Tracksters go to NCAA meet

Most were in California, one was in Kansas.

But wherever San Diego State's track and field athletes were competing, it seemed as though Sunday was their day.

Two qualified for the NCAA championships. Two set school records. Three set personal lifetime bests. One recorded a season best. One former Aztec set an American record.

"It was a completely different day than Saturday; I got a sunburn," said SDSU coach Jim Cerveny, referring to the rainstorm that delayed events and hindered performances Saturday in the Mt. San Antonio College Relays in Walnut, Ca.

"It was a knowledgeable crowd that was there, and our people did well. We had two people qualify for nationals."

In Lawrence, Kan., Gaylen Ames' 41-foot-9 1/4-inch triple jump was a personal record, a school record and a qualifying performance for the NCAA Championships.

"She's very strong," Cerveny said. "She's just putting it together. She hasn't practiced (the triple jump) all year, because she's been concentrating on the hurdles."

Meanwhile, at the Mt. SAC, Matt Clayton beat the NCAA qualifying time in the 10,000 meters by three seconds, finishing in 29:14.

"It's a matter of getting in with the right people," Cerveny said. "If you get in with the right people, they'll pull you along."

In the women's shot put, former Aztec Ramona Pagel was in with the right people. Another former Aztec, Bonnie Dasse, pushed Pagel with a put of 62-11 ½, the third-best American effort ever. Pagel responded by improving her American record to 63-6 ¼.

"I probably would have thrown that far without her," Pagel told the San Diego Union. "I know she was throwing like a madman, but I have specific plans and didn't want to change just because she's throwing well. I knew the American record was there because I put no limits on myself."

In the men's 1500, Paul Greer set a school record and just missed qual-

ifying for the NCAAs, finishing sixth with a time of 3:43.87. The NCAA standard is 3:42.20.

"Paul ran a good, competitive race, but he had a mental lapse with about 300 meters to go," Cerveny said. "He should have been outside rather than inside, and people slowed down in front of him."

Another lifetime best came in the 3,000-meter steeplechase, as Ken Flint finished in 9:26.

The season best came in the women's 1500. Jennifer Sheflo ran 4:37, the tenth-best finish in SDSU history. Cynthia Sullivan ran a 4:40.9 in the same heat.

In the women's triple jump at Mt. SAC, Sharie Green finished third with a jump of 39-5. Juan Naranjo ran 31:01 in the men's open 10,000 meters, and Rodney Van didn't make it to the finals of long jump, jumping only 24-3 on a bad foot.

But the most significant race of the day, Cerveny said, was the 10,000-meter race.

"About 15 people qualified for the Olympic trials, and some others, like Matt, qualified for the NCAAs," Cerveny said. "In all, 18 of the world's best marks for 1988 were set at Mt. SAC."

Cerveny said the relays served as a good warmup for the Western Athletic Conference championships next week and the Pacific Coast Athletic Association finals in two weeks.

"It depends on who's healthy," Cerveny said. "If everyone is healthy, we have a chance to be within the top three of the WAC, no problem. The women are a very young team, and they showed quite a few people we were good at Mt. SAC."
