



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SoCal Diary

☐ May 9

In the prep competition, the Southern Section schools were holding their league finals, while the City Section was holding their quarter-finals. All potential state meet qualifiers appeared to make it through ok.

The community colleges had the SoCal qualifying meet at Mt. SAC with all potential state meet qualifiers advancing safely. Long Beach City gave notice it was ready for the big meets with a sizzling 39.92 in the men's 400 meter relay.

There wasn't too much cooking on the 4-year scene other than the SoCal women's Invitational at Irvine where CSLA and UCLA warmed up for the nationals with relay times of 44.1 and 3:35.7 respectively.

The track season at all levels began winding down toward completion as the weather, which has kept marks down all season, has finally changed and records are now being challenged. Both the LA City and Southern CIF Sections continued their qualifying rounds with all favorites advanc-Ing except San Fernando High's Ronnie Harris, the favorite in the LA City highs who DNQed in his specialty.

In the SoCal community college champlonships—first in the men's divi-sion—Long Beach CC continued its dominance of this meet for the 5th straight time with an overpowering 112-64-56 victory over conference foes Pasadena and El Camino. While there were a number of good marks in this meet, I don't think anyone expected the times which were posted in the 1500, where the first 6 finishers, lead by Moorpark's Steve Fairman's 3:45.6, virtually destroyed their PR's. Steve, who looked totally out of shape when I saw him last year, has now even progressed past the point he was at in high school a few years back when he was one of the CIF's most feared milers.

In the women's division, Mt. SAC, thanks to its SoCal Cheetah connection, was able to power its way past Mira Costa and Cerritos 63-46-44. Between them, Cheetahs Gervalse McCraw and Zelda Johnson accounted for 58 of the Mountles points, not to mention 3 meet and two national records. The performance of these young ladies makes a strong statement for the girls age group program in SoCal in which clubs like the Cheetahs and Fred Jones' LA Mercurettes have played such a strong part. Both Gervaise and Zelda, as well as Walnut's Gayle Kellon, have been participating in this program since grammer school.

In the PCAA Meet, Fresno State, even with superstar Matt Mileham redshirting, gave a display of tremendous overall strength in achieving a surprisingly easy 185-157-119 win over UC Irvine and San Jose

State which tied with Cal State Long Beach.

In the CCAA men's competition, there was a question among track fans as to what would life be up at CPSLO after Steve Miller. Well, the Mustangs answered that question with a resounding "great" as they ran away from CSLA, CS Northridge, and CS Bakersfield by a 244-129-116-67 margin. While their distance program may not be as strong as it once was, SLO more than made up for it with 1-2-3 finishes in the high hurdles, high jump, and vault.

In the CCAA women's competition, it was business as usual as CPSLO ran away from CS Northridge and CS Bakersfield

255-118-87.

In the big invitational-first up at Modesto-Carl Lewis came within .01 of the world record in the 100 with a 9.96 clocking. Cowling had a 13.44 high hurdle time which ranks him with the best in the world this year. The weightmen were in exceptionally good form lead by Fresno State's Matt Mileham who popped a 240-4 hammer throw, Mac Wilkins 230-10 in the discus and

Kevin Atkins 70-103/4 in the shot.

Down at the UCLA/Pepsi Invitational, the big news, of course, was Tom Petranoff's incredible world record javelin throw of 327-2. I say incredible because the throw had such a low trajectory, I never thought it could carry that far. It was a technique quite a bit different than that used by Mark Murro who used to throw those high floaters. Based on Tom's performance, his coach Bill Webb must now be considered among the best, if not the best, javelin coach in the world. Not only is Bill coaching Tom, but while at So. Illinois, he coached Bob Roggy. This gives him the world's number 1 and 3 throwers. In addition Bill's own Paul Kulack set a CCAA record this year with a 257-9 heave. Other outstanding marks were Steve Scotts 3:53.1 mile, Greg Foster's tremendous 13,11 high hurdles run into the wind, and Eric Reynold's 8:09 3000 meters, which moves him into second place on the all-time HS list. Elsewhere in the field were Earl Bell's 18-51/4 pole vault and Carl Lewis' 28-1 long jump. On the distaff side Robin Campbell's 1:59.7 800 meters and a 4:21.6 mile by an ailing Mary Decker highlighted the days action.

☐ May 23

It was championship time for the CIF's Southern and LA City sections. In the city meet Antonio Manning was the whole show as he won both sprints and anchored the 400 relay team to a winning time of 41.34 for a winning total of 30 points which was 4 ahead of cross country champ Belmont. In the girl's division Kennedy scored in 10 events to defeat favored Crenshaw and super-soph Choo-Choo Knighten 79-58.

In the Southern section, boys teams from Compton, Hawthorne, Cabrillo, and Perris were divisional winners, while girls teams from Millikan, Hawthorne, Ganesha, and Louisville were victorious in their divisions. Most spectacular performance of the day belonged to none other than Hawthorne's super soph Henry Thomas who won both sprints and anchored both Hawthorne relay teams to division record-setting times of 40.89 and 3:13.8.

Another person who emerged from the CIF meets as a real superstar, was L.A. Times high school track editor Chris Baker. Chris, who is just about the best when it comes to predicting winners in CIF meets, really outdid himself this time. Not only did he predict the winners of the boys City Section and Southern 4A Section, but in both instances he predicted the correct point total for the winners with Hamilton at 30

and Compton at 42.

In the community college state meet, it was business as usual in the mens division as Long Beach City rolled to its 5th straight title with an overwhelming 93-44-42 win over San Jose City and Taft. Taft is a newcomer to that elite group of state meet track contenders and showed a lot of power in winning the 400 relay over LBCC in 40.0. This may have been what Taft coach Doug Wells was talking about when he said that when the school upped his scholarship allotment to a full 14, he would be able to compete with Ron Allice. However, if Doug wants to stay competitive then he better start doing some additional recruiting as I understand that two members of his 400 relay team have already defected down to Pasadena CC.

In the women's division, Mt. SAC repeated their SoCal performance which was good for a 62-55 win over hos Modesto. Again, the Mountles were lead by the 1-2 punch of Zelda Johnson and Ger

valse McCraw.

In the PAC-10, Washington State, with ar awesome display of distance power, notch ed its first conference championship evewith a convincing 132-87 victory over UCLA and Arizona State. The Bruins had too man weak events to repeat their performance of last year. All together, UCLA was shut ou in 8 events. However, the big story was the WSU distance runners. As one reader notic ed, I picked WSU for no better than 5th I my pre-season predictions. The reason to this was primarily based on x-countr results where WSU was beaten by UCLA Oregon, and Arizona in PAC-10 track in th 3k, 5k and 10k events. These same WS runners outscored the same 3 school 58-10, 58-8 and 58-1. This just goes to sho you that x-country is not always a reliable source for track predictions.

A lot of people have been disappointe with the new all-weather running track o at Cal State LA and after my first look at during the LA City Quarter-Finals, I mu agree the facility has problems. For on 'the finish line is on the side of the train

While no one except the Section administrators seem to favor the one-day concept, it was still one heck of a track meet!

One of the big North-South battles featured two sophs. Quick-starting Steve Jones (Burbank, Sacramento) of the North against strong finishing Henry Thomas (Hawthorne). Jones was in Lane 6 and Thomas in Lane 4. The script was as expected for the first half of the race, with Thomas giving up a couple of meters before his shift into overdrive. The only problem was that the gutty Jones, with

his upright running style, would not be passed and the Sacramentoan held off his rival 10.64-10.66. The first six athletes in this race are all underclassmen, so look for more fireworks in 1984.

Another classic North-South duel between Kimmie James (Richmond) and Tyrone McCullouch (LB Poly). Tyrone likes to lead, and he took the pack out through a 24.5 200 meter split. The tempo eased as Alfred Burkes (Mt. Eden, Hayward) edged ahead of the massed pack at 53.7 for 400 meters. McCullouch and James moved past down the backstretch, and the Poly star was the leader through 600 meters at 1:21.9. Kimmle finally edged ahead during a furious homestretch battle, with the ultimate outcome in doubt until the final 20-30 meters despite the 1:50.63-1:51.16 times for the first two. James' mark is the nation's third best for 1983.

Yreka's Jim Frey, the Northern champion at a:11.59 had ventured South twice in 1983 to seek competition and escape a frigid winter and spring. Jim was soundly trounced at Sunkist (4:25.8y) and was third at Arcadia (4:12.43). The 6'4" Frey towers over his competition, which is what his running also did here, as the poor spring weather probably forced him into a perfectly timed peak. Running tactically a perfect race, Jim eased in behind Jason Flamm (La Sierra, Carmiohael) at

The key to running the finish out of the highly touted Southern kickers was a third 400 meter segment of 61.9 seconds as Frey jumped into the lead in the middle of the homestretch before the gun was fired to signal the final go-round. A 59.5 final 400 by Frey (2:01.4 last 800) sent him on to a 4:08.82 win ahead of a threesome packed between 4:10.89 and 4:12.29.

Eric Reynolds (Camarillo), the nation's best prep long distance runner, rolls along with such ease and so totality dominates his competition that he falls into one of the strange traps of our sport. Each week he takes on the best a region can toss at him, then casually destroys them. To the average fan it appears a real yawner of a competition, and there is not really the sense of appreciation the Ventura County star deserves. Again going with his constantly accelerating tactic, Eric had Grant Foster (Monte Vista, Cupertino) as his closest company through 69.7-2:20.0 (70.3)-3:26.7 (66.7)-4:32.9 (66.2) splits. Foster proved mortal after that point, and gradually fell back to the second group, while Reynolds pulled away through 65.0-65.4-65.3-66.2 400 meter splits on the way to his 8:54.75 victory. California tacked its large number of super times over the 3200 distance this year partially because of this mid-4:30's first 1600, then build-it-on-in tactic, as there are not many preps with the strength to run 68-69's through four laps, then drop to 66-87's for the next half of the race. Rene Perez (Woodland) finished off a fine season with a 9:04.66 for second.

Danny Harris (Perris) was the Southern's best at just over that prep time barrier of excellence. Mark Boyd (St. Mary's, Berkeley) finished off a fine prep career (which included three trips to state in this event) with a domination of the race over the last four hurdles. After a fairly even start with his Northern compatriots and Harris, Mark steadily edged away at the end to a fine 13.93 against a 1.9 meter per second breeze.

Guess what, another classic North-South confrontation. Erik Montgomery (Independence, San Jose) had taken down the national record with a converted 35.66 from yards at San Jose CC during the qualifying process to get here. From the South came Danny Harris (Perris), undefeated, and with probably more 36.0-36.5 clockings in the event than anyone in history. Montgomery came out smoking after a pep talk from quarter mille great, Lee Evans, and Harris was as far down as he had ever been in the hurdles that make up the backstretch. Around the turn the Perris star, who seems to have a body and stride length made for this event, edged up to Montgomery, and on the homestretch pulled away to a win. The time, a pleasant national record 35.52, destroying by far anything run over the route, and putting a fitting California end to the event, as we will go to the 300 meter intermediates in 1984. For real stat freaks, as we send the event to the grave, here are Harris' touch down spilts over the barriers—5.6 - 3.6 - 3.8 - 3.9 - 4.1 - 4.2 - 4.2 - 4.5 - 1.2 (to finish). Montgomery was second in a fine 36.13, and Mark Boyd (St. Mary's) got up to third in a lifetime heet of 38-14.

Maurice Crumby (Balboa, San Francisco) had set a national record at 7-4½ earlier in the season, but had been bothered by an Achilles tendon injury of late. A fine group of jumpers from around the state would challenge the mild-mannered Bay Area star. Four jumpers were over 6-10 during the competition (Kenny Burke, Doug Dreibelbis, Sean Chambers, and Ted Gladtke), with Maurice passing at 8-9, 6-10 and 6-11. Things got interesting when Maurice missed twice at 7-0. A third miss would put Grumby back to 6th place in the field, mildly spoiling his strategy. But as a true champion, the Balboa star cleared on his third attempt by a good three inches, and he was back in the hunt. Meanwhile, Burke was the only one to get past 6-10, as he cleared 7-0 (after passing 6-11), then as he cleared 7-0 (after passing 6-11), then sailed over 7-1, marking him as among the nation's best ever sophs. Crumby played tactics a bit again at 7-1, passing. Again strategy worked as Crumby sailed over 7-2 on his second attempt, while Burke 7-2 on his second attempt, which could not negotiate that height. "It didn't really feel all that fast, but I can't say I'm not proud," Harris said.
"When you get to this level of competition,

everything feels like it's the same, but actually you're moving faster."

Erik Montgomery of San Jose's Independence High had a slight lead over the first five hurdles, the first time Harris has been challenged this year and the only time he has trailed in any race this season. But Harris caught Montgomery just before the last turn and cruised home in first place. Montgomery finished second in 36.13. The old national record of 35.79 was set by Walter Murray of Berkeley High at

the 1981 state meet at Cerritos College.

"Montgomery really pushed me," Harris said. "I guess the first five or six hurdles he was really pulling me."

This is the last time the 300-meter low hurdles will be run at the state meet. Next year they'll run the 300-meter intermediate hurdles, moving into line with the rest of the nation. California is one of the few states which still runs the 300-meter low hurdles.

Kaaiawahia Puts a Fitting Finish to Prep Career

BAKERSFIELD-Natalie Kaajawahia of Fullerton High won two more State championships Saturday to cap a brilliant high school track career, then said she is

cap a difficult high school track career, then said she is looking forward to the challenge of college.
"I think I proved myself to everybody in California how good I am," Kaawiawahia said. "I feel pretty proud."

Kaawiawahia, bound for Arizona State in the fall, won the shotput for the fourth time with a put of 52-7½ and won the discus for the second time with a throw of

Only Clarence (Bud) Houser of Oxnard High, a three-time Olympic champion who won the shotput and discus in 1920-22, took as many individual State championships as Kaawiawahia.

No one had ever earned four State titles in the same

But Kaawiawahia, who has not lost a high school shotput competition since 1980—when she burst upon the scene to upset defending champion Susie Ray of Villa Park for her first State title—had little trouble adding her name to the record book.

She won both events on her first attempt, then put

further distance between herself and her competition on ensuing throws. She put the shot more than 52 feet four times. Pam Alexander of Arlington High in Riverside finished second at 45-21/2.

She said she was nervous on her first attempt in the scus—she fouled three times last year in the Southern Section qualifying meet and did not get a chance to defend the title she won as a sophomore—but her throw of 162-1 would have been good enough for her to win by

Although neither of her marks were State records Kaawiawahia said she was not disappointed. She has broken the national shotput record four times in her career, most recently at the CIF Southern Section divisional meet two weeks ago with a put of 53-7%. She also has a national best this year in the discus with a sonal best of 174-9.

Her biggest challenge this season may have been keeping herself interested. She did that, she said, by lifting weights more seriously in preparation for next year. She can bench press 205 pounds, more than "most

of the boys" at Fullerton.

Of her performance in the discus, Kaaiawahia said, "I think I could have done better. I need a little work on my ending rotation. I'm a little selfconscious about my spin at the end. But I'm just glad that I won."

Of the shotput, she said, "I'm not disappointed. I don't think anybody has thrown over 52 feet four times."

After her first put (52-1½), Kaaiawahia was announced over the public address system as the winner. That didn't seem to faze her, however. Her next two puts were 52-5¾ and her winning 52-7½.

"I felt real proud after my first three throws," she

said. After two subpar (for her) puts, she finished up with a 52-6½. "I was pumped up because it was the last throw of my high school career," she said.

Not that she's finished

She hopes to make the Olympic team next yearof 55-1½ would qualify her for the trials—but says a more realistic goal is the 1988 Games.

Kaaiawahia, who ranks fifth among the nation's women shotputters, said she is looking forward to

"I think I've set a pretty high standard, especially for women athletes," Kaaiawahia said. "I'm happy with the way I ended my high school career."

Kaaiawahia may be a veteran of State competition, but this was a whole new experience for Cory Schuber of Del Mar High in San Jose.
