

Macdonald captures 13-mile run at Stanford

Duncan Macdonald, a 33-year-old surgeon at Stanford Medical Center and a former U. S. Olympian, won a 13-mile YMCA-sponsored run Sunday at Stanford in a 1:04.31.

Macdonald finished almost three minutes ahead of Menlo Park's Brock Hinzman (1:07.26).

Rain and muddy footing hampered times for the field of runners.

Robert Thomas of Redwood City finished third in 1:10.02. Dan Anderson of Castro Valley placed fourth in 1:10.31 with Gerardo Canchola of San Francisco fifth in 1:10.52.

The first woman finisher was San Jose's Juana Stavalone, who was clocked in 1:21.23 and finished 36th overall. Karen Scanell won the women's 40-49 division in 1:22.46.
