Schoolboy Succumbs In Race

STANFORD - A 14-year-old Santa Clara schoolboy died after collapsing near the end of a twomile cross country race at the Stanford Golf Course yesterday afternoon.

Kenneth Lapka, son of Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Lapka of 654 Hamilton Drive, Santa Clara, was pronounced dead on arrival at Palo Alto-Stanford Hospital Center at 5:15 p.m., shortly after he collapsed.

The hospital's emergency room staff failed in a three-hour effort to revive the youth by applying external heart massage and arti-

ficial respiration.

Hospital officials said they haven't "the slightest idea" why the boy collapsed. The Santa Clara County coroner's office had scheduled an autopsy this afternoon to determine the cause of death.

The youth, a freshman at Buchser High School in Santa Clara, was one of 1,114 high school runners from 57 schools competing in the Stanford Center Cross Country Meet.

Race officials said everyone in the youth's pre-final heat had crossed the finish line and another race had been started when the boy collapsed about 40 yards short of the finish line.

The boy's coach, Pat Penick, rushed him to the nearby hospi-

Penick said he believes the youth was alive during the trip to the hospital. He said he applied mouth-to-mouth resuscitation in an attempt to revive the stricken boy.

Rosary will be recited at 8:30 p.m. Sunday at the Harmon A. Smith Funeral Home, Santa Clara, and a low mass will be sung at 9 a.m. Monday at St. Justin's Church, Santa Clara.

Interment will be in Santa Clara Catholic Cemetery.

Kenneth was the brother of David, James, Marilyn, Joy and Bryan Lapka.

He also is survived by his grandparents in South Dakota.
