

SOME FACTS ABOUT OSU

Oregon State University is the oldest state supported institution of higher learning in Oregon and has celebrated its 100th birthday. It is one of the nation's larger land-grant schools, started by the Morrill Act of 1862. Over 100 major buildings are located on the 400 acre main OSU camous. Some 4,000 acres adjoining the main campus are owned and used by the University for research and instruction, and 24,000 acres more are utilized by Branch Experiment Stations for research. The School of Forestry owns and administers 14,300 acres of forest land within seven miles of the campus. The value of the University is estimated at approximately \$75,000,000.

Oregon State University is a growing institution. It not only has its largest enrollment ever of over 14,000, but has one of the largest building programs ever. The new James Kerr Library, Forestry Lab, Radiation Center, United States Government Water Research Lab., Pharmacy Building Extension, Oceanography Building, and four new dorms, are a few of the newer buildings on campus. The proposed plan indicates more new dormitories and classroom facilities.

Oregon State University offers a wide variety of courses within the areas of Engineering, Business, Pharmacy, Forestry, Science, Agriculture, Home Economics, Humanities and Social Science, and Education. Oregon State's oceanography research program is one of the best in the nation and the oceanography teaching program ranks fourth nationally. The 800 ton research vessel "Yaquina" operates out of OSU's Marine Science Laboratory at Newport, Oregon. OSU offers 125 fields of study in 11 schools and divisions. Masters degrees are offered in 100 fields and doctor of philosophy degrees in 75 fields.

Oregon State University's location in a smaller community (Corvallis' population is about 30,000), is truly a blessing. Student activities are plentiful and well organized. Metropolitan areas usually pull the students away from their campuses for entertainment, but at Oregon State, life is on the campus. Educators say that this is one reason for the student's enthusiasm and interest for their school.

Oregon State University students have a wide range of religious denominations to choose from for their spiritual training. The Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Youth for Christ are among the religious youth groups active on campus.

Oregon State offers a variety of living accommodations for its students. The selection usually is either a fraternity or dormitory, but cooperative, religious and apartment living are also available.

Oregon State University offers young men outstanding ROTC programs. Students can elect to participate in any one of the major branches of the service, either on the basic or advanced level.

Oregon State University is located in an ideal position--just 50 miles from the Pacific Ocean, and even closer to winter sports skiing areas. Although the climate in the Willamette Valley is mild and seldom experiences snowfall, you are close to snow areas if you decide to visit them.

OSU Cross Country History

Cross Country had its start as a sport at OSU back in the 1930's when Coach Grant Swan fielded teams against Oregon Colleges and Universities. In 1948 the University of Portland started one of the few invitational Cross Country meets that existed on the West Coast. This meet was open to any and all colleges and universities in the State of Oregon. Coach Swan's teams led by Beaver stars George Fullerton (later head coach) and Joe Fisher captured the meet title in 1948-49-50.

OSU Cross Country next went through a transitional stage with three coaches at the helm from 1951-57.

Next on the scene was Sam Bell who carried the Beavers into national competition. In 1961 OSU won the NCAA title with 68 points. OSU's <u>Dale Story</u> won individual honors in the 1961 meet and <u>Richard Cuddihy</u> placed 12th to make the All-American team. In the 1962 season the Beavers placed 8th in the NCAA Championships.

Ih his second season as Head Coach, in 1966, Wagner led the Beavers to a 7th place finish in the NCAA Championships. <u>Tracy Smith</u> won his All-American honors by taking second in this race. Another feature of the program under Wagner is the continued scheduling of top-flight teams from other sections of the country, and annual representation in the National Championships. This year, Utah and the Vancouver Olympic Club are on the schedule, as well as the NCAA Meet in New York.

Know Your Coaches

BERNY WAGNER Starting his fifth season as Head Track & Cross Country Coach, following a brilliant prep and college coaching career at College of San Mateo. Coached 13 years in prep ranks in California, following graduation from Stanford where he was an 880 man. Attended and ran for Cal Tech in Pasadena, Stanford, and the S.F.O.C. Obtained A.B. degree in 1948, M.A. degree in 1949. Coach Wagner is married and has three children.

ROY BURNS Roy Burns, newly hired assistant coach is a graduate of Eastern Washington College. He is a Lt. Col. in the Marine Corps Reserve and has coached for the past sixteen years in Oregon and Washington high schools. The past seven years he has been Head Track and Cross Country Coach at Hudson's Bay High School in Vancouver, Washington. He is married, has four children and will be working on a master's degree in education.

CHUCK McNEIL Now in his fifth season for OSU as an assistant to Coach Wagner. Chuck was a standout sprinter at Modesto J.C. and later at San Jose State College. His best marks included 9.6 in the 100, 20.8 in the 220 and 47.4 for the 440. Before coming to OSU Chuck was assistant track and field coach at Bakersfield Junior College in 1961-62 and Head Coach at South High in Bakersfield in 1963.

1969 Forecast

The 1969 Oregon State Cross Country Team will look a great deal like the 1968 Team with the addition of several promising newcomers. Only one man of the top five from last year will not be back. Senior, Lew Dahlin, graduated, but the top four runners, National Steeplechase Champion, Jim Barkley; last year's No. 1 man, Spencer Lyman; miler, Joe Baisch; and junior, Steve Squires, will all be running for the Beavers again.

Freshmen are eligible in the Pacific-Eight Conference for the first time this year, and OSU has three outstanding freshmen cross country prospects. Chris Carey, from Carlmont High School in California has run 9:12.2, Doug Crooks, from North Eugene High School has run 9:03.0, and Dennis Weed, from Portland's Centennial High School has run 9:10.7. Fullerton Junior College transfer, Doug Buck, had a fine cross country season in the tough Southern California J. C. League last season, and may crack the top seven. Returnees, Wayne Dey, a sophomore in eligibility this year, John Lilly, a senior, who has run 4:07.6, and last year's top Rook, Mike Tolstad, will battle the leaders for their positions on the team.

Only two seniors are on the twenty-six man squad, so it will be predominately young in spite of the fact that most of the runners have had previous collegiate experience.

An innovation this season is the fact that there will be no Rook (freshman) Squad. There will be a Varsity and a Junior Varsity since freshmen are now eligible to run on the Varsity. Also, this will be the first year that the Pacific-8 has held a Championship Cross Country Meet, and it will be held on the Stanford Golf Course this fall. The young, but experienced "Eager Beavers" have an exciting season ahead of them meeting local competition, the Vancouver Olympic Club from British Columbia, Canada, the University of Utah, and all of the teams in the Pacific-8.

Individual Profiles of Leading Runners

JOE BAISCH One of the two seniors on the squad was No. 4 man last year. The Washington Junior College Cross Country Champion and Two-Mile Champion two years ago.

JIM BARKLEY The most improved runner in the United States from his high school time of 4:46.0 to his sophomore mile of 4:06.4, and National Collegiate Championship in the Steeplechase at 8:44.4. Jim could be one of the outstanding distance runners on the coast this fall.

DOUG BUCK A junior transfer from Fullerton Junior College in Southern California. His cross country competitive results are better than his best time of 4:15.6.

CHRIS CAREY An outstanding freshman, who ran 9:12.2 last year in spite of being bothered with illness has the potential to go the distance with success.

PAT COLLINS Four-miles may be a little far for this NCAA 880 finalist. He has the strength to run outstanding times, however.

DOUG CROOKS One of the top high school milers and two-milers in the Nation last year. Has outstanding potential.

WAYNE DEY A sophomore who sat out last season was a member of the undefeated Rook Team of 1967.

JOHN LILLY Will be handicapped this fall by a heavy forestry lab and field schedule. Outstanding from the 880 through four miles.

SPENCER LYMAN Rook course record holder, No. 1 man on last year's Varsity in his sophomore season. Could be one of the outstanding runners on the coast this fall.

STEVE SQUIRES No. 3 man last year, now in his junlor year should have the strength to run outstanding times.

MIKE TOLSTAD Last year's leading Rook runner, a fine prospect from Seattle.

LARRY ULRICH Sat out last year while gaining experience and strength, should have a fine sophomore season.

DENNIS WEED Outstanding freshman from Portland. Ran 9:10.7 in high school. He must develop consistency and strength, but has great potential.
