least two athletes every year to the C.I.F. State Track Meet. After being the four-time defending DeAnza Athletic League Champions, Lynbrook's athletes have placed in the Central Coast Section finals eight of the ten years Coach Rowland has been coach. Under her direction, Lynbrook has established a record of 63-13.



ROBERT WECKERLE NORTHERN SECTION Trinity High School

Robert Weckerle has coached track and field for 19 years with the last 15 being at Trinity High School. Although a small school (350 students) Trinity won the Shasta Cascade League Championship eight out of ten years they were members of the league. Coach Weckerle has served for several years on the Northern Section C.I.F. Track Committee and was instrumental in bringing about the Northern Section C.I.F. Small Schools Track Meet.



WALTER OPP SOUTHERN SECTION Muir High School

This year marks the 35th year that Walter Opp has coached track and field. The Muir High School Mentor has won 321 times in his coaching career and has only tasted 18 losses. His 95% winning record is one of the best marks in the Southern Section, State, and even in the Nation. Coach Opp's teams have won two state championships, seven C.I.F. championships, and have finished as the runner-ups on five occasions in the section and four in the state. 1977's "California Coach of the Year" has also won 19 league championships.



STEVE SPRAKER SOUTHERN SECTION Saugus High School

Steve Spraker has been Saugus High School's head cross country and track coach since the school's opening in 1975, and his girl's cross country team has never failed to finish in the C.I.F.'s top 10 during that time. Under Coach Spraker, Saugus has compiled a record of 44-2 and has won four consecutive League Championships in Cross Country including C.I.F. (3A-Southern Section) Championships in 1978 and 1979. Coach Spraker's track program is equally successful as its record is 53-1 and has also won four straight league championships as well as winning its last 40 dual track meets. Steve Spraker, besides coaching is a member of the C.I.F. Southern Section Cross Country Advisory Committee.



JOHN TRIOLO NORTHERN SECTION Durham High School

Born and raised in Northern California, John Triolo has been active in athletics since grade school. In 1971 he began his teaching and coaching at Durham High School as head football and track coach. Durham High School is located in the small farming community of Durham and has an enrollment of 260. Coach Triolo's boys' track teams have captured league championships in 1971, 1972, 1973, 1976, 1977, and the Northern Section's Small School crowns in 1971 and 1976. Since Coach Triolo took over the girls' track program in 1977 they have yet to lose a league championship. In 1978 and 1979 his girls' teams captured the Northern Section Small School crown. In 1972 Coach Triolo became a member of the Northern Section Track Committee and served as its President from 1976-78.



ERNIE MCNEALY SAN FRANCISCO SECTION

Mission High School

Ernie McNealy was a football and basketball star in high school but would later make a name for himself in coaching track and field at Mission High School for the past 18 years. Coach McNealy has coached many outstanding performers during his career, but this year he has a junior (Ken Frazier) who has two national records. Coach McNealy's 1963 team won San Francisco's 3A Championship.



DONALD DOOLEY CENTRAL COAST SECTION

San Mateo High School

Donald Dooley has been involved with high school athletics at San Mateo High School for the past 17 years as a cross country and track coach. Coach Dooley's teams have won numerous league championships and have done well in both regional and state competitions. Coach Dooley, a Wisconsin native, and former high school and college track star is involved in many committees at the Central Coast Section

COACHES HONORED



DENNIS McCLANAHAN SAN DIEGO SECTION Mount Carmel High School

Although he has been in the coaching game relatively few years, Dennis McClanahan has distinguished himself as a highly successful coach at Mount Carmel High School. In five years of competition, his girls' cross country team has won three San Diego Section Championships and his track and field record shows 52 wins and only 17 losses along with four league titles. Coach McClanahan has served on the San Diego Section Track and Field Advisory Committee for three years and is currently the Meet Director for the Jack-In-The-Box/Indoor Track and Field Invitational.



HANK WELCH SAC-JOAQUIN SECTION Tracy High School

Hank Welch began his coaching at Tracy High School in 1956 after serving in the Army in Korea, and has gained the respect of SacJoaquin Section coaches through his skillful coaching, positive influence on athletes and coworkers, and his dedication to the sport of track and field. Coach Welch like so many of California's track coaches has gone beyond his high school commitments by staging track clinics for elementary school youths, directing a "Junior Olympic" type meet for 22 consecutive years, and has directed as well as assisted in all-comers and invitational meets.



BOB BUUM NORTH COAST SECTION Irvington High School

Bob Buum, a 26-year veteran of coaching track and field has only lost one dual meet during the past five years during which his Irvington Team has won five straight league championships. The Meet Director for the North Coast Section's 4A Championships has served as Head Coach at Irvington High School for the past 19 years. Coach Buum has coached numerous State Qualifiers during his long and successful coaching career.



PENNY DEZEN LOS ANGELES CITY SECTION Jordan High School

Penny Dezen has been coaching the track team at Jordan High School for the past five years and in 1978 her girls' 440 relay team won the State Championship. Coach Dezen's track team was the league champion in 1980 and has never finished lower than second in league competition. Coach Dezen has been Assistant Athletic Director at Jordan for five years and this year she coached both the boys' and girls' cross country teams. Coach Meyers has sent eight athletes to the State Track Meet in eight different events. Coach Meyers track and cross country teams have won numerous league, sun-section and invitational titles. Coach Meyers has also hosted five league championship meets and one sub-section meet.





PETE NELSON LOS ANGELES SECTION Kennedy High School

For the past 18 years Pete Nelson has coached successful teams in the Los Angeles City Section. At Palisades High School his Varsity Swimming Team went undefeated in dual meets for seven years, compiling a 42-0, and his Varsity Cross Country teams at Palisades and for the past 10 years at Kennedy High School have compiled a dual meet record of 105-36. Coach Nelson's track teams at Kennedy High School have won three League Championships in the past five years. 
