Boeving competed in three sports at Monte Vista High; basketball, softball and volleyball. She amassed 15 school records in basketball, including most points scored in a career (1,778), highest single-season average (24.5 in 1992) and most points scored in a game (39).

Her goal is to take her basketball skills to the highest level, with a desire to compete for the US Olympics in the year 2000.

Boeving's individual honors in basketball go on and on including being named *USA Today* All-American, *Street and Smith's* All-American, and all-East Bay Athletic League.

She was a varsity pitcher for all four years at Monte Vista and was named all-league as both a sophomore and junior. Boeving helped Monte Vista High take the CIF North Coast Section Division II championship in volleyball and was voted her team's Most Inspirational Player.

Boeving was her junior class treasurer, a member of the National Honor Society, a Hugh O'Brien Youth Foundation (HOBY) Alumni, and was *Teen Magazine's* 1993 Sportsgirl of the Year. She was a Miss America Teen finalist in 1990.

Park helped San Marino High capture the CIF Southern Section 2A baseball title as a junior, a year in which this shortstop hit a lofty .380. During his team's current 17-game winning streak, Park was a key offensive and defensive performer. Park was named first team all-Rio Hondo League as a junior in baseball (selection this year done after publication).

In football, Park was his team's Most Valuable Player in a season that saw San Marino reach the CIF Southern Section Division VIII finals. Park played offense and defense and was named all-CIF first team wide receiver in addition to being named Rio Hondo League Defensive Back of the Year.

In addition to his athletic success, Park has been very active in school. He was Co-Managing Editor for his school newspaper and was a member of the class advisory board. His non-sports awards include being a National Merit Finalist, Boys State representative and Smith Book Award recipient.

Park's career interests center around sports medicine. He will major in chemistry or biology at Stanford.

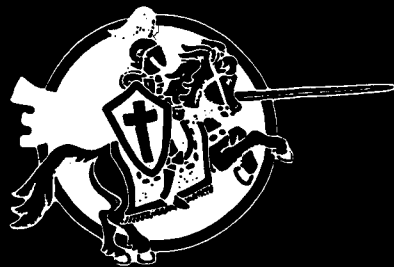
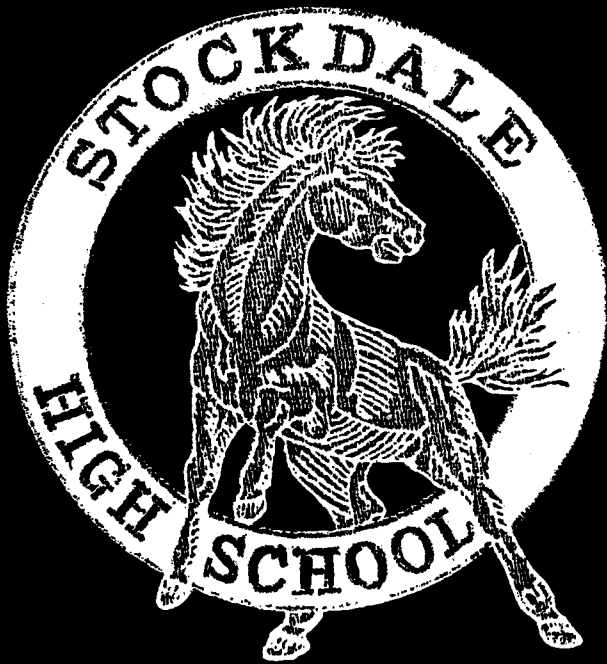

The Name Game: California's Unique High School Mascots

"The Banana Slugs Do It Again." This, or similar headlines have appeared in newspapers across the United States for the past few years. They have announced that the Banana Slugs of the University of California at Santa Cruz have once again topped the list of the most unique college mascots.

No one denies that Banana Slugs is a unique and interesting name for a mascot. But if the mascots of California high schools were included in the list of candidates, it remains to be seen whether the Banana Slugs would be number one.

There are 1,148 schools with membership in the State CIF, representing 235 different mascots. Of these, 54 call themselves Eagles, making Eagles the most popular. Next come the Warriors, Cougars, Panthers and Vikings. There are about 120 high schools whose mascot is claimed only by that school. This list of "one-only" mascots provides the most interesting.

Mascots are chosen for many reasons. Usually those which suggest power, aggression, deception, or invincibility are selected. Geography plays a part. It seems evident why Hollywood are the Shieks; Big Bear the Bears; Mammoth the Huskies; Hollister the Haybalers; and Vintage of Napa Valley the Crushers. Some have historical significance, such as the Washington Generals, the Yreka Miners, the Jefferson Democrats, the Fremont Pathfinders, and the Teddy Roosevelt Roughriders.

It's tempting to believe that alliteration entered into the reason for some mascots being chosen. For example, the Burroughs Burros, the Antelope Valley Lopes, the Mary Star of the Sea Stars, the Tustin Tillers, and the Elk Creek Elks.

Some were chosen because of their uniqueness. That's why Kearny High are the Komets, Thacher the Toads, and Ambassador Christian the Dawgs.

Christian and parochial schools often choose mascots which reflect religious or patriotic emphasis. Thus, we have Angels, Crusaders, Cherubs, Contenders, Flames, Friars, Gaels, Heralds, Jesters, Minutemen, Kings, Patriots, Seekers, Seraphs, Spirits, Swordsmen, and Waves.

But some of the mascot names are so unique that they nearly defy the imagination. A little research is needed to understand their selection since the name itself does not readily communicate its significance.

Two of the more obscure mascots are the Kares of Rio Hondo Prep and the Tologs of Flintridge Sacred Heart Academy. Ask the average person to identify either and note the response.

One thing is certain. A Kare is not a bug, desert animal, or exotic bird. The name "Kares" was selected by the original students of the school at its founding in 1965. Coming together as a student body, they searched for a name which

would reflect the fact they they cared for each other and that their school provided a place where this fact could be demonstrated. Their decision was to take the word "cares" and change the first letter to "K." The result was, "Rio Hondo Kares."

According to Katy Sadler of Flintridge Sacred Heart Academy, the origin of "Tologs" is unknown. It has been the mascot since the school became involved in athletics in the 1940's. The word is simply an acronym for "To Our Lady of Good Success." Their visual representation is a teddy bear, but one can only imagine how many times they've been asked, "What is a Tolog?"

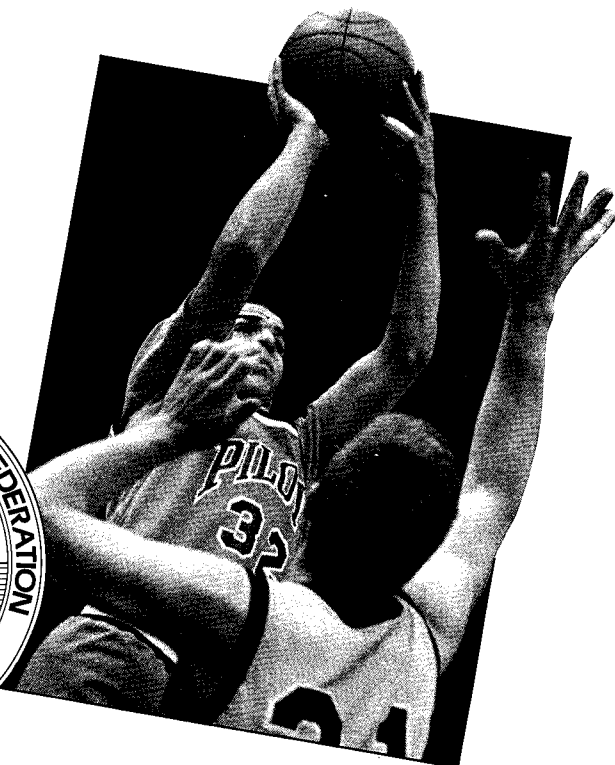
Cathedral High has the mascot with the most interesting historical background. In 1925, about two years after its beginning, the school was built on the property previously occupied by Calvary Cemetery. With the school having been built on the former graveyard, the Christian Brothers selected "Phantoms" as its mascot. Actually, nothing else seems logical. And, of course, its' visual representation is the grim reaper.

There are about 120 high schools whose mascot is claimed only by that school. This list of "one-only" mascots provides the most interesting....Some of the mascot names are so unique that they nearly defy the imagination.

Compton High presents mascot uniqueness from another perspective. Their mascot is the Tarbabes which has produced a variety of reactions. At first, one may be tempted to conclude that the name is based on the character from Brer Rabbit and contains racial overtones. However, according to Lee Griffin, vice principal, this conclusion is incorrect. Neither the students nor the community associate racial connotations with the name. Most of the cheers and spirit slogans do use the shortened name of "Babes," but this is for simplicity, not to avoid racial implications.

Originally, Compton College shared the same campus with Compton Union High School. The college was known as the Tartars which refers to those who when confronted, unexpectedly become formidable opponents. The high school adopted the name of Baby Tartars. In time, this name evolved into Tarbabes.

Mascot names can be common, obscure, strange, humorous, or individual. But no matter, there is a common thread which runs through each fabric. To every school, its mascot is number one. This is the way it should be. So, whether you are in Wildcat Country or the Lion's Den; whether you beep beep with the Roadrunners or hoop with the Warriors; whether you fight with the Knights or sail with the Argonauts, remember that pride is showing. And you are part of it.



A History of the CIF/Reebok State Championships

In existence since 1914, the CIF offers state championships in six different sports; cross country, girls' volleyball, wrestling, basketball, track and field and golf.

Track and field, the longest running state championship, was held for the first time at Fresno High in 1915 and reaches its 75th anniversary this year. Except for the war years from 1941-45, the track and field championships have been held annually.

Early championships were conducted at high schools, YMCA's, universities and fair sites including: the Sacramento Fair in 1918, the San Bernardino Fair of 1919, the Bakersfield Fair in 1920 and the Stockton Fair in 1922.

The 1993 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships marks the sixth consecutive year that Cerritos College, Norwalk was the host site. 1974 featured the first year of girls' competition in the CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships with the setting at Memorial Stadium, Bakersfield.

Accomplished athletes in various sports dot the list of California High School competitors in the track and field state championships.

Names like Dwight Stones, an Olympic medalist in the high jump, Rafer Johnson, a Gold Medalist in the decathlon, and Sherri Howard, an Olympian in the 4 X 400 highlight the list.

Track and field stars from California High

schools have gone on to succeed in other sports as well. Lynn Swann from Serra High in San Mateo, James Lofton of Washington, Los Angeles and Dokie Williams of El Camino, Oceanside each made a name for themselves in professional football, and were state champions in the long jump - a feat Swann accomplished on two occasions (1969-70). Henry Ellard, of Hoover Fresno and now with the Los Angeles Rams won the CIF/Reebok State title in the triple jump in 1979.

After track and field, the CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships were established in 1916 and were held until 1928. The first state basketball championship was played between Whittier High and Berkeley High at Whittier High School on March 25, 1916. The final result: Whittier 31-20. In 1989, Glendora High standout Tracy Murray set a record for most points scored with a phenomenal 64 - more than Berkeley and Whittier combined in the first title tilt. Women's basketball joined the state championships in 1981 when the championships were renewed for both boys and girls.

In its short history, the Girls' CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships have experienced tremendous success with names like national record-holder Cheryl Miller, Lisa Leslie, Tanda Rucker and Kate Paye playing starring roles. Point Loma's four state championships (1984 Division II; 1985-87 Division I) have also highlighted girl's competi-

tion. The Ladycats of Brea Olinda, with a record five straight appearances, have also garnered four titles including the 1992 Division II crown. Menlo School of Atherton, won three straight titles in Division V (1989-91).

On the boys' side, Stockton High dominated early play winning four championships in the 1920's (1922-23, 1925, 1928).

Crenshaw High equalled that dominance in the modern championship, winning four titles in the 1980's (1983, 1985-86, 1989) and adding an unprecedented fifth this March. Besides Murray, great names like Michael Manning, Jason Kidd, Shon Tarver, Ed O'Bannon and Stais Boseman have participated in the state finals.

The CIF/Reebok Basketball Championships have come a long way since its beginning at Whittier High in 1916. The 1990 championships marked the first time that all five boys' and girls' Divisions (I, II, III, IV and V) were housed under the same roof - the Oakland Coliseum. Attendance for the two-day championships have eclipsed the 20,000 mark in each of the last three seasons with a record 22,613 at the Arco Arena for the 1992 title games.

The CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships were established in 1973 and conducted at Cal State Hayward. The University of Pacific's Spanos Center has been the host site since 1987. Clovis High dominated during the first years of the champion-

ships, winning three consecutive CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships from 1974-76 and then equalled that with a recent three straight 1990-92. Clovis West has won three titles (1983-84, 1989) in the 1980's.

Individually, standouts like Jimmy Aguirre, Tony Okada, Zach Cooper and Trent Barnes have competed in championships.

With the largest participation of any girls' sport, volleyball has increased its following by leaps and bounds since the first CIF/Reebok State Volleyball Championships in 1978. Highland High, Bakersfield won the first championship, held at Highland High.

In 1981, a Division II classification was added to the championships and a year later a Division III classification was included.

The CIF/Reebok State Volleyball Championships expanded to a five division format in 1991 and the result was more spectacular action under one roof.

The growth of the sport is also evident in terms of revenue. Volleyball has been a self-supporting championship the last three seasons.

Five teams have won three titles in their respective divisions, starting with Mira Costa, which went unbeaten en route to Division I championships in both 1985 and 1990. Just

down the road Division I rival Corona del Mar also has three championships, with its third coming this fall against Laguna Beach. Rim of the World has three titles in Division II, along with La Habra (1989-91). Francis Parker, San Diego has won three titles in Division III.

Individual standouts include 1991 tournament sensation and MVP Jaimie Torromeo of St. Joseph Lakewood, 1990 MVP Tracy Schriber of Corona del Mar, 1989 MVP Piper Hahn of Mira Costa, Bev Oden, Katy Eldrige, Zrinka Kristich, Kristal Atwood and Jenny Evans, among others.

Traditionally, the last CIF/Reebok Regional Championship completed during the course of the school year, the State Golf Championships were established in 1976 for boys and 1977 for girls and ran until 1981. Since then, regional championships have been conducted. Torrey Pines has dominated in the Southern Regionals with four regional championships, while Vintage of Napa has taken three Northern Regional titles. Sharon Barrett, Kim Saiki, Jean Zedlitz and Kim Cathrein have excelled on the girls side, while stars on the boys field include Craig Sadler, Joe Rassett, and David Games.

The CIF/Reebok Cross Country Cham-

pionships were the newest edition to the state championship fold in 1987 and have been held annually at Woodward Park, Fresno. Bryan Dameworth and Deena Drossin, both of Agoura High, have won three and two individual state titles respectively. Jeff Wilson of Newbury Park (1990-91) and Kira Jorgensen of Rancho Buena Vista won two consecutive individual state championships (1987-88). Milena Glusac of Fallbrook broke the Girls Division I record in 1991 with a time of 17:13, then proceeded to add another title this fall (17:14).

Palos Verdes girls' have dominated the team championship with three consecutive titles (1987-89). Palos Verdes High was closed in 1989 and was combined with Miraleste and Rolling Hills High into Peninsula High.

Nine teams have won two CIF/Reebok State Championships including Agoura (Girls Division I), San Pasqual (Girls Division II), Bret Harte (Girls Division III), Maranatha (Girls Division III), Nordhoff Ojai (Girls Division IV), Hart (Boys Division I), Corona del Mar (Boys Division II), San Marino (Boys Division II) and Laguna Beach (Boys Division III).

A fourth division was added to cross country in 1990.

Jones Makes High School Curtain Call in What Figures to Be Action-Packed Finals

Wow! Grab that favorite seat cushion and get ready to strap yourself down to prepare to deal with the thrill and spills of the 75th annual CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Meet. This year's competition will feature spectacular action equal to any of the previous three-quarters of a century's worth. We will mark the interscholastic end to the career of the athlete that many consider the best in Golden State track and field history with the final steps on this Cerritos College oval by Marion Jones (Thousand Oaks/SS). Great team competition will feature top squads from across the state, with a number of individual California athletes rising to that level of challenging all-time records or contention for "best in the nation" status during a fine spring season.

Whether we want to admit it or not, we probably all have become a bit spoiled by the successes of Jones, who has come to this competition and swept the 100 and 200 meter dash events in each of her first three prep seasons, spicing things with interscholastic records each of the last two state gatherings at 100 meters (11.17 and 11.14 last year). Jones can stretch her state record of individual titles to nine this weekend with 100 and 200 meter triumphs, and with her surprise new event the long jump, where she is also favored. An indicator of Marion's athletic talent is her #3 position all-time already among preps with a 21-7 best, with a National Interscholastic Record equalling 22-1 3/4 in the CIF Southern Section/Reebok divisional competition nullified by an illegal aiding breeze. This in an event she had never competed in previous to last March of this season! Statistics go on and on for Miss Jones, with, for example, a glance at all-time lists having her with eight of U.S. prep history's fastest 200 meter times, topped by her all-time prep best of 22.56 in a fourth place effort at the 1992 Olympic Trials that had her narrowly miss the U.S. team. Watch her closely this weekend, as she may just be the prep "athlete of a lifetime" in this sport that each of us is blessed to enjoy during our tenure here.

Male athletes ranked among the top handful nationally in action here include Anthony Volsan (Merced/SJ) 100m (10.42), Calvin Harrison (North Salinas/CCS) 400m (45.93), Brian Wilkinson (Merced/SJ) 800m (1:49.50 though Brian is entered in the 1600m here), Vondre Armour (Bakersfield/CE) 800m (1:50:23), Jeff Nadeau (Monroe, Sepluvada/LA) HJ (7-2 1/4), Tye Harvey (Sonora/SJ) PV (17-1), and Tyson Lingenfelter (Upland/SS) SP (63-11).

Girls among the top few nationally in their event across the nation are Andrea Anderson (Poly, Long Beach/SS) 100m (11.54)-200m (23.60), Milena Glusac (Fallbrook/SD) 1600m (4:51.66)-3200m (10.26.72), Angela Harris (Skyline, Oakland /O) 300mLH (42.4), Amy Littlepage (Mt. Miguel, Spring Valley/SD LJ (20-5), Kristin Heaston (Ygnacio Valley, Concord/NC) SP (51-11 1/2), and Suzy Powell (Downey, Modesto/SJ) discus (178-6).

The nation's best group of girls relay teams will start and end each day in fine style this weekend, with Poly (Long Beach/SS) (400m Re-45.59), Morningside (Inglewood/SS) 46.57, Skyline (Oakland/O) (1600m Re-3:43.0), Morningside 3:44.97, and Poly (Long Beach) 3:45.09 tough baton groups.

Fans need to realize a change in qualifying formulas for Friday's Prelim action, with three heats in events where there previously were four. The CIF LA City lost one of its qualifying participants in a vote by the State CIF governing body, putting total participation statewide in each event at 27. With nine lanes on the Cerritos track, there will be three heats in all but the 1600 meters (two there, none in the 3200-everyone in a Saturday final). In each running

event heat, the first two placers, instead of the old four-heat system of winner only, plus the next fastest time from all of the heats will be used to fill out the nine qualifying spots.

Team contests feature interesting geographic clashes, with North Salinas attempting to become the first CIF Central Coast Section boys team to take a state team title since 1970. Coach Ed Barger has twins Calvin and Alvin Harrison burning up the track this spring, with relay squads that can score high. Calvin has been the nation's most surprising prep this spring, with a 45.93 400m while winning by gigantic margins and 20.71w-20.95 200m times. Twin Alvin has a 21.10w/21.27 200m best, with the team 41.63 and 3:14.87 baton crews. Muir has favored Ken Haslip 300mIH (37.20), with Gerald Stamps 110mHH (14.31), and strong baton groups (41.43-3:16.23). Merced/SJ has fine sprinters Volsan, Lindsey McDonald (10.52-21.50), favored 1600m runner, Brian Wilkinson (4:11.17 1992 4:08.7 relay carry 1993), and 41.57 and 3:19.99 baton crews.

On the girls side, four monster programs will battle for the title. Defending champs Poly Long Beach has super sprinters Anderson (100m-11.54 200m-23.60), Aminah Haddad (11.66-23.67), 800m star Sharron Rhetta (2:11.76), with fine baton crews (400m-45.59 1600m-3:45.09). Latasha Prothro (400m-55.35) will try to supply insurance points for Poly. Morningside has wicked baton squads (400m-46.57, 1600m-3:44.97), with 400 meter runners LaShawn Stringer (54.88), Jaronda White (55.08), and Felesha Williams (55.53), and Nicole Thomas (300mLH-43.40) putting points on the board. Skyline (Oakland) has relay groups (46.61 and 3:43.0), with Angela Harris (300mLH-42.4) and Malika Freeman (400m-55.88) scoring individually. Bishop O'Dowd (Oakland/NC) has Bisa Grant (100m-11.92, 200m-24.34, 100mHH-14.24), Miesha Marzell (800m-2:11.69), Jamila Churchill (HJ 5-8), and a fine 1600m relay team (3:47.9). The four girls squads mentioned above are the equal of any team in the nation.

Speed will certainly be the name of the game on the boys side of the competition, with a group of sprinters equal to any in state history on the line over two days. Volsan, Brian Howard (Canyon Springs, Moreno Valley/SS) (10.50-21.14), Brian Lewis (Highlands, North Highlands/SJ) (10.38w-21.28), Paul Turner (University City, San Diego) (10.62), Marques Holliwel (West, Bakersfield/CE) (10.57w), Shon Lewis (Wilcox, Santa Clara/CCS) (10.492-21.41), Calvin Harrison (North Salinas/CCS), Edward Turner (Morningside,

(21.07), Andre DeSaussure (Taft, Woodland Hills/LA) (20.93w), and late surprise Rashawn Sanders (Lincoln, San Francisco) (10.402) scorching the facility up through 200 meters. The hot action will continue through one lap, with Calvin Harrison cranking an amazing unpressed 45.93 for 400 meters, with super frosh Michael Granville (Bell Gardens/SS) (47.23), Andre DeSaussure (47.1), and Jack Beloney (Oak Grove, San Jose/CCS) (47.40) hoping to push the Central Coast star.

In the girls 400 meters, Asha Jayasinghe (Arcadia/SS) (55.47) can push the previously mentioned favored teams athletes.

In the boys middle and long distance events, the 800 meter favorite roll has fallen to Armour (Bakersfield/CE), with the 1:50.23 star moving to the front of the class when (SJ) star Brian Wilkinson (1:49.50) and Bell Gardens (SS) frosh Michael Granville (1:51.61 national frosh record in big Arcadia showdown) moved to other events. Nathan Woods (Duarte/SS) (1:52.2), surprising Matt Silva (San Pasqual, Escondido/SD) (1:52.23), and Adrian Garcia (Roosevelt, Fresno/CE) (1:52.70) had good Section Finals runs. Wilkinson, who had a 4:08.7 1600m relay carry the day of his 1:49.50 is the 1600 meter favorite, with Mark Hauser (St. Augustine, San Diego) (4:11.33), Mehbratom Keflezighi (San Diego) (4:11.82), Nazario Romero (San Pasqual, Escondido/SD) (4:12.24) and Ryan Wilson (Agoura/SS) (4:12.82) strong in local action. A fast early pace could result in a great mass 3200 meter finish, with Southern Section qualifiers Dan Minami (Peninsula, Rolling Hills) (9:04.14), Margarito Casillas (Hoover, Glendale) (9:04.14), Jaime Martinez (Orange) (9:06:48), Shawn Frack (Esperanza, Anaheim) (9:06:70), and Mike Love (Katella, Anaheim) (9:07:03) joined by fast early season stars Matt Farley (Jesusit, Sacramento/SJ) (9:05.11) and soph Jason Balkman (Lynbrook, San Jose/CCS) (9:06.90).

Girls 800 meter action will be headlined by undefeated defending champion Miesha Marzell (Bishop O'Dowd, Oakland/NC), with the 2:11.69 performer taking the state's best easily in a big Arcadia meet showdown. Sharron Rhetta (Poly, Long Beach/SS) has emerged as the south's best, racing 2:11.76 in taking Christie Engesser (Ocean View, Huntington Beach/SS) (2:12.88) and Kamara Mayberry (St. Bernard, Playa del Rey/SS) (2:13.16) in Section action. Melanie Hand (Fallbrook/SD) was 2:13.84 in state qualifying. Milena Glusac (Fallbrook/SD) will attempt to win both the 1600m, where she has run 4:51.66, and 3200, where her 10.26.72 Arcadia win leads the nation. Erica Sumi (Wilson, Long Beach/SS) (4:58.48), Nicole Becker (Bonita Vista, Chula Vista/SD), (4:58.48), and Carrie Caulkins (Esperanza, Anaheim/SS) (4:59.35) will keep Glusac honest in the four-lapper. Southern Section qualifiers Karen Bockel (Nordhoff, Ojai) (10.48.00), Kim Nelson (Canyon, Anaheim) (10:48.13), Kellie Campbell (Corona del Mar, Newport Beach/SS) (10:51.29), Gabriela Rodriguez (Oxnard) (10:52.34), and Elyse Homberger (Edison, Huntington Beach) (10:54:58) will be joined by Melissa Keim (San Pasqual, Escondido/SD) (10:53.85), and Ellssa Riedy (Mission San Jose, Fremont/NC) (11:00.56) in challenging the University of Oregon-bound Glusac in the 3200.

In the boys 100 meter hurdles, Drue Powell (Reseda/LA) rode the wind to a 13.99w in the Section finals, with Gerimi Burleigh (Upland/SS) (14.26), Danny Perryman (Lemoore/CE) (14.28), and Gerald Stamps (Muir) (14.31) best of the rest. In the 300 meter intermediates, Muir/SS junior Ken Haslip is one of the nation's best at 37.11, with Henry Varnhill (Mountain View/CCS) (37.74), Esperanza, Anaheim/SS soph Anton Hector (37.80), Kyle O'Neil (Bella Vista, Fair Oaks/SJ) (37.84), and Adrian Williams (River City) (37.84) others under 38.00.

Grant (Bishop O'Dowd) has survived the Golden State girls hurdle jump up from 30" to 33" for the 100 meter distance the best this year with a 14.24 clocking. Jennifer Odom (Independence, San Jose/CCS) (14.44), Cheaza Figueroa (Quartz Hill) (14.50) and Miesha McKelvy (Gahr, Cerritos) (14.50) will challenge. In the 300 meter hurdles, Angela Harris (42.4) will battle Nicole Thomas (Morningside) (43.40) and Jennifer Odom (Independence, San Jose/CCS) 43.77.

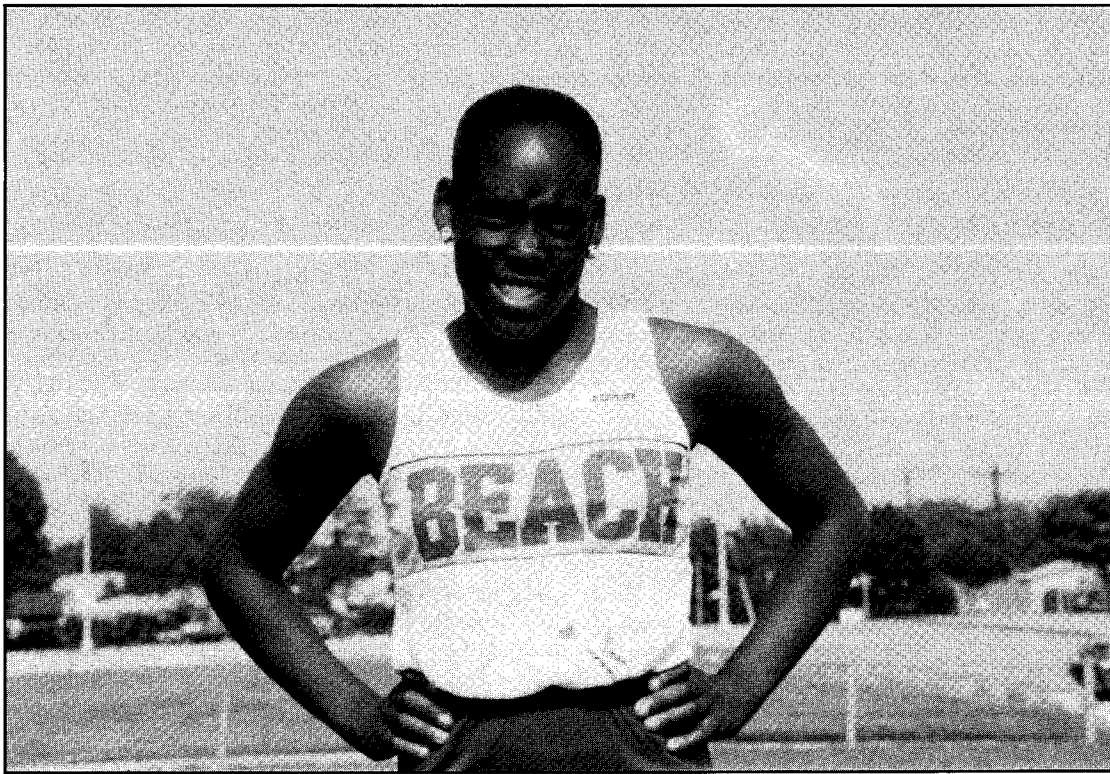
Boys relay action will feature teams competitive for the team titles, with everyone realizing the volatility of dependence on points in this area. Should Muir (41.43), North (Salinas/CCS) (41.63), and

Merced/SJ (41.57) all make Saturday's 4x100 finals, the team picture could start to come into focus. A classic meet finish could have Calvin Harrison anchoring North (Salinas/CCS) (3:14.87) in the 4x400, where he has split under 46.0, with Edward Turner 45.7 for Morningside (Inglewood/SS) (3:15.43) a week ago, and consistent Foothill (Santa Ana/SS) (3:15.09), Muir (Pasadena/SS) (3:16.23), and Bakersfield/CE (3:17.85) dangerous.

The girls 4x400 meter relay to complete that half of the meet on Saturday evening could be U.S. prep history's greatest ever baton contest, with team powers Skyline (3:43.0), Morningside (3:44.97), Poly (3:45.09), and Bishop O'Dowd (3:47.95), joined by James Logan (Union City/NC) (3:47.4). Poly is U.S. history's #8 team ever at 45.59 in the 4x100 relay, with Morningside (46.57), Skyline (46.61), and Etiwanda (Rancho Cucamonga/SS) (46.95) among the nation's best half-dozen squads.

The boys high jump will be a super event. Surprising Jeff Nadeau (Monroe, Sepulveda/LA) has cleared 7-2 1/4, and had good attempts at 7-3 after a 7-0 LA City win. Jeremy Fischer (Camarillo/SS) (7-2) has more seven foot clearances than any jumper in the nation, with Todd Kelly (Big Valley/N) (7-1 1/2), Art Lloyd (Eisenhower, Rialto/SS) (7-0 1/4), and Brian Carlson (Katella, Anaheim) (7-0) others over the "magic" 7-0 barrier. The pole vault has been a very special event in California this spring. Tye Harvey (Sonora) (17-1), Scott Slover (Leland, San Jose) (16-10), Jesse Stern (Harvard Westlake, North Hollywood/SS) (16-4), Brandon Vance (Los Gatos) (16-3), and David Gehrke (Diamond Bar/SS) (16-0) have bested 16-0, with good competitive credentials. In the long jump, Edward Turner (Morningside) (24-1), LeAndrew Childs (Inglewood/SS) (24-8 3/4w-23-11), Lamonte Adams (Nogales, La Puente/SS) (23-10 1/4), Jackie Frazier (Madera/CE) (23-10), and Jimmi Banks (San Leandro/NC) (23-10) are the state's leaders. A solid boys triple jump field will battle. Ty Gaines (Palmdale/SS) (50-1 3/4), Mel Moultry (Beverly Hills/SS) (50-0 1/2w-48-7), Derrick Mitchell (Mt. Eden, Hayward/NC) (50-1 3/4w-48-2 1/2), Tony Parrish (Marina, Huntington Beach) 49-11 1/4, Xavier Howell (Poly, Long Beach/SS) (49-5 1/2), and Brandon Doss (Bella Vista, Fair Oaks/SJ) (49-1) will be a great group. In the weight events (shot/discus) Tyson Lingenfelter (Upland/SS) (63-11 & 181-6) and Chad Peare (Trabuco Hills, Mission Viejo/SS) (60-11 & 191-11) have ruled the state this spring, with Jason Young (Piedmont, San Jose/CCS) (60-2 3/4) improving in the shot.

In the girls high jump, Danielle Boswell (Bullard, Fresno/CE) (5-10) leads the state, with Tina Bowman (Newport Harbor, Newport Beach/SS) (5-9 1/4), her teammate Kayla Ross (5-8), Reisha Candidate (Clovis West, Fresno/CE) (5-8 1/2), Tracye Lawyer (Cate, Carpinteria/SS) (5-8), Kim Blankenship (Torrance/SS) (5-8), and Jamila Churchill (Bishop O'Dowd) (5-8) others with top marks. In the long jump, Marion Jones (21-7/22-1 3/4w) should be joined for the first time by another prep over 20-0, with Amy Littlepage (Mt. Miguel, Spring Valley/SD) strong lately with a 20-5 best. Cheaza Figueroa (Quartz Hill/SS) (19-7 1/2w/19-1 1/4), Ebonie Henderson (Bakersfield)(19-5), Jernae Wright (James Logan) (19-3 1/2), and Kesha Doby (Lynwood) (19-1) are over 19-0. The triple jump will be another tight event with a number of top athletes. Tamiaka Porter (Orange Glen, Escondido/SD) (40-10 3/4w-4-06 1/4), Ebonie Henderson (Bakersfield) (40-6), Amy Littlepage (Mt. Miguel)(40-4), Cheaza Figueroa (Quartz Hill), and Amber Roberts (Muir) (39-6 1/4) should lead the battle. Spectacular describes the season and efforts in the girls weight events by Kristin Heaston (Ygnacio Valley, Concord/NC) and Suzy Powell (Downey). Heaston's 51-11 1/2 shot best makes her the #4 US High School putter ever, with discus thrower Powell establishing a U.S. 11th grade record of 178-6. Other leaders in the shot are Crystal Brownlee (Westlake, Westlake Village/SS) (45-11 1/2), Lisa Misipeka (Temecula Valley), Lisa Stephaney (Hoover, Fresno/CE) (44-8), and Neda Kawar (Crescenta Valley/SS) (44-6 3/4). In the discus, Soozie Shanley (Tulare/CE)(148-11), Staci Darden (Sonora/SJ) (146-8), Heaston and Mandy Buckley (Bakersfield) (142-4) (yes, she's Jeff's younger sister) lead the charge to keep Powell honest. LB Poly Jackrabbits Look to Sprint Their Way to Second Title

Appropriately nicknamed the Jackrabbits, the Long Beach Poly girls are in a position to sprint off with their second consecutive CIF/Reebok State track title.

"The girls are peaking at the right time," coach Don Norford said.

Freshman Sherron Rhetta though, has stolen the spotlight from sophomore sprinters Andrea Anderson and Aminah Haddad. Using a strong finishing kick, Rhetta shook off the effects of having a photo finish victory reversed to whiz by defending Ocean View High 800-champ Christie Engesser (2:11.7 to 2:12.88) at Southern Section Masters Meet.

"They're running beautifully. I have no complaints," said Norford. "The girls are doing everything asked of them. They should do well and put on a show at the state meet. And, I think that the people who show up at Cerritos College, will be impressed how the girls handle the pressure of trying to successfully defend a state title."

Poly's 400-meter relay team of Haddad, Chanelle Anderson, LaTasha Prothro and Andrea Anderson goes into the state meet at Cerritos College, with the best clocking (45.59) in this event. They ran a 45.97 (second best behind the Jackrabbits' mark set at the Texas Relay in Austin) May 28. Morningside was second at 46.75.

Meanwhile, the Jackrabbits' 1600 relay, which finished second to Morningside May 28, of Ja'luna Gibson, Prothro, and the Anderson cousins, has the third best clocking in the nation at 3:45.09.

"Although the girls appeared to be peaking, you can never be certain," said Norford.

This year's Southern Section team title marked the fourth for the Jackrabbits' program. Their first title came in 1980 with Ike Jones at the helm. Thousand Oaks was the section runner-up. In 1987, Poly, coached by Maurice Valentine, once again bested Thousand Oaks at Cerritos College.

Haddad was third at 11.67. At the Division I meet two weeks ago, Jones (11.32), Anderson and Haddad also placed 1-2-3, but Jones, who breezed to an expected triple (100,200 and long jump) could not keep Poly from outscoring Moore League rival Long Beach Wilson, 76-67.

That was the meet in which Rhetta came to the forefront with her spectacular duel with Engesser. A review of the tape

at that time gave the 800 race to Rhetta (2:12.053) over Engesser (2:12.057).

On further review of the tape by CIF officials, one of the closest races in CIF history (broken down to thousandths of a second), was awarded to Engesser.

"There was a question raised at the meet," said Southern Section Associate Commissioner Dean Crowley, who was director of the Section track and field finals. "It's tough to go over and review the finish at the time because you're trying to run eight divisions (boys and girls)."

Upon reviewing the tape, CIF officials ruled that Engesser had nipped Rhetta at the tape.

"On looking at it again, CIF officials caught the image of the Ocean View girl's shoulder hitting the tape before Sherron did," explained Norford. "That's what they saw when they blew up the photo and reviewed it."

Norford said it didn't affect his team's standing in the meet. "We just lost two points. That's all. She (Rhetta) took it pretty well."

The two met again at the Masters meet and Rhetta pulled away from the senior champ and now will take on defending CIF/Reebok State champ Miesha Marzell and try to upset the Oakland Bishop O'Dowd half-miler.

"She (Rhetta) was really focused," Norford said. "It was a heckuva an effort (photo finish race), and she was determined to show that she could beat Engesser (second time the race was won). I know that she can hardly wait for the 800 to begin."

With her back-to-back 800 runs, Rhetta shattered the school record of 2:12.05, set back in 1982.

Another Poly freshman, Shaveni Williams, finished second in the high jump with a leap of 5-6 1/4, but will not be in the state meet. Poly didn't qualify anyone for the field event segment, although senior Chanelle Anderson turned in a leap of 18-8 3/4 in the long jump.

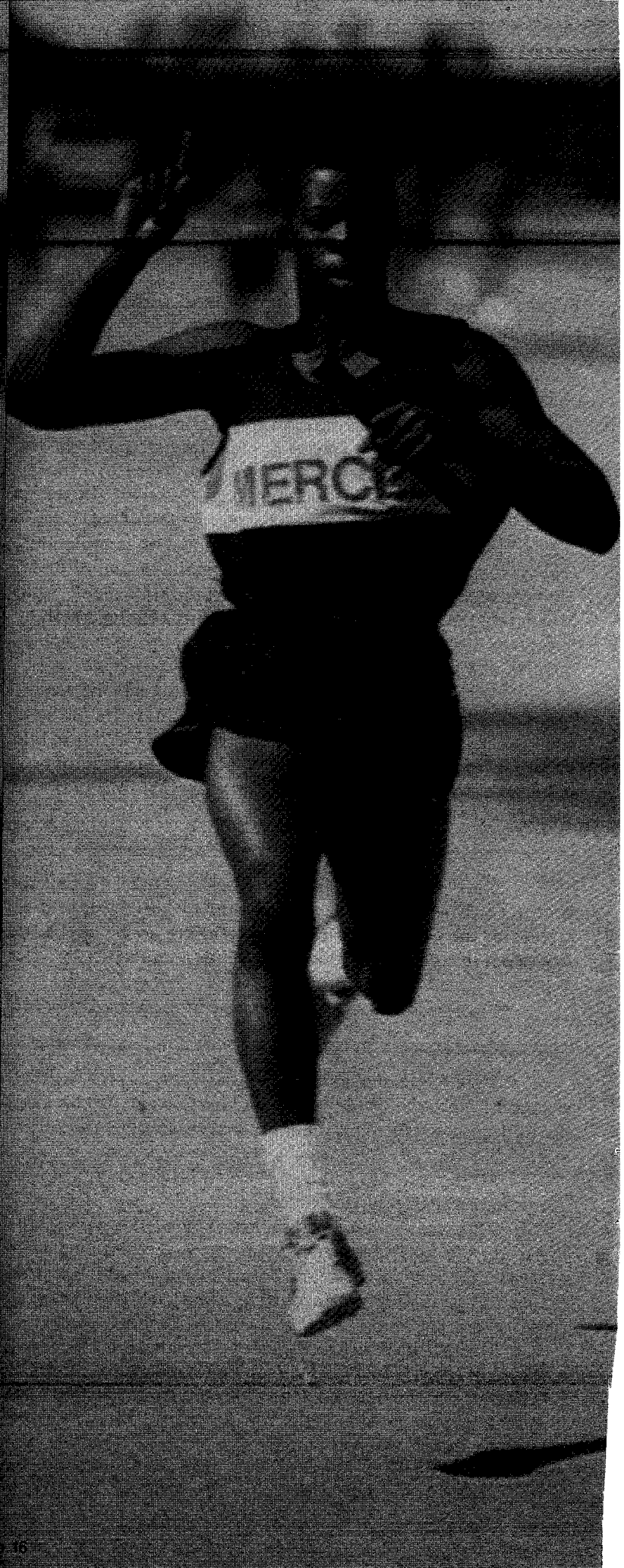
Andrea Anderson has gone undefeated in the Moore League in the 100 the past two seasons in addition to recording a 3.9 grade point average in the classroom. She set a personal best in the 100 (11.66) at the Arcadia Invitational, which she shattered in her showdown with Jones.

"Andrea, who also anchors the 400 and 1600-relay teams, displays a sense of maturity that keeps her level-headed and focused, and that's what made her successful," Norford said. "It's because she thinks things out."

Named last year's Moore League Athlete of the Year, Anderson bounced back well from defeat.

"She just comes back and asks what she can do better," said Norford. "I think that's very important because she understands at an early age that it takes time to be the best. There's a lot of ups and downs to being a champ."

Norford just smiles when you mention the youth of the Poly girls and the possibility of more titles. He just said: "You never know."



Running Fever Hits Merced With Standouts Volsan, Wilkinson Leading Way

A CIF/Reebok State Crown is a Distinct Possibility

Normally a football town, Merced has caught the running fever as well. Thanks to the boys high school's track and field team, the town is a buzz with "state title" talk.

"We've got a really good chance to win state after just missing (four points shy) last year," Bears coach Greg McKinstry said. "Everyone who scored points for us is back."

With USC-bound Anthony Volsan (leading state returner in the 100 and 200 meter races) and Villanova-bound Brian Wilkinson (leads state in 800 and third in the 1600), Merced should go the distance this time.

Keep an eye also on Lindsay McDonald, who has run a 10.55 100 and a 21.35 200 meters this year. Plus, the 400-relay team of Volsan, McDonald, Brett Bean and Rob Warcup has run as well as 41.68 (in top three).

"We potentially have the ability to score points in the 100, 200, 800 and both relays," noted McKinstry.

"It's not that often that you have the chance to talk about winning a state championship. I've been here 10 years, and, until last year, we had never had a shot at it. Now, we have a chance to win it all."

Volsan is very confident of his team's potential success in the CIF/Reebok State meet. "I haven't been beaten in the 200 this year, and I feel our chances are good. I'm not sure how Wilkinson's ankle is, but if he's healthy...look out!"

Coming into the final meet, Wilkinson has the second fastest time in the nation at 1:49.50 in the 800. It came at the Fresno Relays, where he also helped anchor a distance medley relay squad to a 4:08.9 clocking.

"Unfortunately after those sparkling efforts, he blew out an ankle playing in a pick-up basketball game," lamented McKinstry. "We're still trying to get him healthy again, but he's been well enough to help us get this far."

The Bears' 1600 relay team consists of Wilkinson, McDonald, Volsan and Eric Caldwell, a junior half-miler (ran a 1:55.7 800 meters this year). Another sprinter to keep an eye on is Aaron Rosenberg. McKinstry said he might put him in, however, it depends on how the regular foursome is feeling and whether they are healthy enough to run a championship lap.

"Our hopes revolve around Volsan and Wilkinson's individual efforts," McKinstry pointed out. "If they compete up to their capabilities, we should be sitting in good shape. As far as relays are concerned, who knows. Anything can happen. We'll just keep our fingers crossed and try to stay healthy, and keep the baton moving."

Bakersfield captured the team title with 25 points last season. Morningside was second and Hawthorne, coached by Kye Courtney (team won six previous titles before he retired at the end of this season), placed just ahead of the Bear runners.

"We know what it's like to be here (running in the finals)," said Volsan, who this fall rushed for more than 3,000 yards (school record) in the Merced backfield. "That should help."

Volsan, who has a full-ride scholarship to USC (football and track) was recruited by San Diego State, Washington, Washington State and UC Berkeley in addition to the Trojans.

"The distance between Merced and USC is just right, and I like the players and the fact that John Robinson is head coach there. They are planning to turn me into a receiver. I'm not all that big for college. This past season, I had a couple of touchdowns and 500-yards receiving."

But he can fly. He's only been beaten once this year in the 100, and, no one has caught him yet at the finish line in the 200.

"I've always run track, but I really didn't get into it until my freshman year," Volsan said. "I planned to study psychology at USC, but, at this point, I'm not really sure. This is a football town, but the track team has been getting a little more publicity than in the past. It's still not enough as far as I'm concerned."

But some is better than none, he agreed. As far as meets go, Volsan said he enjoyed being at the Mt. San Antonio College Relays (in Walnut), although it was not his best performance. "I saw Carl Lewis and a couple of other big names," he said.

As for his best performance, Volsan said it was at Modesto College as the Bears tried to qualify as many people as possible for the state meet.

McDonald and Volsan were one-two in their 100 heats at the prestigious Arcadia Invitational, while the 400 relay team captured top honors at the Mt. Sac Relays.

"It's not that often that you have the chance to talk about winning a state championship," McKinstry said. "I've been here 10 years, and, until last year, we had never had a shot at it. Now, we have a chance to win it all this year."

Wilkinson is the defending indoor and outdoor national high school scholastic champ.
