California Southern Section State Qualifier--May 27, Cerritos

It's only a qualifying meet. All you are trying to do is finish in the top five. Don't tell that to Gervaise McGraw (Ganesha/Pomona) who won both sprints in 11.61 and 23.54. Of course she had to move. Lisa Winston (Jordan/Long Beach 11.69 and 24.32), Zelda Johnson (Garey/Pomona 11.69 and 24.03), and Kim Grant (Hawthorne 11.96 and 24.77) didn't really let her coast. Don't tell Gayle Kellon (Walnut) or Natalie Kaaiawahia (Fullerton) either. Their 41.74 hurdles and 52'2-1/4" shot efforts were second only to their own national records. And don't tell Lori Lopez (Sacred Heart/ Los Angeles) who ran 10:38.96 and did not qualify for state. That was sixth behind Vickie Cook (Alemany/ Mission Hills 10:13.19), Denise Ball (Newbury Park 10:15.99), Tanya Fischer (Chaminade/ Canoga Park 10:24.39), Shannon Stryker (Tustin 10:32.77), and Teresa Barrios (University/ Irvine 10:33.12). Polly Plumer (University/Irvine) won the 1600 the hard way, running 2:30 for the first 800 and 2:15 the last 800 for an official 4:45.81. Heptathlete Sharon Hatfield (Fountain Valley) qualified for the state meet in four events.

Los Angeles City Championships--May 28, East Los Angeles College

Denean Howard (Kennedy/ Granada Hills) lost her bid for a triple to Latanya Dawkins (Dorsey) who nipped her in the 100, 11.68 to 11.70, but the Cougar sprinter claimed the 200/400 double in 23.25/53.50 all in the space of about a hour. Dawkins, meanwhile, anchored Dorsey's 400 relay to the second fastest clocking ever (a hand-timed 45.5) and ran a 23.81 second place in the 200. The marks are more remarkable since ELAC's dirt track is not considered particularly fast. Neither discus nor triple jump were scored here, but were simply state qualifying events. Sonia Yanez (Garfield) took advantage of having thrown before to win the discus by 27' at 139'7" to complete a weight double (43'4-1/2").

State shot runnerup Ramona Faleto is headed for Redlands, and discus second placer Joan Gago will stay home at U. of H. Punahou's Kimber Pennington and Heidi Friese are UCLA bound....Lost in the recognition of Kym Carter as a high jumper is the fact that she also makes the national list in the shot with over 42'....Andrea Kriva, discus/shot thrower and winner of the Mt. SAC high school heptathlon, will attend UCLA, but will play tennis, not run track.
