

Quinn means win for St. Francis in likely title meet

Ann Quinn allowed none of the nervousness to show as she helped St. Francis High register a 72-55 win over visiting Los Gatos in what likely determined the De Anza Athletic League girls dual meet track championship.

Quinn won the long jump and triple jump and took a second in the 100-meter low hurdles Thursday in "probably her most important contribution to our program," Lancers coach Steve Filios said.

There were other important contributions, especially by Angie Nurisso, who won the 200 and 400 and ran on both winning relays.

"We come to expect heroics from Angie and she certainly did her part," Filios said. "But we really needed the redhead (Quinn) today. She's a senior and it was nice to see her do so well."

Quinn downplayed her role.

"I was nervous because Los Gatos is an outstanding team and it was an important meet," she said. "I think the whole team was caught up in what the meet meant to our season, and I was just one part of that team."

Still, her second-place finish behind Los Gatos double-winner Heidi Brink in the 100 low hurdles was important. And Quinn led an unexpected sweep with a 33-8¼ triple jump, giving the Lancers

momentum at the right time.

St. Francis led, 58-55, going into the last two events — the mile relay and long jump. Nurisso's stirring anchor leg (1:01.4) of the 1,600 relay brought St. Francis from eight meters back to victory in 4:12.6.

The Lancers still needed at least a third in the long jump, which had not been completed. Quinn came to the rescue again, leading another sweep at 16-¾.

Los Gatos was not without its good performers. Brink won both hurdles races in impressive fashion, and Genevieve Farnady won the 1,600 and 800 before running a strong third leg of the 1,600 relay.

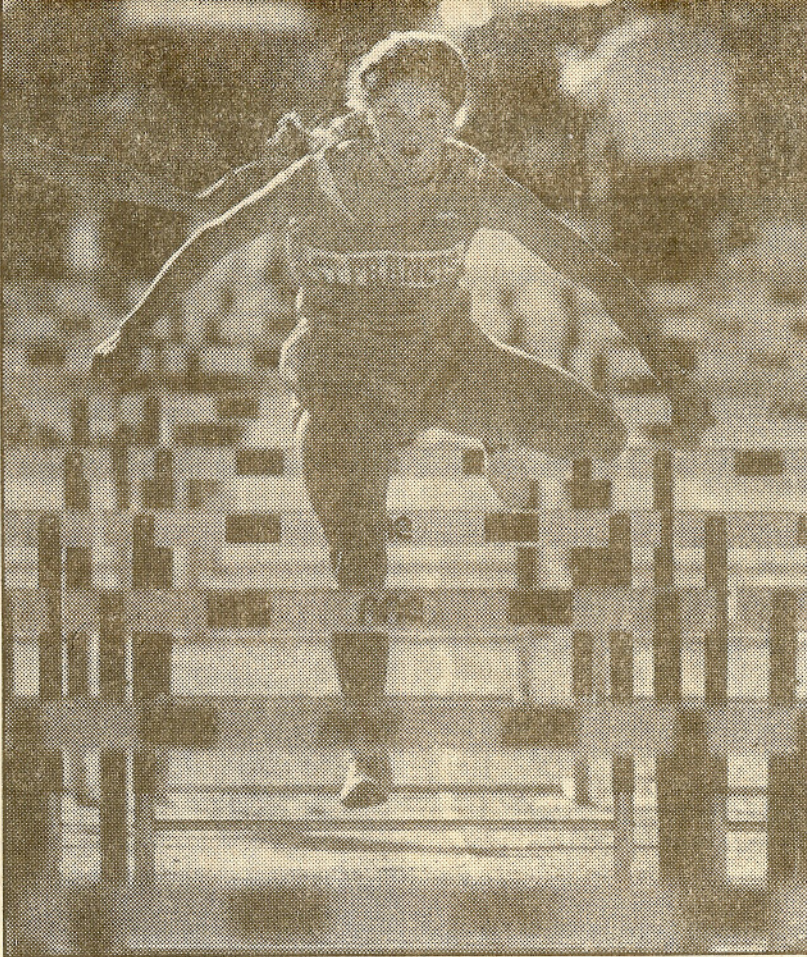
Fremont 95, Monta Vista 31
