MEET CALIFORNIA'S "DREAMER AND DOER" MARGARET QUAN

Margaret Quan, Pioneer High in San Jose, is California's selection as Walt Disney World's "Dreamer and Doer" for 1990-91. The program recognizes individuals who demonstrate the 4 C's - Curiosity, Confidence, Courage and Constancy - characteristics so revered by Walt Disney. Each year one junior from each state is selected. They serve as role models and spokespersons for the values of activity programs and are chairpersons in their state for National Activities Week.

Like Walt Disney, Quan has demonstrated an innate curiosity, and a tremendous amount of courage, confidence and constancy.

Born in Boston, Massachusetts and raised in San Jose, Quan is the daughter of immigrant partents, who came to the United States from China. Her father, Hong Mow, and her mother, Siu Ping, own a Chinese takeout restaurant in San Jose. Margaret's people skills were developed, in part, by helping out at her parent's restaurant.

While Margaret's list of accomplishments go on and on, she is most proud of her involvement within the community, her contact with people, and her work with the Inter School Council (ISC), where she is currently the president.

Her work as president of the ISC, a problem-solving group which consists of students district-wide, includes organizing a district leader-ship dance. She is currently working with other representatives on solutions to graffiti problems in the schools as well as organizing new recycling programs.

She gives her time willingly, whether it be working with the homeless as a crew member of the Homeless Shelter's "Home Run" race, volunteering at Homewood Convalescent Home, a food bank volunteer, or as a member of the Peer Counseling Committee. Quan will attend Santa Clara University this fall and plans to major in either political science or international business.

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT AWARD GOES TO KENNY FAGANS

Kenny Fagans, who served as CIF Southern Section Commissioner from 1954-75, is honored via the 1991 CIF/Reebok State Track Meet with the Distinguished Service Award, for his many years of service to the CIF.

Fagans was largely responsible for the growth of the CIF Southern Section, which expanded from a 218 school membership base to 490 with Fagans at the helm. During his tenure as commissioner, the number of CIF-SS sanctioned sports increased from 11 for boys to 22 for both boys and girls. Fagans proved to be an innovator in the area of girls' athletics and promotional matters, working with the media and selection of playoff teams.

Before taking over as CIF-SS Commissioner, Fagans served as assistant principal and director of athletics at Centennial High School in Compton during the 1953-54 school year. His background in athletic administration includes 12 years as Commissioner of the California Collegiate Athletic Association and two years as Commissioner of the PCAA (currently the Big West). He served as President of the Southern California Basketball Officials Association in 1959 and was President of the Southern California Football Officials Association in 1960.

Fagans gained recognition as a highly successful basketball coach, guiding junior college and high school teams to a phenomenal 248-23 record (.915 percent) over a seven year period. His Compton High School team won 53 consecutive games from 1950-53, a mark exceeded only twice in the 76-year history of the CIF-SS. His 1951-52 club went 32-0 and was the second of Fagans' back-to-back major division champions. Compton Junior College finished third in the nation under Fagans' tutelage during the 1949 campaign.

Fagans excelled as an athlete at Huntington Park High School, where he led his team to CIF-SS basketball titles in 1926 and 1927. He went on to star at Oregon State University, earning All-Pacific Coast honors in 1928 as a guard. In 1935, Fagans played for the Joey Brown All-Stars. He was a member of a United States basketball team that traveled to Japan in 1935 to play against Japanese teams that were preparing for the upcoming 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin.

Later, Fagans was also a contributor to the Olympic Games serving as a member of the United States Olympic Water Polo Committee from 1970-78. He was in charge of the 500 mile run in connection with the 1960 Winter Olympic Games held in Squaw Valley, California. Always the innovator, Fagans arranged for high school track stars to carry the Olympic flame from the Los Angeles Coliseum to Squaw Valley. This set a precedent as the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles used the same idea inititated by Fagans on a nationwide basis.

Fagans originated and still runs the CIF-SS Alumni Association composed of former Southern Section council and executive committee members. He is the president of the Orange County Retired Coaches Association.

In 1990, Fagans was inducted into the Orange County Hall of Fame as the Lifetime Achievement Award winner, joining such notable names as Gene Autry, Tommy Lasorda and Georgia Frontiere.

CIF/REEBOK STATE TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP PREVIEW


One of the highlights of the spring Track and Field season in the entire nation, the CIF/Reebok State Championships, will unfold before us this weekend in usual spectacular fashion. There is no regular season championship competition in the entire nation which, year in and year out, has the series of super performances that are annually featured in the California affair, with another great group of individuals and teams in attendance this weekend.

Highlights of the local spring season have centered around a number of fine individuals who have risen to the cream of the national crop. Defending CIF/Reebok State 100 and 200 meter titlest, sophomore Marion Jones (Rio Mesa, Oxnard-SS), has simply become the country's most spectacular performer in the sport during the outdoor season. A series of dizzying performances has been topped by new National Federation bests over 200 meters at 22.87, while racing against a top national field in mid-April's Arcadia Invitational, and an 11.28 100 meter National Federation Record last weekend in the CIF/Reebok Southern Section State Qualifying Meet. Juliana Yendork (Walnut-SS) was the Track and Field News Prep Indoor Athlete of the Year for extending the National Triple Jump out to 43-11 1/2. Fourth at the World Junior Championship in the Long Jump last Auguust (21-4 1/4), Juliana has bettered the National Federation Triple Jump record twice in as many weekends, topping out at 43-6 1/4 in last weekend's Section State Qualifier on the same Cerritos College facility she will be jumping on the next two days. On the boys side there have also been some real stars. Ricky Carrigan (Compton-SS) has developed quickly into one of the nation's top sprinters, recording 10.41 (100m) and 21.07-20.7w (200m) bests while going undefeated against all comers this spring. Louie Quintana (Arroyo Grande-SS) and Dave Hartman (Canyon, Canyon Country-SS) have proved to be the nation's top distance runners. Quintana was a major meet National Cross Country Champion this fall, and has raced 4:09.28 (1600m) to lead the nation during the spring. No one who was here last year can forget Louie's titanic duel with Coley Candaele (Carpinteria-SS) in last year's CIF/Reebok State Finals 1600m. Hartman has the nation's best 3200 meter clocking at 9:00.63. Also keep an eye out for a fine Morningside (Inglewood-SS) girls 4x100 meter relay team, which blazed 45.90 in the Section State qualifier for the nation's top clocking this year.

Always an exciting part of the weekend is viewing the struggle for team championships, with no one on the boys or girls side totally in the driver's seat prior to the meet's start. Morningside (Inglewood-SS) has a fine girls group, with a favored 45.90 400m relay team. Santishia Arnold, who was second in the CIF/Reebok State Finals last year in both the 100m (11.91) and 200m (24.59w) and LaShawn Stringer (55.67 400m) individually leading the team's charge. Cordova (Rancho Cordova-SJS), with fine all-around star Tanya Smith (14.00 100mLH, 42.8 300mLH, and 5-9HJ) could challenge from the north, with Muir (Pasadena-SS), and the Marion Jones led Rio Mesa (SS) groups waiting in the wings.

Compton (SS), fueled by fine sprinters Ricky Carrigan (10.41 100m-21.07-20.7w 200m), Ed Hervey (21.47 200m-47.14 400m), and a 41.12 4X100m relay, looks mighty tough on the boys side. Should Compton falter in the least, the picture clouds quickly into the most open state team title contest in recent history.

Speed will certainly be the name of the game in the Marion Jones-led girls sprints, with the Rio Mesa (SS) sophomore after meet records here of 11.38 (100m) by the 1989 Rio Mesa grad, Angela Burnham, and 23.19 by eventual two-time Olympian, Sherri Howard (Kennedy, Granda Hills-LA) from 1980. Tamika Bradfield (Dominguez, Compton-SS) (11.78-23.94) is among the nation's best with Santishia Arnold

(Morningside, Inglewood-SS) second in both sprints at the CIF/Reebok State Finals last year to and hoping to aid her team's cause off 11.96-24.59w bests. Angela Sullivan (Serra, San Diego) was hot in the Section Finals at 11.93-24.21. Over 400 meters, defending champions Janice Nichols (Bakersfield-C) (54.40) will face a challenge from Allison Dring (Mt. Carmel, San Diego) (54.39), Latasha Gilliam (Pittsburg-NCS) (55.00), Charlene Baldwin (Logan, Union City-NCS) (55.11), and La Shawn Stringer (Morningside-SS) (55.65).

In the boys sprints, Ricky Carrigan (Compton-SS) (10.41 100m and 21.07 200m) is undefeated, with Tim Martin (San Clemente-SS) (10.56-21.50), Ato Boldon (Piedmont Hills, San Jose-C) (10.49w-1990 100m), Leonice Brown (San Fernando-LA) (10.69-21.2), Damon Butler (Tulare-C) (10.74-21.57), and Darnay Scott (Kearney, San Diego) (10.59-21.27) hot in area action. Junior basketballer Richard Dupree (Roosevelt, Freno-C) exploded to 47.44 over 400 meters late in the season, with Arcadia winner Derek Shepard (Lincoln, San Francisco) (47.60), Milton Hughes (Stagg, Stockton-SJS) 47.71, and Shante Williams (Independence, San Jose-CCS) (47.77) strong from the north. From the south Ed Hervey (Compton-SS) (47.13), Gerald McCladdie (Centennial, Compton-SS) (47.57), and Lamont Warren (Dorsey, L.A.) (48.35-1990 CIF/Reebok State runner-up) look strong.

Season long girls national 800meter leader (2:10.17) Becky Spies (Livermore-NCS) is also the defending CIF/Reebok State 1600 meter champion. Spies raced her 2:10.17 in handling the state's best over 800m at the Arcadia Invitational, and raced 4:53.20 in taking the CIF/Reebok North Coast Section State qualifier 1600. Over 800 meters Kamara Mayberry (St. Bernard, Playa del Rey-SS) a seasonal best of 2:12.29, and last year's state runner-up, Nicole Teter (West Valley, Cottonwood-No) (2:12.23), Shelley Taylor (Edison, Huntington Beach-SS) 2:12.78 (800m) and 4:52.38 (1600m) and Jennifer Hamel (Merced-SJS) 2:12.82-5:01.91 were strong state qualifying meet doublers. Over 1600 meters Spies raced an impressive 4:48.74 to win last year's title,

with Nikki Shaw (4:49.77) Erica Sumi (Wilson, Long Beach-SS) (4:51.17), Shelley Taylor (4:52.38), Melissa Freberg (California, San Ramon-NCS) (4:56.26), and Jennifer Hamel (4:59.14 seasonal best) strong four lappers. Milena Glusac (Fallbrook-SD) has run 4:52.8 (1600m) and will come back over 3200 mteters (10:24.16) to renew her rivalry with defending CIF/Reebok State Champion there, Deena Drossin (Agoura-SS). Drossin was the Arcadia 3200m winner at 10:19.63, with Glusac taking that race out at near 5:10 for the first 1600 before finishing in her seasonal best 10:24.61. Jeannie Rothman (Westlake, Westlake Village-SS), fourth at state last June over 3200m, has run 10:36.89.

In the boy's 800 meters, junior Bryan Woodward (Poly, Long Beach-SS) was a big Arcadia upset winner at 1:52.90, with Mike Terry (El Modena, Orange-SS) since improving to 1:52.95 in handing Louie Quintana a rare defeat in the Section 3A title run. Robert Price (El Cerrito-NCS) was 1:53.37 in a Section win. Over 1600 meters Quintana, the national leader at 4:09.28 had Todd Tressler (San Marcos, Santa Barbara-SS) (4:10.12) close to within three meters at the finish in the Section State Qualifier, with Joe Garcia (Northview, Covina-SS) 4:12.21 and T.J. Reyes (Lakewood-SS) (4:12.25) strong. Steve Guerini (Santa Rosa-NCS) (4:15.97) will provide the northern competition, with Hector Hernandez (Mar Vista, Imperial Beach-SD) 4:13.99 and Daniel DasNeves (Helix, La Mesa-SD) 4:14.34 strong from San Diego. Over the eight lap 3200 meter event, Angel Martinez (San Gabriel-SS) took the CIF/Reebok Southern Section State Qualifying race at 9:01.36, with Dave Hartman (Canyon, Canyon Country-SS) racing the nation's best, a 9:00.63 in winning over Angel at Arcadia, and James Menon (San Luis Obispo-SS), last year's state third placer a 1991 best of 9:02.04.

In the girls hurdles, Tanya Smith (Cordova, Rancho Cordova-SJS) hopes to contribute big points to her team's title effort off 14.00 (100m LH) and 42.8 (300mLH) bests. Erin Blunt (San Pasqual, Escondido-SD) is best from the south, with a 14.26-42.69 Arcardia double win, with Smith absent with injury from that competition. Elinor Tolson (Fountain Valley-SS) was a fine Southern Section double hurdler winner at 14.32 and 43.25.

The boys hurdlers are led by Damon Carson (Jefferson, Day City-C), 1990 CIF/Reebok State runner-up in the 110 meter high hurdles, who has run 13.96, and Keith Williams (Escondido-SD), who has raced 37.2 for the 300 meter intermediates (and 14.31 for the highs). Dominque Arnold (Wilson, Long Beach-SS) took the Southern Section highs at 14.20, with Don Jackson (Duarte-SS) the intermediate champ at 37.64. Adrian Brown (Huntington Beach-SS) has run 14.10w (14.30) in the highs with Demon Smith (Hawthorne-SS) (13.9w-14.49 and 37.97), Chris Redmond (Vallejo-SJS) 37.75 in the intermediates.

Morningside (Inglewood-SS) has the nation's quickest girls 4x100m relay time at 45.90, with Muir (Pasadena-SS) a fine 46.77 for second and Long Beach Poly (S) 46.98 in third in the Section State Qualifier. St. Bernard (Playa del Rey-SS) raced 3:50.41 in the Section State Qualifying 4x400 event, with Poly (Long Beach-SS) next at 3:50.80. San Pasqual (Escondido-SD) 3:52.20 and Mt. Carmel (San Diego) 3:52.43 battled in their Section Finals.

In the boy's baton events, Compton (SS) (4x100m) took Hawthorne (SS-seasonal best 41.66) in the Section State Qualifier at 41.12, with L.A. Washington exploding to 41.11 in the L.A. City Semi-Finals. Lemoore (C) suprised with a 41.52 section win. In the 4x400 Centennial (Compton-SS) has blazed 3:14.46, with Valley (Sacramento-SJS) nipping Vallejo (SJS) 3:14-6-3:14.7 in that area finals race. Dorsey (L.A.) took the CIF/Reebok Los Angeles City Section Finals at 3:15.0. Central Coast Section stars, defending CIF/Reebok State Champion Chi Johnson (Menlo Atherton, Atherton) 5-11, and Tiffany Salmon (Live Oak, Mogan Hill) 5-10 lead the state girls high jumpers, with Johnson winning over the state's top field at the Arcadia Meet. Defending CIF/Reebok Boys State high jump champion Kevin Carlson (Katella, Anaheim-SS), with a 7-0 best, with Tim Rucks (Milpitas-CCS) 6-11, Tim Ross (Royal, Simi Valley-SS) 6-10 1/2, and Chris Olson-O'Neill (Rubidoux, Riverside-SS) 6-10 season bests.

David Cox (Hoover, Fresno-C) is among the nations's top Pole

vaulters at 16-7 3/4, with Matt McCauley (Nevada Union, Grass Valley-SJS) also over 16-0. P.J. Chadwick (Woodland-SJS) has cleared 15-7 1/2


The girls horizontal jumps are led by record-setter Juliana Yendork (Walnut-SS), 20-1 3/4 in the long jump and the new National Record Holder in the triple jump outdoors off a 43-6 1/4 effort last weekend. In the long jump, Lisa Collett (Lynbrook-CCS) improved mightily to 19-1/2 in the Section Finals, with Tannel House (Hoover, Fresno-C) having a best of 19-5 1/2, and last year's CIF/Reebok State runner-up in the event, Amey Mitchell (Rancho Cotate, Rohnert Park-NCS) 19-4w, and Nicole Hayes (Bishop Montgomery, Torrance-SS) 19-1 1/4. In the triple jump, Jessica Renton (Downey, Modesto-SJS) (38-8 3/4) and Tammy Graham (Mission Viejo-SS) (38-8) are next best to Yendork's towering National Record.

In the boys long jump, relative unknown Terrence Sweet (Morse, San Diego) jumped a state leading 23-9 3/4 in his Section Meet, with Roque Balina (Mt. Carmel-SD) 923-9) and Tyrone Edwards (Nogales, La Puente-SS) 23-8 1/2 with good marks prior to last weekend. In the Triple Jump, Offord Rollins (Wasco-C) (49-1) handled the state's best in the Arcadia showdown and returns as the state meet runner-up. Kenny Johnson (Canyon Springs, Moreno Valley-SS) has jumped 49-9 1/2w, and Cary Taylor (Morse, San Diego) 48-6 in winning his Section.


The weight events are headlined by some of the nation's best. In the girls discus, frosh Suzy Powell (Downey, Modesto-SJS) has started a fine prep career with new national age-14 and ninth grade class record in the girls discus at 162-11. A good group will challenge in that event, led by Jessica Alderman (Mission San Jose, Fremont-NCS) 153-8, Teresa Stricklin (Arroyo Garand-SS) 151-8, Celeste McVey (Redlands-SS) 151-3 (winner of the Aracadia showdown of the above mentioned throwers and third in state last year), and Kristina Mataafa (Orange Glen, Escondido-SD) 150-11. Crystal Brownlee (Westlake, Westlake Village-SS) has thrown 45-2 in the shot, with Myra Smith (Workman, City of Industry-SS) 44-0 1/2. Mike Hilaire (Pittsburg-NCS) 43-11 1/4 and Nicole Logan (Novato-NCS) are the north's best.

In the boys weight events CIF/Reebok State shot put runner-up Mark Parlin (Esperanza, Anaheim-SS) has thrown 66-7 1/2 in the shot put, and 194-2 in the discus. Jeff Buckey (Bakersfield-C) has thrown a national age-16 and junior class record 210-1 in the discus and 59-7 in the shot, with Jim Freeland (Amador Valley, Pleasanton) the best Section Finals discus mark in the state at 185-0. Donald Willis (Carillo, Lompos-SS) has a hot best of 59-11.

A Brief History of the CIF/Reebok State Championships

The CIF offers state championships in six different sports; cross country, girls' volleyball, wrestling, basketball, track and field and golf.

Track and field, the longest running state championship, was run for the first time at Fresno High in 1915 and reached the 72nd year mark during the 1990 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships. Except for the war years from 1941-45, the track and field championships have been held annually.

Early championships were conducted at high schools, YMCA's, universities and fair sites including: the Sacramento Fair in 1918, the San Bernardino Fair of 1919, the Bakersfield Fair in 1920 and the Stockton Fair in 1922. The 1990 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships marked the third consecutive year that Cerritos College, Norwalk was the host site. 1974 featured the first year of girls' competition in the CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships with the setting at Memorial Stadium, Bakersfield.

Accomplished athletes in various sports dot the list of California High School competitiors in the track and field state championships. Names like Dwight Stones, an Olympic medalist in the high jump, Rafer Johnson, a Gold Medalist in the decathlon, and Sherri Howard, an Olympian in the 4 X 400 highlight the list.

Track and field stars from California High

schools have gone on to succeed in other sports as well. Bobby Bonds of Polytechnic High in Riverside, who later became a major league baseball star, and Lynn Swann from Serra High in San Mateo, whose success came in professional football, were both state champions in the long jump - a feat Swann accomplished on two occasions (1969-70).

After track and field, the CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships were established in 1916 and were held until 1928. The first state basketball championship was played between Whittier High and Berkeley High at Whittier High School on March 25, 1916. The final result: Whittier 31-20. In 1989, Glendora High standout Tracy Murray set a record for most points scored with a phenomenal 64 - more than Berkeley and Whittier combined in the first title tilt. Women's basketball joined the state championships in 1981 when the championships were renewed for both boys and girls.

In its short history, the Girls' CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships have experienced tremendous success with names like national record holder Cheryl Miller, and 1990 sensation Lisa Leslie playing starring roles. Point Lomas's four state championships (1984 Division II; 1985-87 Division I) have also highlighted girl's competition.

On the boys' side, Stockton High dominated early play winning four championships in the 1920's (1922-23, 1925, 1928).

Crenshaw High equalled that dominance in the modern championship, winning four titles in the 1980's (1983, 1985-86, 1989). Besides Murray, great names like Michael Manning and 1990 standouts Shon Tarver and Ed O'Bannon have participated in the state finals.

The CIF/Reebok Basketball Championships have come a long way since its beginning at Whittier High in 1916. The 1990 championships marked the first time that all five boys' and girls' Divisions (I, II, III, IV and V) were housed under the same roof - the Oakland Coliseum. Attendance for the twoday championship eclipsed the 20,000 mark.

The CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships were established in 1973 and conducted at Cal State Hayward. The University of Pacific's Spanos Center has been the host site since 1987. Clovis High dominated during the first years of the championships, winning three consecutive CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships from 1974-76. Its fourth title in 1990 moved Clovis ahead of rival Clovis West as the team with the most state championships. Clovis West has won three titles (1983-84, 1989) in the 1980's.

With the largest participation of any girls' sport, volleyball has increased its following by leaps and bounds since the first CIF/Reebok State Volleyball Championships in 1978. Highland High, Bakersfield won the first championship, held at Highland High.

CIF/Reebok Championship History Cont.

In 1981, a Division II classification was added to the championships and a year later a Division III classification was included.

The growth of the sport is also evident in terms of revenue. For the first time, volley-ball became self-supporting in 1990 netting more than \$12,000.

Considered the finest volleyball team in the nation last season by several publications, Mira Costa High from Manhattan Beach, completed an unbeaten season by defeating Lynbrook at the 1990 CIF/Reebok Division I State Championships. Rim of the World has three titles in Division II, while Francis Parker has won three titles in Division III. Cal State Fullerton has been the host site for the CIF/Reebok Volleyball Championships since 1986. Cal Poly Pomona will be the setting for the 1990 championship in December.

Traditionally, the last CIF/Reebok Regional Championship completed during the course of the school year, the State Golf Championships were established in 1976 for boys and 1977 for girls and ran until 1981. Since then, regional championships have been conducted. The 1990 CIF/Reebok Regional Golf Championships were held

at El Caballero Country Club in Tarzana for Southern California and Del Rio Country Club, Modesto for Northern California.

The CIF/Reebok Cross Country Championships were the newest edition to the state championship fold in 1987 and have been held annually at Woodward Park, Fresno. Bryan Dameworth and Deena Drossin, both of Agoura High, have won three and two individual state titles respectively. Kira Jorgensen of Rancho Buena Vista won two consecutive individual state championships (1987-88). Palos Verdes girls' have dominated the team championship with three consecutive titles (1987-89).

Bakersfield High 400-Meter Relay/1600-Meter Relay





WIII Webster San Pasqual High School San Diego Section

Will Webster has been coaching at San Pasqual High for 15 years. His girls' track teams have compiled a 57-2 record since 1983 with eight league titles and one co-championship. His girls' cross country teams have won 107 of 117 dual meets as league champions for the last 12 years. Under Coach Webster's tutelage, the San Pasqual girls have been the San Diego Section Cross Country Champions seven of the past nine years, capping off their seasons as the State Meet third-place team in 1988 and 1989 as CIF/Reebok State Champions last fall.



Dennis McClanahan Mt. Carmel High School San Diego Section

As the head coach since 1976 of both the boys' and girl's programs at Mt. Carmel High School, Dennis McClanahan has compiled an overall record of 142 wins and only 34 losses in dual meets with 19 league championships and two section titles. During the last 10 years, 67 of his athletes have competed in the CIF/Reebok State Championships. He is the meet director of the "Sundevil Invitational," and is presently in his 11th year of service on the San Diego Section Track and Field Advisory Committee.




Tim Bruder Alhambra High School North Coast Section

Tim Bruder is one half of the very successful Alhambra High School (Martinez, CA) track and field coaching duo. He is completing his 17th year as a track coach. He/she should give themselves totally to practices and to competition at a level of doing their absolute best, so that satisfaction is acheived in that they competed, not that they won or lost." He has been the Meet Director of the Charlie Easton Relays since 1988 and is a member of the NCS/Reebok Track Meet of Champions Executive Committee.



Al Britt
Esperanza High School
Southern Section

The 1991 Track and Field season concludes the 19th year of coaching for Coach Al Britt. He was first interested in track when he competed at Laguna Beach High under the guidance of the late Red Guyer. Britt's first boys track and field league title was in 1977 at Buena Park High. In 1980 he took over the Esperanza boys and girls cross country teams and claimed nine combined Empire League Championships through 1989. He was the Meet Manager for the Girls Orange County Track and Field Championships in 1983. Throughout the 1980's , his girls track program won 10 consecutive league titles, while his boys team took their first league title in 1984 and then four straight from 1987-90. His boys won the 1989 and 1990 CIF Southern Section/Reebok 3A Team Title.



Jim Brownfield John Muir High School Southern Section

Jim Brownfield has won two CIF/Reebok State Championships (1985 and 1989) as the head coach of the girls track team at Muir. In addition, his teams have claimed three CIF Southern Section/Reebok 4A championships and seven Pacific League titles. He was named "State Coach of the Year" by California Coaches Association in 1990 and in 1989 was enshrined into the California State University of Los Angeles, Athletic Hall of Fame for "Career Coaching Excellence." Brownfield was presented the Stoval Clinics "Coahes Merit Award" in 1987 for contributions to the Coaching Profession. He has coached football, track, cross country, basketball and tennis at the college and high school levels, wrapping up a total of 40 championships and 508 wins.


Jerry Johnson




Ken Israel Tokay High School Sac Joaquin Section







Former Olympians John Pennel and Rafer Johnson Assists in Award Presentations

Two former Olympians will be featured presenters at the 1991 CIF/ Reebok State Track and Field Championships.

Courtesy of Campus 2000, former Olympian John Pennel will be one of the award presenters at this year's event. Pennel, who was a two-time Olympian in the Pole Vault (1964 and 1968), joins Rafer Johnson, a former Gold Medalist in the Decathlon, as a presenter. Johnson attends many CIF/Reebok State Championships as a representative of Reebok, the major sponsor of the CIF.

Pennel, who was the first man in history to vault over 17 feet, was a James Sullivan Award winner in 1963 and has been inducted into the Sports Hall of Fame in Florida, Louisiana and California.

A graduate of Louisiana University in 1964, Pennel completed his graduate studies in Public Relations/Advertising at the University of Miami. He was a National Promotion Manager for a major shoe company from 1976-1981 and was a member of the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee from 1981 until 1984. As the Assistant Vice President Licensing and Merchandising/Manager of Olympic Youth Activities, Pennel assisted in the attainment of \$116 million of Olympic sponsorship through the identification of Olympic sponsors and licensees.

Pennel is currently an Account Manager for Sportsworks, where he is in charge of the development of integrated marketing programs.

An Olympic Gold Medalist in 1960 and a Silver Medalist in 1956, Rafer Johnson is a frequent presenter at the CIF/Reebok State Championships on behalf of Reebok.

Johnson, holder of the World and Olympic record in the Decathlon, was honored as *Associated Press* Athlete of the Year in 1960 and was a Sullivan Award winner, as the Outstanding Amateur Athlete in the United States that same year.

Johnson has devoted innumerable hours to the mentally and physically handicapped. He has been associated with California Special Olympics (CSO) since its inception in 1969 and is now the President of the Board of Directors.

A sports announcer, actor and commercial and public spokesperson, Johnson serves on a variety of special boards and committees in the world of sports. He served on the Board of Directors of the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee and was selected to light the Olympic torch which opened the 1984 games.


