GIRLS STATE ATHLETE OF THE YEAR: SIZZLING JONES WINS AS A SOPHOMORE

Marion Jones has time on her side — she always had and always will. Maybe that's because time can barely keep up with her.

Only a 15-year-old sophomore at Rio Mesa High in Oxnard, Jones is the State Girls Athlete of the Year and is the youngest athlete to receive such an honor since freshman swimmer Cynthia Woodhead of Riverside Poly was chosen for her exploits in 1978-79.

With so many years of competition ahead of her, it is staggering to think of the accomplishments that lie in Jones' future — or how low the sleek Rio Mesa sprinter can take her times.

Already, Jones has shattered the national federation high school record for the 100 meters twice — most recently during the state championship meet at Cerritos College when she blazed out of the blocks for a legal time of 11.17 seconds.

In the same meet, Jones was clocked at a wind-aided 22.91. Her best legal time in that event is 22.87, another national record. Jones hit that time at the Arcadia Invitational when she blazed by Florida's Zundra Feagin, who was regarded as the nation's No. 1 girls sprinter coming into the season.

Jones also entered the 400 meters in several meets and had a best time of 52.91. That was far superior than any other 400 time in the state this year and put her No. 4 on the all-time state list. Jones dropped the 400 leading into the state meet to concentrate on the shorter events.

Both races at Cerritos also indicated that Jones may not find any suitable competition until she suits up for the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1992.

"I'd love to go to the Olympics," Jones said. "But I have another year to make up my mind, and to bring my times down before they would even consider me."

As it is, Jones stands to take the 100 and 200 in two more state meets, which would give her eight individual titles — two more than any other athlete in the meet's history.

At 5-foot-9, the mercurial Jones also plays basketball for Rio Mesa. She averaged 24.5 pts and 11 rebs as a sophomore-her second season of leading the Spartans' (very) fast break. Her high game was 48 points, and she is regarded as one of the top sophomore prospects in the nation.

"I am very serious about basketball," Jones said. "It would be hard right now if someone told me to choose between basketball and track."

Perhaps only time can make that decision for her.

HONORABLE MENTION SENIOR GIRLS

•Juliana Yendork (Walnut)
State Senior Athlete of the Year

The Ghana-born Yendork added two more state titles in the long jump and triple jump to add to the double victories she scored in those events in 1989 and 1990. In the state trials, Yendork also set a national record in the triple jump with a mark of 44 feet-0 1/2 inches. Yendork has a best in the long jump of 21-3 from last year and hit 20-7 1/2 at the state meet. If the triple jump for women was an Olympic event, she'd be a lock for the U.S. team.

•Keri Sanchez (Santa Teresa)

Competed at the state track meet as a junior in three events, but concentrated on soccer this year as she earned a spot on the U.S. National Team. Sanchez is the only high school player on that squad and will be playing in the first World Cup for women in October in China. Her best track marks are 13.91 for the 100 hurdles, 42.6 in the 300 hurdles, 40-1 1/2 in the triple jump and 19-5 1/2 in the long jump.

•Mika Hilaire (Pittsburg)

Powerful athlete won the state shot put title with a heave of 45-4 1/4 and also had a top time of 14.27 in the 100 hurdles. Hilaire also earned All-East Bay honors in basketball with 17.7 ppg and 12 rebs.

•Tanda Rucker (Berkeley)

State Player of the Year in basketball knocked down nearly 25 ppg and handed out nine assists per game in leading the Yellowjackets to the Div. I state title.

Rucker also played well for Berkeley's softball team.

•Deena Drossin
(Agoura)

Won her third state Div. I title in cross country with a clocking of 17:29 at Woodward Park in Fresno, and made it two straight 3200 meter crowns in track with a time of 10:30.71 at Cerritos College.

•Chi Johnson
(Menlo-Atherton)
State Medium Schools
Athlete of the Year

Johnson's 5-4 height makes her clearances of 5-11 in the high jump more amazing. She won the state title as a junior, but was second this year. In basket-

ball, Johnson is a guard and sparked M-A to a 30-2 record by averaging 22 ppg.

•Kate Paye (Menlo, Atherton)

State Small Schools Athlete of the Year Led Menlo to three Div. V state titles in basketball. In this year's finals, Paye scored 21 points and had 10 assists. The 5-6 guard also averaged near the 20 ppg mark for her career, but upped it closer to 25 ppg for playoff games.

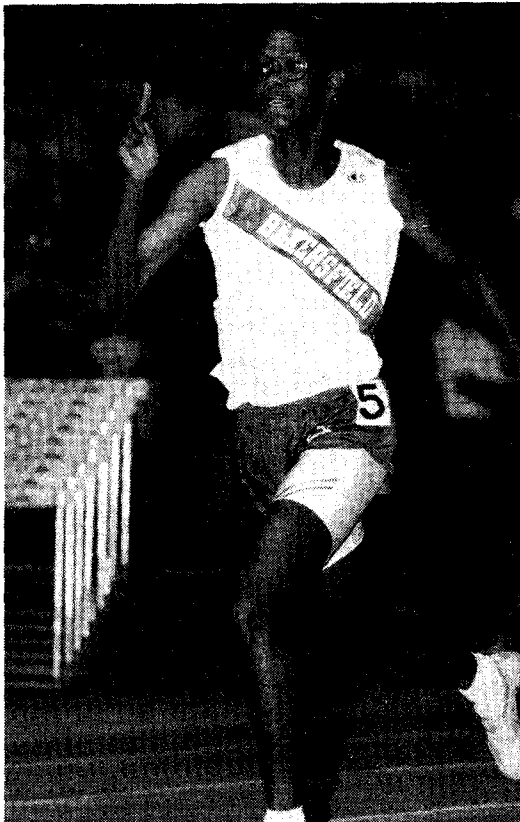
