

Stephens Paces Viking Harriers To 1953 PAL Title

Long-striding Roger Stephens paced Palo Alto to the Peninsula Athletic League cross country championship yesterday, touring a 1.72 mile Stanford course in the record time of 8:34.9.

The Vikings had 41.5 points to annex the team crown with Jefferson taking second place. Lincoln's Mary Gross was second and Willow Glen's Walt Swarthout fourth. Eight of the 65 finishers were clocked under the 9-minute mark.

An expected duel between Stephens and Don Bowden, state half-mile king from Lincoln, did not materialize. Bowden was ordered to bed early in the week because of a cold.

Bill Wilson, Santa Clara ace not eligible to compete in the PAL meet, won a special race in 8:40, a new course mark until Stephens lowered the boom with his sterling performance.
