# Gunn boys pull off a surprise

## Gokel's 880, Clay's anchor help win sprint-medley relay

Anand Gokel, a senior who runs the middle-distance races for Gunn High School, is not likely to sell himself or his teammates short in the future.

Gokel, along with teammates Kanik Chung, Joe Kung and Haile Clay, clocked 3:36.2 to run off with the boys' sprint-medley relay championship on the opening day of the Stanford Invitational track and field meet Friday at Stanford Stadium.

tion starts this morning at 9 o'clock with heats in the girls' 400-meter relay and competition in the girls' high jump and the boys' long jump and discus. The meet ends at 4:45 with mile-relay finals.

"We were thinking sixth place when the race started," Gokel said. "As the race progressed, I thought third place was possible, but no way did I think we would be first."

And Gokel was talking about just the second heat of the event, the supposed slower section. Berkeley already had won the first section in 3:37.2, and that was supposed to have held up for the victory.

Gokel's leg of 2:00.4 for the opening 880 yards had much to do with Gunn's victory. Chung and Kung held the lead with 22.6 legs, and Haile Clay protected it with a 50.6 anchor for the 440.

"I saw shadows behind me all the way around the track," an ecstatic Clay said of his anchor leg. "I just told myself that my teammates were good enough to put me in front and there was no way I was going to allow anyone to pass me."

Westmont was second behind Gunn in 3:36.6 and also was second overall ahead of first-heat winner Berkeley.

Gunn's victory was the most surprising effort by a Peninsula team, but was not the only one.

Bellarmine, with anchorman Scott Robinson making up a 30-yard deficit, won the boys' two-mile relay with an 8:01.1 clocking. Robinson, a junior, was preceded by senior Mark Callon and sophomores Torre Pena and Ian Champeny.

Reno (Nev.) finished second in 8:03.1.

3,200-meter champion Rebecca Chamberlain of Leigh, who was an easy winner in 10:04.50. McCandless, who ran a strong final 1,500 meters, stopped the watch in 10:22.9. Sabrina Han of Westmoor was third in 10:24.9.

Mary Karen Olson of Palo Alto was second in the first heat of the 400 hurdles, behind Gina Albanese of Branham and ahead of experienced and outstanding competitors Jeanne Patton of Arroyo Grande and Christine Gangnuss of Foothill in Pleasanton. Albanese was the overall winner in 1:04.34, and Olson was fifth overall in 1:06.19.

# Mills' Novitzky makes second 7-foot leap ever by CCS athlete

Jeff Novitzky is more than a Times Tribune All-Peninsula basketball standout.

The slender 6-foot-6 senior from Mills High School high jumped 7-0 Saturday to highlight the high school section of the Stanford Invitational track and field meet at Stanford Stadium. Novitzky's effort matched the mark achieved by Ather Track Club's Ron Kamaka, who won the Open Invitational high jump.

Mills' Buffy Sexton and Mountain View's Shannon Clark were the outstanding athletes from the Peninsula in girls' events. Sexton won the shot put with a toss of 41-1 and was second in the discus at 129-7. Clark won the mile in 5:01.3.

Don Powell of Palo Alto finished second in the boys' 110-meter high hurdles in 14.52.

However, Novitzky's effort was the most noteworthy achievement. He was not surprised he jumped 7-0, but was surprised to hear he is only the second Central Coast Section athlete to surpass the magic barrier. The first CCS athlete to clear 7-0 was Jeff Rogers of Overfelt, who went 7-3 last year.

"I didn't know only one other athlete had gone 7-0 in all these years," Novitzky said. "I had an inkling it was only a matter of time. I was not really surprised it came so

early in the season for me.

"In a meet two weeks ago I cleared the bar set at 7-0 on the standards, but was disappointed when it was remeasured at 6-11 7/8. Maybe it was motivation for today."

Novitzky credits basketball, along with work in the weight room and some running, for his improvement in the high jump.

"No doubt about it, basketball gives me the spring in the legs. Even now, I'll go in the gym and dunk to improve my vertical leap," Novitzky said. "I had set a goal of 6-10 at the start of the season."

Now he knows where he stands, and he is also 90 percent sure he will attend the University of Portland.

"I probably should not say it is for certain, but I'm 90 percent certain I'll be going to college at Portland," said Novitzky, whose grade point average is 3.5. "One reason is they will allow me to high jump after the basketball season."

Sexton didn't mind claiming a jacket she won with her efforts in the shot put, but had hoped to do better in the discus.

"I'm pleased with my shot put results today. I was only seven inches off my personal best (41-8 last

year)," Sexton said. "But I had hoped for 135-0 in the discus.

"I think 45-0 in the shot and 145-0 to 150-0 in the discus are realistic goals for this season. And it would be nice to finish in the first five in the state meet."

One reason she did better in the shot put Saturday may have been the competition. A tough competitor, Sexton knew she was going against CCS season leader Heidi Ruiz of Los Gatos, who has a best of 43-7.
