Woodside star sets national best in girls' triple jump

State records won't be enough to satisfy Woodside High School track star Wendy Brown this year.

Unless the she sets a national high school record or two before graduation, Brown will be disappointed in her final season at Woodside.

Although Brown entered this season as the two-time defending state champion in the triple jump (she also won the state long jump title in 1982), she probably enjoyed her most impressive outing yet in Woodside's 81-46 Peninsula Athletic League victory over visiting Burlingame Thursday.

The 5-foot-11 Brown demonstrated Thursday that her goals for national records are realistic as she leaped 41 feet, five inches in the triple jump.

Brown's 41-5 is the best girls' mark ever recorded in the nation, although most publications will not officially recognize it as such because Thursday was a windy day and no wind gauge was being utilized at Woodside.

What stands as a tribute to Brown's outstanding athletic ability, though, is that her triple jump may not have been her most

impressive effort Thursday (she triplejumped 40-3 to win the state title last

Brown's most surprising mark of the day came in the high jump where she set a Central Coast Section record by clearing 6-1 three inches higher than the previous CCS record of 5-10, set in 1975 by Pam Blackburn of defunct Cubberley.

The official national high school record in the girls' triple jump is 41-01/2, set last vear by Meledy Smith of Sterling High in Houston. Smith now is a freshman at the University of Washington.

"I'm going for national records in the long jump and the triple jump this year," Brown said. "This is my senior year, and I

want to go out in style."

Brown was not entirely pleased with her showing in last year's state meet in Bakers-

"When I was a sophomore I thought nothing of winning in the state meet," Brown said. "It was hard to get excited going back as a junior. I slacked off, and I realized it.

"But this year I'm working harder than ever before. I want to jump 43 feet in the triple jump and 22 feet in the long jump by the end of this year."

The national long jump record may be Brown's toughest goal. She will have to

Depth wins a PAL title for Carlmont spikes

MENLO PARK — What really decides an important track meet is how many seconds and thirds a team gets — not how many first-place finishes, or how many meet records are set.

So when Carlmont High got many second-place finishes than host Menlo-Atherton Thursday, the Scots not only ended MA's 21 consecutive dual meet winning streak but got the Peninsula Athletic League dual meet championship, too.

The meet came down to the mile relay. An MA triumph would tie the affair at 68. But Carlmont's Mike Morgan turned in an outstanding anchor leg, and his team won 73-63.

Morgan trailed the Bears' runner by as much as 15 yards when the final lap started. When it came down to the last 50 yards, Morgan had not only caught the man but had started to pass him.

"We've won several pressure meets this year. Several times it has come down to the mile relay," Carlmont Coach Keith Harding said. "The kids have risen to the occasion. I let the kids know where they stood. I knew we would win it if it came down to the mile relay."

Of the 16 events, each team won eight, but Carlmont had nine seconds to MA's five, and that made the difference in the points.

"They came through and we didn't," MA veteran Coach Plato Yanicks said. "They kept creeping up on us with the seconds and thirds."

Carlmont's Mike Montazer was the key performer, in Yanicks' opinion. The Scot won the mile and the two mile, and got a second in the 880.

"He was the key to the whole meet," Yanicks said. "Chris Bartow went out with an injury a month ago. That let Montazer run wild. He just killed us."

Harding said Montazer typified the team's spirit. He usually runs only two events but added a third so the team would be able to score more.

"There was a lot of team cooperadion," Harding said. "The kids got in events they haven't run all year, or don't like to run. They did it for the team. That is what did it for us."

If there's a track rivalry on the Peninsula that can match the spirit and emotion of the rivalry between Carlmont and Menlo-Atherton high schools, it has yet to develop.

Carlmont and M-A met for the first time in two years Thursday (last year's dual meet was rained out), and all kinds of emotions resulted as Carlmont's boys won, 73-63, and M-A's girls won, 105-22.

IVI-A nicked at tape for track title

The Peninsula Athletic League track and field championship came down to the final event of the season, the mile relay, in the April 26 dual meet between Carlmont and Menlo-Atherton.

The meet between the two undefeateds had seesawed back and forth all afternoon, with each team winning half the 16 events.

The Bears held a 63-62 lead before the mile. second to last event, but Carlmont took a first and third to go ahead 68-63. At that point, the best M-A could do was a tie for the title by winning the mile relay.

As usual, the girls team had alrady locked up a lopsided victory of 105-22 to complete a perfect season. Winnie Burns of Portola Valley put in her standard afternoon's work by winning the half-mile and 330 low hurdles, while taking third in the 110 high hurdles, for a tally of 11 points.

Just before the gun, Bear football coach and selfappointed cheerleader Ben Parks gathered the troops at the starting line for a rallying chant of "M-A, (followed by two claps) M-A."

This inspired the first M-A runner Bruce Kikunaga to open up a 10-yard lead, with a 440 of 53 seconds flat. The next two legs, Mark Kirschner and Victor Hudson held the lead and Mike King took the baton for the gun lap with a 15 yard head start.

Although King had already won both the 110 and 330 hurdles, he had been ill and the meet was his first day on the track in two weeks. His energy was spent before he took the baton.

To compound the predicament, Carlmont's anchor man, Mike Morgan, is the fastest quarter-miler in the league, and had already won the 220 and 440.

Morgan steadily closed the gap and caught King around the final turn. The tall Carlmont sprinter hit
