The Meet, the massive Southern Section All-Division Meet, Saturday, May 21st, at Cer-ritos College. With the best nine in each of four school-size divisions competing for individual and team honors a number of state and nation's finest were in attendance. There is a frustrating tantilization to this meet, where many athletes are separated by division from what could be just super competitions, it is kind of neat in a way, because even after eight hours of track you look forward to the next couple of weeks when everyone will come together in the Southern California Regional and State Meets. Four races in each of the Male and Female Track events are run (hopefully you are a 3200m fan as you sit through eight of them) and all thirty-six field event performers compete in an event at the same time. It is kind of wild and crazy with six hour vault competitions, and all, but it somehow all comes off. The top eight marks from an

event will qualify for the Southern California Regional, hosted on this same Cerritos facility by the L.A. City Section the next weekend. Some interesting situations take place with this top eight going on by marks, regardless of division. For instance, a distance runner in the Small Schools IA division may be short on competition, and have to forgo a pace that is

petition, and have to forgo a pace that is very difficult in a solo manner.

Natalle Kasiawahia (Fullerton HS) is back on top of her Shot Putting after two years of marks in the 50-52 foot range.

After edging her own National Record out by an inch to 52-51/2 last week in the Pepsi Meet at UCLA as an unattached competitor, Natalle exploded here to a 53-71/4 effort. It was a good end in Sectional competition for perhaps the most dominating athlete in any event at the Prep level in area history. Against high-school competition it is tough to see how Natalie gets up for things, as she won

here by ten feet.

Hawthorne continued its area domination, moving out to 3A divisional team titles in a handy manner in both the Men's and Women's divisions. Symbolizing the Cougar domination was their relay efforts, the fastest in the Section over both the 400m and 1600m distances in the Men's and Women's races. Early in the afternoon soph Henry Thomas an-chored the Men's short group to a CIF-SS best ever 40-89 win. The winds, which are usually of an alding, but just legal nature here on this north-south facility, were erratic today, most often into the face of sprinters and hurdlers on the east straight-away. 100 Meter, 200 Meter, Men's Highs and Women's 100m Lows athletes usually go crazy with the favorable conditions, but things were inconsistent this day.
