League Fares Well At Region IV Meet

GILROY — Led by Soquel Knight Helen Muth and San Lorezno Valley Cougar Jackie Hale, the Santa Cruz Coast Athletic League fared well at the Region IV Track and Field Championships Friday night at Gilroy High.

Muth captured both the mile and two-mile events in 5:24.0 and 11:33.9, respectively, while Hale won the long jump and placed second in the shot put and discus to lead the SCCAL girls' varsity contingent at the meet.

Seaside crushed runnerup Gilroy in the boys' varsity team scoring, 111-47, while also outdistancing second-place King City in the girls' varsity competition, 94-68. Aptos and Soquel tied for fifth place in the boys' team standings, while SLV, Soquel and Santa Cruz finished fifth, sixth and seventh, respectively, in the girls'.

The top three finishers in all individual and relay events automatically qualify for the Central Coast Section meet Friday night at San Jose City College.

Hale won the long jump on her last leap of the event in a personal best 16-4. She threw the shot put 36-11 and the discus 114-8. She nearly qualified for the CCS meet in a fourth event, the triple jump, but did not do as well as expected and faded to fifth place with a best of 33-2.

"She was just awesome," said SLV Coach Marty Kruger of Hale, who provided the Cougars with all of their 28 team points. "She was amazing."

Harbor's Tricia Ray was the only other SCCAL girl to win an event, running a school-record 47.5 in the 300-meter low hurdles.

Soquel nearly swept the boys' varsity mile with Pete Clemens winning and teammate Lance Dustin finishing third. The only other boys' winners were John Kaits of Aptos in the discus with a personal-best toss of 159-3, and Soquel's John Geringer with a personal-best 52-8.

One of the best races for local runners came in the boys' two mile, where SLV's Mike Rome ran a final lap of 64.8 to finish second in front of third-place Chris Santos of Harbor, who had edged him in the SCCAL meet one week ago.

"It was the race of the night," said Kruger. "He (Rome) was in fourth place 150 yards behind on the last lap. I thought he was out of it. He ran an outrageous race and his eyes just kept getting bigger and bigger as he passed each runner."

Rome finished in a school-record 9:48.9, while Santos was clocked in 9:49.0.

Suffering from a foot injury, SLV's Jay

Avenmarg did not run in the mile, but that didn't stop him from finishing second in the 800-meters in a school record-tying 1:56.2.

Bill Shirley of Aptos placed second in the 400-meters in a personal best 49.5, while the Mariners mile relay team of Tony Terzic, David Hill, Jim Schindler and Shirley also qualified for the CCS with a third-place finish (3:24.0). Shirley ran a 48.9 anchor leg in the relay.

Gina Starr of Marelo Prep qualified for CCS in the girls' 300 low hurdles with a third-place time of 48.9, while teammate Joan Scibetta was third in the shot put with a toss of 35-1½.

Harbor's Molly Myall qualified in the high jump with a leap of 5-3 to place second. The effort was three inches better than her previous best.

Aptos' Karen Cantoni was second in the 800-meters with a personal best of 2:22.0.

Other top league finishers who did not qualify for the CCS were: Teresa Bargetto with a fifth in the girls' mile; Santa Cruz' Lisa DeLucchi with fourths in the girls' 100 and 200-meter dashes; SLV's Kathy McNab with a seventh in the girls' 800-meters; Harbor's Falene Andrus with a seventh in the girls' long jump, Michelle Haberman with an eighth in the girls' 100-meters, Elsa Schwaizer with an eighth in the girls' two-mile, and the seventh-place Pirates girls' mile relay team of Anne LeBourveau, Lisa Bartle, Kay Wolverton and Tricia Ray; SLV's Scott Porter with a sixth in the boys' 800-meters; and Santa Cruz' Wit Woliscko with a fifth in the boys' high hurdles.
