

Stanford women poised for track title repeat — SJS men lead PCAA

The Stanford University women's track and field team is right on schedule to win its second straight Western Collegiate Athletic Association title.

The Cardinal put itself in that position after winning two of five finals and scoring 51 points in Friday's opening day at Stanford Stadium.

Arizona State is second with 45 points, followed by Arizona (25), Southern Cal (16), San Diego State (14) and UCLA (four).

Stanford took the lead right after the first event, the shot put, when senior Carol Cady threw a school-record 56-10 $\frac{3}{4}$ on her final throw to upset favored Ramona Pagel of San Diego State.

"I was real happy with that," Cady said, who is coming off a light week of weight-lifting and expected a good throw. She even expected to come through on her last throw because "that's the way we train in practice."

Practice certainly paid off as Cady's mark, an improvement upon her previous best of 56-6 $\frac{1}{2}$, moved her into the No. 4 position on the U.S. women's all-time list. Cady ranks second to Pagel (58-3 $\frac{3}{4}$) on this year's college list.

Stanford received an additional four points in the shot put when Pam Dukes improved her personal best to 51-7.

Senior Mary Osborne added to the total a few minutes later by finishing second in the javelin at 167-7.

Stanford, which figured to score heavily in the 3,000 meters, didn't disappoint. Sophomore Alison Wiley led a

one-two-three Stanford finish by winning in 9:13.4. Senior PattiSue Plumer was second in 9:17.9 and freshman Cory Schubert was third in a season-best 9:21.9. Stanford junior Ceci Hopp added a sixth place as the Cardinal scored 25 points in the race.

Michelle Mason added a fourth in the 10,000 meters for Stanford's final points.

Today's schedule begins at 9 a.m. with the final three heptathlon events.

In Fresno, San Jose State holds a 24-point lead over host Fresno State and UC Irvine after the first day of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association track and field championships.

San Jose scored 60 points Friday as Felix Bohni won his fourth straight pole vault title (17-4), Dan Katches won the discus with a personal-record 182-7 and freshman Larry Weldon did likewise in the triple jump (52-3).

Fresno State's Matt Mileham of London broke the collegiate and British Commonwealth hammer-throw record with a toss of 252-8.

In women's golf, Stanford and San Jose State are among 17 teams selected Friday by the NCAA Women's Golf Committee to compete in the 1984 NCAA Championship, May 23-26 at Innisbrook Resort and Golf Club in Tarpon Springs, Fla.
