TWO-MAN, TEN-MILE RELAY RESULTS--1959

A record number of entries (nearly double the previous high) and new records in the prep and junior college divisions highlighted the 1959 postal competition sponsored by Track & Field News. T&FN Honor Awards will go to the leaders in each division--World--U.S.--Collegiate--Frosh-Junior College--and High School. THREE MILE TEAM RACE REFILTS--1959

The first annual three-mile team race postal competition got off to slow start in 1959. Only eight teams entered the Track & Field News sponsored event. But we have to start somewhere and the high school two-mile event was almost as slow to get started. Now the preps had 59 entries in the third year and the level of high school two-miling has dropped considerably. 23 preps have broken 9:50 for two miles on the track; 19 of them in the three years of the postal competition. The same thing can happen in the three-mile race for colleges, junior colleges and clubs.

The 1960 competition will be run between Sept. 1 and Dec. 15 with results to be received by Track & Field News, Box 296, Los Altos, by Dec. 20. Honor Awards to the leading teams and individuals.
