## Distance events swing pendulum in Aptos' favor

· SOQUEL. — Aptos High executed its plan perfectly Saturday at the Santa Cruz Coast Athletic League track and field championships and picked up its third straight girls title.

Trailing Santa Cruz going into the final two events, the Mariners went 1-2-3 in the 3,200 meters and then won the 1,600 relay — a 34-point swing — to pull away from the Cardinals. Aptos finished with 111 points while Santa Cruz totaled 97.

"It was a lot harder this year for sure," said Aptos Nicole Silva, who won the 3,200 "We had to individually work harder this year for the team."

Aptos Coach Bill Hotchkiss' plan was for the Mariners to sweep the top three places in the 3,200, 1,600 and 800. And the Mariners did just that, totaling 72 points in just three events.

"We were behind the whole way," Hotchkiss said.
"But I really wasn't worried. These girls are so good."

In the 1,600, Aptos' Meghan Randall finished first in 5 minutes, 31.6 seconds with Silva and Lisa Crouch finishing second and third, respectively.

In the 800, Crouch came home first with Randall and Silva second and third. And in the 3,200, Crouch and Randall came in right behind Silva. The trio plus Lindsey McDougal then raced to a win in the relay and the plan was executed.

She also helped the Cougars to a school record in the 400 relay, with a winning time of 50.8. Serrano, too, set a school mark with a 58.4 in the 400, which was good for second place. Serrano also finished second in the 300 hurdles.

In the shot put, Watsonville's Kelly Nanez won with a put of 32-10 and Holly Royaltey of SLV won the discus at 111-4.

No one could match Aptos, however. The trio of Crouch, Silva and Randall accounted for 72 points by themselves in addition their contribution in the 1,600 relay.

"I thought we'd have 107," said Hotchkiss, who doped the meet beforehand. "And I thought Santa Cruz would have 95."

He missed by two on the Cardinals, and missed his own team's production by four. But not bad.
