Others helping the Scots chalk up their third straight win were last-improving Jerry Barney, fourth; Dick Bronson, fifth; Harley Smith, seventh and Gil Werder, eighth.

Jefferson's Dick Poole wound

up seventh.

The day's junior varsity race ended in an unusual deadlock, 28-28, as Carlmont's Dick Cooley romped in ahead of the field in 12:48.

Next test for the Carlmont harriers is against Menlo-Atherton and Sequoia Friday afternoon over the Highlander course.
