Lindgren, Oregon win titles in Pacific-8 cross country

Two-time NCAA champion Gerry Lindgren of Washington State was the individual winner and Oregon took the team title in Saturday's first-ever Pacific-8 Conference cross country championships.

The competition was held over a six-mile layout at the Stanford Golf Course.

Lindgren, former Olympian, barely edged freshman Steve Prefontaine of Oregon at the finish line. Both were timed in 28:32.4 but the judges declared Lindgren the winner.

Oregon took the team championship with a low score of 46 points, followed by WSU with 63. Stanford placed third with 86, followed by Southern California (90), UCLA (94), California (127), Oregon State (165) and Washington (230).

Oregon had four runners among the top 10 finishers and

should rank as the favorite in last NCAA championships later this month in New York.

Eighteen runners bettered the course record of 29:46 set by Brook Thomas of Stanford last year. Four Stanford entries were included in the group, led by Greg Brock, who finished fifth.

Nevada took the Northern California freshman meet with a low score of 31 points over a four-mile course. Stanford was second with 40.

Lindgren nips 'Pre', but UO harriers win

STANFORD, Calif. — After a six-mile run through the countryside Saturday, Washington State senior Gerry Lindgren and Steve Prefontaine, an Oregon freshman, found themselves battling it out down the stretch of the first Pacific Eight cross country championships here.

Lindgren won the individual duel, but Prefontaine and his Duck teammates walked off with team honors almost as easily as expected.

Lindgren, two-time NCAA cross country champion, was a victim of the Webfoot freshman

earlier this year, but came back to nip Prefontaine at the tape.

Or did he?

"Pre" said no. "It should have been called a tie," said the former Marshfield star.

The pair, timed in 28:32.4 for the six-mile course, led for most of the race, and 17 people followed them to the tape in record-breaking time.

Oregon's Steve Savage was third, with the Cougars scoring with Rick Riley in fourth and Freshman Mark Hiefield of Milwaukie in sixth.

The Ducks' top five places

were rounded out by Roscoe Divine in ninth, Mike McClendon in tenth and Tom Morrow, 22nd.

"We won it and we're pleased," said UO cross country coach Bill Dellinger, "but some of our men didn't run up to their capabilities.

"To win this on a bad day — and it was a bad day all around — is an indication of the quality of this team."

The Cougars finished second with 63 points, while host Stanford, second place finishers in the NCAA championships last year, was third with 86.

Rounding out the team finish was USC with 90, UCLA 94, California 127, Oregon State 165, and Washington 230.

Oregon Takes Harrier Title

STANFORD — Gerry Lindgren, two-time NCAA champion from Washington State, won the Pacific-8 Conference cross country title Saturday, but Oregon walked off with team honors by plac-

ing four men in the first 10 finishers.

Oregon captured the team championship with a low of 46 points with Washington State second with 63. Stanford was third with 86, followed by USC with 90, UCLA 94, California 127, Oregon State 165 and Washington 230.

Lindgren and Steve Prefontaine of Oregon both were timed in 28:32.4 for the six mile race, but judges gave the Washington State senior first place over the Webfoot freshman. Steve Savage of Oregon was third while Roscoe Divine and Mike McClendon of the Ducks placed ninth and 10th.

Eighteen runners bettered the course record of 29:46 set last year by Stanford's Brook Thomas. Four Stanford men were included in the group, Greg Brock (29:08), Bob Coe (29:33), Decker Underwood, a freshman (29:35) and Don Kardong (29:41).

P A C I F I C - 8 C R O S S C O U N T R Y C H A M P I O N S H I P M E E T

This, the first-ever Pacific-8 Cross Country Championship Meet, is the type of talent-laden affair that may reduce the NCAA Championships to secondary importance. Five of the nation's strongest teams will be competing against each other in the meet, with only one of them assured of a berth in the NCAA finals. It should be a brilliant start for what promises to turn into one of the highlights of every Pacific-8 Athletic season.

PLACE - Stanford Golf Course, Stanford University
DATE - Saturday, November 15, 1969, 10:30 A.M.
DISTANCE - 6 Miles. Race will start and finish at the #2 Tee by the stables. Spectators should be able to view at least half of the race.
RECORD - 29:46.4 Brook Thomas (Stanford) 1968.

REVIEW OF TEAMS - Oregon Coach - Bill Dellinger. Oregon is loaded with great talent. The Ducks fresh from winning the No. Division meet are led by freshman Steve Prefontaine, America's youngest international distance running star. Steve was the individual winner in the No. Division meet (29:13.8 for 6 miles). Four more Ducks finished in a tight grouping in places three through six with junior Steve Savage, sophomore Mike McClendon, Canadian senior Norm Trerise, and senior Tom Morrow.

Washington State Coach - Jack Mooberry. WSU is paced by the 1-2 punch of Gerry Lindgren and Rick Riley. Gerry is a two-time NCAA champion in cross country and is concluding a brilliant collegiate track and cross country career. Riley, also a senior, finished 2nd in the 1969 NCAA 6 mile run. WSU has demonstrated good team strength all season with only the loss to Oregon to mar the record. Freshman Mark Hiefield (8:55 2 mile) has proven to be a strong third man.

UCLA Coach - Jim Bush. Team strength characterizes a veteran Bruin team. Ron Fister leads the six seniors and one junior, a group of runners that have jelled this season into a solid running unit. The Bruins ground out a 27-28 victory over Stanford with a 14.4 second gap 1-5 on the Stanford 6 mile course.

Stanford Coach - Marshall Clark. 2nd in the NCAA in 1968, the Indians again have a strong team. Sophomore Robert Coe is the individual leader. Three members returning from last year's team are seniors Greg Brock (All-American '68), Chuck Menz, and junior Don Kardong.

USC Coach - Ken Matsuda. 3rd in the NCAA in 1968 the Trojans can be dangerous if all the horses are running at their best. The Trojans are led by All-American Jeff Marsee, frosh sensation Fred Ritcherson, and junior college transfer Rick Muth. NCAA 3 mile champion Ole Oleson is still recovering from a knee operation.

Oregon State Coach - Berny Wagner. OSU is another team paced by young stars. Freshman Doug Crooks and junior Spencer Lyman lead the Beavers. OSU cannot be underrated.
