VICTOR REPEATS HIS 1967 TRIUMPH

Walsh Finishes 2d to Pace Villanova to 4th Straight Team Championship

Art Dulong of Holy Cross, who won the I. C. 4-A cross-country crown as a sophomore and was the runner-up as a junior, regained the title yesterday as a senior.

The Crusader captured the colorful Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America event by a convincing 125 yards, covering the five-mile Van Cortlandt Park course in the Bronx in 24 minutes 6.8 seconds. He missed by 2.4 seconds the record he posted two years ago. Donal Walsh of Villanova was second.

As expected, Villanova, paced by Walsh and heavily fortified by its foot cavalry from England and Ireland, took team honors for the fourth

The Wildcats' top five finishers accounted for a total of 60 points toward a lopsided 78-point margin over second-place Harvard.

Ron Stonitsch, Post College's premier distance runner, and Roy Chernock, the Pioneers' coach, have one race they want to forget . . . NCAA University Division cross country championships of 1968.

In that one, Stonitsch, only a sophomore, finished in 74th place for his lone setback in hill and dale competition since he entered the Brookville school.

"Things are going to be different this

time," said Chernock yesterday after his prize pupil breezed to a 150-yard victory for a second consecutive 1C4A College Division title at Van Cortlandt Park, the Bronx.

"I take the blame for that one I'm a year older and a lot smarter now. Last season I told Ron to stay back in the field and then make his move after two miles.

"He isn't able to do that. He has to run in front. Another thing, we didn't really train for that race last year.

"Our whole schedule was based on the NCAA and IC4A College Division meets. By the time the NCAA University Division came around, Stonitsch was starting to cut down."

Yesterday's triumph, gained in 25:03.3 for the five miles, was the second major title in three days for the 20-year-old junior from Long Beach.

On Saturday, in four inches of snow in Chicago, the 5-9½ harrier took the gold medal in 24:53 in the NCAA College Division. He was sixth in that event in '68.

Stonitsch, undefeated in 28 dual meets with the Pioneers, won the Lehigh University, Albany State College and Collegiate Track Conference crowns earlier this campaign.

And now comes the NCAA University Division next Monday at Van Cortlandt.

"I'll only run about 50 miles in training this week," said Ron, who usually does between 80 and 100. "I got back from Chicago late Saturday night and when I woke up Sunday I went out and jogged six miles around the track at Long Beach High School.

"My goal is to finish in the top 20 next week. I'm ready this time."

In yesterday's University Division competition, Art Dulong, a senior at Holy Cross, was the gold medalist in 24:06.3 as he regained the title he won as a sophomore.

The Crusader, second last year, fell short of the meet record of 24:04.4 he es-

tablished as a soph.

Villanova, led by Donal Walsh, a sophomore from Ireland who was runnerup to Dulong by 125 yards, took the team title for the fourth straight year with 60 points.

Harvard, the Heptagonal titlist, was next with 138, followed by Penn State (154), St. John's (163) and Connecticut (176). The fourth-place finish was the highest ever for the Redmen. Their previous best was a seventh in 1957.

Terry Mcuade paced Steve Bartold's team with a 10th place in 25:10. Don Rowe, another Johnnie, was 11th and Manhattan's Ed Walsh of Rockville Centre was 12th.

The College Division team crown went to Lehigh with 36 points.
